THE COLLINS MEMORIAL LIBRARY The unique collections of the Collins Memorial Library, in both print and electronic formats, covers a broad range of topics, formats and periods. The collections provide educational and research resources for students, faculty, and staff and support the university's commitment to teaching, learning, civic engagement and diversity.

Extensive travel is required of the position of president and s/he is encouraged by the Board of Trustees to travel business or first class on flights of two hours or more. This provision is made for several reasons: (1) business or first-class travel allows for the most flexibility to accommodate a travel schedule that must frequently be altered, often at the last minute to accommodate donors' schedules, add critical meetings, or to take advantage of other strategic opportunities for the university; (2) circumstances sometimes call for the president to return to campus without notice, or to remain on campus when a trip was planned, and first or business-class travel best accommodates these changing conditions; and (3) the Board of Trustees wishes the president to be at his or her best performance representing and seeking funding for the university during often grueling travel itineraries for meetings frequently critical to the institution's well-being. This accommodation was not treated as taxable compensation. HOUSING ALLOWANCE OR RESIDENCE FOR PERSONAL USE The president is required to live on campus in the university-owned president's residence where he regularly holds university events. Because the president accepts this requirement as a condition of employment, the residence is on university premises, and it is provided for the convenience of the university, under IRS rules it is not considered a taxable benefit to the president. As required by IRS Form 990, the value of the portion of the residence used by the president for living quarters has been estimated and is included in the amounts reported in Form 990, Part VII, Column (F), and in Form 990, Schedule J, Part II, Column (D).
