This represents the calculated average of monthly cash balances of \$747,570 used in Part X (which also includes \$1,188,352 in cash - non - interest bearing as of the end of year book value on Page 2, Part II line 1 on the Balance Sheet). All other assets on the balance sheet are not included in the calculations in Part X because they represent assets on deposit with trustee/fiscal agents that are permanently restricted and cannot be accessed by Community Finance Corporation based on the provisions of legal documents such as trust indentures, loan agreements, promissory notes, and management agreements.
