(1) Organization

The Charles and Helen Reichert Family Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") is a tax-exempt private foundation that works to help all people lead healthy and productive lives. It focuses on giving to local communities on Long Island, N.Y.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Date of management's Review

Subsequent events were evaluated through November 12, 2014 which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

(b) Basis of Financial Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

(c) Cash

For the purpose of the statements of cash flows, cash consists of U.S. currency.

(d) Grant Expense

Grant Expense is recognized in the period the grant is approved, provided the grant is not subject to significant future conditions. Conditional grants are recognized as grant expense and as a grant payable in the period in which the grantee meets the terms of the conditions. Grants payable that are expected to be paid in future years are recorded at the present value of expected future payments. At December 31, 2013, grants payable were discounted using a 3.25 percent discount rate based on the U.S. prime rate.

(e) Contributed Services

Contributed services are recognized if the services received either create or enhance long-lived assets, or require specialized skills, are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation. For the year ended December 31, 2013, there were no contributed services.

(f) Presentation of Expenses on the Statement of Activities

The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been allocated between grants, direct charitable, and program and administrative expenses in the accompanying statements of activities based on management's estimates. Grants and direct charitable expenses are charitable costs, expended for the benefit of others. Programs and administrative expenses relate to activities that support the grant-making process as well as administrative operational costs.

(g) Tax-Exempt Status

The Foundation is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) and is classified as a private foundation under Section 509(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Foundation is subject to federal excise taxes.

(h) Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(5) Federal Excise Taxes

The Foundation is subject to federal excise taxes imposed on private Foundations at 2%, or at 1% if certain conditions are met. The excise tax is imposed on net investment income, as defined under federal law, which includes interest, dividends, and net realized gains on the sale of investments. The Foundation provided for excise taxes at the 2% excise tax rate for the year ended December 31, 2013. The current portion of excise tax expense was \$2 for the year ended December 31, 2013.
