Mentor Denton stands out as a collaborative effort between United Way of Denton County, Denton Independent School District, Communities in Schools, University of North Texas, Texas Woman's University and other local organizations. Mentor Denton responds to Denton County's growing population of at risk children in an effort to match each child with a qualified mentor. The Initiative is made popular by its "One kid. Twenty two agencies serving Denton County were provided with funds to maintain a "safety net" of services for those residents most in need. All agencies that received funds provided services that fall under at least one of the following focus areas:

Education: Preparing children and youth to achieve their potential

Income: Promoting financial stability and independence

Health: Improving People's Health

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Funding decisions are based on recognized existing and emerging needs in Denton County. Three teams of community volunteers reviewed the community needs assessment and evaluated partner agency programming, outcomes and financials to determine the most effective use of funds.

Funding for this process comes from UWDC's annual fundraising campaign which is conducted with the help of hundreds of local companies and volunteers. The campaign includes workplace and individual solicitation and corporate donations and sponsorships. Funded partner agencies participate in this process by providing outcome information and numbers served, providing speakers for presentations, and conducting internal fundraising campaigns within their offices. UWDC also provides donors the opportunity to designate their donations to local agencies. Local agencies must annually verify compliance with provisions of the USA Patriot Act and verify they are an agency in good standing as an IRS Code Section 501(c)3 non-profit organization.

During the 2013-2014 funding year, UWDC was able to distribute a total of \$685,000 to our 20 partner agencies.

Through these partnerships, UWDC partner agencies were able to assist more than 57,500 individuals and families in Denton County in 2013.

Population growth, changes in area demographics and the local economy influence and often stress the public and nonprofit health and human services.

Outside factors also have a profound effect in determining the local needs. Federal and state government changes have a major impact on community agencies' abilities to provide the needed services as well as on the individuals who receive governmental assistance. The rapid population growth of the community and the constantly changing government funding priorities require regular community assessments.

The community needs assessment provides essential information to

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develop a long-term plan for health and human services based on socio-economic trends and long-standing health, housing, and human service issues.

In March 2012, United Way of Denton County published a needs assessment for Denton County, and continues to update the data on an annual basis, or as new data becomes available.

Denton County, Texas encompasses 957 square miles and is comprised of eleven (11) school districts; over 20 incorporated cities or towns as well as substantial unincorporated areas. The City of Denton is the county seat as well as the largest City in Denton County and is located in a metropolitan triangle formed by Dallas located 38 miles to the southeast and Fort Worth located 38 miles to the southwest. Denton is experiencing strong growth along with other communities in the Dallas-Ft. Worth Metropolitan area. The City's population increased by 40.8% from 2000 to 2010 and the County grew by 53% during that same time.

In addition, United Way of Denton County published a Mental Health Report for Denton in August 2013. As a result of the significant findings from the report the Citizen's Council for Mental Health was formed and meets on a monthly basis throughout the year to educate and harness additional resources to provide mental health to Denton County.

EDUCATION INITIATIVES &amp; GRANTS

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Sanger ISD Impact Grant

Through a new grant to Sanger Independent School District for the 2013-2014 School Year, children in need receive backpacks of school supplies, new clothes and food for the weekends. Through a community impact grant of \$12,000 UWDC was able to strengthen the office of the homeless liaison to improve lives in the Sanger Community.

Pre-Kindergarten Initiative

In January 2013 United Way of Denton County, in partnership with the Denton Independent School District and the City of Denton formed the Pre-K Coalition and began working on a plan to distribute the "Ready Rosie" early learning resource to the community. Ready Rosie is a 2 minute video that is emailed to a parent or caregiver on a daily basis that models an activity that can be done with their child that will prepare them for success when they start Kindergarten. In its first year, the Coalition signed up over 3,650 preschool and kindergarten children for this resource.

## THE FINANCIAL STABILITY INITIATIVES &amp; GRANTS

In 2007, United Way of Denton County launched a new initiative to promote financial stability among low-to-moderate income families and individuals in Denton County. This initiative has continued and grown in 2012.

Through the VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) Program, United Way of Denton County operates free tax-preparation sites for low-to-moderate income workers, educating filers on the Earned Income Tax Credit and the Child Tax Credit, and offering choices of how to invest their refunds to benefit the financial health of their families. VITA sites are located in Denton, Sanger and Little Elm, and are staffed by IRS certified volunteers who are trained specifically to offer free tax preparation.

During the 2013 tax season the UWDC VITA program was able to provide 59 free tax preparation dates, at 5 different sites, over a period of two and half months. During this time volunteers prepared and submitted 656 tax returns and served 754 individuals.

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The IRS estimates that the average out-of-pocket cost incurred by taxpayers to prepare and submit their returns is \$242 per return. Based on this calculation, the United Way of Denton County VITA program saved residents roughly \$157,784 in tax preparation alone. During the 2013 tax year, volunteer tax preparers found over \$381,558 in Earned Income Tax Credits and had \$1,062,151 in Federal refunds issued.

## COMMUNITY EDUCATION

UWDC has provided management assistance, training and supportive services to over many local agencies and organizations that serve Denton County.

UWDC conducted 10 training/networking meetings for local funded partner agencies that covered topics such as fundraising, volunteer management, community initiatives and collaboration. These were all topics that were requested needs by partner agency staff leadership. Participation rates for these services by our 20 partner agencies were 65%.

## Project Blueprint

United Way of Denton County's Project Blueprint: Board Leadership Training program is designed to train community volunteers to become qualified, quality board members of non-profit organizations in Denton County. The training consists of a series of meetings where the following areas are taught:

Governance (Mission Statements, Vision Statements, Developing & Reviewing Programs, Funding Relationships, Policies, Strategic Planning, Board Self-Assessment)

Board and Agency Relations (Recruitment, Succession Planning, Tenure, Diversity, Human Resources, Personnel Policies, Board vs. Staff Roles)



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Operations of the Board (Board Functions & Responsibilities, Meetings, Committees, Code of Ethics, Conflicts of Interest, Bylaws, Legal Issues & Insurance, Job Descriptions)

Finance (Budgets, Financial Statements, Accounting Policies & Reporting, Investments, Management & Oversight, 990's, Audits)

Fundraising/Marketing (Special Events, Types of Giving, Fundraising Plans and Goals, Fundraising Ethics, Marketing Plans, Public Relations)

Each module taught is presented by an expert in that field, with attendance requirements and group exercises. Each graduate of Project Blueprint will be placed for service with UWDC or introduced to an agency that matches their interests and passion.

In 2013 UWDC Certified 19 community leaders through the Board Training Program.
