Augusta Locally Grown promotes growing, buying, cooking, preserving, eating and enjoying local, seasonal, sustainably-grown food. Our efforts include creating and managing farmers markets, cooking education programs, home gardening education programs, farm volunteer days, new farmer programs, nutrition education, healthy food access in low income areas, summer camps, farmers market events, and connecting farms to chefs & schools, all with a focus on local agriculture as foundational to a healthy, vibrant community.

1) THE ALG ON-LINE MARKET is the first, direct farm-to-consumer farmers market in the Augusta area, with pick-up locations in three different locations. This market is a service to local farmers in that it significantly streamlines the market process for more effective use of time and resources for farmers. In 2013, the on-line market included about 60 farmers, many of them hobby farmers who are new to farming and/or farmers markets. As such, Augusta Locally Grown also provides a service to new farmers by helping them understand and work within the county, state and federal guidelines for food safety and economic benefit of all. It runs year-round.

2) THE EVANS TOWNE FARMERS MARKET is a traditional, direct farm-to-consumer farmers market in Columbia County, GA. It is a weekly market located in the heart of the county seat. The market features extensive childrens' education programs, cooking demos, cooking contests, and grow-your-own garden education programs. It runs March-October.

3) THE VEGGIE TRUCK FARMERS MARKET is a traditional, direct farm-to-consumer market in the low income neighborhood of Harrisburg. It is the only market in Augusta that accepts EBT/SNAP and also the first Wholesome Wave EBT/SNAP doubling program in the area. It enjoys significant volunteer support from Medical College of Georgia students and local churches. Runs March-October.

4b (Code:) (Expenses \$ 9,989.82 including grants of \$ 0.00) (Revenue \$ 10,218.38)**EDUCATION PROGRAMS:** In 2013, Augusta Locally Grown conducted a variety of educational programs targetted at a wide audience. This included:

1) CULINARY ARTS YOUTH COOKING CLASSES - at Fort Gordon Army Base and at several Boys & Girls Clubs throughout Augusta.

2) TEACHING GARDENS FOR YOUTH - at St. Luke United Methodist Church and with the BenderDigger Project at River Island.

3) GROW-YOUR-OWN GARDENING WORKSHOPS FOR ADULTS - at the Evans Towne Farmers Market and at local garden clubs.

4) LOCAL FOODS EDUCATION SPEAKING ENGAGEMENTS - at local hospitals, churches, schools and youth programs.

5) LOCAL FOODS EDUCATION SPECIAL EVENTS - including the "BenderDinker," a large kayaking and local foods awareness event.

6) FARM WORKSHOPS AND TOURS - including educational farm tours, hands-on workshops, and farm-to-table dinners.

7) THE KIDS MARKET PASSPORT PROGRAM - a seasonal foods education program, similar to a library summer reading program.

8) CAMP VEGGIE TRUCK - a free, five-session, all-day camp for 50 low income children, focused on cooking and gardening.

9) MEDIA - Given Augusta's status as "America's Fifth Fattest City," our work requires lots of public education about seasonality, nutrition and the economic benefits of buying, growing and eating locally. We work closely with local media to accomplish this.

4c (Code:) (Expenses \$ 0.00 including grants of \$ 0.00) (Revenue \$ 0.00)**STUDENT INTERN PROGRAM AND VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS:** In 2013, Augusta Locally Grown voluntarism continued as the driving force behind our mission.

1) HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT INTERNSHIP PROGRAM - Our student intern program for high school students involves them in the management of our farmers markets, in hosting special events, in assisting with our educational programs, and in a wide variety of farm-based or garden-based projects of their choosing. All student interns do several volunteer days on farms to better learn about the complexity of tasks involved in sustainable farming. Those who commit to a full semester of volunteer hours (3 hours per week) receive a small stipend. Students who use the opportunity to complete their senior project volunteer without a stipend. Intern projects completed in 2013 included: a) helping to start and design our "Kids Market Passport Program" at the markets; b) organizing two successful "Crop Mob" volunteer events, one at a mushroom farm and one at an organic vegetable farm; c) working as a beekeeper; d) working on an herb farm and learning the health benefits of herbs.

2) VOLUNTEERS - In 2013, we enjoyed the help of approximately 150 volunteers, including those who help run our farmers markets, our special events, our educational programs and our fundraising event. Costs include minimal travel stipends, tshirts, & event food.
