We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of Davis Health System, Inc, subsidiary and affiliates, which comprise the consolidated balance sheets as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, and the related consolidated statements of operations, changes in net assets, and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these consolidated financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of consolidated financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these consolidated financial statements based on our audits. The Hospital recorded the net amount of \$376,168 as a change in pension funded status within Other Changes in Net Assets for the year ended December 31, 2012. In our opinion, netting the expense portion and the Other Change in Net Assets is not in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects of not recoding the effect of the pension settlement within operating income during 2012, the consolidated financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Davis Health System, Inc., subsidiary and affiliates as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, and the results of their operations and their cash flows for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America

NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Nature of Operations and Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of operations and subsequent event: The Davis Health System, Inc (the System) is a nonstock, nonprofit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of West Virginia. The System is the parent organization of other health care organizations or companies through membership status, Board appointment or stock ownership. A brief description of the activities of each entity follows

Davis Health System, Inc – provides financial support and management assistance to Davis Memorial Hospital, Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc , Health Facilities, Inc , Davis Health System Foundation, Inc and Central WV Medcorp, Inc It also holds 100% of the stock of Providers Re SPC - Segregated Portfolio No 5, a captive insurance company

Davis Memorial Hospital – provides acute inpatient, outpatient and emergency services to residents of Elkins, West Virginia and surrounding communities Effective January 1, 2014, the hospital's name was changed to Davis Medical Center

Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc — provides acute medical, outpatient, and long-term care services to the residents of Philippi, West Virginia and the surrounding area — Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc is a critical access hospital

Health Facilities, Inc — operates a retail pharmacy, leases office space and engages in durable medical equipment sales and leasing. Wholly-owned by Davis Memorial Hospital

Central WV Medcorp, Inc – provides physician medical services to the residents of Elkins, West Virginia and surrounding areas

Provider's Re SPC - Segregated Portfolio No 5 - formed in March, 2004, domiciled in the Cayman Islands A wholly-owned captive insurance entity which has underwritten a claims-made insurance policy to fully cover reported medical malpractice claims of the System (Note 9)

Davis Health System Foundation, Inc – promotes the maintenance, development, and improvement of the health system and its affiliated and subsidiary entities that qualify as exempt organizations

A summary of significant accounting policies is as follows:

Basis of consolidation: The accompanying consolidated financial statements include the accounts of the System, its wholly owned subsidiary and its affiliates. All significant intercompany transactions and balances have been eliminated in consolidation.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Significant estimates used in preparing these financial statements include those assumed in determining the allowance for uncollectible accounts, estimated third-party payor settlements and the estimated costs for self insured medical malpractice claims. It is at least reasonably possible that the significant estimates used will change within the next year.

Basis of presentation: Net assets and revenues, gains and losses are classified based on donor imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets of the System and changes therein are classified and reported as follows

Unrestricted - Resources over which the Board of Directors has discretionary control Designated amounts represent those net assets which the System has set aside for a particular purpose

NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Temporarily restricted - Resources subject to donor imposed restrictions which will be satisfied by actions of the System or passage of time. The System had temporarily restricted net assets of \$1,089,802 and \$1,045,964 at December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively

Permanently restricted - Resources subject to donor imposed restrictions that they be maintained permanently by the System or for which perpetual trusts have been established. The System had permanently restricted net assets of \$0 at December 31, 2013 and 2012.

Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met within the same year as received are reported as unrestricted contributions in the accompanying financial statements

Gifts of cash and other assets are reported at fair value and are presented as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of operations as net assets released from restrictions

Cash and cash equivalents: For purposes of presenting the statement of cash flows, the System considers all cash accounts, which are not subject to withdrawal restrictions, penalties, or other arrangements under trust and endowment agreements and all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents excluding amounts classified as assets limited as to use by Board designation and other arrangements under trust agreements

Patient accounts receivable: Patient accounts receivable are carried at the original charge less an estimate made for doubtful or uncollectible accounts. In evaluating the collectability of accounts receivable, the System analyzes its past history and identifies trends for each of its major payor sources of revenue to estimate the appropriate allowance for doubtful accounts and provision for bad debts. The allowance is based upon a review of the outstanding balances aged by financial class Management uses collection percentages based upon historical collection experience to determine collectability Management also reviews troubled, aged accounts to determine collection potential. For receivables associated with self-pay patients (which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances due for which third-party coverage exists for part of the bill), the System records a significant provision for bad debts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible. The difference between the standard rates (or the discounted rates ıf negotiated) and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts. Recoveries of accounts previously written off are recorded as a reduction to the provision for bad debts when received. Interest is not charged on patient accounts receivable

The System's allowance for doubtful accounts for self-pay patients remained at 76 percent of self-pay accounts receivable at December 31, 2013 and 2012 In addition, the System's self-pay write offs increased approximately \$9.7 million from approximately \$4,447,000 for the fiscal year 2012 to approximately \$14,176,000 for fiscal year 2013. The increase was the result of negative trends experienced in the collection of amounts from self-pay patients in fiscal year 2013. The System does not maintain a material allowance for doubtful accounts from third-party payors, nor did it have significant write offs from third-party payors.

Supplies inventory: Supplies inventory is stated at latest invoice cost, which approximates lower of cost (first-in, first-out method) or market

NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Assets limited as to use: Assets limited as to use primarily include assets held by trustees under indenture agreements and designated assets set aside by the Board of Directors for future capital improvements, employee benefits, and self-insurance malpractice claims. The Board retains control over the assets and may at its discretion subsequently use for other purposes. Amounts required to meet current liabilities have been reclassified as current assets in the balance sheets at December 31, 2013 and 2012.

Investments: Investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are measured at fair value in the balance sheets. Investment income or loss (including realized gains and losses on investments, interest and dividends) is included in the excess (deficiency) of revenues over expenses unless the income or loss is restricted by donor or law. Unrealized gains and losses on investments are excluded from the excess (deficiency) of revenues over expenses unless the investments are trading securities.

Property and equipment: Property and equipment acquisitions are recorded at cost. Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful lives of each class of depreciable assets and is computed by the straight-line method. Equipment under capital lease obligations is amortized on the straight-line method over the shorter period of the lease term or the estimated useful life of the equipment. Such amortization is included in depreciation and amortization in the financial statements. Expenditures for repairs and maintenance are charged to expense as incurred. Interest costs incurred on borrowed funds during the period of construction of capital assets are capitalized as a component of the cost of acquiring those assets.

Gifts of long-lived assets such as land, buildings, and equipment are reported at fair value and are presented as unrestricted support, and are excluded from the excess of revenues over expenses, unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions that specify how the assets are to be used and gifts of cash or other assets that must be used to acquire long-lived assets are reported as restricted support. Absent explicit donor stipulations about how long those long-lived assets must be maintained, the System reports expirations of donor restrictions when the donated or acquired long-lived assets are placed in service.

Pledges receivable: The Foundation has pledges receivable approximating \$161,000 and \$236,000 as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively. As of December 31, 2013 and 2012, payments of approximately \$72,000 and \$76,000, respectively, are expected to be received within one year and are included in current assets, and \$89,000 and \$160,000 within one to five years and are included in other long-term assets, respectively

Deferred bond issuance costs: Deferred bond issuance costs are amortized over the remaining life of the bonds using the straight-line method which is not materially different from the effective interest method

Excess (deficiency) of revenues over expenses: The statement of operations includes excess (deficiency) of revenues over expenses. Changes in unrestricted net assets which are excluded from excess (deficiency) of revenues over expenses, consistent with industry practice, included unrealized gains and losses on investments other than trading securities, permanent transfers of assets to and from affiliates for other than goods and services, and contributions of long-lived assets (including assets acquired using contributions which by donor restriction were to be used for the purposes of acquiring such assets)

Net patient service revenue: The System has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the System at amounts different than its established rates. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payors and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors. Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined.

NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Revenue from the Medicare and Medicaid programs accounted for approximately 35 percent and 11 percent and 35 percent and 11 percent, respectively, of the System's net patient service revenue for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term

Charity care: The healthcare affiliates provide care to patients, who meet certain criteria under their charity care policy, without charge or at amounts less than their established rates. Because the healthcare affiliates do not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care, they are not reported as net patient service revenue in the System's financial statements.

Estimated malpractice liability: The liability for estimated medical malpractice claims includes estimates of the ultimate costs for reported claims and claims incurred but not reported

Income taxes: The System, except for Central West Virginia Medcorp, Inc , and Health Facilities, Inc , is exempt from Federal and state income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and similar state statutes relating to not-for-profit organizations. Central West Virginia Medcorp, Inc , and Health Facilities, Inc are subject to Federal and state income taxes.

The System is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits or any tax examinations for years prior to the fiscal year ended December 31, 2010

Reclassifications: Certain 2012 amounts have been reclassified to conform to the 2013 presentation These reclasses had no impact on previously reported net assets

Subsequent events: The System has evaluated subsequent events through April 9, 2014, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued

New or Recent Accounting Pronouncements: In April 2013, the FASB issued ASU 2013-06 Not-for-Profit Entities (Topic 958) Services Received from Personnel of an Affiliate The amendments in this Update apply to not-for-profit entities, including not-for-profit, business-oriented health care entities that receive services from personnel of an affiliate that directly benefit the recipient not-for-profit entity and for which the affiliate does not charge the recipient not-for-profit entity. The amendments in this Update require a recipient not-for-profit entity to recognize all services received from personnel of an affiliate that directly benefit the recipient not-for-profit entity. Those services should be measured at the cost recognized by the affiliate for the personnel providing those services. However, if measuring a service received from personnel of an affiliate at cost will significantly overstate or understate the value of the service received, the recipient not-for-profit entity may elect to recognize that service received at either (1) the cost recognized by the affiliate for the personnel providing that service or (2) the fair value of that service A recipient not-for-profit entity within the scope of Topic 954, Health Care Entities, that is required to provide a performance indicator (analogous to income from continuing operations of a for-profit entity) should report as an equity transfer the increase in net assets associated with services received from personnel of an affiliate that directly benefit the recipient not-for-profit entity and for which the affiliate does not charge the recipient not-for-profit entity, regardless of whether those services are received from personnel of a not-for-profit affiliate or any other affiliate. Early adoption is permitted. Management of the System does not believe that this ASU will materially affect the financial reporting

Note 2. Cash Concentrations

Financial instruments that potentially subject the System to significant concentrations of credit risk consist principally of cash. The System maintains cash with financial institutions which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The System believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash.

Revenue Bonds 1999A and 1999B:

Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc. has an agreement with the City of Philippi whereby the City issued, on May 1, 1999, City of Philippi Health System Revenue Bonds (Davis Health System-Broaddus Hospital Project) Series 1999A and 1999B (paid off). The purpose of this bond issue was to provide funds to construct and equip a replacement facility for Broaddus Hospital, retire existing indebtedness, and pay certain costs of insurance and related cost.

The bonds are secured by a pledge of the gross revenues of Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc , a pledge of the gross revenues of Davis Health System, Inc , whose pledge is on parity with Davis Health System Series 1998 bonds

Under the terms of the Trust Indenture, Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc. is required to maintain certain deposits with a trustee. Such deposits are included with assets limited as to use in the financial statements. The agreement also contains provisions restricting the Hospital's operations, which include, among others, limitations on incurring additional debt. The agreement requires that Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc. satisfy certain measures of financial performance and to establish depository accounts to accumulate monies to pay bond principal and interest payments and for reserve purposes as long as the notes are outstanding.

NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The 1998 bond indentures for Davis Memorial Hospital and Broaddus Hospital grants an interest in the gross revenues of the Davis Memorial Hospital and Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc. as security for payment of the bonds and requires the Hospitals to maintain specific debt coverage ratios. Other provisions of the indenture or other bank debt require monthly principal and interest payments to the trustee, the maintenance of certain bond fund deposit accounts, and specified insurance coverage, and requires that the Hospitals charge sufficient rates for services to meet the debt service requirements. The System was in compliance with the covenants and requirements of these debt obligations as of December 31, 2013.

The State of West Virginia Disproportionate Share Hospital State Plan provides for a settlement process among participating hospitals. The Bureau for Medicaid services has settled the DSH amounts through 2010 with no cash settlements. The laws and regulations governing the DSH settlement process are complex, involving statistical data from all participating hospitals, and subject to interpretation Accordingly, management of the Hospital is not able to estimate additional settlements, if any, that could arise upon completion of the DSH settlement process for 2011 through 2013

Medicaid Provider Tax Disallowance

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has recently directed some local intermediaries to disallow the cost of provider taxes claimed in cost reports. Hospitals claimed the tax assessment as an allowable cost under the applicable regulations and the Provider Reimbursement Manual (PRM) sections. Hospitals have relied upon the fact that CMS approved applicable State Plan Amendments relating to the Provider Tax Assessments. The System has one hospital critical access hospital that paid the provider tax and included it as an allowable expense. The disallowance may be applied retroactively for several years and the impact could be material. A provision of approximately \$600,000 and \$300,000 has been recorded by the System for the potential liability at December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively. Management and various associations representing affected hospitals plan to appeal the disallowance. The ultimate outcome of the issue is unknown at this time.

Note 7. Net Patient Service Revenue and Cost of Charity Care

The System, through the Hospitals, has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the System at amounts different from its established rates. Payment arrangements include prospectively determined rates per discharge, reimbursed costs, discounted charges, and per diem payments. A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payors follows.

• Medicare - Davis Memorial Hospital

Inpatient acute care services and outpatient services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic and other factors, including regional wage variations. The Hospital is reimbursed for cost reimbursable items at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and audits thereof by the Medicare fiscal intermediary. The Hospital's classification of patients under the Medicare program and the appropriateness of their admission are subject to an independent review by a peer review organization.

Medicare – Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc.

Inpatient acute care services and most outpatient services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid based on a cost reimbursement methodology. Other outpatient services are paid based on fee schedules. The Hospital is reimbursed for cost reimbursable items at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and review thereof by the Medicare fiscal intermediary. The appropriateness of the admission of Medicare program beneficiaries is subject to an independent review by a peer review organization.

Medicaid – Davis Memorial Hospital

Inpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed based on prospectively determined rates per discharge. Medicaid outpatient services are reimbursed based upon the lesser of the Hospital's charge or predetermined fee schedule amounts.

Medicaid – Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc.

Inpatient and most outpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed under a cost reimbursement methodology. The Hospital is reimbursed at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and review thereof by the Medicaid fiscal intermediary. Other outpatient services are reimbursed based upon the lesser of the Hospital's charge or predetermined fee schedule amounts.

NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Commercial Insurance Carriers

The Hospitals also entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers. The basis for payment to the Hospitals under these agreements includes various discounts from established charges.

West Virginia Health Care Authority

The Legislature of the State of West Virginia has created the Health Care Authority to regulate a hospital's gross patient revenue based on limitation orders compiled from rate schedules and budgets submitted by the hospital on a periodic basis. If a hospital's charges are held to be excessive or unreasonable, the Health Care Authority may require rebates to consumers or adjustments to subsequent year revenue limits. Broaddus Hospital Association is exempt from rate regulation as a Critical Access Hospital.

Charity Care

The Hospitals provide charity care to patients who are financially unable to pay for the health care services they receive The Hospitals' policy is not to pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care if the patient has an adjusted income equal to or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Income levels. A sliding scale discount is applied for patients up to 300% of the Federal Poverty Guideline Accordingly, the Hospitals do not report these amounts in the net revenues or in the allowance for doubtful accounts. The estimated costs of providing charity services are based on a calculation which applies a ratio of costs to charges to the gross uncompensated charges associated with providing care to charity patients. The ratio of cost to charges is calculated based on the Hospitals' total expenses divided by gross patient service revenue. The costs of caring for charity care patient for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012 were approximately \$3,584,000 and \$2,977,000, respectively

The Hospitals maintain records to identify and monitor the level of charity care it provides. These records include the amount of charges forgone for services and supplies furnished under its charity care policy, the estimated cost of those services and supplies, and equivalent service statistics. Supplemental Medicaid Funding: In 2012, the Federal Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services approved a State of West Virginia Medicaid Plan Amendment The Plan Amendment provides for supplemental Medicaid payments to qualifying hospitals These supplemental payments are made for medical services provided to Medicaid recipients. The program is limited to state fiscal years 2012 through 2014

NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The supplemental payment methodology implements a provider tax as an expansion of the health care provider tax. The new revenues produced will be used as the state contribution toward drawing down additional federal matching dollars for Medicaid to enhance current hospital payment rates under an Upper Payment Limit (UPL) program. In addition to the current tax of 2.5% currently imposed on providers of inpatient and outpatient hospital services, there is an additional tax of eighty-eight one hundredths of one percent (0.88%) on the gross receipts. The tax decreased to 0.45% for state fiscal year 2014. The tax provisions expire on July 1, 2014 and are being implemented retroactively to July 1, 2011. Amounts charged to expense for the additional tax imposed amounted to approximately \$297,000 and \$612,000 for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively. This additional expense is included within supplies and other expense in the accompanying statements of operations. The System recorded revenue totaling approximately \$2,521,000 and \$3,905,000 for the supplemental Medicaid payments for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively, which is recorded as an increase to net patient service revenue. Of this amount, approximately \$586,000 and \$650,000, respectively, had not been received as of December 31, 2013 and 2012 and therefore is included within prepaid expenses and other current assets in the accompanying balance sheets.

The System recognizes patient service revenue associated with services provided to patients who have third-party payor coverage on the basis of contractual rates for the services rendered. For uninsured patients that do not qualify for charity care, the System recognizes revenue on the basis of its standard rates for services provided (or on the basis of discounted rates, if negotiated or provided by policy). On the basis of historical experience, a significant portion of the System's uninsured patients will be unable or unwilling to pay for the services provided. Thus the System records a significant provision for bad debts related to uninsured patients in the period the services are provided. Patient service revenue, net of contractual allowances and discounts (but before the provision for bad debts), recognized during the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012 from these major payor sources, is as follows.

The Hospitals qualify as disproportionate share hospitals for Medicaid As a result of qualifying for this designation, the Hospitals are entitled to supplemental Medicaid payments Included in net patient service revenues for 2013 and 2012, are Medicaid disproportionate share revenues of approximately \$949,000 and \$1,210,000, respectively In addition, the Hospitals received Medicaid Enhanced payments of approximately \$1.4 million in 2013 and 2012. These amounts are recorded as a reduction of contractual adjustments

As disclosed in Note 6 to the accompanying financial statements, the System has recorded assets and liabilities for cost report settlement amounts with Medicare and Medicaid The 2013 and 2012 net patient service revenue increased (decreased) by approximately \$201,000 and \$(151,000), respectively, as a result of settlements at amounts different than originally estimated

Note 8. Pension and Postretirement Plans

Defined Benefit Plan

Davis Memorial Hospital had a defined benefit pension plan covering substantially all its employees. The plan benefits were based on years of credited service and the employees' compensation level. The Hospital's policy was to make contributions to the plan in amounts, as actuarially determined, sufficient to fund benefits.

Effective September 30, 2006, the Hospital froze the plan, and then created a 401(k) Plan effective January 1, 2007 There were employer pension contributions of \$65,678 and \$2,587,533 and benefits paid of \$0 and \$58,708 for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively Post-retirement employer contributions were \$145,281 and \$179,832 for the years ending December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively

The Board of Trustees of Davis Memorial Hospital adopted a resolution to terminate the defined benefit pension plan. The pension plan was terminated in 2012. The plan paid numerous lump sum payments resulting in a combined total of \$103,756 and \$12,528,148 for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively, which represents a settlement of the plan.

Pension Plan - Broaddus Hospital Association, Inc.

The Hospital has a noncontributory defined contribution plan that, effective January 1, 2009, was merged into the Davis Memorial Hospital 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and the assets were subsequently transferred to that Plan

Effective January 1, 2009, the Hospital instituted a 401(k) profit sharing pension plan for eligible employees whereby the Hospital matches employee contributions and can make additional contributions. The amount of the employee's contributions that are matched and the amount of additional contributions are based upon a percentage of employee contributions and eligible salaries, respectively, and are determined annually. Employer expense totaled approximately \$36,000 and \$87,000 for 2013 and 2012, respectively, of which approximately \$11,000 and \$90,000 was accrued and included in accrued retirement plan contribution in the balance sheet as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively

Note 9. Medical Malpractice Insurance, Contingency and Commitment

The System has professional and general liability insurance from Providers Re SPC, Providers Segregated Portfolio No 5 (the Captive), which is a captive insurance company domiciled in the Cayman Islands wholly owned by the System, to fully cover medical malpractice claims. Consequently, the System is self-insured for medical malpractice claims. The ultimate costs of malpractice claims, which include costs associated with litigating or settling claims, were accrued when the incidents that give rise to the claims occurred. Estimated losses from asserted and unasserted claims have been accrued based on the best estimates of the ultimate costs of the claims and the relationship of past reported incidents to eventual claim payments. All relevant information, including industry experience, actuarial calculations, historical experience, existing asserted claims, and reported incidents have been used in estimating the expected amount of claims to be paid. The accrual included an estimate of the losses that would result from unreported incidents, which were probable of having occurred before the end of the reporting period. The coverage limits are \$2,000,000 for each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. The System also has reinsurance with \$3,000,000 limits.

Accrued malpractice costs were \$4,158,903 and \$4,284,066 at December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively Total provision for self-insured medical malpractice claims charged to expense for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, was approximately \$727,000 and \$158,000, respectively

Accrued unpaid claims and expenses that were expected to be paid during the normal operating cycle (generally within one year of the date of the financial statements) were classified as current liabilities as of December 31, 2013 and 2012. All other accrued unpaid claims and expenses were classified as noncurrent liabilities.

The System maintained a medical malpractice reserve fund, which was included in assets limited as to use At December 31, 2013 and 2012, the fund had a balance of approximately \$6,006,000 and \$6,224,300, respectively

Note 10. Advertising Expense

The System's policy is to expense advertising costs as they are incurred. Total advertising expense for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, was approximately \$489,000 and \$652,000, respectively

Note 13. Health Insurance Plan

The System is partially self-insured with respect to employee health insurance claims and their health insurance coverage. Under this program, gross charges for employees receiving services at the affiliated hospitals are expensed and recorded as an employee benefit expense. To protect itself against extraordinary claims of its employees, the System has purchased stop-loss insurance. Davis Memorial Hospital's cost is limited to \$125,000 per covered person life. Broaddus Hospital's cost is limited to \$40,000 per covered person per policy period, with a maximum lifetime benefit of \$1,000,000 per covered person. Amounts payable under this plan at December 31, 2013 and 2012, for actual claims and claims incurred but not reported was approximately \$1,055,000 and \$855,000, respectively

Total expense for health insurance for Davis Health System, Inc. and affiliates for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012 was approximately \$7,585,000 and \$5,920,000, respectively

HRA Plan

Davis Memorial Hospital has a health reimbursement arrangement (HRA), whereby funds are set aside to reimburse employees for qualified medical expenses. Employer contributions to this plan totaled approximately \$743,000 and \$719,000 for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively

Note 14. Lease Arrangements and Rental Expense

The System affiliates lease real property and equipment under cancelable operating lease agreements expiring at various dates through December 2013. Total rental expense for all operating leases was approximately \$791,00 and \$706,000 for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively

Note 15. Health Care Legislation and Regulation

The health care industry is subject to numerous laws and regulations of Federal, state and local governments. Government activity has increased with respect to investigations and allegations concerning possible violations of various statutes and regulations by health care providers. Compliance with such laws and regulations can be subject to future government review and interpretation as well as regulatory actions unknown or unasserted at this time. Management believes that the healthcare affiliates are in compliance with fraud and abuse as well as other applicable government laws and regulations. If these affiliates are found in violation of these laws, the affiliates could be subject to substantial monetary fines, civil and criminal penalties and exclusion from participation in the Medicare and Medicaid programs.

Note 16. Derivative Financial Instruments, Unearned Revenue and Contingency

Davis Memorial Hospital has a "forward" contract with First Union National Bank (Union) Under the terms of the contracts, in exchange for up-front fees from Union totaling \$923,000, the Hospital and Trustee on the 1998 Bonds, agreed to use funds held by the Trustee under the Bond Indenture to purchase eligible securities, generally zero coupon U S Government Securities with the difference between maturity value and market value at the time of purchase being paid to Union. In essence total interest to be recognized on each security over its life was to be paid to Union on the date of purchase. In effect, through this derivative financial instrument, the Hospital received prepayment of the discounted present value of the expected future interest income on the Trustee funds and was obligated to pay Union all earnings on the funds to be deposited, under the sinking fund requirements of the outstanding bond offering, into these Trust accounts

The Hospital's goals in this transaction were to obtain ready cash, and to protect itself against potentially unfavorable fluctuations in interest rates. The forward contract entails market risk for the Hospital since the Hospital will be unable to benefit from the potential future favorable interest rate fluctuations. In addition, in the event scheduled deposits are not made into the Trustee funds, or in the case of early extinguishment of the Bonds, the Hospital would be required to reimburse Union the economic equivalent of Union's lost rights under the contracts.

The up-front fees from Union were deferred and are being amortized on a straight-line basis over the life of the 1998 Bonds. The amortization is reported as interest income on the statement of operations. The unamortized amount at December 31, 2013 and 2012 of \$339,644 and \$373,059, respectively, is shown on the balance sheet as deferred income. Payments to Union are equivalent to earnings on the Bond Trust accounts and the net impact on earnings of the payments under the forward contract and the earnings on the bond fund are \$0.

Note 17. Fair Value of Financial Instruments

The Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures Topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value and expands disclosures about fair value measurements

NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

This Topic defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. This Topic also establishes a fair value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The standard describes three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value.

- Level 1: Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities traded in active exchange markets such as the New York Stock Exchange
- Level 2: Observable inputs other than Level 1 including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in less active markets or other observable inputs that can be corroborated by observable market data. Level 2 also includes derivatives contracts whose value is determined using a pricing model with observable market inputs or can be derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data.
- Level 3: Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity for financial instruments whose value is determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation, also includes observable inputs for nonbinding single dealer quotes not corroborated by observable market data

Fair Value Measurements

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets and liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying balance sheets, as well as the general classification of such assets and liabilities pursuant to the valuation hierarchy

Investments and Assets Limited as to Use: Investment securities and assets limited as to use are recorded at fair value on a recurring basis. Fair value measurement is based upon quoted prices, if available. If quoted prices are not available, fair values are measured using independent pricing models or other model-based valuation techniques such as the present value of future cash flows, adjusted for the security's credit rating.

Note 18. Electronic Health Records (EHR)

The Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act ("HITECH Act") was enacted into law on February 17, 2009 as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). The HITECH Act includes provisions designed to increase the use of EHR by both physicians and hospitals. The Hospitals intend to comply with the EHR meaningful use requirements of the HITECH Act in time to qualify for the maximum available Medicare and Medicaid incentive payments. The Hospitals' compliance will result in significant costs including professional services focused on successfully designing and implementing EHR solutions along with costs associated with the hardware and software components of the project. The System has incurred and will continue to incur both capital expenditures and operating expenses in connection with the implementation of it EHR initiatives. The timing of these expenditures does not necessarily correlate with the timing of receipt of the incentive payments and the recognition of revenues. The System currently estimates that at a minimum, total costs incurred to comply will be recovered through improved reimbursement amounts over the projected lifecycle of this initiative. During the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, the System recognized approximately \$2,259,000 and \$0, respectively, in revenues related to Medicare and Medicaid EHR incentive payments.

Note 19. Contract Settlement

On December 13, 2013, the System entered into an amendment and settlement agreement with a health care service company in the amount of \$2 1 million. The settlement is included in Other Income (Losses) in the accompanying Consolidated Statement of Operations for the year ended December 31, 2013.
