The issues on which FCAN focuses its advocacy change from year to year with input from our members, FCAN's Board of Directors ultimately determines our issue agenda. 2013 issue priorities included

Educating the public on health care issues, particularly the need for a national program of affordable, available, accessible health care for everyone. FCAN organizers held town hall meetings, met with community leaders, phoned members, all urging people to get involved in the issue.

We are advocating consumer friendly telecommunications policy at the state and federal levels. Special attention is paid to privacy issues and net neutrality.

Organizing homeowners for insurance reforms to protect policyholders through available and affordable insurance, including working to create an independent Florida Insurance Consumer Advocate and forming an Insurance Consumer Coalition.

Program work includes public education supporting safe drinking water, food safety, pesticide reform, and other national environmental issues.

Working to preserve the civil justice system and the rights of citizens to seek redress in the courts before a jury of their peers when damaged.

Defending Florida's public campaign finance laws for statewide candidates and working for passage of the Florida Clean Elections act, a campaign finance reform bill.

Organizing citizen groups to protect Cypress Creek Preserve, a vital headwater of the Hillsborough River system. As part of the Cypress Creek Campaign, FCAN is working to create a regional transportation system that will take the place of roads like the one proposed through the Cypress Creek Preserve.

FCAN is advocating for cleanup of Florida's dirty power plants including the Crystal River power plants and for use of clean renewable energy resources and greater energy efficiency. FCAN opposes construction of new nuclear plants and especially opposed advanced billing of consumers for those plants, since we believe they may never be needed or built. FCAN monitors activities at the Federal Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the Florida Public Service Commission as well as participating in discussions with allies and the Legislature.

Carrying out Civic Engagement activities targeting low income, minority voters, and other underrepresented groups. These activities included voter registration, GOTV, and organizer training.

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES:

The Florida Consumer Action Network, Inc. (FCAN) is a grassroots organization which empowers citizens to influence public policy by organizing and educating in those areas where consumer voices are underrepresented. FCAN values a positive, inclusive approach to issues. FCAN will help build networks of local grassroots organizations and individuals united statewide in a structure based on coordinated autonomy on issues and empowerment of local groups to undertake local issues: to develop low and moderate income leadership strategies; to influence public policy and to present a challenge to social, political, economic and environmental injustice throughout the state. Decisions are made openly through consensus where possible.

ARTICLE I - NAME, LOCATION, PURPOSE AND FUNCTIONS

Section 1. Name

The name of the nonprofit, non-partisan corporation shall be Florida Consumer Action Network, Inc., hereafter referred to as FCAN.

Section 2. Location

The principal administrative office of the corporation shall be in the state of Florida. The corporation may have such other offices, either within or without the state of Florida, as the Board may determine from time to time.

Section 3. Purposes

A. The purposes of FCAN shall be to:

- (1) Educate our members, the public and public officials on important issues
- (2) Advocate public policy which improves quality of life for all citizens and protects the environment.
- (3) Ensure that legislation and regulation results in a fair economic return to the consumer.
- (4) Encourage citizen participation in the public policy arena, and organize with the poor, distressed and indigent and educate citizens and communities to individual rights and responsibilities.
- (5) Raise adequate funds to maintain a professional staff and meet our organizational goals.
- (6) Help build progressive networks, coalitions and trust among local, statewide, and national citizen's organizations, grass roots organizations, and individuals united statewide. Develop low and moderate income leadership to influence public policy and challenge social, political, economic and environmental injustice.

B. These purposes shall be unrestricted by considerations of age, color, creed, disabilities, lifestyle, race, religion or sex.

Section 4. Functions

A. The functions of FCAN shall be to:

- (1) Develop a broad-based membership through field and phone canvass activities and other outreach methods.
- (2) Work with the media to publicize and gain support for our views on relevant issues.
- (3) Publish a periodic newsletter and other program material.
- (4) Build and encourage coalitions on specific issues.
- (5) Support and elect public officials who are sensitive to FCAN's issues and goals.
- (6) Use staff to monitor and analyze the impact of policy issues.
- (7) Lobby on behalf of our membership at the city, county, state and federal levels.
- (8) Actively participate in public hearings, forums, and task forces.
- (9) Represent membership before administrative proceedings involving FCAN issues.
- (10) Notify members of opportunities to participate in relevant activities.
- (11) Motivate members to communicate their views on issues through petition, personal letters, phone calls, and meeting attendance.
- (12) Conduct forums which encourage an open exchange of ideas.
- (13) Organize and conduct fund raising events.
- (14) Obtain grants and contributions from organizations that support our issues and contract our services to advance our program purposes.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP, DUES, MEMBERSHIP YEAR

Section 1. Membership composition and qualifications

FCAN shall have no formal members as defined under the Business Organizations Code of the State of Florida.

Supporting membership shall be open to any individual or organization that embraces the principles, purposes and policies of FCAN as stated in these By-laws, provided dues are not delinquent. The Board of Directors may offer supporting membership to organizations that embrace the principles, purposes, and policies of FCAN.

Section 2. Dues

- A. Any individual or organization desiring supporting membership shall pay membership dues.
- B. Payment of dues may be excused by the FCAN Board of Directors.
- C. A current list of members in good standing shall be maintained.

Section 3. Disciplinary Action

The Board of Directors shall have the authority to expel from membership an individual or organization whose conduct jeopardizes or is detrimental to FCAN or which works against the purpose, programs or policies of FCAN.

Section 4. Organizational membership obligations

- A. Organizational members of FCAN shall have complete autonomy of action.
- B. No organizational member shall engage in programs or take actions on behalf of, or in the name of FCAN, unless authorized to do so by the FCAN Board of Directors.

Section 5. Petitionary members

- A. Petitionary members shall be afforded the same rights and privileges as individual supporting members.
- B. Petitionary members shall not receive the FCAN newsletter except when the newsletter is used as notification to FCAN membership to cast a ballot (i.e. annual membership meeting).
- C. Petitionary members may be canvassed by phone, polled and or lobbied during the course of a campaign.

Section 6. Term of Supporting Membership

Supporting membership shall be counted for up to twenty-four consecutive months from the time of initial dues payment.

ARTICLE III. REMOVED

ARTICLE IV - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. General

The Board of Directors of FCAN shall consist of a maximum of twenty-five (25) members. This shall be the chief governing body of the organization. It shall have the responsibility for managing the affairs of the organization, implementing policy decisions of the organization, initiating and implementing changes in organizational structure.

Section 2. Composition

- A. Members of the Board, including designated organization members' representatives, shall be selected for two-year terms. In selecting Board members, every care shall be taken to reflect the demographic diversity of Florida's citizens including race, gender and organizational mission as well as to promote active representation for persons with low and moderate level incomes.

- B. Approved organization members are entitled to one position on the Board of Directors, subject to the approval of the Progressive Future Network.
- C. The Executive Director will be an ex-officio member of the Board, with the rights and privileges of Board members selected by other means.

Section 3. Duties of the Board of Directors

The State Board of Directors shall:

- A. establish major administrative policies governing FCAN and provide for the transaction of general business:
- B. provide for the expenditure, investment and oversight of FCAN funds:
- C. provide for the adoption and administration of a budget:
- D. provide for the operation and maintenance of a centralized office:
- E. employ an Executive Director, define duties and fix compensation:
- F. report to the membership the business transacted by the Board:
- G. establish and dissolve committees in accordance with these by-laws:
- H. propose and adopt amendments to these By-laws and the Articles of Incorporation:
- I. propose and adopt resolutions implementing policy positions taken at the annual meeting:
- J. approve and assist in fund raising projects of the Board:
- K. When matters come before the Board or any committee from which a Board member may personally benefit, that person or persons shall disclose that fact and shall recuse themselves.
- L. conduct the business of the organization including, but not limited to
 - 1. hiring and firing of the Executive Director
 - 2. directing the financial affairs of the organization
 - 3. planning and implementing actions on behalf of FCAN
- N. The President shall concur in the hiring and firing of all FCAN personnel who report directly to the Executive Director. If the President does not concur, a majority vote of the Board of Directors must approve the hiring or firing.

Section 4. Quorum and majority

A quorum for the Board shall be considered present when over 33 1/3% of elected Board members are in attendance, not including proxies.

Section 5. Proxy Votes

- A. Board members are expected to attend the Board meetings. Once per calendar year only, when a Board member is unable to attend a meeting, the Board member may give another Board member or alternate representative of an organizational member a written proxy vote. The Board will make every effort to maximize attendance, such as facilitating telephone participation, providing travel assistance in cases of hardship, and rotating meeting venues.

- B. A proxy shall include the date of the meeting it is issued for and be witnessed by at least one individual other than the bearer.
- C. No Board member shall cast more than one proxy vote.
- D. All proxies must be submitted to the Chair prior to the meeting being called to order, or when asked by the Chair.

Section 6. Attendance

- A. Any Board member failing to attend at least one board meeting per year may be removed from the board by a three fourth (3/4) vote of the Executive Committee.
- B. Any Executive Committee member failing to attend any two (2) regularly scheduled Executive Committee members' meetings within a calendar year may be removed by a three fourth (3/4) vote of the Board of Directors.

Section 7. Pre-Nomination Process

- A. The standing Governance Committee shall be appointed by the President.
- B. Suggestions for general board membership shall be submitted to the Governance Committee.
- C. Requests for names of potential board members shall be published in the Newsletter.
- D. All individuals proposed by Governance Committee must be members in good standing and sign a statement consenting to serve if nominated and appointed.

Section 8. Nominating Process

- A. Elections to nominate general Board membership shall be held at the first meeting after the pre-nomination and receipt of consent-to-serve-if-selected statements are received.
- B. Elections to nominate Officers and Board members shall be held at the annual meeting in odd numbered years.
- C. A plurality of votes cast by those entitled to vote, and voting, shall constitute a nomination.
- D. Elections for nomination shall be by secret ballot. Ballots shall be pre-printed with the slate of proposed nominees whenever possible.
- E. Members may vote for persons other than those whose names appear on the ballot by writing in the names of qualified candidates who have consented to serve if nominated and appointed.

Section 9. Appointment Process

Notwithstanding any other provision of the Bylaws, the Board may be expanded, vacancies on the Board may be filled, and Officers and Board Members may be removed from office with or without cause by a majority vote of the Board of Directors of the Progressive Future Network, Inc., with the exception that to remove a Board Member from the office of President in the midst of a term would require a 2/3 vote of the Board of Directors of the Progressive Future Network, Inc. The Progressive Future Network, Inc. shall consider all individuals nominated to serve as Officers or Board Members of FCAN under the provisions of the Bylaws but shall have full discretion to appoint any person, without limitation, to the Board, and may, without limitation, remove any Officer or Board Member of FCAN from office with or without any action on the part of the Members, Officers, or Board of FCAN, with the requirement that to remove a Board Member from the office of President

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

Section 1. General

The officers shall be:

- D. Treasurer

Section 2. Qualifications

- A. A nominee for officer shall be a member in good standing of the State Board of Directors.
- B. Officers are elected by members of the Board of Directors at the annual membership meeting to be held in odd-numbered years. The Progressive Future Network, Inc. may, at its discretion and by a majority vote of its Board of Directors, remove any Officer except President from office, and may appoint any member in good standing of the Board of Directors to hold any Officer position. - C. Officers are accountable to the general FCAN membership.

Section 3. Duties

- A. The Officers shall perform the duties prescribed by these by-laws, and as directed by the State Board of Directors.
- B. Officers, upon expiration of their terms of office, shall surrender to the new Officers all properties in their possession belonging to their respective offices.
- C. The President shall:
 - 1. Chair the State Board of Directors;
 - 2. Chair the Executive Committee;
 - 3. make formal statements on behalf of FCAN;
 - 4. serve as ex-officio member of all committees;
 - 5. be responsible for nominating the chairs of committees with the advice and consent of the Board.
 - 6. designate regional chairperson(s) in regions which do not have an elected representative, as may be required;
 - 7. assist the Executive Director.
- D. The Vice-president shall:
 - 1. assume the duties of the President in the absence of the President;

2. perform other duties as may be assigned by the President or the Executive Committee:
review policies and By-laws as needed

- E. The Secretary shall:
 - 1. be the official custodian of all corporate books and records, providing that copies of all books and records shall be maintained at the principal office of the organization;
 - 2. record the minutes of the Board of Directors and Executive Committee meetings;
 - 3. prepare and distribute copies to the Board members prior to the next scheduled meeting.
- F. The Treasurer shall:
 - 1. act as the chief financial officer for corporate purposes;
 - 2. act as custodian for all financial books and records of the organization;
 - 3. report the financial standing of FCAN to the Board of Directors at each meeting
 - 4. serve as Chair of the Finance Committee:
 - 1.

Section 4. Vacancies in Office

- A. A vacancy in the office of President shall be filled by the Vice President for the remainder of the unexpired term, unless by a majority vote of its Board of Directors the Progressive Future Network, Inc. appoints another member in good standing of the Board of Directors to fill the office.
- B. Vacancies in all other offices shall be filled by the President subject to the approval of the Board at its next meeting.

ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. Composition

There shall be an Executive Committee of the Board of Directors, comprised of the officers described in Article V, and the Executive Director, Ex-Officio.

Section 2. Duties

- A. The Executive Committee shall be empowered to act in place of the Board of Directors between Board meetings.
- B. The Executive Committee shall report its actions at the next scheduled Board meeting.
- C. Emergency meetings of the Board may be called by the Executive Committee, or the Board may be polled by mail, electronic mail or phone for ratification of Executive Committee action.

Section 2. Duties (Continued)

- D. The Executive Committee shall designate Assistant Treasurers as needed; their duties include reviewing expenses of the organization as well as countersigning checks for payment.

Section 3. Meetings

Meetings may be called by the President or the Executive Director provided five (5) days notice of such meeting is given whenever possible, but at least forty eight (48) hour notice shall be given.

Section 4. Quorum

A quorum for the Executive Committee shall be present when 50% of the Executive Committee are in attendance including electronically.

Section 5. Emergency Phone polling

Phone polling of Executive Committee is not intended to replace Board/Committee meetings and shall be allowed with the following provisions:

- A. Executive Committee members shall be duly noticed and adequately informed of any pending decision prior to a telephone poll.
- B. Three (3) attempts shall be made to contact an Executive Committee member.
- C. Notification of the poll results shall be sent within seven (7) days to all members of the Executive Committee. A list of those members contacted shall also be included.
- D. Ratification of any action by phone poll will be obtained at the next meeting of the Board.

ARTICLE VII -- MEETINGS AND VOTING RIGHTS

Section 1. Meetings

- A. The Board of Directors shall meet at least once every six (6) months at a place and time determined at the previous meeting, or rescheduled after polling a substantial number of members.
- B. The first Board meeting of each year shall be designated the Annual Membership Meeting and shall be held for the purposes of:
 1. reviewing the activities of the organization;
 2. establishing priorities for the upcoming year;
 3. nominating officers (odd numbered years only);
 4. transacting business.
- C. Notification of meetings of the Board of Directors shall be sent by mail to all Board members and organizations affiliated in accordance with these By - laws.
 1. notice shall include the location, date and time of the meeting and a proposed agenda;
 2. shall be sent to be received no less than ten (10) days before the meeting date.
 3. Notification of the location, date and time of the Annual Membership Meeting shall be issued at least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting.

Section 2. Voting Rights

- A. Only Board members may vote on business decisions brought before the Board.

- B. Any member in good standing may vote for Officers of the Board and Board membership nominations.

Any member in good standing with Florida Consumer Action Network, Inc. may attend any meeting of the Board of Directors and shall be entitled to participate in discussions in an orderly manner, except that the Board of Directors may by a majority vote choose to conduct closed meetings as it deems appropriate.
- D. Any member of an organizational member shall be considered an FCAN member for participation in discussions, but only one designated representative may vote on business decisions before the Board membership.
- E. Voting strength at the Annual Membership Meeting shall be in accordance with the following:
 - 1. Individual members (excludes Article 7, Section 2 D non-designated members) 1 vote
 - 2. Designated Organizational members 10 votes
 - 3. Board members 10 votes

Section 3. Conduct of Business

- A. Action shall be limited to the items of the mailed agenda as amended and approved by a majority vote of the voting members present.

Discussion of each matter contained in the agenda shall be open, and to the extent possible, not subject to formal rules of procedure, provided that the Chair may regulate discussion by recognizing persons to speak, and by limiting the time allowed for discussion when necessary for the efficient management of business.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES

Section 1. General

There shall be four (4) committees of continuous standing:

- A. Personnel
- B. Political
- C. Finance
- D. Governance

Section 2. Composition

The President shall appoint the chairs of standing committees with ratification by the Board, except that the Treasurer shall chair the Finance/Budget committee. Members may be recruited by the President, the Board, or the Committee Chair and confirmed with the consent of two of those three.

Section 3. Duties

Standing committees will meet no less than annually to review the operating policies of their committees. The chair will report to the Board any recommendations for change of policy and other matters that may come to the committee for action.

Section 4. Ad Hoc Committees

Additional committees may be established by the President, Executive Committee, or Board of Directors. Committee members and the chairs shall be appointed in accordance with Section 2. above.

A. Financial Oversight Committee

At the end of each calendar year the President will appoint, from among Board members not on the Financial Committee, a Financial Oversight Committee to examine that year's financial statements and transactions for accuracy and completeness and report its findings to the board. This committee will convene in January and complete its work and report to the Board before the end of the first quarter.

ARTICLE IX – AMENDMENTS


These By-laws may be altered, amended, or repealed and replaced with new By-laws by majority vote of the Board provided proposed changes have been delivered in writing to all Board members at least thirty (30) days in advance of the meeting at which action is to be taken. Any member of the Board of Directors may propose a change in the By-laws. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Articles IV and V, relating to board composition and director and officer election, appointment and removal, and this Article IX relating to amendment, may not be amended or repealed except by unanimous vote of all the Directors and with the consent of the Progressive Future Network, Inc.

ARTICLE XI. REMOVED.

ARTICLE XII – DISSOLUTION

In the event that this organization should be dissolved for any reason, any remaining assets shall be liquidated and distributed in accordance with governmental regulations. No funds can inure to the benefit of any individual member
