#### NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

**Purpose of Foundation** – The Oregon Tech Foundation (Foundation) is an Oregon nonprofit corporation chartered December 30, 1969. It secured exemption from federal income tax in accordance with Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and is classified as an organization other than a private foundation by letter dated October 10, 1992. Contributions to the Foundation are tax deductible as a charitable contribution under the Internal Revenue Code.

The purpose of the Foundation is to promote the educational, cultural, charitable, and service functions of the Oregon Institute of Technology. Funding for the Foundation's activities is primarily provided by public and corporate donations. Most expenses of the Foundation are paid directly by the Oregon Institute of Technology and then reimbursed through the Foundation. These expenses are categorized in the statement of activities and the supplemental schedule of management and general expenses.

The Foundation's Board of Directors consisted of 22 individuals during the 2013-2014 fiscal year. The executive director manages the day-to-day administration of the Foundation.

Basis of Presentation – The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Net assets and revenues, gains, and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets of the Foundation and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

- *Unrestricted* Support received that is not subject to donor-imposed restrictions and over which the Board of Directors has discretionary control is classified as unrestricted.
- Temporarily Restricted Support received subject to donor-imposed use restrictions or time
  restrictions that will be met either through actions of the Foundation or by the passage of
  time is classified as temporarily restricted. In the period donor restrictions are met,
  temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the
  statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.
- Permanently Restricted Support received subject to donor-imposed restrictions stipulating
  that funds be invested in perpetuity is classified as permanently restricted. In accordance
  with purposes stipulated by donors, earnings from such funds may be either unrestricted or
  temporarily restricted.

## NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Cash and Cash Equivalents – All highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less at acquisition are considered to be cash and cash equivalents unless subject to donor-imposed restrictions that limits their use to long-term purposes such as endowments. Cash with restrictions are reported as an investment.

Accounts receivable – Accounts receivable are recorded at the amount management expects to collect. Management believes that all outstanding accounts receivable are collectible in full; therefore, no allowance for uncollectible receivables has been provided. Accounts receivable consist of an anticipated amount from an estate that the Foundation was beneficiary of.

Investments – Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair value. The alternative investments, which are not readily marketable, are carried at estimated fair values as provided by the investment managers. The Foundation reviews and evaluates the values provided by the investment managers and agrees with the valuation methods and assumptions used in determining the fair value of the alternative investments. Changes in unrealized gains and losses are reported in the accompanying statement of activities and changes in net assets.

Investment in privately held stock is accounted for under the cost method. Under this method, investments are carried at the lower of cost or market and are reviewed annually for impairment. A decline in the fair value of any available-for-sale security below cost that is deemed to be other-than-temporary results in an impairment reducing the carrying amount to fair value. The impairment is charged to earnings and a new cost basis for the security is established. For the year ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, no impairment was recorded.

Investment in a limited partnership is accounted for under the cost method. Under this method, investments are carried at the lower of cost or market and are reviewed annually for impairment. Dividends received are recognized as income when received. For the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, no impairment was recorded.

Collections – The Foundation capitalizes collection items displayed and used in the fulfillment of its purposes. Collection items are recorded at cost if purchased and at fair value at date of accession if donated. The Foundation does not depreciate collection items that are protected, kept unencumbered, cared for, and preserved.

### NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Unconditional Promises to Give – Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to the Foundation that is, in substance, unconditional. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the fiscal year in which the contributions are recognized. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets. Promises to give expected to be collected in future years are recorded at the present value of estimated future cash flows using a discount rate of 0.77% and 0.20% as of June 30, 2014 and 2013, respectively.

The Foundation uses the allowance method to determine uncollectible unconditional promises receivable. The allowance is based on prior years' experience and management's analysis of specific promises to give. As of June 30, 2014 and 2013, the allowance was \$52,039 and \$14,800, respectively.

One pledge made up approximately 75% and 65% of total pledges at June 30, 2014 and 2013, respectively.

**Donated Services** – The Foundation receives donated services from a variety of unpaid volunteers assisting the Foundation in its program services. No amounts have been recognized in the accompanying statement of activities because the criteria for recognition of such volunteer efforts have not been satisfied. In addition, the Foundation receives services and facility use from Oregon Institute of Technology. No amounts have been estimated for these services.

In-Kind Contributions and Expenses – The Foundation received donated items which have been recorded at their estimated fair value. Total in-kind donations for the years ending June 30, 2014 and 2013, are \$88,980 and \$45,783, respectively.

Grants and Contributions – The Foundation receives some contributions as grants from private companies and non-profit organizations. These contributions have reporting requirements that the Foundation must comply with. These grants have been reported with contributions revenue.

Income Taxes – The Foundation is a not-for-profit organization which is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Foundation is required to pay income taxes on its unrelated business income received from a partnership interest and affinity program royalties. The Foundation accounts for income taxes under the asset and liability

#### NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

method. Under this method, deferred income taxes are established for the differences between the financial reporting and income tax basis of assets and liabilities as well as operating loss and tax credit carry-forwards. Deferred tax assets are reduced by a valuation allowance when, in the opinion of management, it is more likely than not that some portion of the deferred tax assets will not be realized. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using enacted tax rates expected to apply to taxable income in the years in which those temporary differences are expected to be recovered or settled. The effect on deferred tax assets and liabilities in tax rates is recognized in income in the period that includes the enactment date.

The Foundation's federal Exempt Organizations Business income tax returns (Form 990T) for 2013, 2012 and 2011 are subject to examination by the IRS, generally for three years after they are filed.

Use of Estimates – Preparation of the financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimated. Significant estimates include allowance for uncollectible promises to give, fair value of alternative investments and other investments, actuarial assumptions used to compute annuity and life income obligations and estimated bequests.

**Reclassifications** – Certain accounts in the prior year financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the presentation of the current year financial statements. These reclassifications have no effect on previously reported changes in net assets.

#### **NOTE 2 – INVESTMENTS**

At June 30, 2014, the Foundation had approximately \$4,587,421 in investments with underlying investments that are not readily marketable. These investments are in liability corporations, off-shore investment funds, partnerships and privately held stock. Such investments represent 21.4% of the total investments and 20.2% of net assets at June 30, 2014. These investments contain elements of both credit and market risk. Such risks include, but are not limited to, limited liquidity, absence of regulatory oversight, dependence on key individuals, emphasis on speculative investments, and nondisclosure of full portfolio composition. Because these investments are not readily marketable, their estimated values are subject to uncertainty and, therefore, may differ from the value that would have been used had a ready market for such investments existed. Such differences could be significant.

#### NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL ASSETS AND FINANCIAL LIABILITIES

FASB ASC 820 establishes a hierarchy that prioritizes fair value measurements based on the types of inputs used for the various valuation techniques (market approach, income approach and cost approach). The levels of hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1: consists of financial instruments whose value is based on quoted market prices for identical financial instruments in an active market
- Level 2: consists of financial instruments that are valued using models or other valuation methodologies. These models use inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly; Level 2 inputs include (i) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, (ii) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, (iii) pricing models whose inputs are observable for substantially the full term of the financial instrument and (iv) pricing models whose inputs are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data through correlation or other means for substantially the full term of the financial instrument
- Level 3: consists of financial instruments whose values are determined using pricing models that utilize significant inputs that are primarily unobservable, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

# NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL ASSETS AND FINANCIAL LIABILITIES (continued)

Management's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the valuation of financial instruments and their classification within the fair value hierarchy. As required by FASB ASC 820, financial instruments are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The fair market value of a split-interest agreement was transferred from a Level 3 measurement to Level 1 at June 30, 2013 after the terms of the trust agreement were evaluated and the current practice among other similar nonprofit entities was considered. - Cash, cash equivalents, short-term unconditional promises to give, and notes payable: The carrying amounts reported in the statement of financial position approximate fair values because of the short maturities of those instruments.
- Short-term and permanent investments: The fair values of investments are based on quoted market prices for those or similar investments.
- <u>Long-term unconditional promises to give</u>: The fair value of promises to give that are due in more than one year is estimated by discounting expected future cash flows using a rate of return based on the yield of average daily treasury curve rates at June 30 of each year.

Management relies on third party fair value measurement valuation, including those for Level 3 recurring and nonrecurring measurements. The Foundation's Board of Directors, finance committee and management assesses and evaluates the reasonableness of the fair value measurements and at least annually, management determines if the current valuation techniques used in fair value measurements are still appropriate.

#### **NOTE 4 – ALTERNATIVE INVESTMENTS**

Alternative investments include limited liability corporations and off-shore investment funds. Included in investments of the limited liability corporations are investments in private funds that are invested in financial instruments including, among others, forward and future contracts, interest rate and currency swap agreements, written options and structured notes and stripped securities. The Foundation holds less than 1% of the stock noted above. During the year ended June 30, 2014, a pledge was fulfilled with privately held stock. For the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, the Foundation evaluated the stock for impairment. Evidence considered in this assessment includes the reason for impairment, the severity and duration of the impairment, market conditions, changes in value subsequent to year end, forecasted performance of the investee, and the general market condition in the geographic area or industry the investee operates in. For the year ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, no impairment was recorded.

#### NOTE 6 - INVESTMENT IN PARTNERSHIP

The Foundation owns approximately 10% of a partnership which was a contributed asset. It is recorded at \$1,816,500, the fair market value at the time of the gift. For the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013 the investment is recorded at the lower of cost or market.

### NOTE 7 – ENDOWMENT AND QUASI-ENDOWMENT FUNDS

The Foundation's endowment pool includes contributed funds to be maintained in perpetuity, donor-restricted funds contributed for a specific purpose or term, and funds designated by the Board to function as endowments. As required by generally accepted accounting principles, net assets associated with endowment funds, including funds designated by the Board to function as endowments, are classified and reported based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

#### Board Interpretation of Relevant Law

The Board of Directors of the Foundation has interpreted the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA) as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the Foundation classifies as Permanently Restricted net assets (a) the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment, (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument at the time the accumulation is added to the fund. The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified in Permanently Restricted net assets is classified as Temporarily Restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the Foundation in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by UPMIFA. In accordance with UPMIFA, the Foundation considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds: 1) the duration and preservation of the fund, 2) the purposes of the Foundation and the donor-restricted endowment fund, 3) general economic conditions, 4) the possible effect of inflation and deflation, 5) the expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments, 6) other resources of the Foundation, 7) the investment policies of the Foundation.

Investment Return Objectives, Risk Parameters and Strategies. The Foundation has adopted investment and spending policies, approved by the Board of Directors, for endowment assets that attempt to provide a predictable stream of funding to programs supported by its endowment funds while also maintaining the purchasing power of those endowment assets over the long-term. Accordingly, the investment process seeks to achieve an after-cost total real rate of return, including investment income as well as capital appreciation, which exceeds the annual distribution with acceptable levels of risk. Endowment assets are invested in a well diversified asset mix, which includes equity and debt securities, that is intended to result in a consistent inflation-protected rate of return that has sufficient liquidity to make an annual distribution of

4%, while growing the funds if possible. Therefore, the Foundation expects its endowment assets, over time, to produce a minimum average return of Consumer Price Index plus 5% annually. Actual returns in any given year may vary from this amount. Investment risk is measured in terms of the total endowment fund; investment assets and allocation between asset classes and strategies are managed to not expose the fund to unacceptable levels of risk.

Spending Policy. The Foundation has a policy of appropriating for distribution each year 4% of its restricted fund's average fair value based on a trailing 16 quarter moving average. In establishing this policy, the Foundation considered the long-term expected return on its investment assets, the nature and duration of the individual endowment funds, many of which must be maintained in perpetuity because of donor-restrictions, and the possible effects of inflation.

Split-Interest Agreement funds are held in separate accounts and are maintained by independent trustees and do not operate under the return objectives and risk parameters or the strategies employed for achieving endowment objectives and therefore, are not included in the changes in the following tables.

The Board of Directors has designated \$6,890,617 and \$6,430,790 as of June 30, 2014 and 2013 of unrestricted net assets as a general endowment fund to support the mission of the Foundation. Since that amount resulted from an internal designation and is not donor-restricted, it is classified and reported as unrestricted net assets.

#### **Funds with Deficiencies**

From time to time, the fair value of assets associated with individual donor-restricted endowment funds may fall below the level that the donor or UPMIFA requires the Foundation to retain as a fund of perpetual duration. In accordance with FASB ASC, deficiencies of this nature are reported in unrestricted net assets. These deficiencies resulted from unfavorable market fluctuations that occurred after the investment of permanently restricted contributions and continued appropriation for certain programs that was deemed prudent by the finance committee of the Foundation.

#### **NOTE 8 – SPLIT-INTEREST AGREEMENTS**

The Foundation has entered into charitable remainder unitrust (CRUT) agreements whereby assets are made available on the condition that income is paid periodically to designated individuals. The unitrusts provide a lifetime benefit for the beneficiaries. Upon the death of the beneficiaries, all remaining assets of the trust pass to the Foundation to be added to specified scholarship funds. The agreements each provide a required annual distribution percentage which is based on the trust value as of the first day of the trust year. Remainder trust obligations are an actuarially determined liability recorded by the Foundation which represents the present value of estimated future payments to beneficiaries, discounted at applicable interest rates.

The Foundation has entered into charitable gift annuity (CGA) agreements whereby donors contribute assets in exchange for the Foundation's promise to pay a fixed amount to donor-determined beneficiaries for their life, with the remaining assets reverting to the Foundation upon the death of the beneficiaries to be used to support the charitable purposes of the Foundation. The difference between the amounts received and the present value of future annuity payments is recorded as a contribution. The liability for the present value of the future annuity payments is determined annually based on the ages and life expectancies of the donors as of the statement of financial position date, discounted at applicable interest rates.

Charitable gift annuity contributions included in the contribution revenue for the year ended June 30, 2014 and 2013 were \$0 and \$9,652 respectively.

The Foundation's federal tax rate effective for 2014 ranges from 15% to 38% of taxable income. The Foundation's Oregon tax rates are 6.6% of Oregon taxable income up to \$1,000,000 plus 7.6% of the Oregon taxable income over \$1,000,000 plus \$66,000 with a minimum of \$150.

As of June 30, 2014 and 2013, the Foundation had available net operating loss carryforwards of \$2,499,416 and \$2,779,457, respectively, from unrelated business income subject to income tax. The net operating losses will expire in various years from June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2033.

#### Deferred Tax Asset:

The net operating loss carryforwards give rise to a deferred tax asset of \$849,801 and \$945,015, which are reduced by valuation allowances of \$628,801 and \$945,015 as of June 30, 2014 and 2013, respectively. Deferred tax asset was \$221,000 and \$0 as of June 30, 2014 and 2013, respectively, all of which is considered current.

#### NOTE 17 – CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK

The Foundation maintains cash balances at one financial institution. The total of these accounts is insured up to \$250,000 by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. For the fiscal years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, the Foundation was under insured at various times during the year and at year end for the year ended June 30, 2013.

The Foundation also invests funds in professional managed mutual funds that contain various types of marketable securities. Such investments are exposed to various risks, such as fluctuations in market value and credit risk. Thus, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the near term could materially affect investment balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

To minimize risk, the Foundation's cash accounts are placed with high credit quality financial institutions and the Foundation's investment portfolio is diversified among a variety of asset categories, which are held by several investment managers. The Foundation regularly evaluates its depository arrangements and investment strategies.

#### **NOTE 18 – RELATED PARTY**

Oregon Institute of Technology (Oregon Tech) is a related party of the Foundation. The Foundation provides direct support to Oregon Tech for various program expenses. During 2014 and 2013, the Foundation provided program expense support to Oregon Tech of \$601,799 and \$741,398, respectively.

The Foundation reimburses Oregon Tech for salaries of certain Foundation employees and other operating costs. The amount payable or "due to university", totaled \$181,597 and \$144,347 for the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, respectively.

Board members and employees of the Foundation and of Oregon Tech are related parties of the Foundation. This group often makes and is expected to make contributions or pledges to the Foundation since they are leading the way for the community. All donations are treated the same as non related parties.

#### NOTE 19 – PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENTS AND RESTATEMENT

The Statement of Financial Position and the Statement of Activities for June 30, 2013 have been restated to properly record June 30, 2013 dividends received into the proper period. For fiscal year ended June 30, 2013, investment income on the Statement of Activities has been increased by \$14,272. Investments and unrestricted net assets on the Statement of Financial Position have increased by the same amount.

For the year ended June 30, 2013, amounts have been reclassified to properly reflect the amount of Permanently Restricted Net Assets, Temporarily Restricted Net Assets and Unrestricted Net Assets at June 30, 2013. This has resulted in a decrease to Permanently Restricted Net Assets of \$143,241, an increase to Temporarily Restricted Assets of \$285,439 and a decrease to Unrestricted Net Assets of \$142,197. Net assets in total do not change as a result of this adjustment.

#### **NOTE 20 – CONTRIBUTION RETURNED**

During the year ended June 30, 2014, the donor of a life insurance policy requested that his gift be returned. Although the Foundation was not obliged to return this gift, the board decided to comply with the donor's request as long as the Rescinding Gifts Policy was adhered to. The policy was complied with and the gift was returned to the donor. The gift value at the time of return was \$276,543. This resulted in a decrease in temporarily restricted net assets in the amount of \$276,543 for the year ended June 30, 2014.

#### **NOTE 21 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

The Foundation has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and recognition through September 19, 2014, the date on which these financial statements were available to be issued.

On August 25, 2014, the Foundation entered into a three year loan agreement with Wells Fargo in the amount of \$600,000 at 3%, secured by Foundation funds held in accounts with Wells Fargo or its affiliates.

On September 12, 2014, the Foundation received a distribution from a partnership investment in the amount of \$239,259. At this time, there is not enough information to determine the effect of this distribution on the investment in this partnership.
