Guidelines for Grant Applications/April 1, 2012

GENERAL

These guidelines are designed to furnish information necessary to apply for a grant from the K. T. Wiedemann Foundation, Inc ("Foundation"). The Foundation reserves the right to amend the guidelines at any time. It is suggested that the Foundation be contacted prior to the submission of a proposal to determine if the Foundation has funds available to make grants and if the Foundation has an interest in a project. Ultimately, each proposal is evaluated on its consistency with the Foundation's areas of interest, potential value to the community, quality of planning, leadership, support and vision expressed in the proposal

BACKGROUND

K. T. Wiedemann and his wife, Gladys H. G. Wiedemann, lived in Minneapolis, Minnesota, for over forty years. In the 1920's, Mr. Wiedemann established a gasoline and fuel distribution business headquartered in Minneapolis. The service stations that constituted a portion of this business were located primarily in Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa and Missouri. In 1950, the Wiedemanns moved to Wichita, Kansas so that they could be near Mr. Wiedemann's extensive land holdings and cattle operations in the Flint Hills and his extensive oil operations in south central Kansas. After Mr. Wiedemann's death on January 29, 1961, the gasoline and fuel distribution business that Mr. Wiedemann owned was operated by Clark Oil and Refining Corporation, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and formed a significant proportion of the over 1,500 service stations operated by that company in the Midwest. Mrs. Wiedemann passed away on February 6, 1991.

FOUNDATION

Mr. Wiedemann was an astute and determined businessman and was known for his unfailing integrity, innate modesty and acts of philanthropy. In the latter regard, he contributed generously and preferred to give anonymously. The philosophy of the Wiedemanns can best be gleaned from the following remarks made by Mrs. Wiedemann prior to her death that appeared in an article in the Wichita Eagle dated February 8, 1991 ("She made Wichita far richer").

"My husband told me 'that the parable in the Bible about it being more blessed to give than to receive is very true.' It is "

"He (Mr. Wiedemann) used to tell me 'You're going to derive a lot of joy from being able to give to those charities.' And he was right "

CHANGE IN POLICY REGARDING CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS

(By Doug Pringle)

The Foundation has had a unique history among foundations in Kansas. The foundations that this writer is aware of in Kansas have limited their giving to charities in two ways. First, they have limited their giving to specific fields or narrow fields of interest. Historically, the Foundation has spread its wealth among a very wide variety of charities as is evidenced by the fact that it has been extremely rare for the Foundation to decline a request for support from a charity.

Secondly, other foundations limit their distributions to the minimum amount that they are required by law to distribute to charities. Historically, the Foundation has consistently distributed a far greater amount than it has been required by law to distribute to charities. After Mr. Wiedemann's death, the decision was consciously made to invest the assets associated with the Foundation so that they would produce maximum income. Furthermore, the decision was consciously made after his death to distribute significantly more from the Foundation than the Foundation was required by law to distribute to charities. If the Foundation had distributed only the minimum amount required by law and had invested the assets of the Foundation for maximum growth, the Foundation would be worth hundreds of millions of dollars today.

For nearly sixty years, the Foundation has recognized the importance of one's giving back to one's community (this despite the fact that the Wiedemanns did not make their fortune in Wichita nor did they spend most of their lives in the area). The Foundation, however, believes that the success of a community depends on the strength, good will and vitality of all of the members of its community, and, most importantly, that it is the responsibility of every successful individual and business to share success with their neighbors. The role of the Foundation is as follows:

1. To help charities identify foundations, individuals and businesses that the charities should contact to seek support;
2. To assist charities by sharing the history of the Foundation with other foundations, individuals and businesses;
3. To review proposals that charities are interested in submitting to other foundations, individuals and businesses and to provide objective comments and suggestions concerning how those charities might increase their chances of securing a commitment from those foundations, individuals and businesses; and
4. Although the Foundation has heretofore rarely issued challenge grants, the Foundation will only donate to charities on a challenge grant basis. Challenge grants will be issued solely to individuals and businesses connected with the oil industry and individuals and businesses connected with agriculture and ranching (Flint Hills) who have not contributed to the charity previously.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

- 1 Organizations that are interested in participating in challenge grants issued by the Foundation as set forth under CHANGE IN POLICY REGARDING CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS above.
2. Organizations classified as tax-exempt under section 501 (c) (3) with a 509 (a) (1) or 509 (a) (2) designation.
- 3 Organizations located primarily in Butler, Cowley, and Greenwood Counties in Kansas
- 4 Organizations whose primary charitable activities fall within the Foundation's areas of interest-arts, "at-risk" children, youth and families; elderly; health; low income, and mentally and physically challenged.
5. If an organization is religious or religious affiliated, organizations must receive broad based Christian support (Protestant and Catholic churches/organizations) During their lives, the Wiedemanns supported primarily Presbyterian, Lutheran, Catholic, and Methodist causes The Wiedemanns were also proponents of ecumenical and interfaith efforts. If the organization does not receive that type of support, describe in detail the efforts that have been made by the organization to obtain that type of support

NON-ELIGIBLE FOR SUPPORT

- 1 Individuals
2. Endowment projects and scholarships are typically not funded
- 3 Conferences, seminars, media events, or workshops are not supported unless they are an integral part of a broader project
- 4 Churches or religious affiliated organizations for direct religious activities or religious instruction
- 5 Operating deficits or retirement of debt
- 6 Political projects of any kind
- 7 Civic organizations or trade associations
- 8 Veterans' organizations, fraternal societies or orders
9. National fundraising efforts

GUIDELINES FOR PREPARING GRANT APPLICATION

The Foundation accepts proposals on an ongoing basis. All questions must be answered completely and all attachments provided in order for the proposal to be reviewed. Proposals will be processed as expeditiously as possible based upon the number of proposals submitted, the interest in the project, the start date of the project, and on the fact that the fiscal year of the Foundation ends on the last day of February of each year. If the Foundation deems it advisable, it may request a site visit once the proposal has been received and may also subsequently request a formal presentation. The Foundation does not provide an oral or written explanation for denying a proposal.

One copy of the proposal, together with attachments, should be sent to the address set forth above.

The proposal must contain the following information and must be no longer than 2 pages

1. Background information-Project title, organization name, contact person, title, address, phone, fax, e-mail address, website
2. History and major accomplishments of the organization
3. Mission and geographic focus of the organization
4. Number of full-time staff, part-time staff and number of volunteers of the organization
5. Frequency of board meetings
6. Approximate number of people served by the organization and by the project
7. Project start date and duration
8. Goals of the project (immediate and long-range). If possible, list as many as three measurable results that you expect to accomplish with this project
9. Principal staff that will be working on the project and their qualifications
10. Implementation plan to achieve the goals
11. Impact on the relevant communities
12. Organizations in the community that are also working on the same issues and how the organization is collaborating with them
13. Criteria and procedures that will be used to evaluate the project
14. Amount requested from the Foundation
15. Information relating to how the project will be affected if the Foundation funds the project in a lesser amount
16. Indicate how the project will be sustained after Foundation funding has ceased

In addition, you must furnish the following attachments:

1. Verification of tax-exempt status as set forth above
2. List the names of any churches or other religious affiliated organizations that support the organization and the amount and type of support that it receives from these groups (see 5 above under Application Criteria)
3. List the ten largest contributors to the organization during the past five years and the total amount of support received from each of them during that time period
4. Organization's current operating budget together with year-to-date revenue and expenses compared with budget, and, if available, next year's operating budget
5. Project budget
6. List individually other funding sources for the project. Include amounts and whether received, committed or pending
7. Most recently submitted IRS Form 990
8. Organization's most recent audited financial statement
9. List of current board of directors
10. List and describe any issues, i.e. legal or accreditation, which might impact the organization's ability to successfully complete the project
11. Copies of any newspaper or periodical articles concerning the organization or the project, if desired
12. Letters of support, if desired
