Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2013 and 2012

Note 1: Nature of Operations and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Operations

Olathe Medical Center, Inc ("OMCI") operates an acute care hospital in Olathe, Kansas OMCI primarily earns revenues by providing inpatient, outpatient, emergency care, hospice and home health care services to residents in Johnson County and Miami County. Kansas and the surrounding area OMCI is controlled by Olathe Health System. Inc ("OHSI"), its sole member

OMCI is the sole member of Miami County Medical Center, Inc ("MCMCI"), Olathe Medical Services. Inc ("OMSI") and Olathe Medical Center Charitable Foundation ("OMCCF") All of the entities are collectively referred to as the "System" in the accompanying consolidated financial statements

MCMCI is an acute care hospital located in Paola, Kansas, and earns revenue by providing inpatient, outpatient and emergency care services to patients in Miami and Linn County, Kansas, and the surrounding area

OMSI provides physician services in various clinic locations within its service area

OMCCF was organized for the purpose of providing support services to advance or support the provision of health care services for the System's not-for-profit entities and the communities in which they serve

Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements include the accounts of OMCI and its controlled subsidiaries. Olathe Medical Services, Inc., Miami County Medical Center, Inc. and Olathe Medical Center Charitable Foundation. All significant intercompany accounts and transactions have been eliminated in consolidation.

Investment in and Advances to Affiliates

OMCI has an investment in Cedar Lake Village, which operates an assisted living, senior housing and skilled nursing facility located on OMCI's campus This investment is reported using the equity method of accounting

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2013 and 2012

Excess of Revenues Over Expenses

The consolidated statements of operations include excess of revenues over expenses. Changes in unrestricted net assets which are excluded from excess of revenues over expenses, consistent with industry practice, include unrealized gains and losses on investments other than trading securities, the change in fair value of highly effective interest rate swap agreements, permanent transfers to and from affiliates for other than goods and services and contributions of long-lived assets to be used in providing health care services (including assets acquired using contributions which, by donor restriction, were to be used for the purpose of acquiring such assets)

Temporarily and Permanently Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use by the System has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose. Permanently restricted net assets have been restricted by donors to be maintained by the System in perpetuity.

Temporarily restricted net assets are available primarily for specific program and department activities and the purchase of equipment and buildings at December 31, 2013 and 2012

During 2013 and 2012, net assets were released from donor restrictions by satisfying the restricted purposes in the amounts of \$1,589,716 and \$55,798, respectively

Net Patient Service Revenue

The System has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments to the System at amounts different from established rates. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payers and others for services rendered and includes estimated retroactive revenue adjustments. Retroactive adjustments are considered in the recognition of revenue on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and such estimated amounts are revised in future periods, as adjustments become known. Laws and regulations governing Medicare and Medicaid are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. Compliance with such laws and regulations are subject to government review and interpretation as well as significant regulatory action, including fines, penalties and exclusion from the Medicare and Medicaid programs. As a result, there is a possibility that the recorded estimates may change by a material amount in the near term

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The System considers all liquid investments, other than those limited as to use, with original maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents. At December 31, 2013 and 2012, cash equivalents consisted primarily of money market accounts

Patient Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are reduced by an allowance for doubtful accounts. In evaluating the collectability of accounts receivable, the System analyzes its history and identifies trends for each of its major payer sources of revenue to estimate the appropriate allowance for doubtful accounts and provision for bad debts. Management regularly reviews data about these major payer sources of revenue in evaluating the sufficiency of the allowance for doubtful accounts.

For receivables associated with services provided to patients who have third-party coverage, the System analyzes contractually due amounts and provides an allowance for doubtful accounts and a provision for bad debts, if necessary (for example, for expected uncollectible deductibles and copayments on accounts for which the third-party payer has not yet paid, or for payers who are known to be having financial difficulties that make the realization of amounts due unlikely)

For receivables associated with self-pay patients (which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances due for which third-party coverage exists for part of the bill), the System records a significant provision for bad debts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible. The difference between the standard rates (or the discounted rates if negotiated or provided by policy) and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts.

The System's allowance for doubtful accounts for self-pay patients increased from 70% of self-pay accounts receivable at December 31, 2012, to 81% of self-pay accounts receivable at December 31, 2013. In addition, the System's write-offs decreased approximately \$2,364,000 from approximately \$16,640,000 for the year ended December 31, 2012, to approximately \$14,276,000 for the year ended December 31, 2013. The decrease was the result of a change in account processing where more self-pay accounts being written off to a contractual allowance than bad debt write-offs.

Assets Limited as to Use

Assets limited as to use include (1) assets held by bond trustees. (2) assets restricted by donors, and (3) assets set aside by the Board of Trustees for future capital improvements over which the Board retains control and may at its discretion subsequently use for other purposes. Amounts required to meet current liabilities of the System are included in current assets.

Investments and Investment Return

Investments in equity securities having a readily determinable fair value and all common trust funds are carried at fair value in the consolidated balance sheets. Donated investments are reported at fair value at the date of receipt, which is then treated at cost. Investment income or loss (including realized gains and losses on investments, interest and dividends) is included in excess of revenues over expenses, unless the income or loss is restricted by donor or law. The investment in Cedar Lake Village is reported on the equity method of accounting

Supplies

The System states supply inventories at average cost for perpetual inventories and last purchase price for non-perpetual inventories

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful life of each asset Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the respective estimated useful lives

The estimated useful lives for each major depreciable classification of property and equipment are as follows

Buildings and improvements 10-40 years Equipment 3-15 years

Donations of property and equipment are reported at fair market value as an increase in unrestricted net assets unless use of the assets is restricted by the donor. Monetary gifts that must be used to acquire property and equipment are reported as restricted support. The expiration of such restrictions is reported as an increase in unrestricted net assets when the donated asset is placed in service.

Estimated Self-Insurance Costs

The provision for estimated self-insured employee health, dental and workers' compensation claims includes estimates of the ultimate costs for both reported claims and claims incurred but not reported, including related administrative costs

Estimated self-insurance costs also include amounts for estimates related to medical malpractice and general liability claims which are covered by insurance

Financial Assistance

The System provides care without charge or at amounts less than its established rates to patients meeting certain criteria under its financial assistance policy. Because the System does not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as financial assistance, these amounts are not reported as net patient service revenue. The System's direct and indirect costs for services furnished under its financial assistance policy were developed utilizing a cost accounting system and aggregated approximately \$4,107,000 and \$4,198,000 in 2013 and 2012, respectively

Income Tax Status

Olathe Medical Center, Inc., Olathe Medical Services, Inc., Miami County Medical Center, Inc. and Olathe Medical Center Charitable Foundation are not-for-profit organizations within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and are exempt from taxes on their business income

The System is no longer subject to U S federal, state and local income tax examinations by tax authorities for years before 2009

Insurance and Litigation

Medical malpractice insurance is purchased under claims-made policies. Under these policies, only claims made and reported to the insurer that occurred subsequent to July 1, 1976 are covered during the policy term. Under Kansas law, the Kansas Insurance Department provides excess liability insurance through the Kansas Healthcare Stabilization Fund. Excess liability insurance coverage is also purchased under a claims-made policy. Under this policy, only claims made and reported to the insurer that occurred subsequent to January 2, 1985 are covered during the policy term.

The System accrues the expense of its share of asserted and unasserted claims occurring during the year by estimating the probable ultimate cost of any such claim. Such estimates are based on the System's own claims experience. The System's management does not expect any claims to exceed the insurance coverage limits. However, because of the risk involved in providing health care services, it is possible an event has occurred that will be the basis of a future material claim. In the normal course of business, the System is, from time to time, subject to allegations that may or do result in litigation. Some of these allegations are in areas not covered by the System's commercial insurance. The System evaluates such allegations by conducting investigations to determine the validity of each potential claim. Based upon the advice of counsel, management records an estimate of the amount of ultimate expected loss, if any, for each of these matters. Events could occur that would cause the estimate of ultimate loss to differ materially in the near term

The System recognizes an accrual for claim liabilities based on estimated ultimate losses and costs associated with settling claims and a receivable to reflect the estimated insurance recoveries, if any

Based upon the System's claims experience, an accrual had been made for the System's portion of medical malpractice and general liability costs related to its deductible under its malpractice and general liability insurance policies, amounting to approximately \$337,000 and \$545,000 as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively. These amounts are included in estimated self-insurance costs on the accompanying consolidated balance sheets. It is reasonably possible that this estimate could change materially in the near term.

The System recorded in other current assets on the consolidated balance sheets approximately \$195,000 and \$365,000 as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively, of professional liability reserves insurance coverage receivables

The System has available a letter of credit totaling \$2,246,000, which expires in 2014, subject to renewal The purpose of the letter is for the possible funding of self-insured workers compensation claims

Contributions

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets are accrued at estimated fair value at the date each promise is received. Unconditional gifts expected to be collected within one year are reported at their net realizable value. Unconditional gifts expected to be collected in future years are initially reported at fair value determined using the discounted present value of estimated future cash flows technique. The gifts are reported as either temporarily or permanently restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reported as net assets released from restriction. Gifts having donor stipulations which are satisfied in the period the gift is received are reported as unrestricted revenue and net assets. Receipt of contributions that are conditional are reported as liabilities until the condition is eliminated or the contributed assets are returned to the donor.

Deferred Financing Costs

Deferred financing costs represent bond issuance costs incurred in connection with the Health Facilities Revenue Bonds. Costs associated with the debt outstanding for each year are being amortized over the term of the respective bond issue using the bonds outstanding method.

Bond Premiums (Discount)

The bond premiums and discount arose from the issuance of the Health Facilities Revenue Bonds. Series 2008B. Series 2008C. Series 2010A. Series 2012A and Series 2012B and, when combined, result in a net bond premium. This unamortized net bond premium is recorded as an adjustment of long-term debt in the accompanying consolidated financial statements. The bond premiums and discount are being amortized over the life of the related bonds using the bonds outstanding method.

Variable Rate Bonds and Related Agreements

OMCI has issued daily variable rate demand bonds as part of the 2008C bond issue and the 2010B bond issue (*see Note 6*) As part of the indenture agreement. OMCI entered into a remarketing agreement to remarket the bonds on a daily basis. OMCI also entered into a Letter of Credit and Reimbursement Agreement (LOC) with a bank to purchase bonds that are tendered but not remarketed. Under the LOC, the Letter of Credit is a direct obligation of the bank to pay to the Trustee until such time as the bonds are remarketed. The current LOC expires October 29, 2015.

Electronic Health Records Incentive Program

The Electronic Health Records Incentive Program, enacted as part of the *American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009*, provides for one-time incentive payments under both the Medicare and Medicaid programs to eligible hospitals that demonstrate meaningful use of certified electronic health records technology (EHR) Payments under the Medicare program are generally made for up to four years based on a statutory formula. Payments under the Medicaid program are generally made for up to four years based upon a statutory formula, as determined by the state, which is

approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services Payment under both programs are contingent on the hospital continuing to meet escalating meaningful use criteria and any other specific requirements that are applicable for the reporting period. The final amount for any payment year is determined based upon an audit by the fiscal intermediary. Events could occur that would cause the final amounts to differ materially from the initial payments under the program

The System recognizes revenue ratably over the reporting period starting at the point when management is reasonably assured it will meet all of the meaningful use objectives and any other specific grant requirements applicable for the reporting period

The System has completed requirements under the Medicare and Medicaid programs, and has recorded revenues in the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012 of approximately \$4,844,000 and \$1,400,000, respectively, which are included in other revenue within operating revenues in the consolidated statements of operations

Note 2: Net Patient Service Revenue

The System recognizes patient service revenue associated with services provided to patients who have third-party payer coverage on the basis of contractual rates for the services rendered. For uninsured patients that do not qualify for charity care, the System recognizes revenue on the net basis of its standard rates less an uninsured discount for services provided to individuals who do not qualify for the charity care program. On the basis of historical experience, a significant portion of the System's uninsured patients will be unable or unwilling to pay for the services provided. Thus, the System records a significant provision for uncollectible accounts related to uninsured patients in the period the services are provided. This provision for uncollectible accounts is presented on the consolidated statements of operations as a component of net patient service revenue.

The System has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments to the System at amounts different from its established rates These payment arrangements include

Medicare. Inpatient acute care services and substantially all outpatient services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic and other factors. The Hospital is reimbursed for certain services at tentative rates with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the System and audits thereof by the Medicare Administrative Contractor.

Medicaid. Inpatient and outpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed at prospectively determined rates

Other Third-Party Payers. The System has entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers, health maintenance organizations and preferred provider organizations. The basis for payment under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates per discharge, discounts from established charges, case rates, fee schedules and prospectively determined daily rates.

Uninsured. The System provides discounts from charges for patients who do not have health insurance coverage and also provides assistance to those who qualify for the System's financial assistance program (charity care)

Certain investments in marketable equity securities are reported in the consolidated financial statements at an amount less than their historical cost. The System has adopted a long-term investment strategy which could result in volatile swings in fair value over time.

The System has elected to measure common trust funds at fair value which has been estimated using the net asset value per share of the investments. The common trust funds include investments in several common trust funds that invest in equity securities of developed and emerging markets other than the United States. The common trust funds have redemption dates twice a month with a redemption notice period of two days. These investments have no unfunded commitments.

In accordance with the terms of the bond indentures, as amended, authorizing Health Facilities Revenue and Refunding Bonds, OMCI and MCMCI are to establish and maintain certain funds as follows

Debt Service Fund – This account contains the required lease payments for interest and principal payments on bonds

Debt Service Reserve Fund – This account is to be funded only in the event that certain financial ratio requirements are not met. No funding was required at December 31, 2013 and 2012

Project Fund – This account includes the proceeds of bond issues to be used for qualified capital expenditures

At December 31, 2013 and 2012, Cedar Lake Village, Inc (CLVI), an equity investee, had outstanding loan balances to OMCI of \$3,428,094 and \$3,608,958, respectively, at an interest rate of 7%, subordinated with a bank as part of a letter-of-credit arrangement. Semiannual interest payments and annual principal payments are required with the final payment on the loan due in December 2026.
