FIRST RESTATED BYLAWS OF THE BANNER FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I Name and Purpose

- **Section 1.1.** Name. This corporation shall be known as: The Banner Foundation ("Corporation").
- <u>Section 1.2</u>. <u>Purpose</u>. The purposes for which the Corporation is formed are exclusively charitable, to wit:
- (a) To receive and administer funds for religious, educational, medical, scientific and charitable purposes and to that end to take and hold by bequest, devise, gift, grant, purchase, lease, or otherwise, either absolutely or jointly with any other person, persons, or corporation, any property, real, personal, tangible, or intangible, or any undivided interest therein, without limitation as to amount or value; to sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of any such property and to invest, reinvest, or deal with the principal or the income thereof in such manner as, in the judgment of the directors, will best promote the purposes of the Corporation without limitation, except such limitations, if any, as may be contained in the instrument under which such property is received, the Articles of Incorporation, or these bylaws ("Bylaws"), or any applicable laws.
- (b) Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the primary purposes of the Corporation shall be for the exclusive benefit of making grants to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code").
- (c) Alone or in cooperation with other persons or organizations to do any and all lawful acts and things which may be necessary, useful, suitable, or proper for the furtherance, accomplishment, or attainment of any or all of the purposes or powers of the Corporation.
- **Section 1.3. Restrictions.** The Corporation is subject to the following restrictions:
- (a) This Corporation shall not engage in any activities not permitted to be carried on by a Corporation exempt from federal income tax. The Corporation shall not participate in any political campaign in any manner. The Corporation shall not attempt to influence legislation.
- (b) No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any director, officer or employee of the Corporation, or of any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the

Corporation affecting one or more of its purposes), and no director, officer or employee of the Corporation, or any private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation.

- (c) The Corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Code Section 4942 and the Regulations promulgated thereunder as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.
- (d) The Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Code Section 4941(d) and the Regulations promulgated thereunder as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.
- (e) The Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Code Section 4943(c) and the Regulations promulgated thereunder as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.
- (f) The Corporation shall not make any investments which jeopardize the carrying out of any of its exempt purposes so as to subject it to tax under Code Section 4944 and the Regulations promulgated thereunder as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.
- (g) The Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Code Section 4645(d) and the Regulations promulgated thereunder as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.
- (h) Upon the dissolution of the Corporation and the winding up of its affairs, the assets of the Corporation shall be distributed exclusively to charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational organizations which would then qualify under the provisions of Code Section 501(c)(3) and the Regulations promulgated thereunder as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

ARTICLE II Directors

<u>Section 2.1</u>. <u>Number and Term of Directors</u>. The business, property and affairs of this Corporation shall be managed by a Board composed of at least three (3) persons. The initial Board was named in the Articles of Incorporation and thereafter successor directors shall be elected at regular annual director's meetings. Successor directors shall serve for a term of one (1) year, or until their successors are duly elected and qualified, or until their death, resignation or removal. A majority of directors present in person shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

<u>Section 2.2</u>. <u>Removal of Directors</u>. Any director may be removed with or without cause upon a two-thirds majority vote of the other directors then in office.

<u>Section 2.3</u>. <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy on the Board shall be filled by the then serving directors. Each director so appointed to fill a vacancy on the Board shall remain a director until removed by the Board or until his or her successor director has been appointed by the Board.

ARTICLE III Meetings of Directors

- <u>Section 3.1</u>. <u>Annual Meeting of Board</u>. Subject to the discretion of the Board to hold the annual meeting on any date, an annual meeting of the Board shall be held each year on a business day between July 1 and September 15.
- <u>Section 3.2.</u> <u>Place of Meeting.</u> Any or all meetings of the Board of Directors ("Board") of this Corporation may be held within or outside of the State of New Mexico. Meetings shall be held at the office of the Corporation in Albuquerque, New Mexico, unless provided otherwise pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Board or in the notice of the meeting pursuant to Section 3.
- <u>Section 3.3.</u> <u>Notice of Annual Meeting.</u> Not more than ten (10) days and not more than fifty (50) days prior to the date of the meeting, written notice date, time and place of the meeting shall be mailed or sent via electronic mail to each director. Each director is under a continuing duty to advise the Corporation of his or her current mailing address or electronic mail address. In the event of cancellation of the meeting, notice of such cancellation shall be sent as soon as is reasonably practicable after such cancellation. Notice of a rescheduled meeting shall be sent according to the terms and requirement of this Section. A director may waive notice of any meeting of the Board in writing at any time, regardless of whether the meeting has already been held.
- Section 3.4. Special Meetings of Board of Directors. Special Meetings of the Board ("Special Meetings"), in addition to the annual meeting, may be called by the President or by any two (2) or more directors. Notice of a Special Meeting shall contain the information as provided in Section 3. and shall additionally include a description of all business to be transacted at the meeting. The notice must be signed by the President or the directors who call the Special Meeting, who shall cause such notice to be sent to each director as provided in Section 3. Unless the directors unanimously agree at the Special Meeting to transact business not described in the notice, the directors shall limit the business transacted at the Special Meeting to that business described in the notice.
- <u>Section 3.5.</u> <u>Electronic Participation</u>. Directors may appear at a meeting by telephone, by videoconferencing, or by other electronic means as the Board may approve, so long as all directors are able to participate in the meeting simultaneously and in real time.
- <u>Section 3.6</u>. <u>Action Without a Meeting</u>. The directors may unanimously consent in writing to take any corporate action without a meeting of the Board.

ARTICLE IV Powers, Duties and Responsibilities of the Board

- <u>Section 4.1</u>. <u>General Powers, Duties and Responsibilities</u>. The Board has the following general powers, duties and responsibilities, in addition to the enumerated powers, duties and responsibilities set forth hereinafter in Sections 4.2. through 4.10., and powers granted by New Mexico statute.
- (a) The management of the Corporation, including without limitation, management of corporate affairs and corporate assets, is vested exclusively in the Board. The Board shall have the exclusive care, custody and control of all of the assets of the Corporation. The Board shall exercise all of the corporate powers pursuant to and subject to the laws of the State of New Mexico, the Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws.
- (b) The Board may distribute corporate assets and income in furtherance of the purposes of the Corporation, to whom, in what amounts, at what times and under what conditions it deems appropriate, including distributions in cash, in kind, by establishing supporting grants or by maintaining research and studies, but any such distribution must be exclusively of the type permitted by the Articles of Incorporation.
- (c) The Board may appoint a corporate trustee to receive, manage, hold, invest and disburse the income and assets of the Corporation, subject to the control of the Board; the Board may enter into an agreement containing the terms and conditions of such relationship, including without limitation the powers and duties of a corporate trustee.
- (d) The Board may pay reasonable salaries or other compensation to officers and directors for services actually rendered by them to the Corporation.
- (e) The Board may borrow money on behalf of the Corporation and may use corporate property to secure such loans.
- (f) Notwithstanding any other provision herein to the contrary, the powers, duties and responsibilities of the Board are to be exercised by it in a fiduciary capacity and in furtherance of the purposes of the Corporation; such powers, duties and responsibilities are expressly restricted to prevent the Board from taking any action that would be in contravention of such purposes.
- <u>Section 4.2.</u> <u>Power to Appoint Officers</u>. The Board shall appoint persons from the Board to serve the Corporation as officers as follows: President, Secretary and Treasurer. The Board may appoint one person to hold two or more such positions, except that the positions of President and Secretary may not be held by the same person.

- <u>Section 4.3.</u> <u>Power to Appoint Other Officers and Agents.</u> The Board may appoint such other officers and agents as it deems necessary for the transaction of the business of the Corporation. The directors may appoint assistants to the officers.
- <u>Section 4.4</u>. <u>Removal of Officers</u>. Any officer may be removed with or without cause upon a two-thirds majority vote of the Board or a quorum thereof.
- <u>Section 4.5</u>. <u>Officer Vacancies</u>. The Board shall appoint a person to fill an officer vacancy as soon as is reasonably practicable.
- <u>Section 4.6</u>. <u>Delegation of Powers</u>. The Board may delegate any or all of the powers and duties of an officer to another officer for any reason.
- <u>Section 4.7.</u> <u>Honorary Directors</u>. The Board may appoint Honorary Directors to the Board ("Honorary Director"). Such Honorary Directors shall have no voting rights or other powers or duties of directors and shall not be entitled to compensation in their capacities as Honorary Directors.
- <u>Section 4.8.</u> <u>Executive Director</u>. The Board may appoint an Executive Director to act as an advisor to the Board.
- (a) The Executive Director shall work with the officers to implement the purposes of the Corporation. The Executive Director shall prepare the annual report to the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission and shall maintain them and make them available to the general public for inspection during regular business hours. The Executive Director shall have such additional powers, duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the Board.
 - (b) The Executive Director may not be a voting member of the Board.
- (c) The Board may set a reasonable level of compensation for the services performed by the Executive Director on behalf of the Corporation.
- (d) The Executive Director may be removed with or without cause upon a two-thirds majority vote of the Board or a quorum thereof.
- <u>Section 4.9.</u> <u>Employees</u>. The Board may hire employees with such additional powers, duties and responsibilities as it shall determine to facilitate the business and purposes of the Corporation.
- <u>Section 4.10.</u> <u>Distributions.</u> The Board, acting alone or upon the advice of others after conducting appropriate investigation and research, shall not less frequently than annually:
- (a) Determine all distributions to be made from net income and principal of the Corporation pursuant to provisions of the Articles of Incorporation and these Bylaws

in such amounts and at such times, with such accompanying restrictions, if any, as it deems necessary to assure their use for the charitable, religious, scientific, literary or educational purposes of the Corporation, and

- (b) Determine all disbursements to be made for administrative expenses incurred by the Board.
- (c) Directors shall disclose the fact that they are associated or related to organizations or persons to whom the Corporation makes distributions and disbursements. Such disclosures shall be made in advance of such distributions or disbursements and shall be entered in the minutes of any meeting of the Board, or if such disclosure is not made at a meeting, it shall be made in a writing addressed to the President and signed by such directors.

ARTICLE V Officers

- <u>Section 5.1</u>. <u>President.</u> The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Corporation and shall preside over all meetings of the Board. The President shall be an *ex-officio* member of all standing committees. The President shall have such additional powers, duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the Board.
- <u>Section 5.2</u>. <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the Board and shall preserve in the books of the Corporation true minutes of the proceedings of all such meetings. The Secretary shall safely keep in his or her custody the seal of the Corporation, if any, and shall have authority to affix the same to all instruments where its use is required. The Secretary shall cause all notices to be issued pursuant to the Bylaws, resolution of the Board or other law. The Secretary shall have such additional powers, duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the Board.
- <u>Section 5.3</u>. <u>Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer is primarily responsible for the management of corporate finances.
- (a) The Treasurer shall deposit corporate receipts in such corporate depositories as the Board may designate. The Treasurer shall make such distributions as the Board may resolve. The Treasurer shall keep accurate books detailing all corporate receipts, distributions and other financial transactions, such books to remain the property of the Corporation. The Treasurer shall render an accounting of all corporate financial transactions and of the overall financial condition of the Corporation at the annual meeting, and at such other times as the President or Board may request. The Treasurer shall have such additional powers, duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the Board.
- (b) When a Treasurer ceases to so serve, for whatever reason, that Treasurer (or his or her representatives) must return all corporate property of whatever kind in the possession or control of the Treasurer (or his or her representatives) to the

Corporation within three (3) months of such cessation of service. The Board may require the Treasurer to post bond to secure the performance of the duties of the Treasurer.

ARTICLE VI Execution of Instruments

<u>Section 6.1</u>. <u>Checks, Banking</u>. All checks, drafts and orders for payment of money shall be signed in the name of the Corporation by the President or any officer of the Corporation authorized by the Board so to act.

<u>Section 6.2</u>. <u>Contracts, Conveyances, etc.</u> When the execution of any contract, conveyance or other instrument has been authorized by the Board, the President or any officer of the Corporation authorized by the Board so to act may execute the same in the name and on behalf of this Corporation and may affix the corporate seal thereto. The affixing of the corporate seal is not a condition to the effectiveness of any contract, conveyance or other instrument executed by the Corporation. The Board shall have the power to designate the officers and agents who shall have the authority to execute any instrument on behalf of this Corporation.

ARTICLE VII Accounting Year

<u>Section 7.1</u>. <u>Accounting Year</u>. The accounting year of the Corporation shall be based on the calendar year.

ARTICLE VIII Indemnification of Officers, Managers and Directors

<u>Section 8.1.</u> <u>Indemnification.</u> The Corporation may indemnify any director, officer or employee or former director, officer or employee ("Corporate Representative") against reasonable expenses, costs and attorney's fees actually and reasonably incurred by him or her in connection with the defense of an action, suit or proceeding, civil or criminal, in which he or she is made a party by reason of being or having been a Corporate Representative. The indemnification may include any amounts paid to satisfy a judgment or to compromise or settle a claim. The Corporate Representative shall not be indemnified if he or she shall is liable, as determined by the Board, on the basis that he or she breached or failed to perform the duties of his or her office and the breach or failure to perform constitutes willful misconduct or recklessness.

<u>Section 8.2.</u> <u>Advance indemnification</u>. The Corporation may indemnify a Corporate Representative in advance for prospective reasonable expenses to be incurred in connection with the defense of the action, suit or proceeding provided that the Corporate Representative must reimburse the Corporation if it is subsequently determined by the Board that the Corporate Representative was not entitled to indemnification.

<u>Section 8.3.</u> <u>When Authorized</u>. The Board shall determine whether or not to indemnify any Corporate Representative on a case by case basis. Such determination shall be made only by directors who are not parties to such action, suit or proceeding.

ARTICLE IX Distribution Upon Dissolution

- <u>Section 9.1.</u> <u>Distribution Upon Dissolution</u>. Upon dissolution of the Corporation, the assets of the Corporation shall be applied and distributed as follows:
- (a) All liabilities and obligations of the Corporation shall be paid and discharged, or adequate provision shall be made therefor;
- (b) Assets held by the Corporation upon condition requiring return, transfer or conveyance, which condition occurs by reason of the dissolution, shall be returned, transferred or conveyed in accordance with such requirements;
- (c) Assets received and held by the Corporation subject to limitations permitting their use only for charitable, religious, eleemosynary, benevolent, educational or similar purposes, but not held upon a condition requiring return, transfer or conveyance by reason of the dissolution, shall be transferred or conveyed to one or more nonprofit domestic or foreign corporations, nonprofit societies or nonprofit organizations, pursuant to a plan of distribution adopted as provided in the Nonprofit Corporation Act (NMSA 1978 § 53-8-1, et seq.);
- (d) Other assets, if any, shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Code Section 501(c)(3) or the corresponding provision of any future federal tax code and any regulations promulgated thereunder, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government for a public purpose, but in no event may any Corporate Representative directly or indirectly receive any distribution or portion of a distribution of any assets; and
- (e) Any remaining assets shall be disposed of by the district court of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated for such permissible purposes.

ARTICLE X Miscellaneous

- <u>Section 10.1</u>. <u>Amendment of the Bylaws</u>. The Bylaws may be amended or repealed by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board.
- <u>Section 10.2.</u> Gift to the Corporation. Gifts shall vest in the Corporation upon receipt and acceptance thereof by an officer or director. Receipt and acceptance of a

negotiable instrument shall be evidenced by endorsement thereon by an officer or director.

- **Section 10.3. Notices.** Unless otherwise provided, all notices required to be given by any provision herein shall state the authority pursuant to which they were issued, *e.g.*, "by order of the President," or "by order of the Board," and shall bear the printed name and signature of the Secretary. Notice shall be deemed duly served upon:
- (a) Delivery to a mailbox or representative of the United States Postal Service, to a mailbox or a representative of a private mail delivery service, with fully prepaid postage, addressed to the addressee at his or her last known address appearing in the records of this Corporation; or
- (b) In the case of electronic mail, pursuant to the provisions of the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act (NMSA 1978 § 14-16-1, et seq.).
- <u>Section 10.4</u>. <u>Singular and Plural; Gender</u>. Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, words denoting the singular may be construed as plural and words of the plural may be construed denoting the singular. Words of gender may be construed as denoting another gender (including nongender such as "it") as is appropriate within the context.
- <u>Section 10.5.</u> <u>Heading of Articles, Sections and Subsections</u>. The headings of Articles, Sections and Subsections are included solely for the convenience and reference of the reader. They shall have no significance in the interpretation or construction of this document.
- <u>Section 10.6.</u> <u>Severability</u>. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of this document shall not impact the validity or enforceability of any other provisions of this document. If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any provision is invalid, the remaining provisions of this document shall be interpreted and construed as if the invalid provision had never been included in this document.
- <u>Section 10.7</u>. <u>Governing Law</u>. These Bylaws will be governed by and construed according to the laws of the State of New Mexico.
