The Winter Park Health Foundation (WPHF) is a private foundation dedicated to improving the health of youth, older adults and the community-at-large in Winter Park, Maitland and Eatonville.

The WPHF funded 190 grants to 92 not-for-profit organizations totaling \$2,915,658 paid in 2013 to support programs making a positive difference in the lives of residents in Winter Park and surrounding communities.

On its mission to build the healthiest community in the U.S., the WPHF Board of Trustees directs attention and resources toward three focus areas: Children & Youth, Community Health and Older Adults.

In addition, WPHF supports, via grant funding, various projects and programs offered by Winter Park Memorial Hospital/Florida Hospital, the University of Central Florida Medical School and community programs to help address basic needs among local residents — including hunger and access to health care — related to challenging economic conditions. Mini-grants are also awarded to local not-for-profit organizations through WPHF Trustee and Staff Discretionary Funds.

While programs and activities vary among the three focus areas described below, all share the overarching guiding principles of encouraging healthy lifestyles, improving the system of care, and reducing health disparities.

#### Children & Youth

**Overall Goal**: To create the healthiest children and youth in the U.S. More specifically, its objectives are to optimize physical, mental and social health and well-being, and to promote environments that support health and well-being.

Priority areas for intervention include Early Childhood Development, Healthy Children & Adolescents, Making Children's Health a Priority, and Barriers to Good Health.

A keynote program for this focus area is the Coordinated Youth Initiative (CYI), a collection of free, school-based health and wellness services financially supported by WPHF in partnership with Orange County Public Schools to serve students in 12 public schools in Winter Park, Maitland and Eatonville. All of the programs within this initiative, founded and supported by WPHF, are designed to eliminate barriers to learning by addressing the health and wellness needs of students and their families.

Based on the successful coordinated school health model promoted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the CYI programs include CHILL (Community Help & Intervention in Life's Lessons) which provides mental health professionals based in each of 12 Winter Park Consortium schools (Winter Park High School and its elementary and middle feeder schools) to provide free, comprehensive individual and group counseling to students in need. Other programs include the School Nursing Initiative, whereby WPHF offers supplemental funding to schools to support the placement of full-time licensed nurses in school clinics, and it funds two School-Based Health Centers staffed with Nurse Practitioners who are able to provide students in need with more advanced care.

WPHF also supports the formation and activities of Healthy School Teams at each school. These teams develop and implement activities at each school to encourage healthier living among students, their families and school staff.

Building on the health and wellness work already underway in local elementary, middle and high schools, WPHF grant support enables Nemours to bring its nationally recognized Healthy Habits for Life program to local child care centers and preschools. The sites selected have many students that go on to attend the Winter Park Consortium schools. Through this program, early childhood staff members receive training on how to teach children and parents about eating right and being physically active in hopes of establishing healthy habits for life at an early age. In addition, Nemours staff members work with child care center directors to develop and implement wellness policies for their facilities and programs.

Other Children & Youth programs and activities have included grant support for programs at the Eatonville Boys & Girls Club, playground safety initiatives at two low-income day nurseries in Winter Park, supplementary food packs for needy children, outreach services so the families of students are able to apply for and obtain state and federal benefits for which they are eligible, summer home visits to new students/families by pre-kindergarten and kindergarten teachers in Winter Park Consortium elementary schools, professional development for school nurses in the Coordinated Youth Initiative, and a collaborative effort with the WPHF Older Adults focus area to develop and initiate a brain health awareness campaign geared toward all ages.

#### **Community Health**

**Overall Goal**: To enhance the health for people of all ages through active support and thoughtful creation, implementation and evaluation of policies, practices and programs that focus on community health improvement.

Its objectives are to foster health-promoting policies and partnerships, to foster healthy places and to foster healthy behaviors.

Using the CDC model of ACHIEVE (Action Communities for Health, Innovation & EnVironmental ChangE), WPHF—through its Community Health Work Group—continues to support the work of the three healthy community teams developed for Winter Park, Maitland and Eatonville. The teams are focused on making their communities healthier places to live, learn, work and play – where the healthy choice is an easy choice – through the promotion and development of programs, policies and practices that focus on increasing physical activity, improving nutrition, and eliminating tobacco use.

All are focused on policy change and are an important part of a two-year-old initiative co-founded by WPHF: Healthy Central Florida.

Projects and programs financially supported under the Community Health focus area include faith community initiatives--such as faith community nurses, a community-wide diabetes outreach program in Eatonville, and Our Whole Community (OWC), Inc., a faith-based organization that brings communities together to share resources resulting in programs that educate individuals in their pursuit of optimal health.

Other significant work in this focus area includes support of a major pedestrian safety campaign, and continuing support of Work Well Winter Park, which is a worksite wellness initiative coordinated through the local chamber of commerce.

This focus area also continues to support the development of a major initiative to further the use of electronic medical records among various health care providers. In addition, it supported the permanent placement of Health News Florida, a free, not-for-profit online news service, at WUSF, insuring its continued ability to inform the public on state and local health policy and finance issues as they develop.

Also, it continued its support, along with the Jessie Ball duPont Fund in Jacksonville, to commission the Georgetown Health Policy Institute to produce educational briefs on critical health issues in Florida. And it supported efforts to provide education and assistance to uninsured residents in Eatonville, Maitland and Winter Park to enable them to enroll in coverage through the Affordable Care Act.

#### **Older Adults**

**Overall Goal**: To create the healthiest elder-friendly community in the U.S. More specifically, the objectives for the Older Adults focus area are to optimize physical, mental and social health and wellbeing, and to promote environments that support health and well-being. Its priority areas for intervention are to promote healthy behaviors; to encourage lifelong learning, meaningful service and employment; to enhance and strengthen underlying support systems; and to make aging issues a community wide priority.

Expanding on the earlier work that was part of the Boost Your Brain initiative, a two-year grant-provided in collaboration with the WPHF Children & Youth focus area--continues to support the launch of an innovative initiative, Brain Up!, designed to educate Central Floridians that it is never too early or late to protect the health of their brains. It is focused on spreading the word about the importance of being brain healthy and getting people of all ages committed to and actively involved in brain healthy practices. It includes distribution of educational materials and offering seminars to diverse audiences of all ages. In addition, a Brain Up! website was created where the public can go to learn more about brain health, find book reviews, brain healthy activities and the latest brain research.

Work continues on developing the Village Living Model—a membership organization that enables older adults to safely age in place with WPHF staff members actively participating in grass roots development efforts.

Faith communities in Winter Park, Maitland and Eatonville have successfully launched a wide range of programs designed to promote whole person health that have impacted the lives of young and old. The programs were made possible by grants made jointly by the WPHF Older Adults and Community Health focus areas. They were designed to support the development of health programs in faith community settings and to inspire the faith communities to include health in their mission and work.

To further promote healthy behaviors, grants approved through this focus area continue to support a Falls Prevention Pilot Program.

Grants through this focus area also supported the development of the Center for Lifelong Learning at Rollins College aimed at stimulating lifelong learning among adults age 50 and up.

#### Healthy Central Florida

Incorporated into the work of all three WPHF focus areas is Healthy Central Florida (HCF). HCF is a community-based, multi-year initiative collaboration founded and launched by WPHF and Florida Hospital in 2011 in hopes of transforming the community into the healthiest in the nation. It is designed to encourage residents to get active, eat healthier and be happy/connected; and to create large and small-scale change and a culture of well-being.

HCF relies on a two-pronged strategy. Through social marketing efforts, HCF raises awareness of health issues, educates residents on how to get healthier, and encourages behavior change. Policy change plays an important role, because it can help create lasting change which can lead to new healthy social norms (i.e.; not smoking, taking the stairs, walking). Leadership teams in Winter Park, Maitland and Eatonville—mentioned earlier in the Community Health focus area—lead the way for HCF efforts through the development and implementation of community action priorities and plans.

#### **WPHF Community Facilities**

WPHF developed and owns several facilities that address health and wellness needs of community members. Each of these community assets offers a unique variety of services. WPHF has formed important collaborations with the nonprofit organizations listed to operate its facilities.

The Peggy and Philip B. Crosby Wellness Center and the Center for Health and Wellness (Wellness Centers) are facilities dedicated to helping individuals of all ages achieve optimal wellness. The Wellness Centers focus on providing fitness programs, equipment, facilities and personal consultation to assist participants in setting and achieving their individual wellness goals. The Wellness Centers offer a wide range of health and fitness programs, such as weight management services, nutrition counseling, and other health education activities. The Wellness Centers are available to the general public and financial assistance is available to subsidize membership and program fees. On December 1, 1999, WPHF and the Central Florida YMCA (CFYMCA) formed a collaboration in which the CFYMCA operates the Wellness Centers while WPHF continues to own both facilities. This collaboration combines the talents of both organizations to better serve the health and wellness needs of residents in Central Florida. The value of the donated facility/in-kind rent for these two facilities is approximately \$1,077,000 per year.

The Elinor and T. William Miller, Jr. Center for Older Adult Services (Miller Center) provides community service programs which address the special needs of older citizens from Winter Park and surrounding communities. On January 1, 2002, the Winter Park Health Foundation and Easter Seals Florida (ESF) formed a collaboration in which ESF operates the Miller Center and its adult day care and personal emergency response services while WPHF continues to own the facility. Financial assistance for Miller Center services is available to families in need. The value of the donated facility/in-kind rent for this facility is approximately \$136,000 per year.
