Note 1: Nature of Operations and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Operations

The consolidated financial statements of United Regional Health Care System. Inc (URHCS) include the accounts of URHCS and its wholly owned subsidiaries. Entities included in the consolidated financial statements of URHCS are

- United Regional Health Care System (URHCS)
- United Regional Physician Group (URPG)
- United Regional Professional Services Corporation (URPSC)
- United Regional Foundation (URF)
- Rathgeber Hospitality House (RHH)
- Texoma Insurance Agency (TIA)

URHCS operates 325-bed acute care hospital and provides inpatient, outpatient and emergency care services to residents of Wichita Falls. Texas, and surrounding areas as well as, northern Texas and southern Oklahoma In 1997, URHCS consolidated the health care operations of two separate hospitals located in Wichita Falls. Texas

- Bethania Hospital, which is referred to as the 11th Street Campus and was owned by the Holy Family of Nazareth Health Ministry of Wichita Falls, formerly known as Bethania Regional Health Care Center (Bethania), a Texas nonprofit corporation, and
- Wichita General Hospital, which is referred to as the 8th Street Campus and is owned by the Wichita County-City of Wichita Falls. Texas Hospital Board (City-County Board), a body corporate and politic, organized under the laws of the state of Texas

In October 1997, URHCS reorganized its corporate structure. The City-County Board leased the 11th Street Campus and related assets from Bethania pursuant to a 50-year lease and, in turn, subleased that campus and related assets to URHCS under a 50-year sublease. The Lease and Management Agreement for the 8th Street Campus was also simultaneously amended and restated to provide for a 50-year lease for those assets to URHCS for \$1 per year.

On June 12, 2007, URHCS, Bethania and the City-County Board entered into a First Amended Master Agreement, under which URHCS purchased the 11th Street Campus and other properties from Bethania and revised certain governance and operational structures of URHCS. Under the Amended Master Agreement, the City-County Board and Bethania retain their proportional stakeholder interests in URHCS.

The change in ownership of the 11th Street Campus also required URHCS and the City-County Board to enter into a First Amended and Restated Lease under which URHCS leases the 11th Street Campus and South Tower site to the City-County Board and a First Amended and Restated Sublease Agreement that leases these properties back to URHCS. The Amended Lease and Amended Sublease are effective until 2047 with automatic 50-year renewal periods unless a one-vear notice of nonrenewal is given before expiration of the term

The 8th Street Campus lease was also amended under the Second Restated and Amended Management Contract and Lease Agreement, and together with the Master Agreement. Amended Lease and Amended Sublease, allow URHCS to return the 8th Street Campus to the City-County Board upon the completion of the South Tower and 11th Street Campus renovations by a termination of the Second Amended Lease and Management Agreement. The agreement provides the City-County Board with certain options as it relates to the 8th Street Campus. See additional discussion at *Note 16*

URPG, a nonprofit corporation, is a multi-specialty physician group organized to own and operate outpatient medical clinics serving the patients of URHCS

URPSC, a taxable corporation, provides various general and administrative services to external entities and participates in various health care related joint ventures URPSC has equity interests in the following entities

- Wichita Falls Endoscopy Center Management, LLC (34 00%)
- WFCC Radiation Management Company, LLC (34 71%)
- CMS Rehab of WF, LP (25 00%)
- United Regional Health Care System Cardiology, LLC (50 00%)

In 2012, URHCS entered into a co-management and operating agreement with Wichita Falls Heart Clinic, PLLC (Heart Clinic) to become the sole members in United Regional Health Care System Cardiology, LLC (URHCS Cardiology), an entity formed on February 2, 2012, to provide management services to URHCS and the Heart Clinic for the purpose of expanding cardiovascular services throughout the Wichita Falls. Texas, community and surrounding area Profits and losses are paid in the form of distributions. As of December 31, 2013 and 2012, URHCS recorded receivables of \$275,000 and \$105,000, respectively, from URHCS Cardiology.

URF, a nonprofit corporation, organized to encourage charitable gifts to support the vision of URHCS URF's revenues and other support are derived principally from contributions, and its activities are conducted principally in the Wichita Falls, Texas, area

RHH, a nonprofit corporation, operates a hospitality house that provides temporary living facilities for the families of inpatients of URHCS

TIA, a taxable corporation, is a licensed insurance company. This company is not currently operating and had no significant activity in 2013 or 2012.

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2013 and 2012

Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements include the accounts of URCHS, URPG, URPSC, URF, RHH and TIA—All significant intercompany accounts and transactions have been eliminated in consolidation

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates

Cash and Cash Equivalents

URHCS considers all liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents, including assets limited as to use. At December 31, 2013 and 2012, cash equivalents consisted primarily of money market accounts with brokers.

At December 31, 2013, URHCS' cash accounts exceeded federally insured limits by approximately \$6,507,000

Pursuant to legislation enacted in 2010, the FDIC fully insured all noninterest-bearing transaction accounts beginning December 31, 2010 through December 31, 2012, at all FDIC-insured institutions. This legislation expired on December 31, 2012. Beginning January 1, 2013, noninterest-bearing transaction accounts are subject to the \$250,000 limit on FDIC insurance per covered institution.

Investments and Investment Return

Investments in equity securities having a readily determinable fair value and in all debt securities are carried at fair value. Other investments are valued at the lower of cost (or fair value at time of donation, if acquired by contribution) or fair value. Investment return includes dividend, interest and other investment income, realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments carried at fair value, and realized gains and losses on other investments.

Investment return that is initially restricted by donor stipulation and for which the restriction will be satisfied in the same year is included in unrestricted net assets. Other investment return is reflected in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations and changes in net assets as unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted based upon the existence and nature of any donor or legally imposed restrictions

The investments in the joint ventures are reported on the equity method of accounting. Changes in the investment in the joint ventures are reflected in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations as a component of other income (expense).

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2013 and 2012

Assets Limited As to Use

Assets limited as to use include (1) assets set aside by the Board of Directors (Board) for future capital improvements. (2) assets set aside by the Board under self-insurance trust agreements and (3) assets held by a trustee for debt service. The Board retains control over internally designated assets and may at its discretion use those assets for other purposes. Amounts required to meet current liabilities of URHCS are included in current assets.

Patient Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are reduced by an allowance for doubtful accounts. In evaluating the collectibility of accounts receivable. URHCS analyzes its past history and identifies trends for each of its major payer sources of revenue to estimate the appropriate allowance for doubtful accounts and provision for uncollectible accounts. Management regularly reviews data about these major payer sources of revenue in evaluating the sufficiency of the allowance for doubtful accounts.

For receivables associated with services provided to patients who have third-party coverage. URHCS analyzes contractually due amounts and provides an allowance for doubtful accounts and a provision for uncollectible accounts, if necessary (for example, for expected uncollectible deductibles and copayments on accounts for which the third-party payer has not yet paid or for payers who are known to be having financial difficulties that make the realization of amounts due unlikely)

For receivables associated with self-pay patients, which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances due for which third-party coverage exists for part of the bill. URHCS records a significant provision for uncollectible accounts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible

The difference between the standard rates (or the discounted rates if negotiated or provided by policy) and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts

URHCS' allowance for doubtful accounts for self-pay patients was approximately 93% and 94% of self-pay accounts receivable at December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively URHCS' write-offs increased approximately \$6,961,000 from approximately \$27,118,000 for the year ended December 31, 2012, to approximately \$34,079,000 for the year ended December 31, 2013. This increase was primarily due to slight shifts in payer mix

Supplies

URHCS states supply inventories at the lower of average cost or market

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2013 and 2012

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment acquisitions are recorded at cost and are depreciated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of each asset. Assets under capital lease obligations and leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of the lease-term or their respective estimated useful lives. The estimated useful lives for each major depreciable classification of property and equipment are as follows.

Buildings and improvements	5 - 40 years
Equipment	3-20 years

Donations of property and equipment are reported at fair value as an increase in unrestricted net assets unless use of the assets is restricted by the donor. Monetary gifts that must be used to acquire property and equipment are reported as restricted support. The expiration of such restrictions is reported as an increase in unrestricted net assets when the donated asset is placed in service.

URHCS capitalizes interest costs as a component of construction in progress, based on the weighted-average rates paid for long-term borrowing. Total interest incurred was

Long-lived Asset Impairment

URHCS evaluates the recoverability of the carrying value of long-lived assets whenever events or circumstances indicate the carrying amount may not be recoverable. If a long-lived asset is tested for recoverability and the undiscounted estimated future cash flows expected to result from the use and eventual disposition of the asset is less than the carrying amount of the asset, the asset cost is adjusted to fair value and an impairment loss is recognized as the amount by which the carrying amount of a long-lived asset exceeds its fair value

During the year ended December 31, 2012, URHCS recognized an impairment loss of approximately \$1,292,000 related to buildings owned by URHCS that have been or will be demolished in order to use the land for alternative purposes. The impairment loss is included in the loss on disposal of property and equipment in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations. No asset impairment was recognized during the year ended December 31, 2013.

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2013 and 2012

Deferred Financing Costs

Deferred financing costs represent costs incurred in connection with the issuance of long-term debt Such costs are being amortized over the term of the respective debt using the effective interest method

Temporarily and Permanently Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use by URHCS has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose. Permanently restricted net assets have been restricted by donors to be maintained by URHCS in perpetuity.

Net Patient Service Revenue

URHCS has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments to URHCS at amounts different from its established rates. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payers and others for services rendered and includes estimated retroactive revenue adjustments. Retroactive adjustments are considered in the recognition of revenue on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and such estimated amounts are revised in future periods as adjustments become known

Charity Care

URHCS provides care without charge or at amounts less than its established rates to patients meeting certain criteria under its charity care policy. Because URHCS does not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care, these amounts are not reported as net patient service revenue.

Contributions

Unconditional gifts expected to be collected within one year are reported at their net realizable value. Unconditional gifts expected to be collected in future years are initially reported at fair value determined using the discounted present value of estimated future cash flows technique. The resulting discount is amortized using the level-yield method and is reported as contribution revenue.

Gifts received with donor stipulations are reported as either temporarily or permanently restricted support. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified and reported as an increase in unrestricted net assets. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met within the same year as received are reported as unrestricted contributions. Conditional contributions are reported as liabilities until the condition is eliminated or the contributed assets are returned to the donor.

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2013 and 2012

Professional Liability Claims

URHCS recognizes an accrual for claim liabilities based on estimated ultimate losses and costs associated with settling claims and a receivable to reflect the estimated insurance recoveries, if any Professional liability claims are described more fully in *Note* 6

Self-insurance

URHCS has elected to self-insure certain costs related to employee health and accident benefit programs. Costs resulting from noninsured losses are charged to expense when incurred. URHCS has purchased insurance that limits its exposure for individual accident and medical claims to \$350,000 annually. Self-insurance claims are described more fully in *Note 6*.

Income Taxes

URHCS, URPG, URF and RHH have been recognized as exempt from income taxes under Section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and a similar provision of state law. However, these entities are subject to federal income tax on any unrelated business taxable income. URPSC and TIA are taxed as corporations

With a few exceptions, URHCS and its consolidated entities are no longer subject to U S federal examinations by tax authorities for years before 2010

Excess of Revenues Over Expenses

The accompanying consolidated statements of operations include excess of revenues over expenses. Changes in unrestricted net assets which are excluded from excess of revenues over expenses, consistent with industry practice, include contributions of long-lived assets with no donor restrictions (including assets acquired using contributions, which, by donor restriction, were to be used for the purpose of acquiring such assets)

Electronic Health Records Incentive Program

The Electronic Health Records Incentive Program, enacted as part of the *American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009*, provides for one-time incentive payments under both the Medicare and Medicaid programs to eligible hospitals that demonstrate meaningful use of certified electronic health records technology (EHR) Payments under the Medicare program are generally made for up to four years based on a statutory formula. Payments under the Medicaid program are generally made for up to four years based upon a statutory formula, as determined by the state, which is approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Payments under both programs are contingent on the URHCS continuing to meet escalating meaningful use criteria and any other specific requirements that are applicable for the reporting period. The final amount for any payment year is determined based upon an audit by the administrative contractor. Events could occur that would cause the final amounts to differ materially from the initial payments under the program

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2013 and 2012

The URHCS recognizes revenue under the grant accounting model using the cliff recognition approach. Under this approach, revenue is recognized once meaningful use status has been met for the full reporting period.

In 2013, URHCS completed the second-year requirements under the Medicare program and the third-year requirements under the Medicaid program. In 2012, URHCS completed the first-year requirements under the Medicare program and the second-year requirements under the Medicaid program. Approximately \$2,255,000 and \$3,292,000 of revenue has been recorded and included in other revenue within operating revenue in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively

Note 2: Net Patient Service Revenue

URHCS recognizes patient service revenue associated with services provided to patients who have third-party payer coverage on the basis of contractual rates for the services rendered. For uninsured patients that do not qualify for charity care. URHCS recognizes revenue on the basis of its standard rates for services provided. On the basis of historical experience, a significant portion of URHCS uninsured patients will be unable or unwilling to pay for the services provided. Thus, URHCS records a significant provision for uncollectible accounts related to uninsured patients in the period the services are provided. This provision for uncollectible accounts is presented on the accompanying statements of operations as a component of net patient service revenue.

URHCS has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments to URHCS at amounts different from its established rates. These payment arrangements include

Medicare. Inpatient acute care services and substantially all outpatient services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates per discharge or occasion of service. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic and other factors. Defined medical education costs are paid based on a cost reimbursement methodology. During 2012, URHCS received designation by the Medicare program as a Sole Community Hospital (SCH). SCH status provides for a hospital specific payment rate for inpatient services if that rate, in aggregate, results in total payments greater than the prospective payment that would be paid under Medicare's normal payment methodology and a 7.1% add on to the prospective payment for outpatient laboratory services URHCS is reimbursed for certain services at tentative rates with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by URHCS and audits thereof by the Medicare administrative contractor. URHCS' Medicare cost reports have been audited by the Medicare administrative contractor through December 31, 2009.

Medicaid. Inpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed under a prospective payment methodology. Outpatient and physician services are reimbursed under a mixture of cost reimbursement and fee schedule methods. URHCS is reimbursed for cost reimbursable services at tentative rates with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by URHCS and audits thereof by the Medicaid administrative contractor URHCS' Medicaid cost reports have been audited by the Medicaid administrative contractor through December 31, 2009.

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2013 and 2012

On December 12, 2011, the United States Department of Health and Human Services approved a Medicaid Section 1115(a) waiver (Waiver) demonstration project entitled "Texas Health Transformation Quality Improvement Program" This demonstration expands Medicaid managed care programs to additional counties and established two funding pools that assist providers with uncompensated care (UC Pool) costs and promote delivery system transformation that improves the quality and lowers the cost of patient care (DSRIP Pool). The demonstration project is effective from December 12, 2011 to September 30, 2016. During the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, URHCS recognized revenue of approximately \$9,256,000 and \$9,264,000, respectively, from the UC Pool. During 2013, URHCS recognized revenue of approximately \$5,089,000 for the DSRIP Pool. URHCS did not recognize revenue from the DSRIP Pool in 2012. This funding is subject to recoupment based on future audits and is not necessarily representative of funding URHCS will receive in future years.

URHCS also participates in the state of Texas' disproportionate share (DSH) program. This funding program is designed to compensate hospitals for a portion of the difference in what Medicare would have paid for URHCS' Medicaid charges and what Medicaid actually paid. Funding available for this program has been impacted by the Waiver and future funding from the DSH program is not certain. Revenue recognized from the DSH program was approximately \$5,335,000 and \$4,367,000 for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively

Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are complex and subject to interpretation and change. Settlements under reimbursement agreements with Medicare and Medicaid programs are estimated and recorded in the period the related services are rendered and are adjusted in future periods as adjustments become known or as the service years are no longer subject to audit, review or investigation. Annual cost reports required under the Medicare and Medicaid programs are subject to routine audits, which may result in adjustments to the amounts ultimately determined to be due to URHCS under the reimbursement programs. These audits often require several years to reach their final determination of amounts earned under the programs. As a result, it is reasonably possible that recorded estimates will change materially in the near term. During 2013 and 2012, changes in estimates associated with estimated amounts due to third-party payers increased net patient service revenue by approximately \$4,536,000 and \$4,600,000, respectively.

URHCS has also entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers, health maintenance organizations and preferred provider organizations. The basis for payment to URHCS under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates per discharge, discounts from established charges and prospectively determined daily rates.

Note 6: Risk Management

URHCS is self-insured for professional and general liability risks. URHCS has purchased umbrella insurance for individual claims exceeding \$4,000,000 and aggregate claims exceeding \$8,000,000 annually, up to the limits of the umbrella policy. Losses from asserted and unasserted claims identified under URHCS' incident reporting system are accrued based on estimates that incorporate URHCS' past experience, as well as other considerations, including the nature of each claim or incident and relevant trend factors. It is reasonably possible that URHCS' estimate of losses will change by a material amount in the near term. URHCS has established a revocable trust fund for the payment of professional and general liability claims. Professional insurance consultants have been retained to assist URHCS with determining amounts to be deposited in the trust fund. An actuarially determined accrual for possible losses attributable to incidents that may have occurred but have not been identified under the incident reporting system has been made. The ultimate cost to settle all the asserted and unasserted claims against URHCS may vary, perhaps substantially, from the amounts recorded

URHCS is also self-insured for workers' compensation and employee health care claims. A provision is accrued for self-insured claims, including both claims reported and claims incurred but not yet reported. The accrual is estimated based on consideration of prior claims experience, recently settled claims, frequency of claims and other economic and social factors. It is reasonably possible that URHCS' estimate will change by a material amount in the near term

Note 7: Risk-sharing Agreement

During 2012, URHCS entered into an agreement with a Medicaid HMO insurer to share in the risk of the insurer's coverage of Medicaid HMO beneficiaries living and receiving medical care in the URHCS service area. Under the terms of the agreement, URHCS shares gains or losses associated with providing health care coverage to these Medicaid HMO beneficiaries based on risk-sharing corridors. Losses of approximately \$2,219,000 and \$2,000,000 were recorded in 2013 and 2012, respectively, as a result of this agreement and are reflected in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations as a component of other income (expense). The estimated losses have not been paid and are reflected as a liability in accrued expenses in the accompanying consolidated balance sheets at December 31, 2013 and 2012. It is reasonably possible that this estimate will change by a material amount in the near term. The agreement was terminated in August 2013.

Upon issuance and delivery of the Series 2007 Bonds, \$30,150,000 of the Series 2003 Bonds were defeased Proceeds from the Series 2007 Bonds were used to purchase securities that were deposited in trust under an escrow agreement sufficient in amount to pay future principal and interest on the defeased Series 2003 Bonds. This advance refunding transaction resulted in an extinguishment of debt since URHCS was legally released from its obligation on that portion of the Series 2003 Bonds at the time of the defeasance. Accordingly, a portion of the Series 2003 Bonds, aggregating \$31,165,000 at both December 31, 2013 and 2012, remain outstanding, but are excluded from URHCS balance sheet.

The remaining balance of the Series 2003 Bonds for which URHCS is obligated is scheduled to be paid on September 1, 2014

During 2013, it was determined the original amount of the Series 2003 Bonds recorded as having been defeased was overstated by \$1.015,000. As a result, an additional loss on extinguishment of debt of \$1.015,000 was recognized in 2013 and is reflected in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations as a component of other income (expense).

The indenture agreement requires that certain funds be established with the trustee. Accordingly, these funds are included as assets limited as to use held by trustee in the financial statements. The indenture agreement also requires URHCS to comply with certain restrictive covenants including minimum insurance coverage, maintaining a maximum debt-service coverage ratio and restrictions on incurrence of additional debt.

Note 10: Charity Care

In support of its mission, URHCS voluntarily provides free care to patients who lack financial resources and are deemed to be medically indigent. The cost associated with URHCS charity care program were approximately \$20,774,000 and \$20,247,000 for 2013 and 2012, respectively. The cost of charity care is estimated by applying the overall ratio of URHCS cost to charges to the gross charges related to services provided to patients qualifying for the URHCS charity care program.

Note 12: Retirement Plans

URHCS sponsors a voluntary Section 403(b) plan to which employees can make salary deferral contributions as well as additional defined contribution plans organized under Sections 401(a), 457(b) and 457(f) of the IRC. The Board annually determines the amount, if any, of URHCS' contributions to the plan. Expense for all plans was approximately \$3,367,000 and \$2,947,000 for 2013 and 2012, respectively

Note 13: Related Party Transactions

URHCS is a member of the North Texas Service Organization (Service Organization), a nonprofit corporation and has one representative who serves on the Board of the Service Organization URHCS contributed approximately \$8,960,000 and \$5,900,000 to the Service Organization during the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively. These contributions were used to fund emergency care services and physician directorships in the North Texas area and are reflected as a component of supplies and other expense in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations.

Investments

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, securities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics or independent asset pricing services and pricing models, the inputs of which are market-based or independently sourced market parameters, including, but not limited to, yield curves, interest rates, volatilities, prepayments, defaults, cumulative loss projections and cash flows. Such securities are classified in Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. In certain cases where Level 1 and Level 2 inputs are not available, securities are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy. URHCS held no Level 3 securities at December 31, 2013 and 2012.

Physician Guarantees

In an effort to recruit new physicians to its service area. URHCS has entered into various agreements with physicians guaranteeing certain levels of income for the first 12 – 48 months that the physician operates in the service area. These agreements typically require that the physician operate in the service area for a defined period of time. In the event that URHCS has made payments to the physicians under these income guarantee agreements and the physician does not fulfill his or her obligation to practice in the service area for the term specified in the agreement. URHCS can demand that the physician return all or a portion of the payments made under the agreement. As of December 31, 2013, the maximum potential future payments that URHCS could be required to make under existing agreements is approximately \$1,066,000.

Litigation

In the normal course of business, URHCS is, from time to time, subject to allegations that may or do result in litigation. Some of these allegations are in areas not covered by URHCS' self-insurance program (discussed elsewhere in these notes) or by commercial insurance, for example, allegations regarding employment practices or performance of contracts. URHCS evaluates such allegations by conducting investigations to determine the validity of each potential claim.

Based upon the advice of counsel, management records an estimate of the amount of ultimate expected loss, if any, for each of these matters

Events could occur that would cause the estimate of ultimate loss to differ materially in the near term

Health Care Reform

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) will substantially reform the United States health care system. The legislation impacts multiple aspects of the health care system. Including many provisions that change payments from Medicare. Medicaid and insurance companies. Starting in 2014, the legislation requires the establishment of health insurance exchanges, which will provide individuals without employer provided health care coverage the opportunity to purchase insurance. It is possible that some employers currently offering insurance to employees will opt to have employees seek insurance coverage through the insurance exchanges. The reimbursement rates paid by insurers participating in the insurance exchanges may be substantially different than rates paid under current health insurance products. Another significant component of the PPACA is the expansion of the Medicaid program to a wide range of newly eligible individuals. In anticipation of this expansion, payments under certain existing programs, such as Medicare disproportionate share, will be substantially decreased. Each state's participation in an expanded Medicaid program is optional.

The state of Texas has indicated it will not expand the Medicaid program, which may result in revenues from newly covered individuals not offsetting reduced revenue from other Medicare/Medicaid programs

The PPACA is extremely complex and may be difficult for the federal government and each state to implement. While the overall impact of the PPACA cannot currently be estimated, it is reasonably possible that it will have a negative impact on URHCS net patient service revenue. In addition, it is possible URHCS will experience payment delays and other operational challenges during PPACA's implementation.

Note 16: 8th Street Campus

On August 1, 2011, URHCS provided notice to the City-County Board of its intent to early terminate its lease of the 8th Street Campus and certain other related properties. This early termination gave the City-County Board the following three options as it relates to the 8th Street Campus

- Retake possession of the 8th Street Campus
- Not retake possession of the 8th Street Campus and thereby permit URHCS to take any and all action, in any manner elected by URHCS, without a need for further consent by the City-County Board Such actions include, but are not limited to, the sale or conversion to alternative use of the 8th Street Campus
- Retake possession of the 8th Street Campus but also direct URHCS to demolish the facility prior to transfer of possession of the land back to the City-County Board

On June 13, 2012, the City-County Board elected not to retake possession of the 8th Street Campus conditioned upon URHCS' agreement to demolish the facility within an agreed upon timeframe not to exceed two years

On October 1, 2012, the City-County Board conveyed the 8th Street Campus (and certain other related properties) to URHCS and entered into a first amendment to the second restated and amended management contract and lease agreement discussed in *Note 1*. in which URHCS originally leased the 8th Street Campus and other properties to the City-County Board These transactions transferred the ownership of the 8th Street Campus property and certain other related properties to URHCS, with no change in URHCS contractual obligations to the City-County Board as contained in the management agreement Leased properties which were not early terminated and thus not transferred to URHCS remain under lease with the City-County Board

Upon the election of the City-County Board not to retake possession of the 8th Street Campus and direct URHCS to demolish the facility. URHCS recognized demolition and related expenses of \$2,940,000 in 2012 which is included in the accompanying 2012 consolidated statements of operations within the loss on disposal of property and equipment. The demolition project was completed during 2013
