Note 1: Nature of Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Organization

Taos Health Systems. Inc (the Organization), located in Taos. New Mexico, is a not-for-profit 29-bed acute care hospital along with specialty clinics as further described below. The Organization provides inpatient, outpatient, emergency care and clinical services for residents of Taos County and surrounding areas.

In 2008, the Organization established two 100% owned affiliates, MOMs and Taos Surgical Specialists (TSS) MOMs operates as an obstetrics a gynecology clinic and TSS is a surgery clinic These affiliates, along with the Rural Health Clinic (RHC) in Peñasco, New Mexico, comprise the reporting entity Taos Professional Services (TPS) Effective June 1, 2013, the Organization became the sole owner in Taos Sports Medicine Services, LLC (TSM) The Organization previously held a majority interest in this subsidiary

The Organization has a management agreement with Quorum Health Resources (Quorum), a healthcare management company, to supervise and direct the daily operations of the Organization The agreement expires in April 30, 2016 Management fees were \$1,173,836 and \$1,174,945 in 2014 and 2013, respectively. The Organization was provided other services by Quorum outside of the management agreement, which approximated \$0 and \$82,000 in 2014 and 2013, respectively. Fees for the other services provided by Quorum are included in the caption purchased services in the accompanying statements of operations.

Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements include the accounts of Holy Cross Hospital (the Hospital). TPS and TSM All material intercompany accounts and transactions have been eliminated in consolidation. The outside investor's noncontrolling interest in TSM is included in the Organization's financial statements as a noncontrolling interest in subsidiary as of May 31, 2013. Effective June 1, 2013, TSM became a wholly owned subsidiary.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the consolidated financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements May 31, 2014 and 2013

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Organization considers all liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents. At May 31, 2014 and 2013, cash equivalents consisted primarily of money market accounts with brokers and certificates of deposit

At May 31, 2014, the Organization's cash accounts exceeded federally insured limits by approximately \$2,080,000

Short-term Investments

Short-term investments consist of investments with original maturities between three months and one year. The short-term investments consist of certificates of deposit. At times, such investments may be in excess of the FDIC insurance limit, however, the Organization has not experienced any losses in such accounts.

Investments and Investment Return

Investments in equity securities having a readily determinable fair value and in all debt securities are carried at fair value. The investment in equity investee is reported on the equity method of accounting. Other investments are valued at the lower of cost (or fair value at time of donation, if acquired by contribution) or fair value. Investment return includes dividend, interest and other investment income, realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments carried at fair value, and realized gains and losses on other investments.

Investment return that is initially restricted by donor stipulation and for which the restriction will be satisfied in the same year is included in unrestricted net assets. Other investment return is reflected in the consolidated statements of operations and changes in net assets as unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted based upon the existence and nature of any donor or legally imposed restrictions

Assets Limited as to Use

Assets limited as to use primarily include investments held in brokerage accounts as collateral for the outstanding notes payable and designated assets set aside by the Board of Directors (the Board) for future capital improvements, over which the Board retains control and may at its discretion subsequently use for other purposes

Patient Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are reduced by an allowance for doubtful accounts. In evaluating the collectibility of accounts receivable, the Organization analyzes its past history and identifies trends for each of its major payer sources of revenue to estimate the appropriate allowance for doubtful accounts and provision for uncollectible accounts. Management regularly reviews data about these major payer sources of revenue in evaluating the sufficiency of the allowance for doubtful accounts.

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements May 31, 2014 and 2013

For receivables associated with self-pay patients (which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances due for which third-party coverage exists for part of the bill), the Organization records a significant provision for uncollectible accounts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible. The difference between the standard rates (or the discounted rates if negotiated or provided by policy) and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts

The Organization's allowance for doubtful accounts for self-pay patients decreased from 70% of self-pay accounts receivable at May 31, 2013, to 67% of self-pay accounts receivable at May 31, 2014. In addition, the Organization write-offs decreased approximately \$600,000 from approximately \$7.6 million for the year ended May 31, 2013 to approximately \$7.0 million for the year ended May 31, 2014. Both decreases were the result of Medicaid expansion. The decrease in write-offs was also due in part from the reduction in overall revenue.

Supplies

The Organization states supply inventories at cost, determined using the first-in, first-out method

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment acquisitions are recorded at cost. Assets are capitalized if the cost is greater than \$2,000. Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful life (3 to 40 years) of each class of depreciable assets and is computed on the straight-line method. Equipment under capital leases is amortized on the straight-line method over a shorter period of the lease term or the estimated useful life of the equipment.

The estimated useful lives for each major depreciable classification of property and equipment are as follows

Buildings and improvements 3 - 40 years Equipment 3 - 10 years

Long-lived Asset Impairment

The Organization evaluates the recoverability of the carrying value of long-lived assets whenever events or circumstances indicate the carrying amount may not be recoverable. If a long-lived asset is tested for recoverability and the undiscounted estimate future cash flows expected to result from the use and eventual disposition of the asset is less than the carrying amount of the asset, the asset cost is adjusted to fair value and an impairment loss is recognized as the amount by which the carrying amount of a long-lived asset exceeds its fair value.

No asset impairment was recognized during the years ended May 31, 2014 and 2013

Investment Accounted for Under the Equity Method

The Organization has a 50% ownership interest in Taos Community Health Plan. Inc., a Physician Hospital Organization (PHO) created to present a united group of health care providers to negotiate contracts with managed care organizations. This investment is accounted for under the equity method of accounting. Under the equity method, the original investment is recorded at cost and adjusted by the Organization's share of undistributed earnings or losses of this entity.

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use by the Organization has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose

Net Patient Service Revenue

The Organization has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments to the Organization at amounts different from its established rates. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net amounts realizable from patients, third-party payers and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payers. Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined.

Charity Care

The Organization provides care to patients who meet certain criteria under its charity care policy without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Because the Organization does not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care, they are not reported as net patient service revenue. The Organization's direct and indirect costs for services furnished under its charity care policy aggregated approximately \$777,000 and \$1,124,000 in 2014 and 2013, respectively.

Income Taxes

The Organization has been recognized as exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and a similar provision of state law. However, the Organization is subject to federal income tax on any unrelated business taxable income

The Organization files tax returns in the U S federal jurisdiction. With a few exceptions, the Organization is no longer subject to U S federal examinations by tax authorities for years before 2010.

The taxable income of TSM, if any, is reported to the individual members for inclusion in the member's tax return

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements May 31, 2014 and 2013

Deficiency of Revenues Over Expenses

The consolidated statements of operations includes deficiency of revenues over expenses. Changes in unrestricted net assets which are excluded from deficiency of revenues over expenses, consistent with industry practice, include unrealized gains and losses on investments other than trading securities, permanent transfers of assets to and from affiliates for other than goods and services, and contributions of long-lived assets (including assets acquired using contributions which by donor restriction were to be used for the purpose of acquiring such assets)

Self Insurance

The Organization has elected to self-insure certain costs related to employee health and accident benefit programs. Costs resulting from noninsured losses are charged to income when incurred. The Organization has purchased insurance that limits its exposure for individual claims and that limits its aggregate exposure to \$85,000.

Electronic Health Records Incentive Program

The Electronic Health Records Incentive Program, enacted as part of the *American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009*, provides for one-time incentive payments under both the Medicare and Medicaid programs to eligible hospitals that demonstrate meaningful use of certified electronic health records technology (EHR) Payments under the Medicare program are generally made for up to four years based on a statutory formula. Payments under the Medicaid program are generally made for up to four years based upon a statutory formula, as determined by the state, which is approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Payment under both programs are contingent on the Organization continuing to meet escalating meaningful use criteria and any other specific requirements that are applicable for the reporting period. The final amount for any payment year is determined based upon an audit by the fiscal intermediary. Events could occur that would cause the final amounts to differ materially from the initial payments under the program

In fiscal year 2012 and 2013, the Organization completed the first-year and second-year requirements under the Medicaid program and had recorded revenue of approximately \$1,900,000 Subsequent to receiving payment. Medicaid completed an audit of EHR, resulting in a refund of \$748,000 Medicare year one began in fiscal year 2013, which \$95,000 of revenue had been recorded. The Organization has recognized the incentive payment revenue received for qualified EHR technology expenditures during the period in which management was reasonably assured meaningful use was achieved and the earnings process was complete.

Reclassifications

Certain 2013 financial information has been reclassified to conform to the 2014 presentation. These reclassifications did not affect the excess of revenues over expenses, total assets, total liabilities or total net assets.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through the date of the Independent Auditor's Report, which is the date the consolidated financial statements were available to be issued

Note 2: Net Patient Service Revenue

Arrangements with Third-party Payers

The Organization recognizes patient service revenue associated with services provided to patients who have third-party payer coverage on the basis of contractual rates for the services rendered. For uninsured patients that do not qualify for charity care, the Organization recognizes revenue on the basis of its standard rates for services provided (or on the basis of discounted rates, if negotiated or provided by policy). On the basis of historical experience, a significant portion of the Organization's uninsured patients will be unable or unwilling to pay for the services provided. Thus, the Organization records a significant provision for uncollectible accounts related to uninsured patients in the period the services are provided. This provision for uncollectible accounts is presented on the consolidated statements of operations as a component of net patient service revenue.

The Organization has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments to the Organization at amounts different from its established rates. A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payers follows

Medicare Inpatient acute care services and outpatient services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic and other factors. Inpatient non-acute services and defined capital are paid based on a cost reimbursement methodology. The Organization is reimbursed for cost reimbursable items at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Organization and audits thereof by the Medicare fiscal intermediary.

Medicaid Inpatient and outpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries through October 31, 2010 were reimbursed under a cost reimbursement methodology. The Organization was reimbursed at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Organization and audits thereof by the Medicaid fiscal intermediary.

The New Mexico Medicaid program implemented a new hospital outpatient payment reimbursement based on a simplified Medicare APC method effective November 1, 2010. The outpatient prospective payment system (OPPS) reimbursements were set to 100% of the Medicare standard rate. Under the new payment method cost reports will still be required, however cost report settlements are discontinued.

Other Third-party Payers The Organization has also entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers, health maintenance organizations and preferred provider organizations. The basis for payment to the Organization under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates per discharge, discounts from established charges, and prospectively determined daily rates.

Patient service revenue, net of contractual allowances and discounts (but before the provision for uncollectible accounts), recognized in the years ended May 31, 2014 and 2013, respectively, was approximately

The Organization has a \$5 million revolving line of credit. At May 31, 2014 and 2013, there was \$508,430 and \$401,139, respectively, borrowed against this line. The line is collateralized by substantially all of the Organization's assets limited as to use investments and is payable on demand. Revolving credit agreement bears interest at LIBOR plus 1.75%

Note 8: Pension Plan

In June 1998, a collective bargaining agreement was entered into by the Organization and the Professional Performance Association, affiliated with District 1199 NM. National Union of Hospital and Health Care Employees, AFSCME AFL-CIO As part of this agreement, a defined contribution pension plan (the Plan) was established under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code as of that same date Effective April 1, 2012, an amended collective bargaining agreement was entered into by the aforementioned parties

Under the agreement as amended, the Organization agreed to continue to maintain a qualified, long-term, tax-deferred savings plan Effective January 1, 2013, for employees earning less than \$35,250 annually, the Organization will match dollar-for-dollar, the employee's contribution to the Plan up to \$705 annually. For employees earning more than \$35,250 annually and who contribute at least \$705, the Organization will match dollar-for-dollar the employee's contribution up to 20% of the employee's annual compensation, not to exceed \$2,500 annually. Only employees eighteen (18) years of age or older qualify. Members of the Plan will be vested in the Plan on a five (5) year graduated schedule, but fully vested no later than the employee's sixty-fifth (65th) birthday. The Organization will appoint a plan administrator, prepare and distribute summary plan descriptions, and assist the plan administrator in distributing reports to individual participants no less frequently than annually, and pay all direct administrative costs to operate the Plan

All employees, whether represented by the bargaining unit or not, who meet the eligibility requirements are eligible to participate and receive the contributions as noted above

Note 9: Operating Leases

The Organization has entered into a lease arrangement with the county of Taos. New Mexico requiring a 10-year rent prepayment and the purchase a new ambulance every two years on a calendar year basis. The current estimated cost of the ambulance payable in calendar year 2014 is \$140,000. This amount is amortized over a two year period and recorded as rent expense. This cost is re-evaluated every two year period.

The Organization has various operating leases for buildings and equipment. Total expense approximated \$1,327,698 in 2014 and \$1,224,689 in 2013 for all operating leases. The following is a schedule by year of future minimum lease payments for the building and equipment under non-cancelable operating leases as of May 31, 2014 which have initial or remaining lease terms in excess of one year.

Note 10: Commitments and Contingencies

Labor Agreements

At May 31, 2014, 308 of the Organization's 415 employees and at May 31, 2013, 300 of the Organization's 432 employees work under collective bargaining agreements. The current collective bargaining agreement is set to expire on May 30, 2015. Management intends to begin renegotiations during calendar year 2014.

Employee Health Insurance

The Organization maintains a stop-loss agreement with an insurance company to limit its losses on individual claims related to group employee insurance. Under the current terms of this agreement, the Organization's claims liability is limited to \$85,000 per employee per plan year. As of May 31, 2014 and 2013, the Organization accrued employee insurance claims of \$401,504 and \$298,409, respectively, which are included in accounts payable in the accompanying consolidated balance sheets.

Stop-loss premiums and claims payments totaling \$2,193,862 and \$1,906,798 were expended during the years ended May 31, 2014 and 2013, respectively, and are included in the employee benefits expense in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations

Professional Liability Insurance

The Organization purchases medical malpractice insurance a under a claims-made policy. Under such a policy, only claims made and reported to the insurer during the policy term, regardless of when the incidents giving rise to the claims occurred, are covered. The Organization also purchases excess umbrella liability coverage, which provides additional coverage above the basic policy limits up to the amount specified in the umbrella policy.

Based upon the Organization's claims experience, an accrual had been made for the Organization's estimated medical malpractice costs, including costs associated with litigating or settling claims, under its malpractice insurance policy, amounting to approximately \$1,415,000 as of May 31, 2014 and 2013. It is reasonably possible that this estimate could change materially in the near term

Workers' Compensation Insurance

The Organization is insured under the New Mexico Hospital Workers' Compensation Group for the purpose of providing insurance coverage for workers' compensation. The policy is a retrospectively rated policy whose premiums accrue based on the ultimate cost of the experience of a group of participating health care entities. The Organization expensed approximately \$294,000 and \$299,000 in workers' compensation premiums during 2014 and 2013, respectively. Such amounts are included in employee benefits expense in the accompanying consolidated statements of operations.

Cost Report Settlements

The Organization's Medicare cost reports have been final settled for fiscal years through May 31, 2010, and Medicaid cost reports have been final settled for fiscal years through May 31, 2011. In management's opinion, the estimated third-party settlement receivable of \$116,163 and \$245,496 at May 31, 2014 and May 31, 2013, respectively, is currently management's best estimate of the remaining cost reports settlements. Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term Estimates are continually monitored and reviewed, and as settlements are made or more information is available to improve estimates, differences are reflected in current operations.

Safety Net Care Pool

The Organization receives Sole Community Provider Funding to compensate the Organization for providing health care to the indigent population in Taos County. The funding is subject to annual reviews and approvals by Taos County as well as the State of New Mexico Human Services. Department. In fiscal years 2014 and 2013, the Organization recognized Sole Community Provider Funding of \$4,353,784 and \$2,402,934, respectively. Such amounts are reported as other revenue in the accompanying consolidated financial statements. Management expects to receive a similar

amount of funding in fiscal year 2015 as in fiscal year 2014, however, funding in periods beyond calendar year-end 2014 is uncertain. This funding has been essential to the Organization's financial results and as a result of the decline in funding and uncertainty over future funding, management has implemented a variety of measures aimed at reducing costs and enhancing revenue.

Note 12: Fair Value Measurements

Management uses a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows

- **Level 1** Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the reporting entity can access at the measurement date
- **Level 2** Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly
- Level 3 Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The Organization has no Level 3 investments. In addition, the Organization had no transfers between levels during the years ended May 31, 2014 and 2013.
