REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER BOARD AND AFFILIATE MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS (UNAUDITED) JUNE 30, 2014 AND 2013

This section of the Regional Medical Center Board and Affiliate's (the "Board") combined financial statements presents management's analysis of the Board's financial performance during the fiscal years that ended on June 30, 2014 and 2013 Please read it in conjunction with the combined financial statements, which follow this section

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Fiscal Year 2014

Operating revenues increased by 13 6% The increase in operating revenues results from an increase in net patient revenues of 11 4% as well as an increase in other operating revenues of 48 8%. Net patient revenues increased due to a full year of ownership of RMC Jacksonville (acquired in midyear FY13) and the acquisition of clinics by the Board and Affiliate, as well as inpatient and outpatient volume increases at RMC Anniston. The other operating revenue increase is attributed primarily to the EHR Medicare / Medicaid Incentive revenue at both RMC Anniston and RMC Jacksonville along with an increase in the Retail 340b Pharmacy revenue.

Operating expenses increased by 12 3% primarily as a result of increased salaries, wages, and employee benefits and supplies and other expenses. Salaries, wages and employee benefit expense increased by 12 1% primarily due to the increases in FTEs with the acquisition of clinics and RMC Jacksonville (12 months in FY14 compared to 6 months in FY 13). Supplies and other expenses increased by 15 2% primarily due to increases in patient volumes and to the acquisition of clinics and RMC Jacksonville (12 months in FY14 compared to 6 months in FY 13).

Nonoperating income, net, increased approximately \$0.8 million or 200% primarily as a result of the increase in investment income of \$1.0 million offset by the affiliates income tax expense increase of \$0.2 million

Fiscal Year 2013

Operating revenues increased by 8 8%. The increase in operating revenues results from an increase in net patient revenues of 7 5% and as well as an increase in other operating revenues of 35 8%. Net patient revenues increased due to the acquisition of RMC Jacksonville and clinics by the Board and Affiliate. The other operating revenue increase is attributed to the EHR Medicaid Incentive revenue, the Retail 340b Pharmacy revenue, and the Quest Outpatient Lab revenue along with an increase in the Affiliates other operating revenue with the acquisition of RMC Jacksonville.

Operating expenses increased by 10 2% primarily as a result of increased salaries, wages, and employee benefits and supplies and other expenses. Salaries, wages and employee benefit expense increased by 11 4% primarily due to the increases in FTEs with the acquisition of clinics and RMC Jacksonville. Supplies and other expenses increased by 9 0% also primarily due to the acquisition of clinics and RMC Jacksonville.

Nonoperating income, net, decreased approximately \$3.2 million or 114.3% primarily as a result of the decrease in investment income of \$3.5 million

Overview

The combined financial statements consist of two parts management's discussion and analysis (unaudited) and the combined financial statements. The combined financial statements also include notes that explain in more detail some of the information in the combined financial statements.

Required Basic Combined Financial Statements

The combined financial statements of the Board offer short-term and long-term financial information about its activities. The combined balance sheets include all of the Board's assets and liabilities and provide information about the nature and amounts of investments in resources (assets) and the obligations to Board creditors (liabilities). The assets and liabilities are presented in a classified format, which distinguishes between current and long-term assets and liabilities. It also provides the basis for computing rate of return, evaluating the capital structure of the Board and assessing the liquidity and financial flexibility of the Board.

All of the current fiscal year's revenues and expenses are accounted for in the combined statements of revenues, expenses, and changes in net position. This statement measures the success of the Board's operations over the past fiscal year and can be used to determine whether the Board has successfully recovered all its costs through its services provided, as well as its profitability and creditworthiness.

The final required financial statement is the combined statements of cash flows. The primary purpose of this statement is to provide information about the Board's cash receipts and cash payments during the reporting period. The statement reports cash receipts, cash payments and net changes in cash resulting from operating, investing, noncapital financing and capital and related financing activities, and provides answers to such questions as where did cash come from, what was cash used for, and what was the change in the cash balance during the reporting period.

Financial Analysis

Our analysis of the combined financial statements of the Board begins below. One of the most important questions asked about the Board's finances is "is the Board as a whole better off or worse off as a result of the fiscal year's activities?" The combined balance sheets and the statements of revenues, expenses, and changes in net position report information about the Board's activities in a way that will help answer this question. These two statements report the net position of the Board and changes in them. You can think of the Board's net position - the difference between assets and liabilities - as one way to measure financial health or financial position. Over time, increases or decreases in the Board's net position are one indicator of whether its financial health is improving or deteriorating. However, you will need to consider other nonfinancial factors such as changes in economic conditions, regulations, and new or changed government legislation.

Net Position

To begin our analysis, a summary of the Board's combined balance sheets is presented in Tables A-1 and A-2

As shown in Table A-1, net position decreased \$3.5 million from fiscal year 2013. This change in net position was primarily attributable to operating losses of \$3.9 million, partially offset by nonoperating income of \$0.4 million, as shown in Table A-3.

As shown in Table A-2, net position decreased \$5.8 million from fiscal year 2013. This change in net asset position was primarily attributable to operating losses of \$5.4 million combined with nonoperating losses of \$0.4 million, as shown in Table A-4.

Revenues, Expenses, and Changes in Net Position

While the combined balance sheets show the change in net position, the combined statements of revenues, expenses, and changes in net position provide information as to the nature and source of these changes. A summary of the Board's combined statements of revenues, expenses, and changes in net position is presented in Tables A-3 and A-4.

Operating revenues increased by 13 6% The increase in operating revenues results from an increase in net patient revenues of 11 4% as well as an increase in other operating revenues of 48 8%. Net patient revenues increased due to a full year of ownership of RMC Jacksonville (acquired in midyear FY13) and the acquisition of clinics by the Board and Affiliate, as well as inpatient and outpatient volume increases at RMC Anniston. The other operating revenue increase is attributed primarily to the EHR Medicare / Medicaid Incentive revenue at both RMC Anniston and RMC Jacksonville along with an increase in the Retail 340b Pharmacy revenue.

Operating expenses increased by 12 3% primarily as a result of increased salaries, wages, and employee benefits and supplies and other expenses. Salaries, wages and employee benefit expense increased by 12 1% primarily due to the increases in FTEs with the acquisition of clinics and RMC Jacksonville (12 months in FY14 compared to 6 months in FY 13). Supplies and other expenses increased by 15 2% primarily due to increases in patient volumes and to the acquisition of clinics and RMC Jacksonville (12 months in FY14 compared to 6 months in FY 13).

Nonoperating income, net, increased approximately \$0.8 million or 200% primarily as a result of the increase in investment income of \$1.0 million offset by the affiliates income tax expense increase of \$0.2 million

Operating revenues increased by 8.8%. The increase in operating revenues results from an increase in net patient revenues of 7.5% as well as an increase in other operating revenues of 35.8%. Net patient revenues increased due to the acquisition of RMC Jacksonville and clinics by the Board and Affiliate. The other operating revenue increase is attributed to the EHR Medicaid Incentive revenue, the Retail 340b Pharmacy revenue, and the Quest Outpatient Lab revenue along with an increase in the Affiliates other operating revenue with the acquisition of RMC Jacksonville.

Operating expenses increased by 10 2%% primarily as a result of increased salaries, wages, and employee benefits and supplies and other expenses. Salaries, wages and employee benefit expense increased by 11 4% primarily due to the increases in FTEs with the patient volume increases and the acquisition of clinics. Supplies and other expenses increased by 9 0% also primarily due to increased patient volumes and the acquisition of clinics.

Nonoperating income, net, decreased approximately \$3.2 million or 114.3% primarily as a result of the increase in investment income of \$3.5 million

Capital Assets and Debt Financing

Property and Equipment

As of June 30, 2014, the Board had \$74 7 million invested in a variety of capital assets, as reflected in Table A-5 below, which represents a net decrease (additions, deductions and depreciation) of \$6.2 million or 7.6% from the end of last fiscal year

As of June 30, 2013, the Board had \$80 9 million invested in a variety of capital assets, as reflected in Table A-5 below, which represents a net increase (additions, deductions and depreciation) of \$5.5 million or 7.3% from the end of last fiscal year

Debt Financing

On June 30, 1998, the Board issued \$50 million of Series 1998-A Bonds (the "Series 1998 Bonds") The proceeds were used to finance the Board's renovation and replacement plan, which includes various capital improvements and additions

The Series 1998 Bonds are subject to redemption prior to their respective maturities at the option of the Board, on or after June 1, 2008, at redemption prices ranging from 100% to 102% of principal plus accrued interest at the date of redemption. Beginning in 2014, the Bonds, which mature in 2014 and after, are required to be redeemed in annual amounts ranging from \$1.54 million to \$3.16 million.

The Series 1998 Bonds are limited obligations of the Board. The principal of and the interest on the Series 1998 Bonds are secured by a pledge of, and are payable solely out of, the gross revenue of the Board to be derived from the operation of the Regional Medical Center Board. None of the physical assets of the Board have been pledged or mortgaged to secure the Series 1998 Bonds. These bonds do not constitute an indebtedness of the State of Alabama, Calhoun County or the City of Anniston, nor do they give rise to a pecuniary liability or a charge against the general credit or taxing powers of any of the foregoing.

REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER BOARD AND AFFILIATE MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS (UNAUDITED) JUNE 30, 2014 AND 2013

Debt Financing (Continued)

On March 5, 2013, the Board entered into a \$5,100,000 note payable ("the 2013 Note Payable") for the purpose of acquisition and improvement of RMC Jacksonville. Interest is payable monthly at a fixed rate of 2 26%. The note requires annual principal repayments on March 1, and matures on March 1, 2023.

On August 22, 2011, the Board entered into a \$36,735,000 notes payable for the purpose of refunding \$36,735,000 of then outstanding Series 1998 Bonds. Interest is payable monthly at a rate of 65% of LIBOR plus 1 54%. The note requires annual debt service payments with final payment due on August 1, 2021.

On May 27, 2005, Regional Health Management Corporation ("RHMC"), the subsidiary of the affiliate, obtained a \$2 4-million note payable from Regions Bank. The proceeds of the note payable were used to pay down amounts owed to the Board. The note payable is guaranteed by the Board.

On September 12, 2008, RHMC amended and restated its note agreement. The amended note bears interest at 5 430% and is due in monthly payments of \$24,918, including interest, maturing on March 4, 2013.

During the year ended June 30, 2014, the Board entered leases for various types of medical equipment over terms ranging up to five years. These agreements essentially transfer the risk of ownership to the Board and are therefore accounted for as capital leases.

NOTE A - NATURE OF BUSINESS

Organization and Nature of Business

Regional Medical Center Board (the "Board") was created as a public not-for-profit corporation on May 7, 1974, by the Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama Since September 30, 1974, the Board has operated the Northeast Alabama Regional Medical Center ("NEARMC") The Board is restricted from the sale or disposal of any part of the real estate used in connection with the operation of the NEARMC or the transfer of the operation and management of the NEARMC without the consent of the governing body of the City of Anniston. On July 29, 1991, the Governor of Alabama signed into law Act No. 91-552 which granted the Board, as well as other applicable hospitals, the powers of a health care authority organized under Article 11 of Chapter 22, otherwise known as "The Health Care Authorities Act of 1982. Code of Alabama 1975," whereby rights are generally less restricted than under previous law. The Board reports as a governmental entity

The combined financial statements include the accounts of the Board and its fully blended component units, Regional Health Services, Inc ("RHS"), Jacksonville Holdings, Inc ("JHI"), and QHG of Jacksonville, Inc ("QHG") RHS (the "Affiliate") is an Alabama not-for-profit entity with NEARMC being the sole corporate member RHS includes a subsidiary, Regional Health Management Corporation ("RHMC"), an Alabama for-profit corporation and a wholly owned subsidiary of RHS RHMC owns and operates clinics which provide various outpatient health services. In the prior year, the Board acquired JHI, which owns and operates clinics providing various outpatient health services. Pursuant to the acquisition, the Board transferred the assets of JHI to RHMC, and RHMC operates all JHI clinics. In the prior year, the Board acquired QHG, which owns and operates Regional Medical Center Jacksonville ("RMCJ"). NEARMC and RMCJ (collectively, the "Medical Center") are both acute care hospitals. NEARMC is a 338-bed acute care hospital located in Anniston, Alabama and RMCJ is an 89-bed acute care hospital located in Jacksonville, Alabama. All significant intercompany balances and transactions have been eliminated in combination.

NOTE B - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the June 30, 2013 financial statements have been reclassified to conform with the 2014 presentation. Such reclassifications had no material effect on the previously reported combined balance sheets, statements of revenues, expenses, and changes in net position, or cash flows

Enterprise Fund Accounting

The Board uses enterprise fund accounting Revenues and expenses are recognized on the accrual basis using the economic resources measurement focus

Use of Estimates

The preparation of combined financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the reporting date and revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates

Operating Revenues and Expenses

The Board's combined statements of revenues, expenses, and change in net position distinguish between operating and nonoperating revenues and expenses. Operating revenues result from exchange transactions associated with providing health care services, the Board's principal activity Nonexchange revenues, including investment income, contributions received for purposes other than capital asset acquisition, and various other items, are reported as nonoperating revenues. Operating expenses are all expenses incurred to provide health care services, other than financing costs

Net Position

Net position of the Board is classified in two components. *Net position invested in capital assets, net of related debt,* consist of capital assets net of accumulated depreciation and reduced by the current balances of any outstanding borrowings used to finance the purchase or construction of those assets. *Unrestricted net position* is remaining net position that does not meet the definition of *invested in capital assets, net of related debt.*

<u>Deferred Outlfows and Inflows of Resources</u>

Deferred outflows and inflows of resources represent the consumption and acquisition, respectively, of net position that applied to future periods. Items previously reported as assets and liabilities have been reclassified in the accompanying combined balance sheets as deferred outflows and inflows of resources.

Charity Care

The Medical Center provides care to patients who meet certain criteria under its charity care policy without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Because the Medical Center does not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care, these amounts are not reported as net patient service revenue in the accompanying combined financial statements.

Charity Care (Continued)

The Medical Center maintains records to identify and monitor the level of charity care it provides. These records include the amount of charges foregone for services and supplies furnished under its charity care policy, the estimated cost of these services and supplies, and equivalent service statistics. The following information measures the level of charity care provided during the fiscal years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013.

Net Patient Service Revenue

Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payors, and others for whom services are rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors. Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined.

Revenues from the Medicare and Medicaid programs accounted for approximately 51% and 10%, respectively, of the Medical Center's net patient service revenue for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2014 (50% and 12%, respectively, for fiscal year 2013) Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are complex and subject to interpretation. The Medical Center believes that it is in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations and is not aware of any pending or threatened investigations involving allegations of potential wrongdoing.

While no such regulatory inquiries have been made, compliance with such laws and regulations can be subject to future government review and interpretation as well as significant regulatory action, including fines, penalties, and exclusion from the Medicare and Medicaid programs

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents recorded as current assets consist primarily of net deposits in demand accounts and certificates of deposits with maturities not in excess of 90 days when purchased and are stated at cost, which approximates market The Board and Affiliate's cash and cash equivalents are deposited in Alabama banks. A portion of the Board and Affiliate's deposits were held by financial institutions in the State of Alabama's Security of Alabama Funds Enhancement ("SAFE") Program The SAFE Program was established by the Alabama Legislature and is governed by the provisions contained in the Code of Alabama 1975, Sections 41-14A-1 through 41-14A-14 Under the SAFE Program, all public funds are protected through a collateral pool administered by the Alabama State Treasurer's Office Under this program, financial institutions holding deposits of public funds must pledge securities as collateral against those deposits. In the event of failure of a financial institution, securities pledged by that financial institution would be liquidated by the State Treasurer to replace the public deposits not covered by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC") and the National Credit Union Administration ("NCUA") If the securities pledged failed to produce adequate funds, every institution participating in the pool would share the liability for the remaining balance. The Board and Affiliate's deposits may, at times, exceed amounts insured under the FDIC, NCUA, and SAFE Program However, the Board and Affiliate has not experienced any losses on such deposits

Patient Accounts Receivable and Third-Party Payor Settlements

Receivables from patients, insurance companies and third-party contractual agencies are recorded at regular patient service charge rates. A majority of the Board and Affiliate's patients are insured by certain third-party insurers based on contractual agreements which generally result in the Board and Affiliate collecting less than the established charge rates. Final determination of payments under these agreements is subject to review by appropriate authorities.

Patient accounts receivable is reduced by an allowance for doubtful accounts and contractual allowances In evaluating the collectability of accounts receivable, the Board and Affiliate analyzes its past history and identifies trends for each of its major payor sources of revenue to estimate the appropriate contractual allowance and allowance for doubtful accounts. Management regularly reviews data about these major payor sources of revenue in evaluating the sufficiency of the allowance for doubtful accounts and contractual allowances For patient accounts receivable associated with services provided to patients who have third-party coverage, the Board and Affiliate analyzes contractually due amounts and records a contractual allowance. For patient accounts receivable associated with non-third-party payors (which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances for which third-party coverage exists for part of the bill), the Board and Affiliate records an allowance for doubtful accounts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible. The difference between the standard rates (or the discounted rates if negotiated) and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts. The methodology of estimating the allowance for doubtful accounts did not change from prior year

Noncurrent Cash and Investments

The Board's cash and investments are reported at fair value based on quoted market prices. As of June 30, the Board had the following noncurrent cash and investments

Noncurrent Cash and Investments (Continued)

For an investment, custodial credit risk is the risk that, in the event of the failure of the counterparty, the Board will not be able to recover the value of its investments or collateral securities that are in the possession of an outside party. All of the Board's \$56,225,116 in investments at June 30, 2014, are held by the investment's counterparty, not in the name of the Board. The Board does not have a policy that limits the amount of investments that are held by counterparties.

The calculation of realized gains and losses is independent of a calculation of the net change in the fair value of investments. Realized gains and losses on investments that had been held in more than one fiscal year and sold in the current fiscal year were included as a change in fair value of investments reported in the prior fiscal year and the current fiscal year.

Noncurrent cash and investments include assets set aside by the Board for future capital improvements, over which the Board retains control and may at its discretion subsequently use for other purposes

<u>Inventories</u>

Inventories of drugs and other supplies are recorded at cost, using the first-in, first-out method, which is not in excess of market

Property and Equipment

It is the policy of the Board and the Affiliate to capitalize the cost of major additions to property and equipment and to remove from the accounts major items of property and equipment retired or sold. The resulting gain or loss from asset retirements or sales is included in the nonoperating revenues and expenses section of the accompanying combined statements of revenues, expenses, and changes in net position. Depreciation is provided using the straight-line method based on the estimated useful lives stated in the American Hospital Association guidelines. Property and equipment is depreciated over the following useful lives.

Land improvements5 - 40 yearsBuildings and building improvements5 - 40 yearsFurniture, fixtures, and equipment2 - 25 years

Use of Restricted Resources

When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the Board's policy to use restricted resources first, then unrestricted resources as they are needed

Electronic Health Records

The Medical Center received funds in the amount of \$3,625,000 from Medicare and \$696,000 from the state Medicaid agency for the year ended June 30, 2014 for their compliance with electronic health records requirements. The Medical Center received approximately \$915,000 from Medicaid during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2012 and deferred revenue recognition until the fiscal year ended June 30, 2013. The Board recognized the revenue once the Medicaid electronic health record requirements had been met. The revenue is included in other operating revenues in the combined statements of revenues, expenses and changes in net position. These amounts are estimates, so there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term based on government review.

Contributions

From time to time, the Board receives contributions from individuals and private organizations Revenues from contributions (including contributions of capital assets) are recognized when all eligibility requirements, including time requirements, are met. Contributions may be restricted for either specific operating purposes or for capital purposes. Amounts that are unrestricted or that are restricted to a specific operating purpose are reported as nonoperating revenues on the combined statements of revenues, expenses, and changes in net assets. Amounts restricted to capital acquisitions are reported after nonoperating revenues and expenses on the combined statements of revenue, expenses, and changes in net position.

Income Taxes

The Board is a political subdivision and the Affiliate is a not-for-profit corporation as described in Section 50l(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, therefore, no provision has been recorded for income taxes for these entities. Regional Health Management Corporation ("RHMC") is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Affiliate. RHMC is a for-profit corporation and accounts for deferred income taxes using the asset and liability method to establish deferred tax assets and liabilities for the temporary differences between the financial reporting bases and the tax bases of RHMC's assets and liabilities at enacted tax rates expected to be in effect when such amounts are realized or settled. As of June 30, 2014 RHMC had net operating loss carry forwards of \$2,550,000.

The Board has evaluated their tax positions and have determined that they do not have any material unrecognized benefits or obligations as of June 30, 2014 and 2013

Adoption of New Accounting Policies

During the year ended June 30, 2014, the Board implemented GASB Statement No 65, *Items Previously Reported as Assets and Liabilities* As a result of the application of this new guidance, certain amounts previously reported as assets and liabilities at June 30, 2013 have been adjusted or reclassified in the accompanying combined balance sheets

As it relates to the Board, deferred financing costs were recorded as an expense and are no longer being amortized. Additionally, various items previously reported as assets and liabilities have been reported as deferred outflows of resources. The effects of the application of GASB Statement No. 65 on the previously reported combined financial statement amounts is summarized below.

NOTE C - NET PATIENT SERVICE REVENUE

The Medical Center has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Medical Center at amounts different from its established rates. A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payors follows

Medicare

Inpatient acute care services and outpatient services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic, and other factors. Inpatient nonacute services and defined pass through costs are paid based on a cost reimbursement methodology. The Medical Center is reimbursed for cost reimbursable items at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of an annual cost report by the Medical Center and audits thereof by the Medicare fiscal intermediary. The Medical Center's Medicare cost reports have been audited and final settlement has been made by the Medicare fiscal intermediary through June 30, 2011.

Medicaid

Under the Alabama Medicaid Program, hospitals are paid three payments for inpatient care per diem for claims submitted, lump sum disproportionate share payment, and quarterly access payments based on the upper payment limit calculation (UPL) Outpatient services are reimbursed through quarterly access payments and based on a fee schedule

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Alabama

Inpatient services rendered to Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Alabama ("Blue Cross") subscribers are reimbursed through a prospectively agreed upon rate, based on rates per day of hospitalization. The prospectively determined rates are not subject to retroactive adjustment. Approximately one-third of outpatient services are reimbursed based on a fee schedule, which has no retroactive settlement. The remaining portion of outpatient services rendered to Blue Cross beneficiaries are reimbursed under a cost reimbursement methodology subject to retroactive settlement. The Medical Center is reimbursed for cost reimbursable items subject to retroactive adjustment at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of an annual cost report by the Medical Center and audits thereof by Blue Cross. Blue Cross cost reports for the Medical Center have been audited through June 30, 2013.

Others

The Medical Center has also entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers, businesses, health maintenance organizations, and preferred provider organizations. The bases for payment to the Medical Center under these agreements include discounts from established charges and prospectively determined daily rates.

On March 5, 2013, the Board entered into a \$5,100,000 note payable ("the 2013 Note Payable") for the purpose of acquisition and improvement of QHG. Interest is payable monthly at a fixed rate of 2 26%. The note requires annual principal repayments on March 1, and matures on March 1, 2023.

On August 1, 2011, the Board entered into a \$36,735,000 note payable ("the 2011 Note Payable) for the purpose of refunding \$36,735,000 of then-outstanding Series 1998 Bonds. Interest is payable monthly at a rate of 65% of LIBOR plus 1 54%. The note requires annual debt service payments with final payment due on August 1, 2021.

As a result of the refunding, the Board recorded a loss of \$1,057,205, which is shown as a deferred outflow of resources on the combined balance sheet. This loss is being amortized over 10 years. The refunding resulted in a positive cash flow of \$10,396,517 and an economic gain of \$436,048.

The Board entered into an interest rate swap agreement to modify the interest characteristics of the debt outstanding under this note payable. The Agreement involves the receipt of amounts based on a variable interest rate in exchange for payments to the counterparty based on a fixed interest rate over the life of the agreement, with notional amounts equal to the outstanding balance of the note payable through the term of the note (see Note G)

On June 30, 1998, the Board issued \$50,000,000 of Series 1998-A Bonds ("the Series 1998 Bonds") The proceeds were used to finance the Board's renovation and replacement plan, which includes various capital improvements and additions. The Series 1998 Bonds were subject to redemption prior to their respective maturities at the option of the Board, on or after June 1, 2008, at redemption prices ranging from 100% to 102% of principal plus accrued interest at the date of redemption. The Board refunded all of the Series 1998 Bonds in conjunction with the issuance of the 2011 note payable.

In connection with the issuance of the 2011 note payable and the 2013 note payable, the Board is required to maintain certain minimum financial ratios, including debt service coverage and a cushion ratio. The Board was in compliance with debt covenants as of June 30, 2014 and 2013.

Note payable - bank, RHMC consisted of a 5 43%, note payable, due in monthly installments of \$24,915, including interest, and matured on March 4, 2013. The note payable was guaranteed by the Board.

The Board entered into leases for various types of medical equipment over terms ranging up to five years. These agreements essentially transfer the risk of ownership to the Board and are therefore accounted for as capital leases. The leased property under capital leases at June 30, 2014 was \$1,743,000 less accumulated amortization of \$354,000. Amortization for the year ended June 30, 2014 was \$303,000 and is included in depreciation expense in the statement of revenues, expenses, and changes in net position.

NOTE G - DERIVATIVE INSTRUMENTS

In order to hedge the cash flows associated with the 2011 Compass Loan, the Board entered into an interest rate swap agreement with Compass Bank. As of June 30, 2014, the swap transaction had a notional amount of \$32,413,235, and requires the Board to pay a fixed rate of 3 305% and the counterparty to pay 65% of the one-month London Inter-bank Offered Rate ("LIBOR"). The swap transaction was entered into on August 19, 2011, and is scheduled to terminate on August 1, 2028. Only the net difference in interest payments is actually exchanged with the counterparty.

The swap arrangements qualified as an effective interest rate hedge at June 30, 2014 and 2013. The fair value of the swap at June 30, 2014 and 2013 was a liability of \$503,922 and \$258,013, respectively. The fair value of the interest rate swap is determined based on inputs that are readily available in public markets or can be derived from information available in publicly quoted markets. The related amount payable to the counterparty is included in long-term liabilities along with the proper offsetting deferred charge in deferred outflows of resources on the combined balance sheets. The counterparty is Baa3 rated by Moody's

The Board is exposed to basis risk on its interest rate swap. Basis risk is the difference between the interest rate on the underlying debt and 65% of one-month LIBOR. The Board pays a fixed rate of 3 305% on the underlying debt and receives 65% of one-month LIBOR on the swap.

The Board or its counterparty may terminate the interest rate swap if the other party fails to perform under the terms on the contract. If at the time of termination, the swap is in a liability position, the Board would be liable to the counterparty for a payment equal to the liability.

NOTE I - RETIREMENT PLANS

The Medical Center has a trusteed noncontributory defined benefit pension plan in which all employees employed prior to May 1, 2007, who have completed one year (1,000 hours or more per year) of service as of April 30, 2008 and have met the age requirements, are eligible to participate. The Plan is not required to issue a stand-alone financial report. The Medical Center's funding policy is to contribute amounts based on periodic actuarial valuations and recommendations. Assets held by the plan include cash equivalents (money market funds), government securities, nongovernment bonds, and corporate stocks.

The annual required contribution for the current year was determined as part of a May 1, 2013 actuarial valuation using the "entry age normal" method. The actuarial assumptions included (a) a rate of increase in compensation levels of 3% for fiscal years 2014 and 2013, and (b) expected long-term rate of return on plan assets of 7.5% for fiscal years 2014 and 2013. Variances between actual experience and assumptions for costs and returns on assets which exceed the 10% corridor are amortized over the average expected vested working lives of employees in the plan.

The Medical Center has a 403(b) defined contribution plan for employees hired after May 1, 2007 Employer contributions are based on years of service and employees will become 100% vested after completing five years of service. Eligible employees may contribute a portion of their annual compensation. The Medical Center contributed approximately \$692,000 and \$556,000 to the plan in fiscal years 2014 and 2013, respectively

NOTE J - OPERATING LEASES

Total rental expenses for all operating leases for the fiscal years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, amounted to \$1,038,000 and \$1,137,000, respectively. NOTE L - COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

At June 30, 2014, lawsuits have been filed against the Medical Center claiming alleged personal and punitive damages. While the outcome of these lawsuits is not presently determinable, it is the opinion of management that the ultimate resolution of these claims will not have a material effect on the accompanying combined financial statements.

Effective June 12, 2003, the Medical Center is insured for medical malpractice claims through a claims-made insurance policy. Such coverage had a deductible of \$1,000,000 per claim until June 12, 2010, when the deductible was decreased to \$25,000 per claim. The Medical Center has recorded an accrual for its deductible as well as claims incurred prior to June 30, 2014, but not reported prior to that date based on historical experience. This accrual is recorded in other long-term liabilities on the accompanying combined balance sheets.

Effective May 1, 2003, the Medical Center is insured for workers' compensation claims through a claims-incurred insurance policy with Healthcare Workers' Compensation Self Insurance Fund Such coverage has a deductible of \$250,000 per claim and is limited to claims incurred during the policy period

At June 30, 2014, the Medical Center had entered into commitments for equipment and property additions totaling approximately \$1,931,000

NOTE M - INVESTMENT IN UNCOMBINED ENTITY

Effective January 1998, the Medical Center authorized, upon becoming the sole member of Regional Health Services, Inc., a noninterest-bearing advance to Regional Health Services, Inc. not to exceed \$4,000,000. Additionally, effective August 2000, the Medical Center authorized a second noninterest-bearing advance to Regional Health Services, Inc. not to exceed \$1,000,000. The Affiliate, through its subsidiary, Regional Health Management Corporation ("RHMC"), has used the funds from the advances to partially finance a joint venture with local physicians. The funds were used for the construction and operations of The Surgery Center, LLC (the "LLC"), an outpatient surgery center in Oxford, Alabama, that began operations in May 2000.

During 2005, RHMC obtained a note payable from a bank. The proceeds from this note payable were used to pay down amounts owed to the Medical Center—RHMC accounts for the investment in the uncombined entity using the equity method of accounting—RHMC's investment in the uncombined entity, was \$3,174,803 and \$3,267,495 at June 30, 2014 and 2013, respectively—RHMC has a 50% interest in the uncombined entity

NOTE N - EMPLOYEE MEDICAL SELF-INSURANCE

The Board is self-insured for employee health claims. The plan is administered by a third party and includes per person stop loss coverage. Health insurance expense totaled \$5,285,927 and \$4,894,963 for the fiscal years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, respectively. The Board has accrued an estimate of its liability for amounts due for incurred but not reported claims in accounts payable in the accompanying combined balance sheets.

NOTE O - FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The carrying amounts of cash and cash equivalents, accounts receivable, and accounts payable approximate their fair values. The carrying value of the Board's investments presented in Note B also approximates fair value. The Board's debt is a variable rate note, so the carrying value approximates fair value.

NOTE P - ACQUISITIONS

On December 31, 2012, the Board acquired 100% of the ownership interest of QHG of Jacksonville Inc ("QHG"), and Jacksonville Holdings, Inc ("JHI"), which together owned and operated Jacksonville Medical Center, an 89-bed acute care hospital, and three medical office buildings and other healthcare facilities, for approximately \$6 million in cash and working capital acquired of approximately \$3 million. The Board operates the former Jacksonville Medical Center as Regional Medical Center Jacksonville ("RMCJ") and transferred the assets of JHI to the subsidiary of their Affiliate, RHMC. The acquisition included all of the assets of QHG and JHI, including land, land improvements, buildings, equipment, and receivables. In addition, the Board assumed accounts payable and accrued expenses of QHG and JHI. The acquisition value of the net position acquired as of December 31, 2012 was determined to be approximately \$13,466,000. The acquisition values of land, land improvements, buildings, and equipment were reduced to eliminate the excess net position received. The Board's financial statements include the result of operations of QHG and JHI since the acquisition date.

NOTE Q - CONDENSED COMBINING INFORMATION

During the year ending June 30, 2013, the Board implemented the provisions of GASB Statement No 61, *The Financial Reporting Entity: Omnibus and amendment of GASB Statements No. 14 and 34* This Statement clarified certain requirements for reporting component units and requires the Board to disclose condensed combining information to distinguish between the Board and its blended component units.
