BYLAWS

Trustees

- 1.a. The number of trustees serving at any time shall be five (5). In the event that a vacancy occurs, whether by death, incapacity, resignation, removal or completion of a term of office, such vacancy shall be filled by a majority vote of the remaining qualified and acting trustees. No trustee may succeed himself or herself upon the completion of a term of office.
- b. No trustee elected after January 1, 1984 shall serve for a term longer than ten (10) years.
- c. The terms of the trustees shall be staggered so that one new trustee is elected every even numbered year.
- d. During the first quarter of each year, each trustee shall file with the Foundation a statement in sufficient detail to disclose all prohibited transactions as defined in Section 4941 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, which may have been engaged in during the preceding year by each trustee and persons or entities related to such trustee as described in Section 4946 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- e. Any former trustee who has served as a trustee for a period of not less than ten (10) years may request the designation as Trustee Emeritus. If the trustees determine that having such former trustee designated

Trustee Emeritus will be of material benefit to the Foundation, the trustees by majority vote may make such designation for such period of time as the trustees shall determine. The position of Trustee Emeritus shall be honorary and any so designated shall be invited to attend regular trustee meetings but shall have no vote or authority, actual or implied, to bind the Foundation.

- f. In the administration of their powers to seek to obtain appreciation of assets, to make and retain investments, and to delegate investment management of trust funds, the trustees shall exercise ordinary business care and prudence under the facts and circumstances prevailing at the time of the action or decision. In so doing, they shall consider long and short term needs of the Foundation in carrying out its religious, charitable, scientific, literary and/or educational purposes, its present and anticipated financial requirements, expected total return on its investments, price level trends and general economic conditions.
- g. During the first quarter of each year, each trustee shall file with the Foundation a statement in sufficient detail to disclose any interest, either personal, financial, or business, or service as a trustee, director or consultant to another non-profit organization, of the trustee or any member of the immediate family of the trustee that likely would be affected by any action being considered for a vote by the Foundation trustees, such interest being a "conflict of interest". During each year after making the annual statement, if the trustee becomes aware of any

additional conflict of interest with respect to the trustee or any member of the immediate family of the trustee, said trustee shall file with the Foundation a supplemental statement in sufficient detail to report such conflict of interest. Prior to Board action on any contract, grant, or other transaction, any trustee who has a conflict of interest shall disclose such interest to the Board and thereafter may not vote on, nor make any motion or second for a resolution concerning the vote on, such contract, grant or transaction, but instead, shall abstain from any such action. Immediate family as used herein means the spouse, ancestors, children or grandchildren, or the spouses of children or grandchildren of the trustee.

Meetings

- 2.a. Regular meetings of the trustees shall be held each month at a time and place selected by the trustees. Once selected, the date for holding regular meetings may be changed by majority vote of the trustees provided that regular meetings shall be held no less frequently than monthly.
 - b. Special meetings of the trustees may be called on not less than two (2) days written notice by not less than two (2) trustees at a time and place set forth in the notice. Requirement for written notice of a special meeting may be waived by written waiver signed by all trustees.
 - c. No action taken by the trustees (other than filling a vacancy pursuant to paragraph 1.a., hereof) shall be binding upon the Foundation unless

approved by a majority of the trustees, except that a decision to use all or part of the principal of the trust estate pursuant to paragraph Fifth (d) of the Trust Indenture shall require the unanimous vote of all trustees.

- d. The proceedings of all meetings shall be recorded and written minutes, approved for accuracy by the trustees, shall be maintained in a permanent record. All minutes, other than those recording the proceedings at an executive session of the trustees where personnel or other sensitive matters are discussed, shall be available for inspection on reasonable notice by interested parties during regular business hours at the principal office of the Foundation.
- e. Any trustee who fails to attend eight (8) regular meetings during any calendar year without good cause as determined by the remaining trustees shall be deemed to have voluntarily resigned at the end of that calendar year.

Employees

3.a. The Foundation may hire such employees as are deemed necessary in the Trustees' discretion for the efficient conduct of the Foundation's affairs, including but not limited to a Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Chief Financial Officer (CFO), and Grants Officer. Compensation and benefits paid to the employees of the Foundation shall be reviewed by the Trustees no less frequently than annually, and compensation and benefits for the senior officers named above shall be determined by approval of the majority of the Trustees (with compensation and benefits

of all other employees to be determined by the Trustees based on recommendations by the CEO).

b. The trustees shall adopt written policies and procedures setting forth the authority and responsibility of its employees and duly appointed committees, if any, and shall review such policies and procedures no less frequently than annually. On a continuing basis the trustees shall require all employees to perform their duties and responsibilities pursuant to the terms of such policies and procedures.

Officers and Duties

- 4.a. At the monthly meeting of trustees held in March of each year, the trustees by majority vote shall elect officers to serve for the next succeeding year or until their successors shall have been elected and qualified. The officers of the Foundation and their duties shall be as follows:
 - (1) Chairman of the Board of Trustees who shall preside at all meetings of trustees and function as chief executive officer on behalf of the trustees, recognizing that no action taken by the Chairman or any other trustee shall be binding upon the Foundation unless approved by a majority of the trustees.
 - (2) Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees who shall, in the absence or disability of the Chairman, perform the duties and exercise the responsibilities of the Chairman, and shall

- perform such other duties as a majority of the trustees shall prescribe.
- (3) Secretary of the Board of Trustees who shall attend all meetings of trustees and record all votes on matters decided by the trustees and be responsible for the keeping of accurate minutes of meetings of trustees. The Secretary shall give, or cause to be given, notice of all meetings of trustees and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the trustees.
- b. Checks written on Foundation accounts in amounts in excess of \$25,000 and all checks for charitable grants shall be signed by not less than two (2) Trustees. Checks written on Foundation accounts for amounts less than \$25,000 may be signed by not less than two (2) Foundation employees duly authorized by the Trustees, one of whom shall be either the CEO or the CFO.
- c. All instruments in writing affecting ownership of Foundation real and mineral properties such as conveyances, deeds, deeds of trust, bills of sale, mortgages, liens, encumbrances, leases, mineral interests, easements, releases, division orders, earnest money contracts, promissory notes and similar commitments shall be signed on behalf of the Foundation by not less than three (3) trustees. Instruments in writing affecting the ownership of Foundation investments, other than real and mineral properties, such as stocks, bonds, corporate and

governmental obligations may be signed and the exercise of rights pertaining to such investments such as purchases, sales, hypothecation, voting of proxies and other voting rights incident to such ownership may be exercised by agents who from time to time may be appointed by a majority of the trustees.

- If the proposal is approved, the organization will receive a Grant Contract outlining the terms and conditions of the grant.
- Grants are generally awarded for a 12-month period.
- Once the contract for an approved grant has been executed by the Board Chair and Staff Executive Officer and returned to the Foundation, grant payment will be scheduled.
- No commemorative gifts should be provided to the Foundation.
- The Foundation considers it important to inform the public of the work of philanthropy and therefore encourages grant recipients to acknowledge publicly the support the Foundation gives to a grant project
- If a proposal is declined, the Foundation sends a notification letter to the organization that will also indicate the organization must wait one year to reapply.
