# RESTATED BYLAWS OF THE WOODARD FAMILY FOUNDATION Adopted: February 22, 2014

### ARTICLE I - MEMBERS.

The Woodard Family Foundation (the Corporation) shall have no members.

### ARTICLE II - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. <u>Number</u>. The Board of Directors (the Board) shall consist of at least three (3) but not more than ten (10) Members until such number is increased or decreased by a resolution of the Board passed by a super-majority of the then in office directors.

Section 2. <u>Election and Tenure</u> Directors seeking a consecutive term of office shall be elected by a majority of the directors then in office. First time directors and those not seeking a consecutive term must be elected by a super-majority vote. Each director shall serve for a term of two years, or until his or her successor is elected and has accepted office. There is no limit to the number of terms a director may serve, consecutively or otherwise.

Section 3. <u>Resignation</u>. Except as otherwise provided, any director may resign at any time, either by oral tender of resignation at any meeting of the Board or by giving written notice to the President or Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified in the notice, and its acceptance shall not be necessary to make it effective. Once delivered, a notice of resignation is irrevocable unless the Board permits revocation.

Section 4. <u>Vacancies</u> Any vacancy occurring on the Board due to the death, resignation, removal or disqualification of a director, or to an increase in the size of the Board, shall be filled by a super-majority vote of all the remaining directors. A director so elected shall serve for the unexpired portion of the term of his or her predecessor, or until his or her successor shall have been elected and accepted office.

During the existence of any vacancy the remaining directors shall possess and may exercise all powers vested in the Board. If the Board accepts the resignation of a director tendered to take effect in the future, a successor may be elected to take office when the resignation becomes effective.

Section 5. <u>Removal</u>. Any director may be removed from office with or without cause by vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the directors then in office. A reduction in the prescribed number of directors shall not have the effect of removing any director before that director's term of office expires.

Section 6. <u>General Powers</u>. The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed and controlled by the Board. The Board shall do and perform every act and thing it deems necessary, expedient or advisable to carry out the purposes of this Corporation subject to the provisions of the Act, the Restated Articles of Incorporation and these Restated Bylaws.

Section 7. <u>Annual Meeting</u>. An annual meeting of the Board shall be held each year on a date selected by a majority of the Board.

The Board shall address such other business as may come before the meeting. The annual meeting shall be held at the principal offices of the Corporation, or at such other place as may be specified in the notice of meeting

Section 8 <u>Regular Meetings</u>. Regular meetings of the Board shall be held quarterly, or upon another regular schedule established by the Board and provided in writing to each director. Regular meetings may be held without additional notice of the date, time, place or purpose of the meeting, except directors will receive notice of any changes to the written schedule of regular meetings.

Section 9. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board may be called at any time and for any purpose by the President of the Corporation or by any two directors.

Section 10. <u>Notice of Special Meeting</u>. The person or persons calling a special meeting shall give notice of the date, time and place of the meeting at least ten business days prior to such meeting by (i) telephone communication, either directly to the director or to a person at the office of the director who may be reasonably expected to communicate such notice promptly to the director, or (ii) by a writing delivered personally or mailed to each director, or by e-mail. If written notice is mailed, the notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail, properly addressed with postage prepaid. The notice need not specify the purpose of the meeting.

Section 11. <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. Whenever any notice to any director of the Corporation is required by law, the Restated Articles of Incorporation or these Restated Bylaws, a waiver of notice in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether signed before or after the time stated in the notice, shall be equivalent to the giving of the notice. The attendance of a director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where the director attends for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

Section 12. <u>Quorum</u>. A majority of the directors then in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. If less than a quorum is present at a meeting, a majority of the directors present may adjourn and reconvene the meeting without further notice.

Section 13. <u>Manner of Action</u>. The act of a majority of the directors present and entitled to vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board unless the act of a greater number is required by the provisions of the Act, the Restated Articles of Incorporation or these Restated Bylaws.

Section 14. <u>Super-Majority</u>. Pursuant to Article II section 13, the following actions shall be an act of the board only if approved by 80% of the board members entitled to vote on such matters:

- a. Changes to the By-Laws of the Woodard Family Foundation
- b. Dissolution of the Foundation
- c Change of investment manager
- d. Election of a director to a term which is not a consecutive term
- e. A distribution of Foundation assets that is not pursuant to the Foundation's usual grantmaking activities or normal activities.

Section 15. <u>Action by Unanimous Written Consent</u>. Any action which may be taken at a meeting of the Board may be taken without a meeting if consent in writing, setting forth the action taken, is signed by all of the directors of the Corporation. The consent shall have the same effect as a unanimous vote of such directors, and shall be filed in the records of minutes of the Corporation.

Section 16. <u>Telephonic Meetings</u>. Meetings of the Board or any Board committee may be held by conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other and participation in such meeting shall constitute presence in person at the meeting

Section 17. <u>Presumption of Assent</u>. A director present at a Board meeting at which action on any corporate matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless the director's dissent is entered in the minutes of the meeting, or unless the director files a written dissent to such action with the person acting as the secretary of the meeting before the adjourn-ment of the meeting, or forwards such dissent by registered mail to the Secretary /Treasurer of the Corporation immediately after the adjournment of the meeting. The right to dissent shall not apply to a director who voted in favor of such action.

Section 18 <u>Compensation and Expenses</u>. Directors and Advisory Directors may be compensated for their services as directors or Advisory Directors in amounts established by the Board from time to time. Upon Board approval, directors and Advisory Directors may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in connection with performance of their official duties.

Section 19. Advisory Directors. A majority of the Board may from time to time appoint one or more Advisory Directors. Each Advisory Director shall hold office for a term of one year from the date he or she was elected, unless removed at an earlier time by a majority of the Board. An Advisory Director may resign at any time. Advisory Directors may attend all meetings of the Board or any committee of the Board to which they have been appointed, and may advise the Board and such committees concerning the business, property and affairs of the Corporation. The Board shall provide Advisory Directors with a schedule of regular meetings, and the person(s) calling a special meeting of the Board shall endeavor to notify Advisory Directors of any such meetings. Advisory Directors shall not have the right to vote on any matter before the Board or a committee of the Board, and shall not be counted for the purpose of determining whether a quorum of the Board or a committee is pre- sent. Advisory Directors shall have no duty to keep themselves apprised of the Corporation's affairs. Unless otherwise specifically provided, references in these Restated Bylaws to "directors" and the "Board" do not include Advisory Directors.

### **ARTICLE III - COMMITTEES**

Subject to the Act, the provisions of the Corporation's Restated Articles of Incorporation and these Restated Bylaws, the Board may appoint committees for any permanent or ad hoc purpose it deems appropriate. Committees shall have as many members as the Board designates, provided that each committee shall have two or more members. Directors, Advisory Directors and any other person may serve on committees. The committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the Board, and shall have such powers as the Board specifically grants. The provisions of Article II of these Restated Bylaws governing meetings, notice and waiver of notice, and quorum and voting requirements apply to the committees and their members.

### **ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS**

Section 1. Officers. The officers of the Corporation shall be a President, Vice-President and Secretary/Treasurer, and such subordinate officers as the Board shall from time to time appoint. An individual may simultaneously hold more than one office

Section 2 <u>Appointment and Term of Office</u>. The Board shall appoint the officers of the Corporation immediately following the biennial election of directors and each shall hold office until a successor shall have been duly appointed and have accepted office. There is no limit to the number of terms an officer may serve, consecutive or otherwise.

Section 3. <u>Resignation</u>. Any officer of the Corporation may resign at any time by giving written notice to the President or Secretary/Treasurer. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified in the

notice, and its acceptance shall not be necessary to make it effective. Once delivered, a notice of resignation is irrevocable unless revocation is permitted by the Board

Section 4. <u>Removal</u>. Any officer may be removed by the majority vote of the directors then in office, with or without cause.

Section 5. <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy in any office due to death, resignation, removal, disqualification or other cause shall be filled by the Board for the unexpired portion of the term.

Section 6. <u>President</u>. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board. Subject to the control of the Board, the President shall be charged with the general supervision of the policies, business and affairs of the Corporation, and shall per- form such other duties as the Board may prescribe from time to time.

Section 7. <u>Vice-President</u>. In the absence of the President, or in the event of the President's death, inability or refusal to act, the Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President, and when so acting shall have all powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President.

Section 8. <u>Secretary/Treasurer</u>. The Secretary/Treasurer shall (i) keep or cause to be kept at the principal office of the Corporation, or such other place as the Board directs, a book of minutes of all meetings of directors showing the time and place of the meeting, whether it was regular or special, and if special, how authorized, the notice given, the names of those present and a description of the proceedings at the meeting, (ii) give or cause to be given such notice of the meetings of the Board as required by these Restated Bylaws, (iii) be responsible for the funds of the Corporation, and keep full and accurate accounts of the receipts and disbursements in books maintained at the Corporation's principal offices or such other place as the Board directs, and (iv) perform such other duties as the Board prescribes.

Section 9. <u>Compensation and Expenses</u>. Officers may be compensated for their services as officers in amounts established by the Board from time to time. Upon Board approval, expenses incurred in connection with performance of official duties may be reimbursed to any officer.

### ARTICLE V - TRANSACTIONS WITH INTERESTED DIRECTORS OR ADVISORY DIRECTORS

Section 1. <u>Validity of Transaction</u>. No transaction in involving the Corporation in which a director or Advisory Director has a direct or indirect interest shall be voidable by the Corporation, or the basis for imposing liability on a director or Advisory Director, solely on the basis of such direct or indirect interest, if the transaction is fair to the Corporation and at the time it was entered into it was approved by (i) the Board, if the material facts of the transaction and the interest of the director or Advisory Director are disclosed or known to the Board, (ii) the Attorney General, or (iii) the circuit court in an action in which the Attorney General is joined as a party.

Section 2. <u>Indirect Interest</u>. For purposes of this Article V, a director or Advisory Director of the Corporation has an indirect interest in a transaction if another entity in which the director or Advisory Director has a material financial interest or in which the director or Advisory Director is a general partner is a party to the transaction, or the transaction is with another entity of which the director or Advisory Director is a director, officer or trustee and the transaction is or should be considered by the Board.

Section 3. <u>Board Approval</u>. For purposes of Section 1 of this Article V, a transaction in which a director or Advisory Director has an interest is authorized, approved or ratified if it receives the affirmative vote of the required number of the directors on the Board who have no direct or indirect interest in the transaction. A transaction may not be authorized, approved or ratified under this Article V by a single

director. The presence of, or a vote cast by, a director with a direct or indirect interest in the transaction does not affect the validity of any action taken by the Board if the transaction is otherwise authorized, approved or ratified in any manner as provided in Section 1 of this Article V.

### ARTICLE VI

To the fullest extent permitted by the Act, no director or officer of the Corporation shall be liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for conduct as a director or officer. Any amendment to or repeal of this provision or to the Act shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a director or officer of the Corporation for or with respect to any acts or omissions of such director or officer occurring prior to such amendment or repeal. No change in the Act shall reduce or eliminate the rights and protection set forth in this Article VI unless the change in the law specifically requires such reduction or elimination.

### **ARTICLE VII - INDEMNIFICATION**

Section 1. <u>Directors, Advisory Directors and Officers</u> The Corporation shall indemnify to the fullest extent permitted by law any person who is made, or threatened to be made, a party to or witness in, or is otherwise involved in, any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, investigative, or otherwise (including any action, suit or proceeding by or in the right of the Corporation) by reason of the fact that:

- i. the person is or was a director, advisory director or officer of the Corporation or any of its subsidiaries;
- ii. the person is or was serving as a fiduciary within the meaning of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 with respect to any employee benefit plan of the Corporation or any of its subsidiaries; or
- the person is or was serving, at the request of the Corporation or any of its subsidiaries, as a director or officer, or as a fiduciary of an employee benefit plan, of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise.

Section 2. <u>Employees and Other Agents</u>. The Corporation may indemnify its employees and other agents to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Section 3. <u>Advances of Expenses</u>. The expenses incurred by a director, Advisory Director or officer in connection with any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, investigative, or other- wise, which the director, Advisory Director or officer is made or threatened to be made a party to or witness in, or is otherwise involved in, shall be paid by the Corporation in advance upon writ- ten request of the director, Advisory Director or officer, if he or she

- i. furnishes the Corporation a written affirmation of his or her good faith belief that he or she is entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation; and
- ii. furnishes the Corporation a written undertaking to repay such advance to the extent that it is ultimately determined by a court that he or she is not entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation. Such advances shall be made without regard to the person's ability to repay such expenses and without regard to the person's ultimate entitlement to indemnification under this Article VII or otherwise

Section 4. <u>Nonexclusivity of Rights</u>. The rights conferred on any person by this Article VII shall be in addition to any rights to which a person may otherwise be entitled under any Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, agreement, statute, policy of insurance, vote of the Board, or otherwise.

Section 5. <u>Survival of Rights</u>. The rights conferred on any person by this Article VII shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director, Advisory Director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation; and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such person

Section 6. Amendments. Any repeal of this Article VII shall be prospective only and no repeal or modification of this Article VII shall adversely affect any right or protection that is based upon this Article VII and pertains to an act or omission that occurred prior to the time of such repeal or modification.

### ARTICLE VIII - CONTRACTS AND BANKING

Section 1. <u>Deposits</u>. All funds of the Corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board may select.

Section 2. <u>Checks</u>. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents, of the Corporation, and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board.

Section 3. <u>Loans</u>. No loan shall be made by or to this Corporation, and no evidences of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution of the Board. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances. No loans shall be made by the Corporation to its directors or officers.

Section 4. Execution of Documents The Board may, except as otherwise provided in these Restated Bylaws, authorize any officer or agent to enter into any contract or execute any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances. Unless so authorized by the Board, no officer, agent or employee shall have any power or authority to bind the Corporation by any contract or engagement, or to pledge its credit, or to render it liable for any purpose or for any amount.

### ARTICLE IX - CORPORATE RECORDS AND REPORTS

Section 1. Records. The Corporation shall maintain adequate and correct books, records and accounts of its business and properties. All of such books, records and accounts shall be kept

at its place of business as fixed by the Board from time to time, except as otherwise provided by law.

Section 2. <u>Inspection of Articles and Bylaws</u>. The originals or copies of the Corporation 's Restated Articles of Incorporation and these Restated Bylaws, and any amendments to or restatements of such documents, certified by the Secretary/Treasurer, shall be open to inspection by the directors and Advisory Directors at the Corporation's principal executive office at all reasonable times during office hours.

Section 3. <u>Inspection of Books and Records</u>. All books, records and accounts of the Corporation shall be open to inspection by the directors and Advisory Directors in the manner and to the extent required by law.

### **ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS**

These Restated Bylaws of the Corporation may be altered, amended or repealed and new Bylaws adopted by the vote of a super-majority of the directors at any meeting of the Board.

### ARTICLE XI - APPROVAL BY MEMBERS

These Restated Bylaws were adopted February 22, 2014 at a meeting of the Board by a majority of the directors entitled to vote.
