

Note 1 Nature of Activities and Significant Accounting Policies

Nature Activities

The Community Foundation of Monroe County attracts, receives, holds and administers gifts, bequests, and devises of property whether on express trusts or otherwise, and the income and proceeds thereof, for the general welfare of the residents of Monroe County, Michigan. The Foundation strives to operate without discrimination as to race, color, creed, sex or age, and, to that end, to support and encourage religious, charitable, scientific, literary and educational programs of all kinds, that will foster improvement of the physical environment, improvement of living, working and social conditions, improvement of public health, prevention of crime or vice, and the amelioration of conditions resulting from crime, vice, or disaster.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Community Foundation of Monroe County have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and, accordingly, reflect all significant receivables, payables, and other liabilities.

Basis of Presentation

The Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: Unrestricted Net Assets, Temporarily Restricted Net Assets, and Permanently Restricted Net Assets. The bylaws of the Foundation include a variance provision that allows the Board of Trustees of the Foundation to modify the use of substantially all contributions received. The Board of Trustees strives to honor the donor's charitable intent, unless in their sole judgment that intent becomes, in effect, unnecessary, incapable of fulfillment or inconsistent with the charitable needs of the community or area served. Based on this variance provision, all assets of the Foundation have been classified as unrestricted with the exception of some assets that are restricted due to donor imposed restrictions that are to be satisfied by the actions of the Foundation. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the purpose of the Statement of Cash Flows, the Organization considers all highly liquid investments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents. Cash and cash equivalents also includes cash and cash equivalents in investment accounts.

Investments

Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the accompanying statement of activities. Investment income and gains and losses are reported as increases or decreases in unrestricted net assets and temporarily restricted net assets.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Contributed Services

During the years ended March 31, 2014 and 2013, the value of contributed services meeting the requirements for recognition in the financial statements was not material and has not been recorded. In addition, many individuals volunteer their time and perform a variety of tasks that assist the Organization, but these services do not meet the criteria for recognition as contributed services.

Office Equipment

Office equipment is capitalized at cost. It is the Foundation's policy to capitalize expenditures for these items in excess of \$500. Lesser amounts are expensed. Office equipment is being depreciated over estimated useful lives of three to seven years using a straight line method, with a half year's depreciation recognized in the years of acquisition and disposal.

Income Tax Status

The Organization is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. However, income from certain activities not directly related to the Organization's tax-exempt purpose would be subject to taxation as unrelated business income. However, the organization did not have unrelated business income. In addition, the Organization qualifies for the charitable contribution deduction under Section 170(b)(1)(A) and has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation under Section 509(a)(2).

The Community Foundation's forms 990, *Returns of Organizations Exempt from Income Tax*, for the years ending 2011, 2012, and 2013 are subject to examination by the IRS, generally for three years after they are filed.

Contributions

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions. Generally, contributions are recorded at fair market value when received.

Notes Receivable

Scholarship notes receivable are recorded net of allowances for uncollectible notes.

Contributions Receivable

Unconditional promises to give are recognized as contribution revenue and contributions receivable in the period in which the promise is received. Conditional promises are recognized as contribution revenue and receivables when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met.

Raising and Holding Contributions for Others

Contributions held for others are recorded as a liability and are included with the total amounts raised in the statement of activities.

Endowments

In August 2008, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued topic 958, *Endowments of Not-for-Profit Organizations: Net Asset Classifications of Funds Subject to an Enacted Version of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act, and Enhanced Disclosures for All Endowment Funds*. ASC Topic 958 provides guidance in the net asset classification of donor-restricted endowment funds for not-for-profit organization that is subject to an enacted version of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (“UPMIFA”).

The State of Michigan adopted UPMIFA effective September 10, 2009 (“SPMIFA”). The Community Foundation has adopted ASC Topic 958 for the year ended March 31, 2010. The Board of Trustees has determined that a majority of the Community Foundation’s net assets do not meet the definition of endowment funds under SPMIFA. The Community Foundation is governed by its Articles of Incorporation and most contributions are subject to the terms of these Articles of Incorporation. Certain contributions received are subject to gift instruments, agreements, or donor imposed restrictions that are to be satisfied by the actions of the Community Foundation.

Under the terms of the Articles of Incorporation and many of the gift instruments, the Board of Trustees has the ability to distribute so much of the corpus of any trust or separate gift, device, bequest, or fund as the Board in its sole judgment will determine. As a result of the ability to distribute corpus, all contributions not classified as temporarily restricted are classified as unrestricted for financial reporting purposes.

Subsequent Events

The Organization's management evaluated subsequent events from March 31, 2014 through June 30, 2014. The date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 Investments and Fair Value Measurements

The Community Foundation of Monroe County determines fair values by applying the following guidelines. If available, the Community Foundation uses market prices in active markets for identical assets and classifies these assets as Level 1. When the market prices for similar financial instruments in an active market are not available, the Community Foundation estimates fair value based on pricing models using matrix pricing and classifies these assets as Level 2. In situations where there is little or no market activity for same or similar financial instruments, the Community Foundation estimates fair value using its own assumptions about future cash flows and appropriate risk-adjusted discount rates and classifies these assets as Level 3. As of March 31, 2014 and 2013, the Community Foundation's investment holdings were all Level 1 assets. The Community Foundation did not have any level 2 or Level 3 assets during the reported years.

Note 10 Charitable Gift Annuities and Annuity Obligations

The Community Foundation utilizes charitable gift annuities in its fund raising activities. The Community Foundation of Monroe County has two contracts with donors to provide gift annuities. In return for contributions which totaled \$1,400,000, the Foundation agreed to pay a fixed annual annuity (payable quarterly) for the lifetime of the donors. The present value of the future expected payments related to the annuity has been recorded on the statement of financial position as an annuity obligation of \$121,181 as of March 31, 2014 and \$438,238 as of March 31, 2013. The interest rates used to calculate the present value of this liability range from 7.4%, for an annuity which began October 26, 2000, and 4.8% for an annuity which began December 31, 2001.

The present value of one annuity has been adjusted to \$5,000 to recognize the forgiveness of future payments under an amendment to the charitable gift annuity agreement. In accordance with the amendment, an endowment has been established in the donor's name.

Contributions received in the form of marketable securities are recognized as investments and related unrestricted revenues and other support to the extent that the fair value of the securities received exceed the estimated present value of the future payments to the individuals named in the contracts. Changes in the fair value of such annuity obligations are included in the statement of activities as annuity expense. Investment income as well as realized and unrealized gains related to the securities received for the charitable gift annuity are also included in the Statement of Activities as unrestricted revenues and other support. Upon the death of the donors and beneficiaries, the residual net assets will be recorded as an endowment specified by the donor.

Note 11 Contingent Liabilities

The Foundation has entered into two gift annuity agreements, which have become severely underfunded.

The first gift annuity was established in October, 2000, and was required to pay the annuitant \$15,000 per quarter for life. This is a two life last-to-die annuity. The present value of this annuity has been adjusted as of March 31, 2014 to recognize the forgiveness of future annuity obligations.

Note 12 Contributions Held for Others

Effective for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2001, the Organization began recording transfers of assets from other Not-For-Profit organizations to be used for special projects as contributions held for others. The Organization had \$254,330 as of March 31, 2014 and \$309,125 as of March 31, 2013 which consisted of donor established agency funds for special projects.

Note 13 Endowment Funds

The Foundation's endowment funds consist of 95 individual funds established for a variety of purposes. The endowment funds include both donor-restricted term endowment funds and funds designated by the Board of Trustees to function as endowments. As required by generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP), net assets associated with endowment funds, including funds designated by the Board of Trustees to function as endowments, are classified and reported based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions as well as variance power.

Interpretation of Relevant Law

The Board of Trustees of the Foundation follows the State of Michigan's version of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act effective September 10, 2009 (SPMIFA"). The Board of Trustees has interpreted the law as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the Board designated or donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary.

As a result of this interpretation, the Foundation classifies as permanently restricted net assets (a) the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment, (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument, if any, at the time the accumulation is added to the fund. The Foundation does not have any donor restricted endowment funds to report as permanently restricted. The remaining portion of the donor restricted endowment fund related to earnings is classified as temporarily restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the foundation in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by SPMIFA.

The Foundation classifies as unrestricted net assets (a) the original value of endowment gifts donated to the Foundation, (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the endowment, and (c) any earnings related to the endowment. See note 1 for further discussion related to net asset classification.

The accounting standards require that investment earnings on restricted net assets subject to UPMIFA to be classified as temporarily restricted until they are appropriated for expenditure by the Community Foundation. In addition, due to the variance power in the Community Foundations Articles of Incorporation and the powers of modification available in the individual endowment agreements, the Community Foundation has decided to designate those funds those endowment funds considered unrestricted.

Endowment Spending Policies

For the years ended March 31, 2014 and 2013, the Community Foundation had spending policy allowing for spending up to 3/4ths of spendable reserves of funds which had positive spendable reserve balances. Income available for spending is determined by market performance. The amount to be spent in the coming year is calculated each December 31 and is reviewed and approved by the Finance Committee annually.

Investment Policy Objectives

The overall, long-term investment goal of the Community Foundation is to achieve an annualized total return (net of fees and expenses), through appreciation and income, greater than the rate of inflation (as measured by the broad, domestic Consumer Price Index) plus 5%, thus protecting the assets against inflation. The assets are to be managed in a manner that will maximize the benefits intended by the donor. The objective is to pursue capital appreciation assuming a moderate amount of risk together with a reasonable amount of income. The investments will achieve this objective through a diversified portfolio of common stocks, mutual funds, fixed income securities, and money market funds.

Strategy

The Board and Finance Committee agree that investing in securities with higher return expectations outweighs their short-term volatility risks. As a result, the majority of assets will be invested in equity-like securities. Fixed income securities will be used to lower the short-term volatility of the portfolio and to provide income stability, especially during periods of weak or negative equity markets. Cash is not a strategic asset of the portfolio, but is a residual to the investment process and used to meet short-term liquidity needs.
