

Thirty-five to 40 exhibitors are expected each year.

BYLAWS
Of the
OREGON SEED GROWERS LEAGUE
As Amended in 2013

ARTICLE I. NAME AND LOCATION

The name of this association shall be Oregon Seed Growers League, hereafter referred to as the "League." Its principal office and principal place of business shall be located in such place or places as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

ARTICLE II. OBJECTS

The purpose of this League shall be to:

Section 1. Promote the production of seeds for which Oregon has trade advantages, or potential trade advantages, market outlets and to stabilize and improve marketing conditions.

Section 2. Analyze costs and charges for the production, harvesting, cleaning, fumigating, or otherwise processing, storing, handling, and marketing of farm seeds.

Section 3. Cooperate actively in the standardization of farm seeds by use of grades, inspection services, brands, trademarks or otherwise and reduce wastes in production, handling and marketing.

Section 4. Assemble and communicate information at the annual meeting on farm seeds and other agricultural products including but not limited to:

- a. Production and marketing costs
- b. Uses.
- c. Methods of distribution.
- d. Trade practices.
- e. Imports and exports
- f. Domestic and foreign stocks, crop prospects, and yields.
- g. Tariffs, reciprocal trade agreements, quote regulations, and governmental programs.
- h. Domestic and foreign purchasing and sales, including prices.
- i. Consumer buying power and potential market demand.
- j. Production and marketing finance.

Section 5. Cooperate actively with federal and state agencies fostering the production and the use of seeds grown in Oregon, including the Agricultural Adjustment Administration, Soil Conservation Services, State Department of Agriculture, and Oregon State Agricultural College Extension Service and Experiment Station.

Section 6. Bring all parties with interest in the Oregon seed industry together in an annual meeting.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. **QUALIFICATIONS.** Membership in the League shall be available to any person, partnership, firm, corporation, or cooperative organization, directly and constructively interested in the promotion and advancement of the Oregon seed industry.

Section 2. **MEMBERSHIP DUES.** Each member shall pay membership dues annually. Membership dues may be included in the cost of the annual meeting registration.

Section 3. **PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP.** Upon payment of the annual dues, a receipt shall be issued to the member which shall serve as proof of membership and shall be non-transferable.

Section 4. **VOTING.** Each member in good standing shall be entitled to one and only one vote. Voting by proxy shall not be permitted.

Section 5. At any time a member fails to meet the qualifications for new members or become delinquent in the payment of his annual dues for a period of one year, his membership shall be terminated.

ARTICLE IV. DIRECTORS

Section 1. **DIRECTORS.** All Directors shall be elected as "at large" from throughout the state and shall have an economic interest in the Oregon seed industry.

Section 2. **NOMINATIONS.** Nominations for expiring positions shall be open from the floor at the annual meeting. At the annual meeting the membership-at-large shall vote on the candidates and the candidate receiving the majority of votes shall be elected to that position.

Section 3. **DIRECTORS.** There shall be no less than seven (7) and no more than twelve (12) Directors. Each Director shall be elected for a term of three (3) years. Each Director shall serve without monetary compensation.

Section 4. **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.** An Executive Committee consisting of three individuals, those being President, who shall act as Chairman, Vice-President and Treasurer may conduct any business or affairs of the League between Board meetings. Action at such meetings is subject to review and approval by the Board.

ARTICLE V. POWER AND DUTIES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND OF OFFICERS

Section 1. **ORGANIZATION.** The Board of Directors shall meet immediately following each annual election, and shall elect by ballot, from its number, a chairman of the Board who shall serve as president of the League, a vice-chairman of the Board who shall serve as vice-president of the League; and a treasurer of the Board, who shall serve as treasurer of the League, each of whom shall be a member of the League. All officers shall hold office for one year or until their successor shall have been elected, qualified and entered upon the discharge of their duties.

Section 2. MANAGEMENT. The Board of Directors shall have general charge of the program and affairs of the League, and may adopt and enforce such rules and regulations as may be deemed desirable for the guidance of the officers, employees, and agents of the League.

Section 3. MEETINGS. The Board of Directors shall meet on call of the president at such times and places as he shall determine. The president shall call such a meeting when so requested in written form by three members of the Board. Effective notice of forty-eight hours shall be given for all Board meetings. Five members shall constitute a quorum for a meeting of the Board of Directors, and a majority vote of a quorum shall constitute a valid action of the Board.

Section 4. VACANCIES. Any vacancy on the Board of Directors other than by expiration of term shall be filled by majority vote of all the remaining members of the Board. The Director so chosen shall hold office for the unexpired portion of the term of the Director whose place he shall have been elected to fill, and he shall be from the same district as his predecessor.

Section 5. EXPENSES. Such travel and subsistence expense as may be incurred by members of the Board of Directors in attending special meetings of the Board, shall be collectible from the League only following specific authorization by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. The PRESIDENT shall call all meetings of the members, and the Board of Directors, and shall preside at such meetings, but shall have no vote except in the event of a tie. In addition, he/she shall sign as president on behalf of the League all documents he/she is authorized by the Board of Directors to sign, name such committees as may be deemed necessary to carry out the purposes of the League and perform all acts and duties usually required of an executive and presiding officer.

Section 7. VICE-PRESIDENT. In the absence, or in the event of the disability of the president, the vice-president shall serve in his stead.

Section 8. TREASURER. In addition to such other duties as shall be specified by the Board of Directors, the treasurer shall:

- a. Receive all League funds and deposit such in the depository specified by the Board of Directors.
- b. Make all disbursements of League funds, by check only, under such signature requirements, and other safe-guards, as shall be specified by the Board of Directors, recorded in its minute book and reported to the depository.
- c. Delegate these administrative duties to staff selected by the Board, however, will retain oversight.

Section 9. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. The Executive Director shall serve continuously until replaced by the Board without the necessity of re-election and shall be compensated in an amount fixed by the Board. The Executive Director shall:

- a. Serve as custodian of all property of the League, including the corporate seal.
- b. In appropriate minute books, keep a record of all meetings of the

members, and of the Board of Directors, and within a reasonable time provide a copy thereof, to each Board member.

- c. Maintain the membership roll.
- d. Each year, immediately prior to the annual meeting of the members, prepare a budget including estimates of receipts and expenditures, and present such data to the Board of Directors.
- e. Serve all notices required by law, by these bylaws, by the Board of Directors, or by the members acting in their regularly called meetings.
- f. Stand responsible for the completeness of all League accounting.
- g. File all required reports, including all state and federal tax reporting, annually.
- h. Shall perform all administrative duties delegated by the Treasurer.
- i. Shall provide staff necessary to accomplish these duties.

ARTICLE VI. FISCAL YEAR – MEETINGS

Section 1. The FISCAL YEAR of this corporation shall begin on the first day of July of each year and close on the last day of the following June.

Section 2. The ANNUAL MEETING of the members of the League shall be held annually, as determined by the Board.

Section 3. SPECIAL MEETINGS of the members may be called by the President for any time, and any place in the State of Oregon. Such meeting shall be called upon request by the Board of Directors, or upon receipt of a written petition signed by 10 percent of the members in good standing.

Section 4. MEETING NOTICES. Ten days prior to the date of any meeting of the members, the Executive Director shall mail notice thereof to each member, to the address recorded on the books of the League. With the call for a special meeting shall be included a statement of the nature of the business to be transacted.

Section 5. QUORUM. Those members present in person shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business at any regularly called meeting of the members.

ARTICLE VII. DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution of the League, the net assets are to be distributed to one or more agricultural-related organizations operated exclusively for purposes as shall at that time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code as the Board of Directors shall determine.

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended at any regularly called membership meeting by two-thirds affirmative vote of the members present, provided that notice of the proposed amendment shall have been included in the meeting call.
