APPLICATION GUIDELINES

HISTORY

The Louis W. and Dolpha Baehr Charitable Foundation Trust was founded in 1967 by Mr. and Mrs. L. W. Baehr, longtime residents of Paola, Kansas. After coming to Paola in the early 1900's, they spent the balance of their lives working toward the growth and well-being of the Paola Community. The Baehr's were generous in their giving. Though they gave to many worthy causes, their greatest joy came from helping people—especially young people.

RESOURCES

The corporate trustee of the funds is First Option Bank Trust Department of Paola, Kansas. Current Trustees are: **Kathy Lovig, Chairman**, Dr. Robert E. Banks, Carl W. Hartley, Artie Stuteville, Gregg Lewis, Phil McLaughlin and Blake Heid.

EVALUATION GUIDELINES

1. The requesting organization must qualify for tax exempt status under Section 501(C) 3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, for such purposes as constitutes public charitable purposes
2. The requesting organization's structure and management, including establishing of objectives, budget and board of directors and staff responsibilities
3. Possible duplication of government or private sector efforts
4. Whether, and how, the success or failure of the program can be effectively measured
5. The programs' impact on the community

LIMITATIONS

Because we cannot fund every worthwhile endeavor, we direct our resources to those areas where we feel the most critical needs exist and where our support can have the greatest impact. ***In general, the Foundation does NOT consider funding the following:***

1. Organizations and causes outside the Kansas City area and the eastern half of Kansas
2. Organizations and programs designed to influence legislation or elect candidates to public office
3. Agencies which are operating as chapters of a state or national organization
4. Individuals
5. Sectarian or religious organizations whose services are limited to members of any one religious group
6. Tickets or tables for benefit purposes
7. Advertising for benefit purposes
8. Loans or investments

RECIPIENT ACCOUNTABILITY

It is the responsibility of the grant recipient to ensure that the grant is used for the purpose indicated in the grant request. In certain cases, the recipient may be asked to sign a statement to this effect. If for any reason the grant is used for other than the stated purpose, the Foundation reserves the right to withdraw funding.

HOW TO APPLY

All requests for grants from not-for-profit, tax exempt organizations should be submitted on the organization's stationery and must include the following information:

- A. Description of the project
- B. Specific amount requested
- C. Verification of community need
- D. Challenge to be addressed
- E. Name, address & phone number of organization
- F. Target group for project
- G. Project goals, timetable & method of achieving the goals
- H. Itemized budget for the project
- I. Brief history of the organization and its prior accomplishments, or a copy of its most recent annual report
- J. Audit report for the latest completed fiscal year and a statement of current operating budget, including fund-raising costs
- K. Copy of the IRS Determination Letter
- L. Statement of whether proposal has been submitted to other sources for support, including a listing of those sources and amounts
- M. Listing of board of directors and officers of the organization and their affiliations
- N. Agreement to report to the Baehr Foundation evaluation procedures and final results of programs to which we have offered support
- O. Name, address & phone number of a primary contact person**

Meetings are currently scheduled for April and September. However, applying organizations should confirm meeting dates prior to submitting requests by contacting either **Kathy Lovig at (913) 294-3811** or **Betty Hewitt at (913) 294-3811**. Eight copies of the proposal must be received at least four weeks prior to the month in which the request is to be reviewed. Following receipt of a proposal, final decision can be given within a period of twelve weeks, at which time the requesting organization will be sent written notification of the status of the request. Multiple proposals in a single calendar year from one organization are discouraged.

The rejection of a proposal should not be construed as a negative reaction to a particular organization or project, but rather as a selective choice on the part of the Baehr Foundation Trustees to use limited resources in an alternative fashion.
