Silicone rubber MCP implants do not increase joint strength and motion, and are likely to fracture during high demand use. The worldwide need for MCP joint replacements is estimated to be approximately 260,000 implants annually. The major need for MCP joint replacement is with patients capable of high functional demand (strength and motion). The pyrolytic carbon Ascension MCP was designed to meet the needs of high functional demand and is being used successfully to treat these patients. However, patients in the late stages of rheumatoid arthritis often have such severe joint destruction that use of a total joint replacement such as the pyrolytic carbon Ascension MCP is not possible. Late stage rheumatoid arthritic patients do not have the potential for stable, functional joint and are best treated using silicone rubber implants to relieve pain and improve appearance. Salk faculty member, Clodagh O'Shea, Ph.D. has developed and enhanced novel research into p53, a tumor suppressing protein that is inactivated by mutations in almost every form of human cancer, and the use of DNA viruses both as tools for tumor target discovery as well as agents for lytic cancer therapies. This grant is for the purpose of protecting the pre-existing intellectual property that may be convenient and useful to commercially develop O'Shea's synthetic viral therapy project. The patents that will be internationally secured through this program related investment may be convenient and useful for research and to develop and bring to market the engineering of synthetic viruses that overcome the long-standing challenges associated with viral therapies, including selective replication in tumor cells that have mutations in p53 or Rb, immunogenecity and broad tumor-specific targeting; additionally, these patents may serve as a foundation to develop technologically innovative genetically encoded chemical adaptors and antibiotics to induce viral retargeting to multiple tumor cell receptors through camelid antibody fusion proteins.
