a. The projects of WOC's Three Ministries are the central focus of the organization. The Ministry of Irritation works to raise awareness about women's ordination with public advocacy, such as prayerful demonstrations at major Catholics events. This year, a major component of this action was raising awareness during the 30th anniversary of *Ordinatio Sacerdotalis*, a Vatican document that officially banned discussion on women's ordination in 1994. A press conference, vigil and meeting with Vatican officials were held in Rome last May. In addition, we filmed an educational awareness video entitled "Vatican: It's a Man's World." Throughout the year we continued our Nun Justice campaign, which focused on supporting women religious, particularly the Leadership Conference of Women Religious. A petition was circulated to members and then delivered to Vatican officials. The Ministry of Walking with Women Called continued to build and coordinate the national network of support. Our Feminist Ministers database was regularly updated to provide members with networking opportunities with ministers in their area. The Ministry of Prophetic Obedience provided ongoing support at ordinations for women called to serve as priests and bishops.

Program Service Expenses: \$60,850

b. Local organizing and coalition efforts: WOC supports local groups across the country in organizing prayerful demonstrations. In addition, WOC participates in coalition-building activities with other church reform organizations both nationally and internationally. Last November, WOC and fourteen U.S. Catholic organizations responded to the Vatican's call for bishops globally to survey Catholics on family issues. WOC created the online questionnaire for U.S. Catholics, which was completed by more than 16,000 Catholics in English and Spanish. The data was analyzed by Dr. Peter Fagen of Johns Hopkins and sent to the Synod of Bishops office (receipt of this report was received from the Vatican). In addition, a vigil was held outside the US Bishops' Conference. WOC continued organizing in Women's Ordination Worldwide, an international coalition of groups working on the issue of Catholic women's ordination throughout the world. A major effort this year has been planning for the 2015 Women's Ordination Worldwide conference. WOC staff attended several meetings both nationally and internationally throughout the year to prepare for this major event. Another major component of this year was building an interfaith connection. We held our first Equal in Faith event on August 26th and continue to sponsor events with Mormon and interfaith feminists. In addition, WOC collaborates with several other organizations including, Catholic Organizations for Renewal, Women-Church Convergence, Coalition for Liberty and Justice, and St. Joan's Alliance.

Program Service Expenses: \$52,150

c. Membership Services and Outreach continues to be an important focus for the organization. To increase general membership, retain our current members, and create overall awareness about the issue of women's ordination, our staff represented WOC at national church reform conferences around the United States, corresponded regularly with members and local leaders, and sponsored advertisements for WOC memberships in publications read by progressive Catholics.

Program Service Expenses: \$26,000

d. New Women, New Church is the magazine of the Women's Ordination Conference and is published twice a year. Each issue is distributed to more than 2,500 members, donors, and subscribers. The

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newsletter contains information relevant to the issue of women's ordination into an inclusive and accountable Catholic Church. It informs readers about resources available to them and regional events across the country in which they can participate and support.

Program Service Expenses: \$17,400

e. Young Feminist Network (YFN) is a group of young Catholic women in their 20s and 30s who work to integrate faith with feminism and eliminate oppression in the church and society. This year WOC's online presence on Facebook, Twitter and YouTube was directed at engaging YFN activists.

Program Service Expenses: \$8,700

f. WOC's Racial Justice, Diversity, and Inclusion initiative continued to publicize information on our efforts to create a more diverse and inclusive organization, and made intentional efforts to include people of all ethnicities in WOC's publications and events. WOC's primary goal is to continue to make the organization more accessible to Spanish-speaking members.

Program Service Expenses: \$5,200

g. The World Day of Prayer for Women's Ordination is sponsored by WOC each year to encourage U.S. participation in the International World Day of Prayer for Women's Ordination. The national office provided a sample prayer service, organizing tips, and contact information of WOC members to event organizers in local regions around the United States. Vigils were held outside of churches across the country, including Rochester, NY; Philadelphia, PA; and Washington, DC. In addition, our executive director gave a keynote address to VOTF-Bridgeport for their annual conference, which was held in solidarity with World Day of Prayer events.
