### BY-LAWS

OF

### ARTHUR J. SCHMITT FOUNDATION

An Illinois Not For Profit Corporation

(As approved September 6, 1995 and amended September 20, 2011)

INTRODUCTION

The Arthur J. Schmitt Foundation is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois and is qualified as a private charitable foundation under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Where appropriate, and in keeping with the often expressed wishes of the Founder, Arthur J. Schmitt, preference in grants is given to Catholic educational institutions because of their emphasis on both spiritual and intellectual values, and their commitment to develop value-based leadership and ameliorate the social ills of our nation.

The Foundation's principal activities are to make grants to educational institutions and other entities supporting education, generally at the level of high school and above, to sponsor programs and projects in such institutions and entities emphasizing the development of value-based leadership, and generally to aid in the overall mission of such institutions and entities.

### ARTICLE I

### OFFICE

The principal office of the Foundation shall be located in the State of Illinois at such place as the Board of Directors from time to time may designate. The Foundation may have such other offices without the State of Illinois, as the affairs of the Foundation may require from time to time.

### ARTICLE II

### MEMBERS

The corporation shall have no members.

### ARTICLE III

### BOARD OF DIRECTORS

### Section 1. Number. Terms of Office and Vacancies.

The property, funds and affairs of the Foundation shall be managed and controlled by a Board of Directors consisting of seven (7) members, or such greater or lesser number (but not less than five (5)) as the Board of Directors may from time to time provide. The Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the Foundation and shall serve for a term of three (3) years and until their successors are duly elected and qualified. If the office of any Director becomes vacant by reason of death, resignation, disqualification or inability to act, the remaining Directors may elect a successor who shall hold office for the unexpired term and until his successor shall have been elected and shall have qualified. Directors need not be residents of Illinois.

### Section 2. Powers.

The Board of Directors shall have the power and authority to receive gifts, legacies, and donations on behalf of the

Foundation; to invest the funds of the Foundation in bonds, common or preferred stocks, notes, real estate mortgages, common trust funds, shares of any investment company or trust, or other securities, partnership interests (general or limited) or in any other property, real or personal, wherever located; to retain and delegate powers to agents, attorneys and advisors (including investment advisors); and to make gifts and donations of capital as well as of income in pursuance of the objects and purposes of the Foundation. In addition, the Board of Directors shall have the right, power and authority to exercise all the powers and to do all the acts and things which may be exercised or done by the Foundation, but subject, nevertheless, to the statutes of the State of Illinois, to the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation, to the By-laws of the Foundation and to relevant provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States.

### Section 3. Regular Meetings.

A regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held during the month of September, at such time and place as may be fixed by the President, or if the President is for any reason unable to act, by any two (2) Directors. The Board of Directors may provide by resolution the time and place for the holding of additional regular meetings of the Board of Directors without other notice than such resolution, except as provided in Section 10 of this Article III.

### Section 4. Special Meetings.

Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by 700561916

or at the request of the President or a majority of the Directors. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the Board of Directors may fix any place in the Chicago metropolitan area as the place for holding any special meeting called by them.

# Section 5. Notice.

Except as provided in Section 10 of this Article III, notice of any special meeting shall be given at least five (5) days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or mailed to each Director, by fax or by email. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail in a sealed envelope with postage thereon prepaid addressed to the Director at the address shown for such Director on the records of the corporation. If notice shall be given by email, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when the email is received by the addressee. Any Director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting except where a Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting, unless specifically required by law or by these By-laws.

## Section 6. Place of Meetings.

All meetings of the Board of Directors, regular or special, shall be held at such place as the Board of Directors may, from time to time by resolution determine, either within or without the State of Illinois, and may at such meetings transact any and all business.

# Section 7. Quorum.

A majority of the Directors shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting.

# Section 8. Informal Action.

Except as in this Section provided, the Board of Directors shall act and shall have the capacity to act only at a Board meeting. Nevertheless, any action taken pursuant to a prior authorization or confirmed and approved by subsequent ratification in writing, whether of record in the corporate record book or otherwise, signed by all of the Directors, shall have and shall be deemed to have the same force and effect as if such action shall have been taken in or pursuant to a resolution adopted in a regularly called or constituted meeting of the Board of Directors.

# Section 9. Attendance by Telephone.

Directors may participate in any meeting through the use of a conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and such participation in a meeting shall constitute presence in person at the meeting and shall constitute a Board

meeting within the requirements of these By-laws. Section 10. Manner of Acting.

The act of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the act of a greater number is required by statute, these By-laws, or the Articles of Incorporation.

# Section 11. Removal.

A Director may be removed for cause by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all Directors then in office. Such action shall be taken at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors or at a special meeting called for such purpose, and the proposed removal shall be set forth in the notice of any such regular or special meeting, sent at least twenty (20) days prior thereto. Section 12. Compensation.

Directors may receive a stated annual compensation for their services, and/or by resolution of the Board of Directors, a fixed sum and expenses of attendance at each regular or special meeting of the Board. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any Director from serving the corporation in any other capacity and receiving reasonable compensation therefor.

# ARTICLE IV

## **OFFICERS**

## Section 1. Number.

The officers of the Foundation shall be a President, one or more Vice-Presidents (in such number as may be determined by the 700561916

Board of Directors), a Treasurer, a Secretary, an Executive Director and such other officers as may be elected or appointed by the Board of Directors. Officers whose authority and duties are not prescribed in these By-laws shall have the authority and perform the duties prescribed, from time to time, by the Board of Directors. Any two (2) or more offices may be held by the same persons except the offices of President and Secretary.

# Section 2. Election and Term of Office.

The officers of the Foundation shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors at the regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors. If the election of officers shall not be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as conveniently may be. Vacancies may be filled or new offices filled at any meeting of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office until his successor shall have been duly elected and shall have qualified or until his death or until he shall resign or shall have been removed in the manner hereinafter provided.

## Section 3. Removal.

Any officer or agent elected or appointed by the Board of Directors may be removed by the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Foundation will be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.

# Section 4. President.

The President shall be selected by and from the membership

of the Board of Directors. He shall, at reasonable intervals, make or cause to be made reports to the Board of Directors on the financial condition of the corporation, grants that have been made or that are proposed to be made, and any other matters of significance that are germane to the operations of the corporation. He may sign, with the secretary or any other proper officer of the corporation authorized by the Board of Directors, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the Board of Directors have authorized to be executed except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Directors or by these By-laws or by statute to some other officer or agent of the corporation; and in general shall perform all duties normally incident to the office of President and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors from time to time.

## Section 5. Vice-Presidents.

At least one (1) Vice-President shall be elected by the Board of Directors. Such Vice-President (or in the event there be more than one (1) Vice-President, the Vice-Presidents in the order designated, or in the absence of any designation, then in the order of their election) shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of the President during the absence, disability or refusal to act of the President. Any Vice-President shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the President or by the Board of Directors.

# Section 6. Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall monitor the performance by the Executive Director of the financial duties assigned to the Executive Director under Section 8 below, and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to the Treasurer from time to time by the President or the Board of Directors.

# Section 7. Secretary.

The Secretary shall monitor the performance by the Executive Director of the secretarial duties assigned to the Executive Director under Section 8 below, and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to the Secretary from time to time by the President or the Board of Directors.

## Section 8. Executive Director.

The Executive Director shall be the principal staff officer of the Foundation. He or she shall process all requests for grants from the Foundation and after appropriate inquiry make recommendations to the Board as to their disposition. With monitoring by the President and Treasurer, the Executive Director shall be responsible for a) maintaining adequate books of account for the corporation, and the custody, receipt and disbursement of all funds and securities of the corporation, b) obtaining regular investment reports by the investment advisor, and regular financial reports, to the Board of Directors, and c) supervising the independent auditors and accountants of the Foundation, and the preparation of annual budgets. With monitoring by the President and Secretary, the Executive Director shall be

responsible for a) keeping the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose, 2) seeing that all notices are given in accordance with these By-laws and applicable law, and 3) serving as custodian of the corporate records of the Foundation. He or she shall perform such other duties and exercise such powers as may be prescribed from time to time by the President or by the Board of Directors.

## Section 9. Director Emeritus.

A retired director may be designated by action of the Board as a director emeritus, who may attend any Board meetings and participate in discussions, but shall not have the right to vote. A director emeritus shall receive no compensation.

# ARTICLE V COMMITTEES

Section 1. Committees of Directors. The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors in office, may designate one or more committees, each of which shall consist of two or more directors, which committees, to the extent provided in said resolution, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the Foundation; but the designation of such committees and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board of Directors, or any individual Director, of any responsibility imposed upon it or her or him by law.

Section 2. Other Committees. Other committees not having and exercising the authority of the Board of Directors in the

management of the Foundation may be designated by a resolution adopted by a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present. Except as otherwise provided in such resolution, members of each such committee shall be Directors of the Foundation, and the President of the corporation shall appoint the members thereof. Any member of a committee thereof may be removed by action of the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Foundation shall be served by such removal.

<u>Section 3. Term of Office.</u> Each member of a committee shall continue as such until the next annual meeting of the Foundation and until his or her successor is appointed, unless the committee shall be sooner terminated, or unless such member be removed from such committee, or unless such member shall cease to qualify as a member thereof.

<u>Section 4. Chairman.</u> One member of each committee shall be appointed chairman.

<u>Section 5. Vacancies.</u> Vacancies in the membership of any committee may be filled by appointments made in the same manner as provided in the case of the original appointment.

<u>Section 6. Quorum.</u> Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the Board of Directors designating a committee, a majority of the whole committee shall constitute a quorum and the act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the committee.

Section 7. Rules. Each committee may adopt rules for its own 700561916

government not inconsistent with these by-laws or with rules adopted by the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE VI

# CONTRACTS, CHECKS AND DEPOSITS

## Section 1. Contracts.

The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers or agent or agents of the Foundation to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Foundation and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

## Section 2. Checks, Drafts, Etc.

All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Foundation, shall be signed by such officer or officers or agent or agents of the Foundation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors. In the absence of such determination by the Board of Directors, such instruments shall be signed by the Executive Director or the Vice President, Treasurer and countersigned by the President or Secretary of the Foundation.

# Section 3. Deposits.

All funds of the Foundation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Foundation in such banks, trust companies, or other depositaries as the Board of Directors may select.

## ARTICLE VII

## INDEMNIFICATION OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

# Section 1.

The Foundation may indemnify any person who was or is a party, or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (other than an action by or in the right of the Foundation) by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a Director, officer, employee or agent of the Foundation, or who is or was serving at the request of the Foundation as a Director, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with such action, suit or proceeding, if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Foundation, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action, suit or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent, shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Foundation, or, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that the person had reasonable cause to believe that 700561916

his or her conduct was unlawful.

## Section 2.

The Foundation may indemnify any person who was or is a party, or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action or suit by or in the right of the Foundation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that such person is or was a Director, officer, employee or agent of the Foundation, or is or was serving at the request of the Foundation as a Director, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with the defense or settlement of such action or suit, if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Foundation, provided that no indemnification shall be made in respect of any claim, issue or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged .to be liable for negligence or' misconduct in the performance of his or her duty to the Foundation, unless, and only to the extent that the court in which such action or suit was brought shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability, but in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses as the court shall deem proper.

## Section 3.

To the extent that a Director, officer, employee or agent of 700561916

the Foundation has been successful, on the merits or otherwise, in the defense of any action, suit or proceeding referred to in Sections (1) and (2) of this Article VII, or in defense of any claim, issue or matter therein, such person shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection therewith. Section 4.

Any indemnification under Sections (1) and (2) of this Article VII (unless ordered by a court) shall be made by the Foundation only as authorized in the specific case, upon a determination that indemnification of the Director, officer, employee or agent is proper in the circumstances because he or she has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Sections (1) and (2) of this Article VII. Such determination shall be made (i) by the Board of Directors by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of Directors who were not parties to such action, suit or proceeding, (ii) if such a quorum is not obtainable, or, even if obtainable, a quorum of disinterested Directors so directs, by independent legal counsel in a written opinion.

## Section 5.

Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding may be paid by the Foundation in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit or proceeding, as authorized by the Board of Directors in the specific case, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the Director, officer, employee or agent to repay such amount, unless it shall 700561916

ultimately be determined that he or she is entitled to be indemnified by the Foundation as authorized in this Article VII. Section 6.

The indemnification provided by this Article VII shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under any agreement, vote of disinterested Directors, or otherwise, both as to action in his or her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a Director, officer, employee or agent, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such a person.

## Section 7.

The Foundation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a Director, officer, employee or agent of the Foundation, or who is or was serving at the request of the Foundation as a Director, officer, employee or agent of another Foundation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any such capacity, or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not the Foundation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Article VII.

ARTICLE VIII
FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Foundation shall be set by resolution of the Board of Directors of the Foundation, or, in the absence of such resolution, it shall begin on the first day of July in each year and shall end on the last day of June in each year.

# ARTICLE IX

# WAIVER OF NOTICE

Whenever any notice whatever is required to be given under the provisions of these By-laws or under the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or under the provisions of the statutes of the State of Illinois, a waiver thereof, in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

# ARTICLE X

## **AMENDMENTS**

These By-laws may be altered, amended or repealed and new By-laws may be adopted at any meeting of the Board of Directors of the Foundation, for which written notice of the proposed alteration, amendment or repeal shall have been given, by a majority vote of the Directors present at the meeting.
