Women's Law Project Highlighted Accomplishments July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014

Introduction. The Women's Law Project (WLP) is the only public interest legal center in Pennsylvania devoted exclusively to women's rights. Nationally recognized for our cutting-edge legal advocacy and four decades of achievement on issues affecting women, WLP is a leader in advancing women's rights and defending reproductive freedom, in Pennsylvania and nationwide. By *influencing public policy*, WLP works to improve official and institutional responsiveness to needs of women, guided by the personal experiences of women and evidenced-based research. By *educating women and mobilizing communities*, WLP empowers women with knowledge and tools to realize their rights as individuals and as members of society. By pursuing *high-impact litigation*, WLP enhances women's legal rights, through cases that will change or enforce existing laws and challenge discriminatory practices, especially on behalf of women who otherwise might not be heard. From our offices in Philadelphia and Pittsburgh, we provide direct services to women from all 67 Pennsylvania counties and beyond who turn to WLP for help. Our advocacy transforms the lives of countless women and girls every year, by helping individuals to fight injustice, then forging groundbreaking reforms in the laws, systems, and institutions that touch all women's lives.

Major New Initiative. This year, WLP continued its state-based strategic communications campaign in Pennsylvania, through its action arm, WomenVote PA (WVPA). We utilized strategic and integrated communications to raise awareness of gender discrimination against women and create a community of supporters. By leveraging the legal and legislative expertise of the WLP, we were able to provide information and advocacy tools to pro-choice policy makers; we assisted a newly created pro-choice Women's Health Caucus (WHC) in creating strategies to reorient and reframe the public and legislative debate about reproductive rights and to reposition our movement in Pennsylvania toward a pro-active, pro-choice agenda and away from destructive anti-choice legislation. After years of being on the defensive, we began to create a bold new focus on positive, inclusive messaging around women's health through the newly created *Pennsylvania Agenda for Women's Health*. Drawing on our coalition partners in Pennsylvanians For Choice (the statewide coalition WLP has convened since 1992), we helped to develop a pro-active agenda while we continued to counter the dominant cultural stereotype about abortion with aggressive strategic messaging that defends women's pregnancy decisions and attacks opponents of women's equality for failing to support women's health.

Through WVPA, we placed scores of op-eds and other articles on women's rights in news outlets across Pennsylvania and nationally. We utilized all of our social media tools to repost our op-eds and other media, in recognition of the fact that much of our younger audience finds their news online, not from newspapers. Special efforts were made to reach, educate and inspire the "rising" and expanding electorate to be fully engaged in civic matters and armed with information about public policy issues affecting women, particularly the centrality of reproductive rights to all of women's rights. We have created an exciting new website, www.womenvotepa.org, designed to attract millennials and provide fast facts on a whole range of women's issues and concerns

Violence Against Women.

Sexual Assault: We met with Attorney General Eric Holder as part of The White House Task Force to Prevent Student Sexual Assault. We completed our annual audit/case review at the Philadelphia Police Department Special Victims Unit. We presented at a conference organized by the Department of Justice Office of Violence Against Women about our work with Philadelphia Police Department and the campaign to change the FBI's definition of rape. We worked with Police Executive Research Forum

(PERF) to review the responses of different U.S. cities to sexual assault. We assisted PERF and law enforcement agencies with compliance issues associated with new data collection. We led webinars with sexual assault and domestic violence programs throughout the country describing the impact of the new FBI definition of rape. We met with military representatives to share our experience improving law enforcement response to sexual assault. Finally, we brought a number of complaints regarding Title IX violations relating to campus response to sexual harassment and assault.

Domestic Violence: We participated in monthly meetings with Deputy Mayor Donald Schwarz and senior city officials to develop a coordinated community response to domestic and sexual violence. We continued to co-chair Philadelphia's Domestic Violence Law Enforcement Committee, which undertook a comprehensive mapping of domestic violence in the city's criminal and civil systems.

Discrimination in Employment. In this area, we brought litigation and filed administrative complaints on behalf of pregnant and nursing workers; signed on to amicus (friend of the court) briefs in state and federal courts, including pregnancy and nursing accommodations at work; advocated more broadly relating to workplace equality in a variety of arenas; represented a teacher in an action under the Allegheny County Human Relations Act and the Pennsylvania ERA, against his employer, the Allegheny Intermediate Unit, for denying his request for health and other benefits for his same-sex partner of 15 years; and represented students before Pittsburgh Commission on Human Relations in challenging University's application of gendered facilities policy to transgender students.

Reproductive Rights. We represented abortion providers needing ongoing legal advice about Pennsylvania's labyrinthine abortion laws, and continued to provide extensive assistance in complying with Health Department regulations pursuant to Act 122, Pennsylvania's TRAP law (targeted restriction of abortion providers). We advocated successfully for a nursing mother who was thrown out of a public library by the librarian. The library changed its practice to comply with applicable law, and the librarian apologized to the woman. We advocated for a juror denied appropriate facilities for expressing breast milk at Allegheny County Courthouse; as a result, the Court is currently installing three properly equipped lactation rooms for jurors. We represented an insured pregnant woman who was denied preauthorization for a tubal ligation at the time of her scheduled cesarean section.

Equity in Athletics: We represented a middle school girl who had wrestled for 3 years and wished to continue to wrestle on the middle school wrestling team, but was denied. The court granted a preliminary injunction and approved a subsequent consent decree requiring that our client be permitted to participate on previously all boys' school wrestling team. We also filed complaints alleging violation of Title IX's athletic equity requirements were filed this month with OCR against 9 universities, all members of the PA State System of Higher Education.
