FORM 990EZ – FYE MARCH 31, 2014

NARAL Pro-Choice Missouri has a thriving internship and young-adult outreach program. Drawing from diverse college campuses, NARAL in Missouri had a dozen summer interns. They are interested in politics, marketing, graphic design, social media, web design, communications, marketing, and grassroots activism. Working with staff, they managed a very impressive social network presence, made YouTube videos on issues of importance to Missourians, and educated Missourians about women's health and potential political threats. Staff, interns, and hundreds of volunteers organized against dozens of threats to women's reproductive rights and health in the last legislative session in Missouri. The organization helped to organize media campaigns and wrote op-ed pieces and editorials in support of a woman's right to choose continuing a pregnancy to term, having healthy babies, offering children for adoption and, within the limits of the law, terminating a pregnancy.

On a grassroots level, the organization gained hundreds of new activists. We held visibility events to heighten public awareness about judicial rulings affecting access to reproductive healthcare, on multiple occasions. We knew that at least three potential anti-choice laws might pass, and we alerted our grassroots activists and campus representatives and supplied them with messaging points. The organization also provided briefing papers to the public about pending legislation. Representatives on college campuses distributed safe sex, "No Means No" pamphlets, and condoms.

Over the past 10 years, the organization has advocated about matters regarding contraceptive access, rape survivors' access to emergency contraception in emergency rooms, access to Title X services, the efficacy of crisis pregnancy centers and the materials they choose to use, the landscape of sex ed in Missouri, and a host of other topics related to reproductive rights. This past year was not different, featuring a dozen educational forums and grassroots activities, in cooperation with our allies.

The organization has actively recruited young people and people of color. With some 25 organizational allies, all working for the health and safety of Missouri women and families, we sought to protect human and women's rights and the rights of families, worked with faith-community allies, and organized against threats posed by the legislature, policymakers, and in the community generally—to protect the women and families of Missouri, as our mission dictates.
