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BYLAWS OF GREYSTONE POWER FOUNDATION, INC.

ARTICLE I. NAME AND OFFICES

SECTION 1. Name. The name of this Corporation shall be GREYSTONE POWER FOUNDATION, INC., (the "FOUNDATION")

SECTION 2. Registered Office and Agent. The FOUNDATION shall maintain a registered office in the State of Georgia, and shall have a registered office whose address is identical with the address of such registered agent, in accordance with the requirements of the Georgia Nonprofit Corporation Code.

SECTION 3. Other Offices. The FOUNDATION may have other offices at such place or places, within or without the State of Georgia, as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time or the affairs of the FOUNDATION may require or make desirable.

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE OF ORGANIZATION

The purpose of the FOUNDATION shall be the accumulation and disbursement of funds for charitable purposes primarily in the service area of GREYSTONE POWER CORPORATION. Upon dissolution of the FOUNDATION, any remaining funds shall be distributed only for charitable purposes.

ARTICLE III. FUNDING

The FOUNDATION shall be funded by such rules and regulations as may be promulgated by the Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation and from any other source of funds available to the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The FOUNDATION shall be administered by a nine (9) person Board of Directors. The initial Board of Directors shall consist of nine (9) persons as designated by the Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation. The FOUNDATION'S service area shall be divided into nine (9) districts with the same boundaries as the districts for the GreyStone Power Corporation Directors and the FOUNDATION shall have one (1) Director from each of the nine (9) districts. The terms of office for each Board member shall be for a period of three (3) years.

ARTICLE V. QUALIFICATIONS OF BOARD MEMBERSHIP

A Board member of the FOUNDATION shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age, a permanent resident of the Director's district from which he/she is chosen and of good moral character. It shall not be necessary for members of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION to be members of GreyStone Power Corporation. No person seeking or holding a seat on the Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation shall remain a member of the FOUNDATION Board.

ARTICLE VI. COMPENSATION OF DIRECTORS

No director shall receive compensation from the FOUNDATION for serving on the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION. Such Board members may, however, be reimbursed for mileage and out of pocket expenses incurred while on the business of the FOUNDATION when such business is sanctioned by the Board of Directors of said FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE VII. SELECTION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The initial Board of Directors shall be designated by the Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation. Thereafter, when vacancies are to be filled or when terms expire, persons shall be named to the respective vacancies on the said Board of Directors by a vote of the Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation. The existing Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may make recommendations to the Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation for nominees for the FOUNDATION Board.

ARTICLE VIII. MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall be held at least quarterly at a place designated by the Board. The Board of Directors may meet at such other times as they may deem, at their discretion, to be necessary.

SECTION 2. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the Chairman or any three (3) Directors, and it shall thereupon be the duty of the Secretary to cause a Notice of such meeting to be given as hereafter provided. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the Board of Directors may fix the place and time for holding any special meeting called by them.

SECTION 3. Notice. The Secretary shall give notice of any regular or special meeting at least five (5) days prior to the meeting by personal delivery, telex, telecopy, cablegram, email or mail. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid. Any director may waive notice of any meeting.

The attendance of a director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

SECTION 4. Action Without a Meeting. Any action that may be taken by the Board of Directors at a meeting may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action to be taken, shall be signed before such action by all of the Directors.

SECTION 5. Participation in Meeting Through Any Means of Communication. Directors may participate in meetings of the Board of Directors, through the use of any means of communications by which all directors participating may simultaneously hear each other during the meeting and participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at such a meeting.

SECTION 6. Presumption of Assent. A director of the FOUNDATION who is present at a meeting of the Board of Directors at which action on any corporate matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting or unless he shall file his written dissent to such action with the person acting as the secretary of the meeting before the adjournment thereof or shall forward such dissent by registered mail to the Secretary of the FOUNDATION immediately after the adjournment of the meeting. Such right to dissent shall not apply to a director who voted in favor of such action.

SECTION 7. Committees. The Board of Directors may, by resolution passed by a majority of the entire Board, designate one or more committees to consist of three or more of the directors of the FOUNDATION, which, to the extent provided in the resolution, shall perform their duties and report to the Board of Directors. Such committee or committees shall have such names as may be determined from time to time by resolution adopted by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IX. QUORUM

A majority of the Board of Directors shall, unless otherwise designated in these Articles, constitute a quorum. In the event that less than a majority of the Board of Directors is present at any meeting, the majority of those Directors present may adjourn the meeting and designate a place and time for the next meeting, under which circumstances the Secretary shall notify the absent members of the place and time of the next meeting. An act of the majority of the Board of Directors present at any meeting at which a quorum is present, and unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws, shall be the act of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE X. REMOVAL OF MEMBER OF BOARD

Any member of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION upon majority vote of the Board may cease to be a member of said Board if and in the event such member misses three

(3) consecutive "regular" meetings as outlined in Section 1 of Article VIII of these Bylaws. Any members of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may otherwise be removed for cause from the Board by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the entire Board of Directors of the Foundation.

ARTICLE XI. OFFICERS OF THE CORPORATION

The officers of the FOUNDATION shall be a Chairman, a Vice Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer, and such other officers as may be determined by the Board from time to time. For the purposes of these Bylaws, the above four (4) officers shall constitute the Executive Committee of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XII. ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND TERMS OF OFFICE

The officers shall by secret ballot be elected annually by the Board of Directors at a meeting of the Board of Directors held on an annual basis after the initial organization meeting.

The terms of office shall be for one (1) one year, however, nothing shall prevent an officer from being re-elected to consecutive terms of office.

ARTICLE XIII. EX OFFICIO MEMBERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The President/CEO of GreyStone Power Corporation shall be an ex officio member of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION. The FOUNDATION may from time to time have other such ex officio members as the Board of Directors may in its discretion determine as necessary or prudent.

The President/CEO of GreyStone Power Corporation in his/her capacity as ex officio member of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall upon request assist the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board with their official duties hereinafter shown in Article XV.

ARTICLE XIV. POLICIES, RULES, AND REGULATIONS

The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall have the power to make and adopt such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with law, the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws, as it may deem advisable for the management, administration and regulation of the business and affairs of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XV. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The Chairman shall be the principal executive officer of the FOUNDATION and, unless otherwise determined by the Board of Directors, shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and in general perform all duties incidental to the office of Chairman and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors from time to time.

SECTION 2. In the absence of the Chairman, or in the event of his/her inability or refusal to act, the Vice Chairman shall perform the duties of the Chairman, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Chairman. The Vice Chairman shall also perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 3. The Secretary shall be responsible for the keeping of the minutes of the meetings of the members of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose; be responsible for seeing that all notices are duly given in accordance with these Bylaws or as required by law; be custodian of the corporate records and of the seal of the FOUNDATION and affix the seal of the FOUNDATION to all necessary documents, the execution of which on behalf of the FOUNDATION under its seal is duly authorized in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws; have general charge of the books of the FOUNDATION; be responsible for the keeping on file at all times a complete copy of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the FOUNDATION containing all amendments thereto; and, in general, perform all duties incidental to the office of the Secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the FOUNDATION; be responsible for the receipt of and the issuance of receipt for monies due and payable to the FOUNDATION from any source whatsoever, and for the deposit of all such monies in the name of the FOUNDATION in such bank or banks as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws; and, in general, perform all the duties incidental to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XVI. CHECK SIGNING

Any and all checks issued by the FOUNDATION, and any and all withdrawals by the FOUNDATION, for any purpose, shall be signed by two (2) officers or one (1) officer and such other person(s) as may be designated by the Board of Directors as having check-signing authority, however, under no circumstances shall checks be signed only by one (1) person.

ARTICLE XVII. DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

Except as otherwise provided by these Bylaws, the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall have the full and sole responsibility for the disbursement of all monies of the FOUNDATION in accordance with the Bylaws and the policies as adopted by the Board of Directors.

Prior to consideration by the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION of any disbursement, member(s) of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall disclose and explain any personal and/or business interest, connection, kinship or other association he or she has with the person, family, group, corporation or other entity under consideration for funding by the FOUNDATION. Such interested director shall excuse himself or herself from the meeting, and shall not participate in the discussion of or voting on the disbursement.

Members of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION, immediate family members of the members of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION, members of the Board of Directors of Grey Stone Power Corporation, immediate family members of the members of the Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation, employees of GreyStone Power Corporation and immediate family members of employees of GreyStone Power Corporation shall not be eligible to receive any disbursement of monies from the FOUNDATION. For the purposes of this Article XVII, immediate family members means spouse, parent, son, daughter, brother, sister, niece, nephew, half-sibling, step-sibling, grandparent, grandchild, in-laws and step-parents.

No disbursements of monies from the FOUNDATION shall be used for the direct payment of utility bills; however, the FOUNDATION may make donations to agencies such as Project Share of the Salvation Army whose purpose is to assist with utility bill payments.

ARTICLE XVIII. TRANSFER OF FUNDS

GreyStone Power Corporation shall transfer funds collected by it for the benefit of the FOUNDATION on a regular basis, but in no event less than quarterly. The FOUNDATION may also solicit and accept contributions from other sources as deemed appropriate by its Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XIX. INVESTMENT OF FUNDS

The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall be responsible for the funds entrusted to it and shall make such investment of said funds in a manner which is reasonable and prudent and in keeping with these Bylaws and the policies of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XX. ACCOUNTING SYSTEM AND REPORTS

The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall cause to be established and maintained a complete accounting system that is in keeping with sound financial management, and furthermore the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall make reports to the Board of Directors of Grey Stone Power Corporation on the operation and expenditures of the FOUNDATION as may be necessary and prudent, but in no case less than annually.

ARTICLE XXI. POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS

No funds of the FOUNDATION shall in any fashion be used to support any candidate for political office or for any political purpose.

ARTICLE XXII. BORROWING FUNDS

The FOUNDATION shall NOT have the authority to borrow monies from any bank, savings and loan or other institutions for any purpose.

ARTICLE XXIII. EMERGENCY EXPENDITURES

The Executive Committee of the FOUNDATION, by a vote of at least (3) of its members, may from time to time make expenditures on an emergency basis in accordance with these Bylaws and policies adopted by the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION, and in accordance with the purpose of this FOUNDATION, in an amount not exceeding FIVE THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$5,000.00) DOLLARS, to a group or organization.

Such emergency expenditure shall be fully disclosed by the Executive Committee at the next called meeting of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XXIV. AMOUNT OF EXPENDITURES

UNLESS otherwise provided by these Bylaws and in keeping with the purpose of this FOUNDATION, the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may make annual expenditures of FOUNDATION funds by majority vote of members present at a meeting and constituting a quorum according to the following rules:

- a.) Except in extraordinary circumstances, the Foundation shall direct funds for the benefit of any group, organization, charity or like organization that provides

assistance to members in GreyStone's service area. Should an extraordinary situation arise, not more than TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND NO/100THS (\$2,500.00) DOLLARS, annually for the benefit of any individual.

- b.) Not more than TWENTY THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$20,000.00) DOLLARS, annually for the benefit of any family unit, group, organization, charity or like organization.
- c.) The FOUNDATION shall not make any disbursements directly to any individual or family unit. Any disbursements intended for the benefit of an individual or family unit shall be made to third parties for the benefit of said individual or family unit.
- d.) Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the FOUNDATION shall not make any disbursements specifically for the payment of utility charges, rent or other costs of housing, including home mortgage payments.

ARTICLE XXV. EXPENDITURES EXCEEDING TWENTY THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$20,000.00) DOLLARS

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may, by an affirmative vote of no less than seven (7) members of the Board of Directors, make expenditures in any amount to any group, organization, charity or like organization which such members determine is in keeping with the purpose and spirit of the FOUNDATION and these Bylaws.

ARTICLE XXVI. RETENTION OF FUNDS

Until such time as there exists a sum of money, including earned interest, in an amount of not less than TEN THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$10,000.00) DOLLARS within the FOUNDATION, no expenditures exceeding ninety-five (95%) percent of the annual contributions, from whatever source derived, may be disbursed or otherwise disposed of for any purpose. Thereafter, the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may, in its discretion and in accordance with other dictates imposed by these Bylaws, expend any and all monies, saving and excepting five (5%) percent of the previous year's total contributions or FIVE THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$5,000.00) DOLLARS, whichever is less.

ARTICLE XXVII. PROXY VOTING

There shall not exist proxy voting at any meeting of the Board of Directors of the

FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XXVIII. AUDIT

The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall on an annual basis cause the books and records of the FOUNDATION to be audited by a certified public accountant and a report in keeping with sound accounting principles be issued to the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION and the Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation.

ARTICLE XXIX. FISCAL YEAR

The Fiscal Year of the FOUNDATION shall commence on the 1st day of September of each calendar year and end on the 31st day of August of each calendar year.

ARTICLE XXX. INDEMNIFICATION

SECTION 1. Right of Indemnification. Subject to the provisions of Section 2 of this Article, the FOUNDATION, shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative (other than an action by or in the right of the FOUNDATION in which such person was adjudged liable to the FOUNDATION or in any other proceeding in which such person was adjudged liable on the basis that personal benefit was improperly received by such person) by reason of the fact that he/she is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the FOUNDATION against expenses (including attorney's fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by him/her in connection with such action, suit or proceeding, if he acted in a manner he/she believed in good faith to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the FOUNDATION, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his/her conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action, suit or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent, shall not, of itself, be determinative that the person did not act in a manner which he/she believed in good faith to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the FOUNDATION, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe that his/her conduct was unlawful.

SECTION 2. Determination and Authorization of Indemnification. Any indemnification under Section 1 of this Article (unless ordered by a court) shall be made by the FOUNDATION only as authorized in the specific case upon a determination that indemnification of the director, officer, employee or agent is proper in the circumstances because he/she had met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in said Section 1. Such determination shall be made (a) by the Board of Directors, by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of directors who were not parties

to such action, suit or proceeding; (b) if such quorum is not obtainable, by a majority vote of a committee duly designated by the Board of Directors (in which designation directors who are parties may participate), consisting solely of two or more directors not at the time parties to the proceeding; (c) by special legal counsel selected by the Board of Directors or its committee in the manner prescribed in (a) or (b) above; or if a quorum cannot be obtained or under (a) above and a committee cannot be selected under (b), by majority vote of the full Board of Directors (in which selection directors who are parties may participate; or (d) by the members who are not parties to the proceeding).

SECTION 3. Mandatory indemnification. If a director, officer, employee or agent of the FOUNDATION has been successful on the merits or otherwise as a party to any action, suit or proceeding, referred to in Section 1 of the Article, or with respect to any claim, issue or matter therein (to the extent that a portion of his expenses can be reasonably allocated thereto), he/she shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorney's fees) actually and reasonably incurred by him/her in connection therewith.

SECTION 4. Advance for Expenses. Reasonable expenses incurred in connection with a civil, criminal, administrative or investigative action, suit or proceeding, or threat thereof, may be paid by the FOUNDATION in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit or proceeding as authorized by the Board of Directors in the specific case upon receipt of a written affirmation of such person of his/her good faith belief that such person has acted in a manner which he/she believed good faith to be in or not opposed to the best interest of the FOUNDATION, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding had no reasonable cause to believe that his/her conduct was unlawful and an undertaking by or on behalf of the director, officer, employee or agent to repay such amount unless it shall ultimately be determined that he/she is entitled to be indemnified by the FOUNDATION as authorized in this Article.

SECTION 5. Insurance. By action of the Board of Directors, notwithstanding any interest to action by a director, officer, employee or agent in his/her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office or position, except that no such other rights, in respect to indemnification or otherwise, may be provided or granted with respect to the liability of any director, officer, employee or agent for (a) any appropriation, in violation of his/her duties, of any business opportunity of the FOUNDATION; (b) acts or omissions not in good faith or which involve intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law; (c) liabilities of a director imposed by Section 14-2-832 of the Georgia Business Corporation Code; or (d) any transaction from which the director, officer, employee, or agent derived an improper personal benefit.

SECTION 6. Non-exclusivity. The provisions for indemnification and advancement of expenses provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights, in respect of indemnification or otherwise, to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under any bylaw, agreement, either specifically or in general terms, resolution, or approved by the affirmative vote of the members entitled to vote thereon taken at a meeting, the notice of which specified that such bylaw, resolution or agreement would be placed before the members, both as to action by a director, officer, employee or agent in his/her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office or position, except that no such other rights, in respect

to indemnification or otherwise, may be provided or granted with respect to the liability of any director, officer, employee or agent for (a) any appropriation, in violation of his/her duties, of any business opportunity of the FOUNDATION; (b) acts or omissions not in good faith or which involve intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law; (c) liabilities of a director imposed by Section 14-2-832 or the Georgia Business Corporation Code; or (d) any transaction from which the director, officer, employee, or agent derived an improper personal benefit.

ARTICLE XXXI. AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be altered, amended or repealed and new Bylaws may be adopted by a majority vote of the entire Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation. The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may make advisory recommendations concerning the alteration, amendment or repeal of the Bylaws and the adoption of new Bylaws to the Board of Directors of GreyStone Power Corporation.

The above Bylaws are hereby adopted by the Board of Directors of Grey Stone Power Foundation, Inc., this 12th day of February 2007.
