

(i) Dynamic X-Change and Teacher Training Institute

Through Dynamic X-Change (DXC), CORE uses dance and movement as a means to open up new pathways to expression. Since 1993, the program has worked with people of all ages who are isolated because of their circumstances: dealing with abuse, homelessness, language barriers, refugee status, substance abuse, aging, and HIV/AIDS.

CORE piloted the Teacher Training Institute (TTI) in 2006 working in collaboration with Atlanta Ballet, Moving in the Spirit, Dance Educators of Georgia, and ArtsConnect. Dynamic X-Change provides safe, constructive, nurturing, creative outlets for young people, seniors and those who are isolated through situation or experience: building self-esteem, communication skills, healthy body awareness and dance appreciation. (ii) Fieldwork

Fieldwork is a rigorous weekly workshop designed to help artists of all disciplines gather information about their works-in-progress. For several weeks in the fall and spring, artists show developing works and receive candid, non-directive feedback from their peers. Fieldwork sessions are guided by an experienced facilitator who is also creating work. At the end of the workshop, CORE presents a public showing of the works.

(iii) CORE Performance Company

Since 1980, CORE Performance Company has been creating and performing innovative contemporary dance. Known for its riveting, passionate and unique work, the CORE Performance Company has been internationally acclaimed in performance, tours and residencies in the U.S., Mexico, Guatemala, Sweden, Germany, Croatia and the Republic of Georgia.
