# SECOND AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS

OF

#### THE WATERFIELD FOUNDATION, INC.

#### **JANUARY 7, 2013**

#### ARTICLE I

#### Name and Offices

- 1. <u>Name</u>. The name of this Corporation is The Waterfield Foundation, Inc.
- 2. Offices. The principal office of the Corporation shall be in Allen County, Indiana. The Corporation may also have offices at such other places as the Board of Directors may from time to time appoint or the purposes of the Corporation may require.

#### ARTICLE II

#### Members

1. <u>Membership</u>. The Corporation shall have no members.

#### ARTICLE III

#### **Directors**

- 1. <u>Election</u>. The business and property of the Corporation shall be managed and controlled by a Board of Directors, who shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors to hold office until the next annual meeting of the Board of Directors or until the election and qualification of their respective successors, except as otherwise provided.
- 2. <u>Number</u>. The number of Directors of the Corporation shall be three (3); provided, however, such number may be increased or decreased by amendment to these Bylaws, in the manner set forth in Article XIII. However, under no circumstances shall the minimum number be less than three (3). When the number of Directors is decreased by amendment adopted by the Board of Directors, such Director in office shall serve until his term expires, or until his resignation or removal.
- 3. <u>Qualifications</u>. The provisions hereafter set forth shall govern the election of Directors at all meetings at which one or more Directors are elected.

- (a) <u>In General</u>. All Directors must be at least twenty-four (24) years of age, U.S. Citizens, competent, and willing to serve on the Board of Directors.
- (b) <u>Initial Directors</u>. The Initial Board of Directors shall consist of Frances W. LeMay, Elizabeth W. Chapman, and Richard D. Waterfield, (the 'Initial Directors'). Each Initial Director represents a "Family Unit." The Frances W. LeMay Family Unit (or the "Frances Unit") shall be represented by Frances W. LeMay and her lineal descendants. The Elizabeth W. Chapman Family Unit (or the "Elizabeth Unit") shall be represented by Elizabeth W. Chapman, her husband, Howard L. Chapman, and her lineal descendants. The Richard D. Waterfield Family Unit (or the "Richard Unit") shall be represented by Richard D. Waterfield, his wife Marni McKinney Waterfield, his niece Anne Menefee, and his lineal descendants.
- (c) <u>Re-election of Initial Directors</u>. Initial Directors shall not be subject to removal during their lifetime and shall be entitled to annual re-election; provided, however, the Initial Directors may be removed if they are not qualified to serve as provided in Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III.

#### (d) Replacement of Initial Directors.

In the event of the death, resignation, or removal of an Initial Director, such Initial Director shall be replaced in the manner hereafter specified.

- (i) Replacement of Frances W. LeMay. Anne K. Menefee shall first be entitled to election as a Director to replace her, and shall be entitled to annual re-election, and to continue to serve for a period of three (3) years. Thereafter, Cynthia F. Whitaker shall be entitled to election on a similar basis for a period of three (3) years. Thereafter, Barbara Lorene LeMay shall be entitled to election on a similar basis for a period of three (3) years. Thereafter, the rotation shall resume so that Anne K. Menefee, Cynthia F. Whitaker, and Barbara Lorene LeMay shall, in successive turns, serve three-year terms. If any of such children of Frances shall die, resign, be removed or otherwise fail to qualify as provided in Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III, then the child of Frances W. LeMay next in line shall be entitled to election as a Director. This provision shall continue so long as any child of Frances W. LeMay shall be eligible to serve.
- (ii) Replacement of Elizabeth W. Chapman. On condition that they continue to be married, Howard L. Chapman, her husband, shall be elected to replace her and to be re-elected annually, and to serve as a Director for a period of five (5) years from the date of election and, during that time, shall not be subject to removal so long as he qualifies as provided in Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III.. Thereafter, Stephen L. Chapman shall be entitled to election as a Director, and shall not be subject to removal, and shall be entitled to annual re-election, during his lifetime, so long as he qualifies as provided in Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III.

- (iii) Replacement of Richard D. Waterfield. On condition that they continue to be married, Marni McKinney Waterfield, his wife, shall be elected to replace him and to serve as a Director, and to annual re-election, during her lifetime, and shall not be subject to removal so long as she qualifies as provided in Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III. Upon her death, resignation or removal, or if she is unable or unwilling to serve, (or upon the death or resignation of Richard D. Waterfield if Marni McKinney Waterfield has predeceased him) then Jill L. Waterfield Meyer, the daughter of Richard D. Waterfield, shall be entitled to be elected as a Director to replace her or him, as the case may be, and to annual re-election, and shall be entitled to serve during her lifetime, and shall not be subject to removal so long as she qualifies as provided in Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III. Upon the death of Jill L. Waterfield Meyer, or if she shall be unable or unwilling to serve, then Anne Menefee, the niece of Richard D. Waterfield, shall be entitled to be elected as a Director to replace her, and shall be entitled to annual re-election, and shall be entitled to serve during her lifetime, and shall not be subject to removal so long as she qualifies as provided in Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III. (If Anne Menefee is already a Director, then she shall be entitled to become a director representing the Richard Unit in accordance with these provisions, and her former directorship shall then be declared vacant and be filled in accordance with the terms of this Article III.) Should Anne Menefee die or be unable or unwilling to serve, then J. Randall Waterfield, the son of Richard D. Waterfield, shall be entitled to be elected, and shall be entitled to annual re-election, and shall be entitled to serve during his lifetime, and shall not be subject to removal so long as he qualifies as provided in Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III. Should J. Randall Waterfield die or be unable or unwilling to serve, then Richard R. Waterfield, the son of Richard D. Waterfield, shall be entitled to be elected, and shall be entitled to annual reelection, and shall be entitled to serve during his lifetime, and shall not be subject to removal so long as he qualifies as provided in Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III. (The term "designated successor" as used in this Article III is intended to refer to Anne Menefee, who may succeed Richard D. Waterfield as above provided.)
- Lineal Descendants of Initial Directors. In the event that an Initial Director has died, resigned or been removed, and no spouse or child of the Initial Director, or other designated successor as set forth in sub-paragraphs (i), (ii) or (iii) above, is qualified to serve, then the oldest qualified lineal descendant of that Initial Director shall be elected to serve as the Director representing that Family Unit. If such oldest lineal descendant does not meet the qualification requirements of Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III, the Directors shall elect the next oldest qualified lineal descendant of that Initial Director, and so on until there are no qualified lineal descendants of that Initial Director. If there are more than one qualified lineal descendants of that Initial Director, then they shall rotate, each serving a three year term, in chronological order according to their ages. If a lineal descendant of an Initial Director does not qualify, pursuant to above Paragraph 3 (a) (as, for example, because of being under 24 years of age), but later does meet such qualifications, that lineal descendant shall, at the next annual election of

Directors, be entitled to move into the rotation to represent the Family Unit of that Director.

- (v) No Lineal Descendants of Initial Director. If an Initial Director has died, been removed or resigned, and there is no spouse, child, designated successor, or qualified lineal descendant of that Initial Director, the oldest qualified lineal descendant of all other Initial Directors shall be elected to represent that Family Unit. If the oldest lineal descendant of all other Initial Directors is already a Director or does not meet the qualification requirements of Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III, the selection process shall continue with the next oldest lineal descendant until there are no lineal descendants of any Initial Director who meet the qualification requirements of Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III. If a lineal descendant of an Initial Director does not qualify, pursuant to above Paragraph 3(a) (as, for example, because of being under 24 years of age), but later does meet such qualifications, that lineal descendant shall, at the next election of Directors, be entitled to election in the place of his or her Initial Director ancestor, and shall have priority over lineal descendants of other Initial Directors, or other persons who may have been elected and who are not lineal descendants of any Initial Director.
- (vi) No Qualified Lineal Descendants. If there are no Initial Directors, and no remaining spouse, child, designated successor, or qualified lineal descendant of any Initial Director, any person who satisfies the qualification requirements of Paragraph 3(a) of this Article III may be elected; provided, that such person must be a resident of Allen County, Indiana; and provided further, that if a lineal descendant of an Initial Director has failed to qualify pursuant to above Paragraph 3(a) (as, for example, because of being under 24 years of age), but later does meet such qualifications, that lineal descendant shall, at the next election of Directors, be entitled to election in the place of his or her Initial Director ancestor, and shall have priority over other persons. The priority rights for lineal descendants of Initial Directors may not be amended or revoked so long as any Initial Director or lineal descendants are living.

#### (e) Intention of Director Qualification Provisions.

It is the intention of Paragraph 3 of Article III of these By-Laws that the Initial Directors, and their designated successors as set forth in sub-paragraphs (d) (i, ii, and iii) above, and subsequent lineal descendants of the Initial Directors, shall have first priority and right to election as Directors. It is also the intent that each Initial Director, or his or her child, spouse, lineal descendant or designated successor, as the case may be, shall represent one of the three seats on the Board of Directors so long as such Initial Director, or his or her spouse (in the case of Elizabeth W. Chapman and Richard D. Waterfield) or child, designated successor or lineal descendants are alive and qualified. It is the further

intent that if any Initial Director shall have no qualified spouse, child, designated successor, or lineal descendants surviving, that the qualified lineal descendants of the other Initial Directors (not already Directors) shall have next priority and right to election as Directors.

- (f) In the event of any conflict between the terms of Paragraph 3 of this Article III and any other provision of these By-Laws, then Paragraph 3 of this Article III shall prevail.
- 4. <u>Resignation</u>. Any Director may resign at any time by giving written notice of such resignation to the Board of Directors.
- 5. <u>Removal</u>. A Director, except as provided in paragraph three (3) of this Article III, elected by the Board of Directors may be removed with or without cause by the vote of a majority of the Directors then in office. The director may be removed only if a majority of the Directors then in office votes for the removal.
- 6. <u>Vacancies</u>. Any vacancy in the Board of Directors occurring during the year, including a vacancy created by an increase in the number of Directors made by the Board of Directors, may be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by the Directors then serving, although less than a quorum, by affirmative vote of the majority. Vacancies shall be filled as set forth in Article III of these Bylaws. Any Director so elected by the Board of Directors shall hold office until the next succeeding annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the Corporation or until the election and qualification of his successor.
- 7. Annual Meetings. The Annual Meeting of the Directors shall be held on the second Tuesday of September of each year at a location chosen by the President. The first order of business shall be the election of Directors for the coming year. The meeting of the newly elected Directors may then proceed to the transaction of any other business. A Director may propose the election of a person not presently serving, but no director may propose more than two such persons with respect to a particular Annual Meeting. If a Director proposes the election of a person not then serving as a Director, he or she shall notify the Secretary in writing, stating the name and address of the proposed new Director, at least seventeen (17) days in advance of the Annual Meeting. The Secretary shall send notice to all Directors of the time and place of the Annual Meeting at least ten (10) days in advance of said date. The notice shall contain the names of all present Directors and of any other person proposed by any present Director to be elected as a Director. Such notice may be waived by written waiver of any Director, and the time and place of such meeting may be fixed by written consent of all Directors. The Annual Meeting may be held on a different date than above specified upon written consent of all Directors.
- 8. <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special Meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or Secretary and must be called by either of them on the written request of any member of the Board. Special Meetings shall be held in Allen County, Indiana, at a place chosen by the President.

- 9. <u>Action by Unanimous Consent</u>. Any action that could be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors may also be taken by written unanimous consent of the members of the Board of Directors.
- 10. <u>Notice of Meetings</u>. Notice of all Directors' meetings, except as otherwise provided, shall be given by mail at least ten (10) days before the meeting to the usual business or residence address of the Director, but such notice may be waived, in writing, by any Director. Any business may be transacted at any Directors' meeting. At any meeting at which every Director shall be present, even though without any notice or waiver, any business may be transacted.
- 11. <u>Chairman</u>. At all meetings of the Board of Directors, the President or in his absence a chairman chosen by the Directors present, shall preside.
- 12. Quorum. At all meetings of the Board of Directors a majority of the Directors shall be sufficient to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and the act of a majority of the Directors present at any meeting at which there is a quorum shall be the act of the Board of Directors, except as may be otherwise specifically provided by statute or by these Bylaws (i.e., voting on distributions; see paragraph 13 below). If at any meeting there is less than a quorum present, a majority of those present may adjourn the meeting without further notice to any absent Director.
- 13. <u>Voting on Distributions</u>. The provisions hereinafter set forth shall govern the distributions of funds by the Corporation. Distribution shall be made in accordance with action taken by the Board of Directors, subject to the terms of Paragraph 13 of this Article III.
  - (a) Accounts and Sub-Accounts. Voting on distributions from the Foundation's various financial accounts will vary depending on the account. Foundation has established a Master Account (presently Barclays Wealth account #832-0183), Sub-Account #1 (also known as the Frances LeMay Family Unit Account, or the "Frances Unit," and presently Barclays Wealth account #832-02032), Sub-Account #2 (also known as the Elizabeth Chapman Family Unit Account, or the "Elizabeth Unit," and presently Barclays Wealth account #823-02034), Sub-Account #3 (also known as the Richard D. Waterfield Family Unit Account, or the "Richard Unit," and presently Barclays Wealth Account #832-02037), and Sub-Account #4 (also known as the RDW Children's Account, or "RDW Children Unit," and presently Barclays Wealth account # 832-02082). The Master Account and each sub-account has other accounts or assets associated with them. The various assets in the Master Account are identified by Barclay's as "Master Account," assets in sub-account number one are identified by Barclay's as "Frances Unit," assets in sub-account number two are identified by Barclay's as "Elizabeth Unit," and assets in sub-accounts number 3 and 4 are identified by Barclay's as "Richard Unit." The assets of the Corporation shall always be held and administered in such a way that they can be identified as being associated with either the Master Account, or one of the above sub-accounts.

- (b) <u>Minimum Distributions</u>. The Corporation shall distribute annually the amount necessary to minimize the excise tax based on investment income and to avoid the tax on the failure to distribute income as provided in Internal Revenue Code Sections 4940 and 4942 and their regulations, respectively, as these provisions now exist or may from time to time be replaced or amended.
- (c) <u>Distributions from the Master Account.</u> Distributions from the Master Account shall require the unanimous vote of all Directors. In the absence of unanimous agreement, they may select a total amount for distribution, and each Director shall be entitled to direct the distribution of one third (1/3) of that amount. In any event, the Directors shall distribute at least enough each year to meet the minimum distribution requirements for that account as set forth in paragraph 13(b) above, or as otherwise required by law.
- (d) <u>Distributions from the Frances W. LeMay Family Unit Account (Sub-Account #1)</u>. All distributions from Sub-Account #1 (the "Frances Unit") shall be directed by Frances W. LeMay, or by the successor Director representing the Frances Unit on the Board at that time. The selection of any grantee, and the amount of any donation, shall be solely at her, or her successor's, discretion, so long as it complies with applicable laws and regulations.
- (e) <u>Distributions from the Elizabeth W. Chapman Family Unit Account (Sub-Account #2)</u>. All distributions from Sub-Account #2 (the "Elizabeth Unit") shall be directed by Elizabeth W. Chapman, or by the successor Director representing the Elizabeth Unit on the Board at that time. The selection of any grantee, and the amount of any donation, shall be solely at her, or her successor's, discretion, so long as it complies with applicable laws and regulations.
- (f) Distributions from the Richard D. Waterfield Family Unit Account (Sub-Account #3). All distributions from Sub-Account #3 (the "Richard Unit") shall be directed by Richard D. Waterfield, or by the successor Director representing the Richard Unit on the Board at that time. The selection of any grantee, and the amount of any donation, shall be solely at his, or his successor's, discretion, so long as it complies with applicable laws and regulations.
- (g) <u>Distributions from the RDW Children's Account (Sub-Account #4)</u>. All distributions from Sub-Account #4 (the "RDW Children's Unit") shall be directed by Richard D. Waterfield, or by the successor Director representing the Richard Unit on the Board at that time. The selection of any grantee, and the amount of any donation, shall be solely at his, or his successor's, discretion, so long as it complies with applicable laws and regulations.

- (h) Master and Sub-Account Disbursements. These provisions regarding disbursements from the Master Account and from the Sub-Accounts may not be terminated or amended so long as there are any living lineal descendants of any Initial Director; however, if there is no Initial Director, or representative of the Family Unit of that Initial Director, pertaining to a particular sub-account, as provided in these By-Laws, then serving on the Board of Directors, the other members of the Board of Directors may make such disbursements from that sub-account, but only to the minimum extent necessary in order to comply with the requirements of applicable laws and regulations, including the Internal Revenue Code. If an Initial Director shall have died, resigned or been removed, and have no living successors, or potential successor [as described in paragraph 3(d)] surviving, then the assets in the sub-account or accounts pertaining to that Initial Director may be merged with the Master Account of the Foundation.
- (i) These provisions regarding disbursements from sub-accounts may not be amended or terminated so long as there is any Initial Director, spouse Director, or lineal descendant of an Initial Director, still living
- (j) Notwithstanding the foregoing, all payments from the Master Account or any Sub-Accounts must comply in all respects with the Articles and By-Laws of the Foundation, and all applicable laws, rules and regulations.
- Contracts and Services. The Directors and officers of the Corporation may be 14. interested directly or indirectly in any contract relating to or incidental to the operations conducted by the Corporation, and may freely make contracts, enter into transactions, or otherwise act for and on behalf of the Corporation, notwithstanding that they may also be acting as individuals, or as trustees of trusts, or as agents for other persons or corporations, or may be interested in the same matters as shareholders, directors, or otherwise; provided, however, that any contract, transaction, or act on behalf of the Corporation in a matter in which the Directors or officers are personally interested shall be at arm's length and not violative of the proscriptions in the Articles of Incorporation against the Corporation's use or application of its funds for private benefit or the proscriptions in the bylaws against a Director receiving compensation of any type; and provided further that no contract, transaction, or act shall be taken on behalf of the Corporation which would result in the denial of the tax exemption under Section 503 or Section 507 of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may be amended. In no event, however, shall any person or other entity dealing with the Directors or officers be obligated to inquire into the authority of the Directors and officers to enter into and consummate any contract, transaction, or other action.
- 15. <u>Compensation</u>. Directors shall not receive any type compensation from the corporation for services rendered to the Corporation in any capacity or reimbursement for expenses of any kind (except only reimbursement for documented out-of-pocket expenses and reimbursement pursuant to the indemnity provisions of Article IX).

- 16. Powers. All the corporate powers, except such as are otherwise provided for in these Bylaws and in the laws of the State of Indiana, shall be vested in the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may by general resolution delegate to committees of their own number, or to officers of the Corporation, such powers as they may see fit.
  - 17. <u>Duties</u>. The Board of Directors shall present at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors a report, verified by the President and Treasurer or by a majority of the directors, showing in appropriate detail the following: (a) the assets and liabilities, including the trust funds, of the Corporation as of the end of the fiscal year immediately preceding the annual meeting, which shall be not more than four months prior to such meeting; (b) the principal changes in assets and liabilities, including trust funds, during the year immediately preceding the date of the report; (c) the revenue or receipts of the Corporation, both unrestricted and restricted to particular purposes, for the year immediately preceding the date of the report; (d) the expenses or disbursements of the Corporation, for both general and restricted purposes, during the year immediately preceding the date of the report.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### Officers

- 1. <u>Number</u>. The officers of the Corporation shall be the President, Secretary, Treasurer, and such other officers with such powers and duties not inconsistent with these Bylaws as may be appointed and determined by the Board of Directors. An individual may simultaneously hold more than one (1) office in the Corporation.
- 2. <u>Election, Term of Office, and Qualifications</u>. The officers shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors from among such persons as the Board of Directors may see fit, at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors. An officer need not be a Director. A director may also be an officer.
- 3. <u>Vacancies</u>. In case any office of the Corporation becomes vacant by death, resignation, retirement, disqualification, or any other cause, the majority of the Directors then in office, although less than a quorum, may elect an officer to fill such vacancy, and the officer so elected shall hold and serve until the next annual meeting of the Board of Directors and until the election and qualification of his successor.
- 4. <u>President</u>. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. He shall have general charge and supervision of the affairs of the Corporation and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors.
- 5. Secretary. The Secretary shall have charge of such books, documents, and papers as the board of Directors may designate. He shall attend and keep the minutes of all the meetings of the Board of Directors. He may, but is not required to, sign with the President in the name and on behalf of the Corporation, any contracts or agreements authorized by the Board of Directors. He shall, in general, perform all the duties incident to the office of Secretary, subject

to the control of the Board of Directors, and shall do such other duties as may be assigned to him . by the Board of Directors.

- Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have the custody of all funds, property, and 6. securities of the Corporation, subject to such regulations as may be imposed by the Board of Directors. He may be required to give bond for the faithful performance of his duties, in such sum and with such sureties as the Board of Directors may require. When necessary he may endorse on behalf of the Corporation for collection checks, notes, and other obligations, and shall deposit the same to the credit of the Corporation at such bank or banks or depositary as the Board of Directors may designate. He shall sign all receipts and vouchers and, together with such other officer or officers, if any, as shall be designated by the Board of directors, he shall sign all checks of the Corporation and all bills of exchange and promissory notes issued by the Corporation, except in cases where the signing and execution shall be expressly designated by the Board of Directors or by these Bylaws to some other officer or agent of the Corporation. He shall make such payments as may be necessary on behalf of the Corporation. He shall enter regularly on the books of the Corporation to be kept by him for the purpose full and accurate account of all moneys and obligations received and paid or incurred by him for or on account of the Corporation, and he shall exhibit such books at all reasonable times to any Director on application at the offices of the Corporation. He shall, in general, perform all the duties incident to the office of Treasurer, subject to the control of the Board of Directors.
- 7. <u>Salaries</u>. The salaries of all officers shall be fixed by the Board of Directors and shall be reasonable in amount. If any officer is also a Director, the officer shall not receive any salary, compensation or reimbursement of any type. An officer who is also a Director may receive compensation, salary or reimbursements if such officer first resigns as a Director of the Corporation.
- 8. <u>Removal</u>. Any officer may be removed from office by the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Corporation would be served thereby.

#### ARTICLE V

#### Agents and Representatives

The Board of Directors may appoint agents and representatives of the Corporation with powers and to perform acts or duties on behalf of the Corporation as the Board of Directors may see fit, so far as may be consistent with these Bylaws, to the extent authorized by law.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### Contracts

The Board of Directors except as in these Bylaws otherwise provided, may authorize any officer or agent to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to a specific instance; and unless so authorized by the Board of Directors, no officer, agent, or employee shall have any power or authority to bind the Corporation by any contract or engagement, or to pledge its credit, or render it liable pecuniarily for any purpose or to any amount.

#### **ARTICLE VII**

#### **Advisory Committee**

The Board of Directors may appoint from its number, or from among such persons as the Board may see fit, one or more advisory committees, and at any time may appoint additional members. The members of any such committee shall serve during the pleasure of the Board of Directors. Such advisory committee shall advise with and aid the officers of the Corporation in all matters designated by the Board of Directors. Each such committee may, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, prescribe rules and regulations for the call and conduct of meetings of the committee and other matters relating to its procedure.

The members of any advisory committee shall not receive any stated salary for their services, but by resolution of the Board of Directors a fixed reasonable sum or any expenses of attendance, or both, may be allowed for attendance at each regular or special meeting of such committee; provided, however, no member of any advisory committee who is also a Director shall receive any salary, compensation or reimbursement of any type. The Board of Directors shall have power in its discretion to contract for and to pay to any member of an advisory committee, rendering unusual or exceptional services to the Corporation, special compensation appropriate to the value of such services unless such member is also a Director in which case no such special compensation shall be paid.

#### **ARTICLE VIII**

#### Voting Upon Shares of Other Corporations

Unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors, the President shall have full power and authority on behalf of the Corporation to vote either in person or by proxy at any meeting of shareholders of any corporation in which this Corporation may hold shares, and at any such meeting may possess and exercise all of the rights and powers incident to the ownership of such shares which, as the owner, this Corporation might have possessed and exercised if present. The Board of Directors may confer like powers upon any other person and may revoke any such powers as granted at its pleasure.

#### ARTICLE IX

#### **Indemnification**

- 1. <u>Definitions</u>. For purposes of this Article IX, the following definitions shall apply:
  - (a) Corporation. "Corporation" means The Waterfield Foundation, Inc.
- (b) <u>Director</u>. "Director" means an individual who is or was a director of the Corporation or an individual who, while a director of the corporation is or was serving at the Corporation's request as a director, an officer, a partner, a trustee, an employee, or an agent of another foreign or domestic corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan, or other enterprise, whether for profit or not. A director is considered to be serving an employee benefit plan at the Corporation's request if the director's duties to the Corporation also impose duties on, or otherwise involve services by, the director to the plan or to the participants in or beneficiaries of the plan. "Director" includes the estate or personal representative of a director.
  - (c) Expenses. "Expenses" include attorney fees.
- (d) <u>Liability</u>. "Liability" means the obligation to pay a judgment, settlement, penalty, fine, including an excise tax assessed with respect to an employee benefit plan, or reasonable expenses actually incurred with respect to a proceeding.
  - (e) Official Capacity. "Official Capacity" means the following:
  - (1) when used with respect to a Director, the office of director in the Corporation; and
  - (2) when used with respect to an officer, the office in the Corporation held by the officer; or when used with respect to an employee or agent, the employment or agency relationship undertaken by the employee or agent on behalf of the Corporation.
- "Official Capacity" does not include service for any other foreign or domestic corporation or any partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan, or other enterprise, whether for profit or not.
- (f) Party. "Party" includes an individual who was, is, or is threatened to be made a named defendant or respondent in a proceeding.
- (g) <u>Proceeding</u>. "Proceeding" means a threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigate and whether formal or informal.

#### 2. Basis.

- (a) <u>Director</u>. If an individual is made a party to a proceeding because the individual is or was a Director, the Corporation shall indemnify the individual against liability incurred in the proceeding if:
  - (1) the individual's conduct was in good faith; and
  - (2) the individual believed:
  - (A) in the case of conduct in the individual's official capacity with the Corporation, that the individual's conduct was in the Corporation's best interest; and
  - (B) in all other cases, that the individual's conduct was at least not opposed to the Corporation's best interests; and
  - (3) in the case of any criminal proceeding, the individual:
  - (A) had reasonable cause to believe the individual's conduct was lawful; or
  - (B) had no reasonable cause to believe the individual's conduct was unlawful.
- (b) Employee Benefit Plan. A director's conduct with respect to an employee benefit plan for a purpose the Director reasonably believed to be in the interests of the participants in and beneficiaries of the plan is conduct that satisfies the requirement of subsection (a)(2)(B).
- (c) <u>Judgment</u>; <u>Order</u>. The termination of a proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent is not determinative that a Director did not meet the standard of conduct described in this Section 2.
- 3. <u>Mandatory Indemnification of Director</u>. Unless limited by the Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall indemnify a Director who was successful, on the merits or otherwise, in the defense of a proceeding to which the Director was a party, because the Director is or was a Director of the Corporation, against reasonable expenses including, without limitation, attorney fees, actually incurred by the Director in connection with the proceeding.

#### 4. Advancement of Expenses.

- (a) The Corporation may pay for or reimburse the reasonable expenses incurred by a Director who is a party to a proceeding in advance of final disposition of the proceeding if the following occur:
  - (1) the Director furnishes the Corporation a written affirmation of the Director's good faith belief that the Director has met the standard of conduct described in Section 2 of this Article;
  - (2) the Director furnishes the Corporation a written undertaking, executed personally or on the Director's behalf, to repay an advance if it is ultimately determined that the Director did not meet the standard of conduct; and
  - (3) a determination is made that the facts then known to those making the determination would not preclude indemnification under this Article.
- (b) The undertaking required by Subsection (a)(2) must be an unlimited general obligation of the Director; but is not required to be secured and may be accepted without reference to financial ability to make repayment.
- (c) Determinations and authorizations of payments under this Section shall be made in the manner specified in Section 6 of this Article.
- 5. <u>Judicial Order</u>. Unless the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation provide otherwise, a Director of the Corporation who is a party to a proceeding may apply for indemnification to the court conducting the proceeding or to another court of competent jurisdiction. On receipt of an application, the court may, after giving any notice the court considers necessary, order indemnification in the amount the court considers proper if the court determines one of the following:
  - (a) the Director is entitled to mandatory indemnification under Section 3 of this Article, in which case the court shall also order the Corporation to pay the Director's reasonable expenses incurred to obtain court ordered indemnification; or
  - (b) the Director is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnification in view of all the relevant circumstances, whether or not the Director met the standard of conduct set forth in Section 2 of this Article.

#### 6. Determining Permissibility of Indemnification.

(a) The Corporation may not indemnify a Director under Section 2 of this Article unless authorized in the specific case after a determination has been made that

indemnification of the Director is permissible in the circumstances because the Director has met the standard of conduct set forth in Section 2 of this Article.

- (b) The determination shall be made by one of the following procedures:
- (1) By the Board of Directors by majority vote of a quorum consisting of Directors not at the time parties to the proceeding.
- (2) If a quorum cannot be obtained under subdivision (1), by a majority vote of a committee designated by the Board of Directors consisting solely of at least two (2) Directors not at the time parties to the proceeding. Directors who are parties may participate in the designation.

#### (3) By special legal counsel:

- (A) selected by the Board of Directors or a committee of the Board of Directors in the manner prescribed in subdivision (1) or (2); or
- (B) if a quorum of the Board of Directors cannot be obtained under subdivision (1) and a committee cannot be designated under subdivision (2), selected by majority vote of the full Board of Directors. Directors who are parties may participate in the selection.
- (c) Authorization of the indemnification and evaluation as to reasonableness of expenses shall be made in the same manner as the determination that indemnification is permissible. However, if the determination is made by special legal counsel, authorization of indemnification and evaluation as to the reasonableness of expenses shall be made by those entitled under Subsection (b)(3) to select counsel.
- 7. Officers, Employees, or Agents. Unless the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation provide otherwise:
  - (a) an officer of the Corporation, whether or not a Director, is entitled to indemnification under this Article and to apply for court ordered indemnification under Section 5 of this Article, in each case to the same extent as a Director.
  - (b) the Corporation may indemnify and advance expenses under this Article to an officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, whether or not a Director, to the same extent as to a Director; and
  - (c) the Corporation may indemnify and advance expenses to an officer, employee, or agent, whether or not a Director, to the extent and consistent with public policy that may be provided by Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, general or specific action of the Corporation's Board of Directors, or contract.

- 8. <u>Insurance</u>. The corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of an individual:
  - (a) who is or was a Director, an officer, an employee or agent of the Corporation; or
  - (b) who, while a Director, an officer, an employee, or an agent of the Corporation, is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a Director, an officer, a partner, a trustee, an employee, or an agent of another foreign or domestic corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan, or other enterprise against liability asserted against or incurred by the individual in that capacity or arising from the individual's status as a Director, an officer, an employee, or an agent, whether or not the Corporation would have power to indemnify the individual against the same liability under Section 2 or 3 of this Article.

#### 9. Remedy Not Exclusive of Other Rights.

- (a) The indemnification and advance for expenses provided for or authorized by this Article does not exclude other rights to indemnification and advance for expenses that a person may have under:
  - (1) the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws;
  - (2) a resolution of the Board of Directors; or
  - (3) any other adopted authorization, whenever adopted after notice, by a majority vote of all the Directors of the Corporation.
- (b) If the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, resolutions of the Board of Directors, or other duly adopted authorization of indemnification or advance for expenses limit indemnification or advance for expenses, indemnification and advance for expenses are valid only to the extent consistent with the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, or resolution of the Board of Directors, or other duly adopted authorization of indemnification or advance for expenses.
- (c) This Article does not limit the Corporation's power to pay or reimburse expenses incurred by a Director, an officer, an employee, or an agent in connection with the person's appearance as a witness in a proceeding at a time when the person has not been made a named defendant respondent to the proceeding.

#### ARTICLE X

#### Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall commence on January 1 of each year and end on December 31.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### <u>Prohibition Against Sharing in Corporate Earnings</u>

No Director, officer, or employee of or member of a committee of or person connected with the Corporation, or any other private individual shall receive at any time any of the net earnings or pecuniary profit from the operations of the Corporation, provided that this shall not prevent the payment to any such person, other than a Director, of such reasonable compensation for services rendered to or for the Corporation in effecting any of its purposes as shall be fixed by the Board of Directors; and no such person or persons, including Directors, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets upon the dissolution of the Corporation. All Directors of the Corporation shall be deemed to have expressly consented and agreed that upon such dissolution or winding up of the affairs of the Corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, the assets of the Corporation, after all debts have been satisfied, then remaining in the hands of the Board of Directors, shall be distributed in such amounts as the Board of Directors may determine or as may be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction upon application of the Board of Directors, exclusively to charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational organizations which would then qualify under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may be amended.

#### **ARTICLE XII**

#### **Investments**

The Corporation shall have the right to retain all or any part of any securities or property acquired by it in whatever manner, and to invest and reinvest any funds held by it, according to the judgment of the Board of Directors, without being restricted to the class of investments which a Director is or may be permitted by law to make or any similar restriction, provided, however, that no action shall be taken by or on behalf of the Corporation if such action is a prohibited transaction or would result in the denial of the tax exemption under Section 503 or Section 507 of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may be amended.

#### ARTICLE XIII

#### Amendments

The Board of Directors shall have the power to make, alter, amend, and repeal the Bylaws of the Corporation. The affirmative vote of all Directors shall be required so long as any Initial Director, Spouse Director, or lineal descendant of an Initial Director, is serving. When there is no longer any Initial Director, Spouse Director or lineal descendant of an Initial Director serving, then such action may be taken by majority vote of the Board. Any such action must be proposed at a regular or special meeting of the Board and adopted at a subsequent meeting, except as otherwise provided by law. In any event, a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors is required to make, alter, or repeal any portion of the Bylaws affecting (1) the number of Directors, (2) Director qualifications or (3) voting rights with respect to distributions by the Corporation. No amendment shall be permitted if it has the effect of disenfranchising a lineal descendant of an Initial Director from his or her opportunity to serve as a Director at a later time (as, for example, a lineal descendant who has not reached the age of 24 years).

#### **ARTICLE XIV**

#### Distributions to Public Charities

It is intended that distributions shall be made to organizations exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations, as they now exist or as they may be amended, primarily to organizations serving communities within the State of Indiana, and with special consideration given to organizations serving Allen County, Indiana.

#### ARTICLE XV

#### **Exempt Activities**

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Bylaws, no Director, officer, employee, or representative of this Corporation shall take any action or carry on any activity by or on behalf of the Corporation not permitted to be taken or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may be amended, or by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of such Code and Regulations as they now exist or as they may be amended.
