

THE FRANK L. HINKLE REVOCABLE TRUST AGREEMENT

DATED Sapt 13, 2010

I, FRANK L. HINKLE, of 80 Fruit Hill Drive, Chillicothe, Ohio 45601, make this Trust Agreement dated as of 3, 2, 2010, with myself, FRANK L. HINKLE as the initial trustee. Unless the context otherwise requires, the term "trustee" as used herein shall mean FRANK L. HINKLE so long as I am serving alone and thereafter shall include any successor or additional trustee or trustees.

Article I. Creation of Trust, Revocation, and Amendment

- A. <u>Creation of Trust</u>. I have transferred to the trustee the assets listed on the attached Schedule. I may transfer other assets, real and/or personal to the trustee or designate the trustee as beneficiary of insurance policies or other accounts. The trustee shall hold all assets received in trust under the terms of this agreement.
- B. Revocation and Amendment. I reserve the right to revoke or amend this agreement or remove the incumbent trustee by a writing (other than my will) signed by me and delivered to the incumbent trustee during my lifetime. The duties or compensation of the trustee shall not be changed without the consent of the trustee. If this agreement has been completely revoked, all trust property held by the trustee shall be transferred and delivered to me or as I otherwise may direct in writing. If this agreement has been revoked but at my death an insurance policy or other account is payable to the trustee, the trustee shall distribute the net proceeds of such account to my estate.

Article II. My Family

I am widowed, my wife having died January 22, 2009 and I have no children.

Article III. Lifetime Provisions

- A. <u>Trust During My Lifetime</u>. During my lifetime, the trustee shall accumulate the income and retain the principal of the trust except as I may otherwise direct. If at any time, I am determined to be disabled as provided subsequently in this Article, the successor trustee may pay income and principal of the trust as the successor trustee may deem necessary to provide for my support and health, and may pay my obligations and shall have such other powers as provided for my Trustees herein.
- B. <u>Determination of Disability by Committee</u>. For purposes of this instrument, I shall be determined to be disabled if a physician who has examined or treated me determines that I am disabled and has so stated in writing. During any period in which I have been declared to be disabled, I shall be: (1) restricted from making withdrawals and giving directions under this Article, (2) removed as trustee, if I am then serving, (3) prohibited from amending or revoking this instrument, and (4) disqualified from removing trustees, appointing successor trustees, and approving trustee accounts, in which event the persons who would exercise those rights if I were then deceased shall exercise them in my place. No person shall have a duty to seek a judicial determination regarding my legal competency.

Article IV. Disposition at Death and Purpose of Trust After Death

1. At my death, my trustee shall have the authority to pay from this trust any taxes, debts and costs of administration including court costs, fiduciary fees, attorney fees or accountants fees, funeral expenses or any other valid expenses in the settlement of my estate and my Trustee is instructed to pay any beneficiary of

specific bequests in my will if my probate estate has no funds or has inadequate funds to pay such bequests.

- 2. My successor trustee shall continue to hold the remainder of my assets in trust and it shall then be the purpose of the trust to serve as a charitable and educational trust known as the Whitehead-Hinkle Trust. The Trustee each year shall pay the net income from the Trust corpus to or for worthy graduates of Teays Valley High School, Pickaway County, Ohio in need, or partly in need, of assistance in furthering their academic, vocational, or technical education, or technical skills. Said education may include graduate school education beyond the college level. The words "in need" or "partly in need" shall be liberally construed in order to meet the changes in social and economic conditions. In liberally construing these words, the Trustee may consider whether the cost of the education of a particular graduate places an undue burden on his resources, his parents' resources, or the resources of those who assist the graduate. The Trustee may also consider all of the resources available to a particular graduate. This Trust should assist the individual graduates regardless of race, color, religion, or sex, and advance education and learning from an academic, vocational, or technical standpoint.
- 3. The pool of eligible applicants shall include the current year's graduating class and those who have received a grant from this Trust and whose grant is being renewed. It shall also include anyone who has graduated within the previous six (6) years, including those who are seeking assistance for graduate

school education, including but not limited to medical, dental or law school, or any other professional school beyond college level.

- 4. In the event that Teays Valley High School ceases to serve high school students in its geographical area, the graduates of the high school or high schools thereafter educating high school students in this geographical area shall be eligible for assistance under the terms of this Trust. In the event the geographical area of the succeeding high school or high schools is larger than the geographical area of Teays Valley High School at the time it ceases to serve its geographical area, first consideration shall be given to the graduates living in the geographical area of Teays Valley High School at the time it ceases to serve the area and then second consideration for assistance shall be given to the remaining graduates of the succeeding high school or high schools.
- 5. In rendering assistance to graduates in need, or partly in need, my Trustee may pay to the graduate, or on his behalf, all or part of his living expenses at or near the school or facility where he furthers his academic, vocational, and technical education, or technical skills, and all or part of the costs of tuition, books, and the amount of laboratory fees.

Article V. Administration of Trust

1. My trustee may, in his discretion, appoint a selection committee to determine the recipients of the scholarships. The Selection Committee shall be comprised of the Superintendent of Schools of the Teays Valley School System, the Principal of Teays Valley School Systems and one member of the Teays Valley High School faculty. At the Trustee's discretion, the decision of the Selection Committee can become binding.

My Trustee may, in his discretion distribute the income of this Trust to the Teays Valley Educational Foundation to be used exclusively for the same scholarship purposes provided for herein, so long as the Teays Valley Educational Foundation remains in operation and retains its 501 (e) (3) tax status with the Internal Revenue Service.

The grants shall be for one (1) year renewable for three (3) additional consecutive years or three (3) additional years to be completed within six (6) years provided the recipient remains in good academic standing and in the opinion of the Trustee he or she continues to be "in need" or "partly in need". Verification from the educational institution of the recipient's acceptance and continued good standing shall be required.

2. My Trustee shall have the following powers:

a) To retain any investment or property that comes into the Trustee's possession regardless of the character and form of said property without incurring liability in any way for any loss of principal caused by the decline in value of any such investment or property. It is anticipated that my Trustee may desire to sell from time to time all or part of three farms and other investments which may eventually become a part of this Trust or are presently part of this trust. It is my desire that my Trustee hold the farms as operating farmland for as long a period of time as possible. This is not a restriction on the sale of said farms but an expression of my desire to keep the farmland functioning as productive farmland as long as is reasonably possible. If in the opinion of my Trustee it is burdensome or unwise to continue to maintain the farms, then in

his (or it's) sole discretion the farms or any of them may be sold on such terms and conditions as my Trustee deems appropriate.

- b) To sell at public or at private sale, to grant options to sell, to exchange or otherwise to dispose of, all or a part of any real or personal property belonging to the Trust, upon such terms and conditions, and for such considerations, as my Trustee shall determine, and to execute and deliver any necessary instruments of sale or conveyance.
- c) To invest and reinvest the trust property belonging to the corpus of the Trust in any form of property, including stocks, bonds, investment trusts, common trust funds, or other security. Investments may include obligations of individuals, corporations, trust associations, or governments, and expressly may include shares or obligations, including certificates of deposit or other deposit relationships of the Successor Trustee's own corporation, an affiliate, parent, or subsidiary thereof. Such investments, however, shall not violate the Internal Revenue statutes and regulations regarding private charitable and educational foundations. Investments may be located either within or outside of the State of Ohio.
- d) To enforce, abandon, defend, compromise, or have adjudicated by legal proceedings or arbitration, any claim or

demand which may exist for or against the trust estate, on the terms that Trustee considers best.

- e) To cause any security or other property which may at any time constitute a portion of said Trust to be issued, held or registered in the name of a nominee or in such form that title will pass by delivery.
- f) To obtain and carry such public liability and property damage insurance as the Trustee deems advisable to protect the Trust estate.
- g) To pay all taxes, assessments, costs and other expenses including fiduciary fees, attorney fees and accountant's fees of Frank L. Hinkle or arising in the administration of the Grantor's Estate and/or this Trust estate and to determine under accounting principles whether such expenses shall be charged against income or principal. After the Grantor's death, the Trustee shall have the power to interpret the provisions of this Trust liberally in such a manner and to the extent possible under the law as will allow this Trust to become a charitable and educational Trust qualifying for non taxable status under the Internal Revenue Code and regulations thereunder with regard to charitable and educational entities and Trusts.

- h) To vote by proxy or in person any stock or security included in the Trust estate upon any question coming before any meeting.
- i) To consent to, or take any other action necessary to obtain the benefit of any reorganization, consolidation, or readjustment of the financial structure, or sale of the assets of any corporation or other organization, the stock or securities of which are held in trust, to continue to hold any resulting securities or stock, and to exercise any conversion privilege or subscription right.

j)Environmental Matters.

(1) For environmental law compliance purposes, the trustee may inspect property of the trust, including interests in sole proprietorships, partnerships, or corporations, and any assets owned by any such business enterprise, for the purpose of determining compliance with any federal, state, or local law, rule, regulation, or ordinance relating to protection of the environment or health (environmental law) affecting such property. The trustee may respond to a change in, or any actual or threatened violation of, any environmental law affecting property of the trust, and the trustee may take, on behalf of the trust, any action necessary to respond to a change in, or prevent, abate, or otherwise remedy any actual or threatened violation of, any environmental law affecting property of the trust, either before or after the initiation of an enforcement action by any governmental body. The trustee may refuse to accept the property in the trust if the trustee should determine that any property to be transferred to the trust either is contaminated by any substance defined as hazardous or toxic or otherwise regulated by an environmental law (hazardous substance) or is being used or has been used for any activity directly or indirectly involving any hazardous substance which could result in liability to the trust or otherwise impair the value

of the assets held therein. The trustee may disclaim any power granted by any document, statute, or rule of law which, in the sole discretion of the trustee, may cause the trustee to incur personal liability under any environmental law. The trustee may charge the cost of any inspection, review, abatement, response, cleanup, or remedial action authorized under this instrument against the income or principal of the trust.

(2) The Trustee shall not be personally liable to any beneficiary or other party interested in the Trust or to any third parties for any claim against the Trust for diminution in value of trust property resulting from matters involving hazardous substances, including any reporting of, or response to: (a) the contamination of Trust property by hazardous substances or (b) violations of any environmental laws related to any Trust; provided, the Trustee shall not be excused from liability for its own negligence in administration of the Trust property or wrongful or willful acts.

ARTICLE VI. Miscellaneous Provisions

- 1. The Trustee shall submit each year to the Superintendent and to the Principal of the Teays Valley High School, or its successor high school or high schools serving the geographical area that Teays Valley High School served, financial statements and accounts showing the principal and income of the trust each year.
- 2 Trustee shall be entitled to receive reasonable compensation for services rendered in the administration of this trust, which compensation may be paid from the income or the principal of the trust estate, or both. For its services as the Trustee, the Trustee or his successors shall receive the compensation stipulated in the Huntington Bank regular schedule of compensation in effect and applicable at the time such compensation shall become payable, or otherwise in

reasonable sums. A copy of the current schedule of Huntington Bank Trust

Department is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit B".

3. At any time, the Trustee shall have the right to resign. If Frank L. Hinkle shall resign or become disabled or die then Robert C. Hess, Attorney at Law shall serve as the Successor Trustee. The Successor Trustee shall have the right to name a second individual Successor Trustee to serve upon the Successor Trustee's resignation, disability or death until such time as the Second Successor Trustee is no longer willing or able to serve as a Second Successor Trustee. The Successor Trustee, Robert C. Hess, shall also have the right to name a different corporate Trustee, other than the Huntington Bank, if in his judgment it is prudent to do so being guided by the purposes of this Trust and the two primary intentions of the Grantor, first the provision of funds for scholarships for the graduates of Teays Valley High School and second to maintain the farmland that constitutes a substantial portion of the corpus of this trust in the trust as farmland for as long as is reasonably possible.

If the Successor Trustee Robert C. Hess does not name a Second Individual Successor Trustee, then the Huntington Bank of Columbus, Ohio, Corporate Successor Trustee will succeed to the duties of Trustee upon the resignation, disability or death of the Successor Trustee, Robert C. Hess. Otherwise, the Huntington Bank as the Corporate Successor Trustee shall succeed to the duties of Trustee upon the resignation, disability or death of the Second Individual Successor Trustee and said bank or its successors shall serve in perpetuity as the Corporate Successor Trustee.

4. Any references herein to powers, rights or duties of my trustee shall apply in the same effect to any successor trustee of this trust.

EXPLANATION FOR REDUCTION CLAIMED FOR BLOCKAGE OR OTHER FACTORS

THE TRUST OWNS FARMLAND WITH AN APPRAISED VALUE OF \$6,111,300, BUT WITH AN AGRICULTURAL USE VALUE OF \$1,196,700 (SEE COUNTY AUDITOR REPORTS WITH CAUV VALUE). THE TRUSTEE IS DIRECTED BY THE TRUST AGREEMENT TO MAINTAIN THE LAND FOR FARM USE (SEE ATTACHED TRUST AGREEMENT, ARTICLE V, PARAGRAPH II ON PAGE 5). AS A RESULT OF THIS RESTRICTION, THE LAND IS CASH RENTED AND CAN ONLY BE SOLD AS A LAST MEASURE. THIS RESTRICTION LIMITS THE VALUE OF THIS NON-CHARITABLE USE ASSET TO THE VALUE OF IT'S RESTRICTED USAGE, WHICH IS IT'S AGRICULTURAL USE VALUE. A REDUCTION IN LAND VALUE OF \$4,914,600 IS BEING TAKEN WHICH IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE APPRAISED LAND VALUE OF \$6,111,300 AND THE CERTIFIED AGRICULTURAL USE VALUE (CAUV) OF \$1,196,700.
