In addition to the National CC survey items, PACC includes up to a dozen additional questions that directly address PACC priorities. In 2012, 36 PACC campuses responded to the survey (55%). This survey was not conducted in 2013-2014. This executive summary highlights some salient data.

AmeriCorps* VISTA (Volunteers in Service to America) is a national service program that, for 50 years, has been on the forefront of building the capacity of communities to fight poverty by providing nonprofits, community organizations, and public agencies with full-time VISTA members to create and expand programs that ultimately bring low-income individuals and communities out of poverty. The Pennsylvania Campus Compact program is based on college/university campuses and dedicated to the elimination of poverty by developing campus-community partnerships, creating a sustainable program, mobilizing volunteers to serve communities, and raising funds to sustain long-term programming. PACC*VISTA members work on projects with a variety of focuses which include Education (K-12 and post-secondary

AmeriCorps Community Fellows-The purpose of the AmeriCorps Community Fellows program is to address compelling community needs in the areas of college readiness, access and success, while developing college students to be active citizens. In exchange for committing to serving 300 or 450 hours over the course of the calendar year, Community Fellows receive an AmeriCorps Education Award of \$ 1,175 or \$ 1,468 upon completion of their service. Through the 2012-2013 AmeriCorps Community Fellow Program, 382 college students served in minimum-time positions (300 hour positions) and 18 college students serviced in quarter-time positions (450 hour positions). Through these projects; 2,717 at-risk high school students showed and increased interest in attending college; 2,082 at-risk

Profile of PACC's Members-A majority of PACC's 64 member institutions (66%) are private, liberal arts institutions. The 2012 Campus Compact survey indicates that an average of 44% of students are involved in civic engagement on PACC campuses contributing to over 24 million hours of service both co-curricular and curricular service in 2012. The top community issues, which students and faculty address through civic engagement, are hunger, housing/homelessness, K-12 education and mentoring, poverty, senior/elder services, agriculture/nutrition, environment/sustainability. As reported in 2011, additional mechanisms for civic engagement beyond ongoing community service or service-learning engagement- 90% of PACC campuses utilize both one-day service projects and service trips. 84% of PACC's campuses have incorporated civic engagement into their first-year experience service opportunities as well as capstone course. More than two-thirds indicated that education for global citizenship, student leadership development and student civic engagement were emphasized in their institution's plans. Over 98% of PACC's campuses indicate that their presidents publicly promote civic engagement and provide fiscal support, while 80% of presidents participate in campus activities and serve on community boards. Institutional infrastructure and support for civic engagement-Out of 55% of campuses reporting in 2012, in PA 91% of our campuses have a civic engagement office; 57% are housed in Student Affairs, while 17% of those offices report within Academic Affairs.
