INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Board of Directors
PathStone Corporation and Affiliates

We have audited the accompanying combined financial statements of PathStone Corporation and Affiliates (a nonprofit organization), which comprise the combined balance sheets as of September 30, 2014 and the related combined statements of activities, cash flows and functional revenues and expenses for the year then ended and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audits. We did not audit the financial statements of certain affiliates including the Housing Council at PathStone, Bradmar Village, LLC, Stonewood Apartments, LLC, Pinnacle Apartments, LLC, Alturas de Castaner, L.P., San German, LLC and Parque Platino, Inc., which statements reflect combined total assets of \$93,331,674, as of September 30, 2014 and combined total support and revenues of \$8,253,973, for the year then ended. Those statements were audited by other auditors whose report has been furnished to us, and our opinion, insofar as it relates to the amounts included in those affiliates, is based solely on the report of the other auditors. We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain other procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, that information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

PathStone Corporation (PathStone) and Affiliates (the Organization) creates and provides opportunities for farmworkers and other disenfranchised people to confront and overcome barriers that systematically prevent them from gaining access to economic, educational, social and political resources.

The Organization provides adult training and employment programs; child development programs; health and safety programs; housing development; housing services; emergency and supportive services; youth and adult education; economic development programs; and advocacy and public policy initiatives.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. The significant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

Basis of Presentation

In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, PathStone Corporation and Affiliates reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to the existence and nature of donor restrictions in three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted, and permanently restricted.

PathStone Corporation and Affiliates also records contributions received as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support depending on the existence and nature of any donor restrictions.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America allow the Organization to treat as unrestricted, any restricted revenue where the restrictions are met in the same year. The Organization has elected to follow that reporting method. As a result, all activities in which restrictions are met are recorded in the Unrestricted Net Asset class.

The following are descriptions of the Organization's net asset classifications:

Unrestricted Net Assets:

Includes undesignated resources that are available for the general support of the Organization's operations and designated funds committed to long-term use by board resolution. Board designated funds may include unrestricted bequests or planned gifts received by the Organization, surplus funds available at year-end (that are not needed for operating reserves), or funds resulting from the sale of an asset. Since donors did not restrict these amounts, the board can remove its self-imposed designation. These are detailed in Note 16.

PATHSTONE CORPORATION AND AFFILIATES NOTES TO COMBINED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS September 30, 2014 (Continued)

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

<u>Temporarily Restricted Net Assets</u>: Temporarily restricted net assets include resources from contributions where use by the Organization is subject to donors' restrictions that expire with the passage of time or by actions of the Organization.

When donor restrictions from prior years expire, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Temporarily restricted net assets, all of which were associated with Sojourner, consisted of the following at September 30, 2014:

<u>Permanently Restricted Net Assets</u>: Permanently restricted net assets include resources from contributions where donors have imposed restrictions which do not expire with the passage of time and are not removed by actions of the Organization.

Permanently restricted net assets also result from Neighborworks America Capital Grants (See Note 17).

Funding for low-income housing projects is recognized as revenue at the time of construction.

Contributions

Contributions are recorded at the time of receipt or when evidence of a non-conditional promise to give has been received. Promises subject to conditions are not recorded as income until those conditions have been met. Contributions that are expected to be received in future years are recorded at their present value. Contributions are recorded as unrestricted unless they are subject to donor restrictions or are required to be used or expected to be received in future years.

Functional Expenses

The costs of providing the various program services have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of functional revenue and expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs, management and general, and fundraising categories.

In-Kind Contributions

In-kind contributions include donated services, donated use of facilities, donated equipment and other donated items.

These contributed items are recorded as contributions at fair market value at the time of donation. Equipment is capitalized and depreciated over its useful life. Other donated specialized skills services, items and facilities are recorded as expenses when incurred. No amounts have been reflected in the accompanying statements for donated (volunteer) services that did not create or enhance the assets of the Organization nor require specialized skills.

Principles of Combination

The combined financial statements include the following:

Principles of Combination (Continued)

Use of Estimates in the Preparation of Financial Statements

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the amounts of revenues and expense. Actual results could vary from those estimates.

Land, Buildings and Equipment

Land, buildings, and equipment are recorded at cost when purchased or at their fair market value when donated. These items are depreciated on a straight-line basis over their estimated useful lives. The Organization capitalizes property and equipment with a cost of over \$5,000 and an estimated life of 3 years or more.

Revenue Recognition

Deferred revenue represents advances received from various funding sources for which qualifying expenses have not yet been incurred. Advances received from funding sources for construction projects are deferred until the project is completed since title to the properties transfers at that time.

Funding sources may, at their discretion, amend the grant and contract amounts. In addition, reimbursement for expenses or return of funds, or both, may be requested as a result of noncompliance by the Organization with the terms of the grants and contracts. The Organization records such amendments, reimbursements, and returns of funds as an adjustment to revenue in the year of the amendment.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Loan Origination Costs

Loan origination costs are capitalized and amortized on a straight-line basis over the terms of the related loans.

Restricted Deposits and Funded Reserves

Restricted deposits and funded reserves are invested in cash and money market funds. They are stated at cost which approximates market value.

Reporting of Restricted Revenue

Program-related revenue consists primarily of federal and other governmental grant monies which are restricted in accordance with the terms of the grant contracts. Program service expenses are expenditures incurred relating to the specific programs.

Income Taxes

The not-for-profit corporations included in these financial statements have been ruled as tax-exempt under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) by the Internal Revenue Service and it has also been determined that they are publicly supported. The for-profit C-Corporations included in these financial statements are subject to federal and state income taxes. No income tax expense or benefit has been included in these financial statements for the limited partnerships since taxable income and losses pass through to, and are reportable by, the partners.

Accounting standards require entities to disclose in their financial statements the nature of any uncertainties in their tax position. Tax years including 2011 and later are subject to examination by tax authorities. Areas that IRS and state tax authorities consider when examining tax returns of a charity include, but may not be limited to, tax-exempt status and the existence and amount of unrelated business income. Areas with respect to pass-through entities' and other business income tax returns include, but may not be limited to, the deductibility of expenses, classification of income, status as a pass-through entity or C-corporation, Nexus with other states, and entity liability for owner income taxes. The Organization does not believe that it has any uncertain tax positions with respect to these or other matters, and has not recorded any unrecognized tax benefits or liability for penalties or interest.

The Organization is not aware of any circumstances or events that make it reasonably possible that tax benefits may increase or decrease within 12 months of the date of these financial statements.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are made up of checking, savings and money market accounts held at various depository institutions, excluding those subject to reserve and other requirements. These accounts, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Organization has not experienced any losses in these accounts and does not believe it is exposed to any significant credit risk with respect to cash and cash equivalents.

Determining Fair Value of Financial Assets and Liabilities

As defined in the accounting standards, fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. This applies to all assets and liabilities that are being measured and reported on the fair value basis. Accounting standards require disclosures that establish a framework for measuring fair value and expand disclosure about fair value measurements. This statement enables the reader of the financial statements to assess the inputs used to develop those measurements by establishing a hierarchy for ranking the quality and reliability of the information used to determine fair values. The statement requires that assets and liabilities carried at fair value will be classified and disclosed in one of the following three categories:

- Level 1: Quoted market prices and active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2: Observable market-based inputs or unobservable inputs that are corroborated by market data.
- Level 3: Unobservable inputs that are not corroborated by market data.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at the amount management expects to collect. Amounts that management believes to be uncollectible, after collection efforts have been completed, are written off. In addition, management evaluates the need for an allowance to reduce receivables to amounts management expects will be collected. Management determined that no allowances were necessary at year-end for grant receivables, management fees receivable and other receivables. For information regarding financing loans see Note 3.

The Organization's Board of Directors reviews its entire loan portfolio performance at quarterly meetings. The Organization specializes in lending to small business start-ups and first time homebuyers. Because the Organization specializes in lending to start-up businesses and first time homebuyers, it considers only those loans in excess of 90 days past due for write off. Past due loans of less than 90 days are intensively serviced by loan officers and loan servicing staff, to assist the borrower to become current in their loans. Without considering subsequent recoveries of collateral, the average loan failure rate over the last nine years has been approximately 1.3%. Currently, the percentage of past due loans over 90 days is 0.27% or \$14,179. The Organization uses .5% of the total outstanding loan balance as its standard annual allowance for uncollectable loans. The balance in the allowance for uncollectable loans at September 30, 2014 was \$53,450. As an additional protection against unanticipated loan losses, the Organization maintains actual segregated loan loss cash reserves at a target of 7.5% of its outstanding loan balances.

NOTE 3 - RECEIVABLES (Continued)

At September 30, 2014 the loan loss cash reserves totaled \$815,396 or 15.3% of the outstanding loans. These funds are utilized periodically to replace actual loan losses and replenish lending capital.

The Organization's loans to first time homebuyers are generally given as secured second mortgages in conjunction with another lender. The loans are secured by liens on the acquired real estate. The average loan size is approximately \$12,500. Small business loans are generally given for start-up or expansion purposes and personal guarantees and liens on other assets are typically required. The average size business loan is approximately \$75,000. Development loans are typically short-term secured loans to real estate development businesses for acquisition or bridge loans to permanent financing.

NOTE 6 - COMMITMENTS

PHAC, RHAC Development Corporation, PHC of PA, PDC of OH and Stanton Meadows Corporation are general partners in various affordable housing rehabilitation partnerships. As general partners, these entities have guaranteed potential operating and development deficits and mortgage notes payable to various lending institutions. No liability has been recorded relative to these guarantees.

NOTE 7 - RETIREMENT PLAN

The Organization maintains a profit-sharing plan for all employees. Employees 21 years of age or older, with one year of service and 1,000 hours of work in any one year are eligible to participate in the plan. The plan also permits employee salary deferrals including Roth 401(k) deferrals, employee rollover contributions and employer profit sharing contributions. Employees are eligible for salary deferrals from their hire date. Profit-sharing contributions by the Organization for its employees are fully vested after 3 years of service and are at the discretion of the Organization's Board of Directors. Retirement plan expense was \$887,264 for the September 30, 2014 year.

NOTE 8 - CONTINGENCIES

Indirect Cost Rate

The Organization receives federal and certain other funding based on direct and indirect costs incurred. Indirect costs are based upon a federally-approved formula that is recalculated each year based on projected indirect costs and a projected direct salary and fringe benefit cost base. After each year end, the cognizant federal agency approves the indirect cost rate that was used, or a revised rate based on actual costs. The indirect cost rate is applied to all applicable programs based on direct labor and fringe benefit expenses.

Homeless Housing Assistance Program Grants

PathStone Housing Action Corporation receives grants for housing projects for the homeless, funded by the New York State Department of Social Services (NYSDSS), through the Homeless Housing Assistance Program (HHAP). All projects have been completed. Under the terms of the contracts with NYSDSS, the projects shall be maintained by PHAC as homeless housing projects and PHAC is restricted from transferring title to, or otherwise assigning or disposing of, the projects before a minimum of ten years occupancy and operation as homeless

housing projects without the prior written consent of the NYSDSS. In the event PHAC does not comply with the terms of the agreement, NYSDSS shall have all rights to terminate the agreement

and to require repayment of any grants.

Capital Advances

Monroe Special Housing was awarded a capital advance from HUD in a prior year, to assist in the construction of residential rental property. The total amount of this advance was \$1,366,000. This advance does not require repayment as long as the housing remains available for at least 40 years to very low income elderly persons or persons with disabilities. This capital advance is also subject to other HUD regulations. No liability has been recorded related to this amount because the Organization expects to comply with requirements.

NOTE 8 - CONTINGENCIES (Continued)

Forgiveness of Debt

PathStone Development Corporation has numerous agreements with governmental entities to maintain revitalized property for the benefit of low-income individuals. PathStone Development Corporation has several debt agreements that contain provisions for the forgiveness of debt over specific terms, as long as PathStone Development Corporation complies with the provisions of the various agreements. It is PathStone Development Corporation's policy to recognize income over the term of forgiveness. PathStone Development Corporation is contingently liable for certain amounts recognized as income to date. If a lending agency determines that any of the agreements had not been complied with, PathStone Development Corporation could become liable for some or all of the amounts below as of September 30, 2014.

NOTE 9 - LINES OF CREDIT

Working Capital

PathStone has a \$500,000 line of credit from a bank for working capital requirements. Borrowings under this agreement bear an interest rate equal to the bank's floating rate. The note is secured by a security interest and a lien upon all moneys, deposit balances, securities or property PathStone has within the possession or control of the lender. There was a balance of \$325,000 at September 30, 2014.

NOTE 9 - LINES OF CREDIT (Continued)

PathStone Development Corporation has a line of credit with approval for borrowings up to \$250,000. Advances under this agreement are subject to interest of 0.25% over the current bank prime rate. A balance of zero must be maintained for 30 consecutive days each year. The line of credit is secured by assignment of savings and direct deposit accounts. Covenants include providing the bank within 120 days of the fiscal year end with consolidated annual financial statements, an annual budget and schedules of debt and debt service. There was no amount outstanding at September 30, 2014.

Sojourner has a line of credit with approval for borrowings up to \$100,000. Advances under this agreement bear an interest rate of prime plus 3/4%. A balance of zero must be maintained for 30 consecutive days each year. The line of credit is secured by all business assets. There was no amount outstanding at September 30, 2014.

NOTE 10 - SOURCES OF REVENUE

PathStone received revenue from a variety of sources for the year ended September 30, 2014. Details of accrued revenue are shown on pages 40-41. In accordance with the Pennsylvania DCED, cash basis revenues for the Pennsylvania state programs are shown on pages 42-44.

NOTE 11 - FUNDED EQUIPMENT PURCHASES AND NET ASSET ADJUSTMENT

Certain not-for-profit program revenue includes amounts designated for purchase of equipment. Consistent with contract terms, those equipment purchases have been treated as current period expenditures for grant reimbursement purposes. In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, these items have been capitalized as fixed assets and depreciated over their useful life.

NOTE 12 - NOTES PAYABLE

Notes payable at September 30, 2014 are detailed on pages 34-39. These schedules include all notes and loans, including related party loans and notes eliminated on the combined balance sheet.

NOTE 13 - RELATED PARTIES

The Organization serves as general partner for, and holds minority interests in, several affordable housing limited partnerships. In addition, the Organization manages several of these properties and is responsible for compliance with funder requirements.

The Organization has financial responsibility for construction performance, and for operating deficits for certain of these projects. The Organization has been required to advance monies to cover operating deficits for some of the projects. These advances are treated as loans to, or investments in, the projects.

The investments in projects and amounts advanced to cover operating deficits are long-term illiquid investments carried at cost. These investments will generally be held for 15 years or more from the start of each project. After that time, the Organization may: 1) be required to continue to invest to operate these projects, or 2) refurbish, and/or refinance projects, which could require continued investment.

The assets and activities of these limited partnerships are included in the financial statements of the Organization on pages 3-5. The outside interests held by the unrelated parties are included in the financial statements on page 4. These entities are audited each year for compliance with loan covenants, tenant eligibility, other requirements of lenders and general governmental compliance.

Total receivables from related parties were \$49,770,245 at September 30, 2014.

NOTE 14 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through March 30, 2015, which is the date the statements were available for issuance.

NOTE 15 - DONATED SERVICES

The Organization receives donated services that, although substantial, do not meet the criteria for recording as revenue and expense under accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. During 2013-2014, approximately 37 active volunteers provided 4,716 hours of service.

NOTE 16 - DONOR-DESIGNATED ENDOWMENTS

The Organization's endowments include both donor restricted funds and funds designated by the board of directors to function as endowments. As required by generally accepted accounting principles, net assets associated with endowment funds, including funds designated by the Board of Directors to function as endowments, are classified and reported based on the existence and nature of donor-imposed restrictions or board designations.

Interpretation of Relevant Law

The Organization has interpreted the New York Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (NYPMIFA) as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the Organization classifies as permanently restricted net assets, the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment, the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument. The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified in permanently restricted net assets is classified as temporarily restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the Organization in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by NYPMIFA. In accordance with NYPMIFA, the Organization considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds: (1) the duration and preservation of the various funds, (2) the purposes of the donor-restricted endowment funds, (3) general economic conditions, (4) the possible effect of inflation and deflation, (5) the expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments, (6) other resources of the Organization, (7) where appropriate and circumstances would otherwise warrant, alternatives to expenditure of the endowment fund, giving due consideration to the effect that such alternatives may have on the Organization, and (8) the Organization's investment policies.

NOTE 16 - DONOR-DESIGNATED ENDOWMENTS (Continued)

Funds with Deficiencies

From time to time the fair value of assets associated with individual donor-restricted endowment funds may fall below the level that the donor or NYPMIFA requires the Organization to retain as a fund of perpetual duration. In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, deficiencies of this nature are reported in unrestricted net assets. There were no such deficiencies at September 30, 2014.

Investment Return Objectives, Risk Parameters and Strategies

The Organization has adopted investment policies for endowment assets that attempt to provide an optimum stream of funding for programs supported by these investments while seeking to maintain the historical value of those assets. These policies are applied to donor-restricted amounts. In developing investment and spending policies, the Organization considered the permanent nature of these funds, the possible effects of inflation and deflation, and the expected total return from income and appreciation.

The policy approved by the Board of Trustees of Sojourner House at PathStone, Inc. permits investments in the more common asset classes, including, but not limited to: common stocks, government and corporate bonds, preferred stocks, convertible securities, and money market funds. Securities may be owned directly or through mutual funds, and various market indices may be acquired. There are constraints on the size of individual holdings to insure appropriate diversification. While the policy allows for the equity component of the portfolio to reach as high as 85% or the fixed income component as high as 80%, the targeted asset allocation for the overall fund is to hold 60% in equities and 40% in fixed income and alternative investments.

To satisfy its long-term rate of return objectives, the Organization relies on a total return strategy in which investment returns are achieved through both capital appreciation (realized and unrealized) and current yield (interest and dividends).

Spending Policy

The Organization has a policy of appropriating for distribution each year, 5% of the endowment fund's average market value for the preceding 5 calendar years as determined on December 31st of each year. For this purpose, the permanently restricted and quasi-endowment fund balances are combined. In establishing this policy, the Organization considered the long-term expected real return of 6% for the portfolio, which would allow the Organization to meet it's 5% annual spending goal and allow for the objective of maintaining historical value due to a higher expected nominal average return on the portfolio commensurate with inflation over time. This is consistent with the Organization's objectives to maintain the historical value of the endowment assets as well as to provide additional real growth through new gifts and investment return.
