patients only the amounts that would normally be paid by insurance companies are
considered bad debt (ie bad debt is not calculated on gross charges but rather on
average realizable commercial rates).

In order to calculate the estimate of bad debt expense attributable to charity care
the Company reviewed household income statistics from the 2007-2012 American
Community Survey for all cities within a 10 mile radius of the hospital campus and

200% of the Federal Poverty Limit threshhold.
The calculated amount was not included in the community benefit summary above as the
Company requires a sucessfully completed charity care application for an account to
be included in the charity care at cost line above.

Part III, Line 4 - Bad Debt Expense
The Company's patient accounts receivable are reduced by allowances for contractual
adjustments and doubtful accounts. In evaluating the collectability of patient
accounts receivable, the Company analyzes its past history and identifies trends for
each of its major payor sources of revenue to estimate the appropriate allowances
for both contractual adjustments and doubtful accounts and provision for bad debts.
Management regularly reviews data about these major payor sources of revenue in
evaluating the sufficiency of these allowances. The difference between the standard
rates (or the discounted rates if negotiated) and the amounts actually collected
after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against
the allowance for doubtful accounts.
The Company's allowance for doubtful accounts increased from 6.7 percent of gross
patient accounts receivable at March 31, 2013 to 8.2 percent of gross patient
accounts receivable at March 31, 2014. In addition, the Company's write-offs were
approximately \$864,000 and \$497,000 for the years ended March 31, 2014 and 2013,
respectively. The Company has not changed its charity care or uninsured discount
policies during 2014 or 2013.

Part VI - Needs Assessment
The Community That Casa Colina Serves
The community that Casa Colina serves is composed of persons with or at risk of
disabilities, that is, those persons within the larger community who have or are at
risk of having a condition that compromises their function in physical or cognitive
domains.
Geographically, about 80% of Casa Colina's patients come from a radius of 15 miles
from Casa Colina's main campus in Pomona, CA. This is roughly described by the 21
cities that make up the 917xx postal codes, from Rancho Cucamonga to West Covina in
the foothills of the San Bernardino Mountains. Particular programs have a more
regional catchment area and specialty programs such as brain injury and spinal cord
injury rehabilitation attract patients from a much larger area, extending to the
western states and the Pacific rim of the U.S.
In general, disability can become an issue for any person, whether acquired from an
