South Region:

For this year, CEPVI hold sixty one (61) educational activities and impacted *one thousand two hundred* eighty (1,280) persons in community. Participated in twenty one (21) educational & health fairs and impacted eight hundred thirty-two (832) persons in diverse sectors of the southern region of our geographic zone. Participated in twenty three (23) outreach activities impacted five hundred twenty two (522) persons. We promote in the CEVI DICE bulletin one (1) article CSR success history, two (2) radio station programs, five (5) newspaper articles and seven (7) articles in social network –Facebook. Five (5) Awareness Campaign in the southern region impacted one hundred seventy three (173) persons; hundred nine (109) persons obtain an informative directory to available services in the southern region and two hundred ninety-seven (297) persons gained access to services available in the community from information & referral service.

The number of people impacted in community was three thousand two hundred and thirteen (3,213) which received guidance on aid program, agencies and services available for persons with disabilities (PWD) in the southern region.

CEPVI collaborate with 107 entities including community group in the Southern Region of PR. Two hundred sixty seven (267) people established independent living goals in order to improve their quality of life and be more integrated in their community.

D: Communities Activities:

For this year, CEPVI hold fourteen (14) educational activities and impacted six hundred fourteen (614) persons in community. Participated in twenty four (24) educational & health fairs and impacted four hundred sixty four (464) persons in diverse sectors of the western region of our geographic zone. We promote in the CEVI DICE bulletin one (1) article CSR success history, four (4) radio station programs, two (2) newspaper articles and one (1) article in social network – Facebook. Ten (10) Awareness Campaign in the western region impacted two hundred forty nine (249) persons; Sixty (60) persons obtain an informative directory to available services in the western region and 88 beneficiated from information & referral service.

In collaboration with ASLES (American Sign Language Educational Services), educational conferences were promoted for the primary purpose of guiding people with hearing impairments, with respect to their rights, agencies, alternative and / or resources available in the community. Fifty-nine (59) persons had the opportunity to learn independent living services, access the removable tag, strategies for success in the job search, the services of the program access to the arts for all and ID for deaf promoting by ILC. CEPVI participated in four (4) conversations in the metropolitan region related to employment, technological assistance, accessibility and deaf-blind population. Thirty-one (31) people with disabilities had the opportunity to present their concerns, recommendations on the issues concerned. Twenty one (21) CSR had the opportunity to participate in social activities and integrate "Not one more bullet in the air" and "Boleando by CEPVI".

CEPVI collaborate with three (3) transportation providers that provided transportation for individuals with disabilities. This year CEPVI began to make coordination with the various municipal representatives to gain access to office space. The main objective is to meet monthly cases in various municipalities in the western region. At present, the IL Technician visit monthly municipalities to achieve more impact people with disabilities.

F. Others

- 227 people established independent living goals in order to improve their quality of life and be more integrated in their community.
- Will continue with the Municipality of Añasco Collaborative Agreement, through the provision of office space and utilities.
- Collaborative agreements with fourth (40) entities West Region agencies to publicize the services and establish a responsive referral system to the needs of people with disabilities by resident's area.
- Acquisition of equipment VRI (Virtual Remoting Interpreter) to provide access to communication services for deaf person requesting the services.

<u>CEPVI-Southern & Western Region ensures equal access in a cross disabilities environment</u> and we have implemented the following strategies:

<u>Communication Access to the Visual Impaired</u>: We have the Duxbury program, JAWS Program and printer to translate into Braille language.

<u>Communication Access to the Hearing Impaired</u>: We provide this year collaborating with the Vocational Rehabilitation Administration, Sorenson's Communication, Sprint Relay and Hands of VRS to provide the access of both videophones and webcam to help promote the communication technology and help consumers achieved their access to technology and information goals including peer counseling. Other alternatives to bring services to deaf consumers in the centers are:

- <u>VRI-(Video Remote Interpreting)</u> It's a new technology for the deaf persons known virtual-interpretation". The staff of direct services was trained to operate the equipment by Mr. Beltran-Interpreter Coordinator of PR.
- <u>Sign Language Interpreters</u>-We guaranteed sign language interpreters every time it was needed.
- <u>Technological Equipment</u>: There are equipment's for the deaf people like: Ultratec Miniprint 425, Dialogue VCO Phone, Ultratec Uniphone 1140, Ameri phone Dialogue XL-25 and D-Link DVC 1000 Videophone that are free of charge through the company's Sprint Relay. The delivery of these devices depend on the ease with which the SPRINT company's works.
