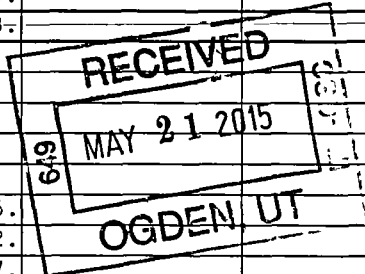

1. PURPOSE

Servco Foundation scholarships are awarded to encourage the spouses and children of Servco Pacific Inc. employees in the United States to pursue higher education at any accredited school. Students already enrolled in college are also eligible to apply.

- B. The applicant must have demonstrated leadership and responsibility through participation in school activities and community service.
- C. The applicant's class standing will be considered. A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.0 in his or her high school career is highly desirable.
- D. The applicant's parent or spouse must be an employee of Servco Pacific Inc. when the scholarship is first awarded.
- E. The applicant must exhibit a desire and the ability to further his or her education.
- F. The applicant's need for financial assistance will be taken into consideration. The applicant must submit his/her Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Student Aid Report, or a signed statement indicating that the student will not be applying for financial aid. If a FAFSA is not submitted, the committee may conclude that there is no significant need for financial assistance.
- G. Current recipients may apply to have their scholarships renewed. To maintain scholarship eligibility, the recipient must make academic progress towards his or her degree by successfully completing a full-time course load each year aid is received.
- H. The Selection Committee is comprised of external, impartial members.

4. APPLICATION DETAILS & DEADLINE

All application materials must be **postmarked** by **March 1, 2014**, to qualify for consideration by the Scholarship Selection Committee. Application materials submitted in person, by email, by interoffice mail, or by facsimile transmission may not be accepted. The following **must** be submitted by the postmark deadline:

- The four-page Application Form for the proper year (filled in completely and accurately), with an original signature on the last page.
- The student's FAFSA Student Aid Report indicating the EFC (Expected Family Contribution) or a statement indicating that the applicant will not be requesting financial aid.
- An official school transcript, including cumulative grade point average and class standing as of the end of the first semester of the 2013-2014 year. The school may submit the transcript directly to the Foundation. For college students, a complete official high school transcript **and** an official college transcript through the Fall semester are required. For applicants not currently attending school, an official transcript from the last attended school should be submitted.
- College entrance test scores (preferably SAT), if available, or a signed statement explaining why the scores are not available.
- At least two letters of recommendation from the student's high school principal, teachers, counselors or professional persons in the community. Letters from relatives will not be accepted.
