INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors of Wallowa Resources

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of Wallowa Resources (a nonprofit organization) and its subsidiaries, which comprise the consolidated statements of financial position as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, and the related consolidated statements of activities and changes in net assets, functional expenses, and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audits. We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Wallowa Resources' investment in Integrated Biomass Resources, LLC, an investment accounted for on the equity method, is carried at a deficit of (\$110,259) on the balance sheet at December 31, 2013 and Wallowa Resources' share of Integrated Biomass Resources, LLC's net loss of (\$95,697) is included in Wallowa Resources' changes in net assets for the year then ended. We were unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence about the carrying amount of Wallowa Resources' investment in Integrated Biomass Resources, LLC as of December 31, 2013 and Wallowa Resources' share of integrated Biomass Resources, LLC's net income for the year then ended because we were unable to obtain audited financial statements or perform adequate audit procedures. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to those amounts were necessary.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects on the 2013 financial statements of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Wallowa Resources as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America

Other Matter

Our audits were conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole The consolidating schedules of financial position and changes in net assets on pages 27-33 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, except for the effects on the supplementary information of the inability to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence on the equity method investment described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph above, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole

NOTE 1 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Organization

Wallowa Resources (Organization) was incorporated in Oregon on October 18, 1996, under the State of Oregon Non-Profit Corporation Statutes The Organization seeks to promote watershed health, stabilize and strengthen the natural resource-based economy and broaden community understanding of the ties between environmental health and economic health in Wallowa County, Oregon and the surrounding region

Financial Statement Presentation and Basis of Accounting

The Organization's accounts are maintained on the accrual basis of accounting Under the Financial Accounting Standards Board's Accounting Standards Codification ASC 958, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets. All contributions and grants are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor or grantor for specific purposes are reported as temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support that increases those net asset classes. When a temporary restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the Statement of Activities as net assets released from restriction. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the year in which the contributions are recognized

Promises to Give and Contributions

Contributions are recognized when the donor gives or makes a promise to give to the Organization that is, in substance, unconditional A grant contribution is distinguished from an exchange transaction as follows a grant would likely be a contribution if the activity specified by the grant is planned and carried out by the nonprofit and the nonprofit has the right to the benefits, a grant would likely be an exchange transaction if the grantor provides the materials and retains the right to the results Donated in-kind professional services are recorded as a contribution and an expenditure at fair market value During the year ended December 31, 2013, the value of promises to give were not material and have not been recorded

Principles of Consolidation and Operations of Subsidiaries

The consolidated financial statements include the accounts of Wallowa Resources and its subsidiaries, Wallowa Resources Community Solutions, Inc (a for-profit C-corporation) and Wallowa Resources Stewardship Center LLC (an Oregon limited liability company operated as a non-profit) Wallowa Resources owns all of the outstanding stock of Wallowa Resources Community Solutions Inc , which was organized in May 2001 to assist Wallowa Resources in carrying out its objectives by demonstrating the commercial viability and efficiently making use of low value natural resources located in Wallowa County In 2010, Wallowa Resources received ownership of certain real property donated to the Organization by the Wallowa Valley Health Care Foundation The property has become the Organization's headquarters and a source of additional revenue Wallowa Resources Stewardship Center LLC is the legal entity created to accept, maintain and operate this property The Organization leases space contained in the facility Wallowa Resources is the only member of Wallowa Resources Stewardship Center LLC, and controls 100% of all membership interests All intercompany activity has been eliminated in consolidation

NOTE 1 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, Continued

Equity Method Investments

Wallowa Resources acquired a 31% interest in Integrated Biomass Resources, LLC (IBR) during the year ended December 31, 2012 This investment has been accounted for using the equity method. The investment was acquired by allowing IBR the use of certain equipment belonging to Wallowa Resources with no cash investment. Wallowa Resources' share of the accumulated losses are presented as a liability and expense in the financial statements.

Grants

Grants awarded to the Organization that will provide support for a particular program are recognized as an increase in temporarily restricted net assets when the award is made and it is expected that conditions of the award will be met. If program expenditures must be incurred before reimbursement is made by the grantor, however, the grant is recorded as this condition is met. When money is received from a government agency under a grant agreement where the conditions of the grant have not yet been fulfilled, and there is the possibility of repayment should the grant conditions not be fulfilled, a deferred revenue liability is recorded.

Accounts and Notes Receivable

The Organization's accounts receivable are primarily balances due on reimbursement based grant agreements. Short and long-term notes receivable are a result of business transactions with others. The Organization uses the allowance method for doubtful accounts.

Inventories

Inventories consist of heating oil and biomass fuel used to heat the Stewardship Center building and are valued at the lower of cost or market

Fixed Assets

Assets that are capital in nature, have a cost greater than \$2,000, and have an expected useful life in excess of one year are capitalized at cost, except for donations, which are recorded as contributions at their estimated fair value. Such donations are reported as unrestricted contributions unless the donor has restricted the donated asset to a specific purpose. Assets donated with explicit restrictions regarding their use and contributions of cash that must be used to acquire property and equipment are reported as restricted contributions. Absent donor stipulations regarding how long those donated assets must be maintained, the Organization reports expirations of donor restrictions when the donated or acquired assets are placed in service as instructed by the donor, and transfers temporarily restricted net assets to unrestricted net assets. The Organization depreciates property and equipment using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets. Estimated useful lives generally range from five to seven years for furniture, fixtures, computer equipment, software and vehicles, 10 to 25 years for alternative energy equipment and 40 years for buildings. Land is not depreciated

Income Taxes

Wallowa Resources is a not-for-profit Organization that is exempt from Federal and State income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and similar state provisions However, Wallowa Resources Community Solutions, Inc is a C-corporation subject to income tax As of December 31,

Income Taxes continued,

2013, the subsidiary had an unused net operating loss carry forward of \$541,199 which can be used to offset future taxable income Of this loss carry forward, \$40,571 will expire in 2029, \$211,641 will expire in 2032, and \$288,987 will expire in 2033 Income tax returns are filed in the United States and Oregon As of December 31, 2013 all tax years prior to 2010 are no longer subject to examination by taxing authorities Wallowa Resources Stewardship Center LLC is a single member limited liability company and considered a disregarded entity for income tax purposes Its net income or loss is combined with Wallowa Resources for reporting purposes

Investments

In accordance with FASB ASC 320, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statement of Financial Position Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets Investment income and gains restricted by a donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met (either by passage of time or by use) in the reporting period in which the income and gains are recognized

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, the Organization considers all highly liquid investments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents

Functional Allocation of Expenses

Costs of providing the various programs, services and other activities are summarized on a functional basis in the Statement of Activities Accordingly, certain costs are allocated among the various programs and supporting services

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates

Restrictions on Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets as of December 31, 2013 and 2012 consist of foundation grants that were given to the Organization with the intent that they be used for a specified purpose The Organization intends to spend these funds on each purpose specified in future periods

Fair Value Measurements

The Organization recognizes financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or would be paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date A three-tier hierarchy maximizes the use of observable market data and minimizes the use of unobservable inputs, to establish classification of fair value measurements for disclosure purposes. Inputs refer broadly to the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability, including assumptions about risk. Inputs may be observable or unobservable. Observable inputs are inputs that reflect the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on market data obtained from sources.

NOTE 1 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, Continued

Fair Value Measurements continued,

independent of the reporting entity Unobservable inputs are inputs that reflect the reporting entity's own assumptions about the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on the best information available. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows

Level 1 inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Organization has the ability to access at the measurement date. These include highly liquid U.S. Treasury securities and exchange traded equity and derivative instruments

Level 2 inputs are inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly Included in Level 2 are derivative instruments which are priced using models with observable market inputs, including interest rates, foreign currency, and certain credit swap contracts

Level 3 inputs are observable inputs for the asset or liability including assumptions about risk

Adjustment to fair value of "available for sale" securities is done on a periodic basis

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the 2012 financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation

NOTE 2 – Investments

The Organization utilizes an integrated system of cash management whereby book bank overdrafts are automatically covered by the line of credit as items are presented for payment. Available funds in the Organization's checking account are regularly applied to reduce the line of credit balance. Depository accounts at each of the above banks are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation for up to \$250,000 at each depository. At December 31, 2013 the Organization had no uninsured cash balances

NOTE 4 – Notes Receivable

In September 2011, Wallowa Resources Stewardship Center agreed to provide a revolving line of credit to Wallowa Valley Networks, a local internet service provider, to facilitate infrastructure upgrades that would benefit the Stewardship Center and its tenants, including the Organization The maximum amount available under the line was \$10,000 and interest was to accrue at the rate of 3 0% per annum No monthly payments were required, however, the entire unpaid balance, including interest, was due and payable on September 29, 2013 At December 31, 2012 the unpaid principal balance was \$2,000, the note was fully paid prior to the 2013 maturity date

On October 15, 2012, Wallowa Resources Community Solutions, Inc (CSI) received from Alternative Energy Solutions International, Inc (AESI) an amended and restated promissory note in the amount of \$135,279 for the amount due as a result of AESI's default on delivery of equipment CSI had purchased on contract and subsequent default on an original note in the amount of \$168,813, which liability had been partially discharged by AESI's subsequent delivery and installation of certain additional equipment as agreed. In April 2013, AESI made a \$10,000 payment on the amended and restated promissory note, \$5,302 of which was applied to principal. AESI defaulted on the original equipment delivery and both the original and the amended and restated promissory notes due to financial hardship. At December 31, 2013, the remaining balance of the amended and restated note plus accrued interest totaled \$137,267. In view of AESI's financial condition, but also recognizing that AESI is an expert on alternative energy and still actively marketing equipment, Wallowa Resources management estimates that it will collect an additional

\$25,000 on the amended and restated note and has therefore recorded a \$112,267 allowance for doubtful accounts, of which \$85,279 was recorded in 2012 and \$26,988 in 2013

As a condition of a lease of office space to the U S Department of Agriculture (USDA), Wallowa Resources expended \$79,209 during 2013 for improvements specifically for the convenience of the USDA The USDA has agreed to pay for these improvements over 111 months with interest imputed at 15% The remaining balance of this receivable at December 31, 2013 is \$76,544

Wallowa Resources maintains a defined contribution retirement plan under Internal Revenue Code Section 403(b) Employees over 21 years of age are eligible to participate in the plan upon employment with Wallowa Resources and will receive employer contributions upon completion of six months of continuous employment The plan currently provides for employer contributions of 4% of eligible employee compensation Employee elective contributions may be made up to the amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Code This plan can be modified by the Board of Directors at any time For the years

Employees are also eligible for six days of personal leave per year to be used for illness or personal business Personal leave does not carry over from year to year and unused leave is not paid at termination

NOTE 8 – Line of Credit

Wallowa Resources has secured a \$245,000 line of credit from Community Bank The terms of the agreement include a due date of September 13, 2014 and a minimum 6 0% variable interest rate. The outstanding principal balance of this short term note at December 31, 2013 and 2012 was \$100,016 and \$245,000 respectively. The note is secured by real property, accounts receivable, intangibles and contract rights. Interest is paid monthly

NOTE 9 – Short-Term Debt

On November 27, 2012, Wallowa Resources secured a short term loan of \$18,000 from the Janet Christine Noel Trust to conduct its activities This trust is administered by James Henson, a member of the Organization's Board of Directors The terms of the agreement included a due date of February 28, 2013 and an interest rate of 5% per annum The outstanding principal balance of this short term note at December 31, 2012 was \$18,000 The loan was paid in full in March 2013 and the interest was forgiven as a contribution from the lender to Wallowa Resources

On November 7, 2012, Wallowa Resources secured a short term loan of \$20,000 from G Douglas McDaniel, a member of the Organization's Board of Directors, to conduct its activities The terms of the agreement included a due date of November 6, 2013 and an interest rate of 3% calculated on the basis of a 365-day year with interest due upon maturity The outstanding principal balance of this short term note at

NOTE 9 – Short Term Debt, continued

December 31, 2012 was \$20,000 In January 2013, the principal of this note and the accrued interest were forgiven as a contribution from the lender to Wallowa Resources

On December 26, 2012, Wallowa Resources secured a short term loan of \$5,000 from Peter Ferre, a member of the Organization's Board of Directors, to conduct its activities The terms of the agreement included a due date of December 26, 2013 and an interest rate of 3% calculated on the basis of a 365-day year with interest due upon maturity The outstanding principal balance of this short term note at December 31, 2012 was \$5,000 In January 2013, the principal of this note and the accrued interest were forgiven as a contribution from the lender to Wallowa Resources

On November 19, 2012, Wallowa Resources Community Solutions, Inc converted accounts payable of \$141,498 to Wellens Farwell, Inc for Integrated Biomass Energy Campus project expenses to a short-term promissory note. The terms of the agreement included a due date of January 31, 2013 and an interest rate of 2%, increasing to a default rate of 6 5% if the note was not paid by the due date. The outstanding principal balance of this promissory note at December 31, 2012 was \$95,793. The note and accrued interest were paid in full on July 31, 2013.

On July 11, 2012, Wallowa Resources secured an advance from Wallowa County, Oregon for \$75,000 in order to make payment directly to the manufacturer for equipment ordered through AESI. This was after AESI encountered financial difficulty and was unable to make payment to the manufacturer from the funds previously advanced to it by Wallowa Resources. This advance was to be paid back from proceeds of the AESI note when it is collected. On October 1, 2012, an additional \$20,000 was subsequently borrowed from Wallowa County in order to complete the Integrated Biomass Energy Campus (IBEC). Combined Heat and Power project. This loan was to be paid back when funds are available. As of December 31, 2013 neither of these loan agreements were in writing. On June 16, 2014, Wallowa Resources and Wallowa County signed an agreement stipulating that as of December 31, 2013 the \$75,000 advance was to be considered a general support grant to facilitate the Organization's investment in IBEC and the \$20,000 advance was to be considered a down-payment by Wallowa County on future lease payments for additional space to be occupied by the Veterans Administration clinic located in the Stewardship Center.

NOTE 11 – Commitments and Contingencies

During 2012, Wallowa Resources Community Solutions, Inc (CSI) became an equity owner in Integrated Biomass Resources LLC (IBR), contributing the use of equipment During the year, one of the original members of IBR withdrew and a new member was admitted, leaving CSI's ownership interest at 31% as of December 31 CSI was contingently liable on IBR's line of credit with Community Bank, the balance of which was \$59,600 at December 31, 2012 In June 2013, IBR secured a \$3,750,000 loan from BizCapital BIDCO I, LLC with a U S Small Business Administration (SBA) guarantee CSI is a coguarantor of this debt along with the majority owners of IBR CSI's loan guarantee is made specifically by and limited to CSI whose assets are the basis of the pledge The guarantees of the majority owners and CSI are primary to the SBA guarantee

Amounts received or receivable from outside agencies are subject to audit and adjustment by those agencies Adjustments in amounts claimed as allowable program expenses may result in a future liability of the Organization

NOTE 12 – Related Parties

During 2011, Integrated Biomass Resources LLC (IBR) partnered with Wallowa Resources to build a biomass energy complex on property then owned by Wallowa County but subsequently purchased by IBR During 2012, Wallowa Resources Community Solutions, Inc formally became an equity owner in IBR as described in Note 11, and as of December 31, 2012 and 2013 owned 31% of that entity A former Wallowa Resources Board Member and his spouse own 57% of IBR

NOTE 12 - Related Parties, continued

From time to time, the Organization has entered into contracts for construction and professional services with members of the Board of Directors and its Advisory Committee During the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012, service contracts with related parties totaled \$57,104 and \$91,383 respectively Wallowa Resources also rented office space to businesses owned by a CSI Board member for a total of \$2,800 and \$8,817 for 2013 and 2012 respectively

Long-term and short-term financing has been obtained from members of the Board of Directors of Wallowa Resources and its Chief Financial Officer Terms of these financing arrangements and the relationships are disclosed in Notes (9) and (10)

NOTE 13- Fundraising Activities

Each year, Wallowa Resources conducts several activities in an effort to raise community awareness and funds. The total amount directly spent on fundraising activities was \$12,508 and \$5,367 for the years ended December 31, 2013 and 2012 respectively.
