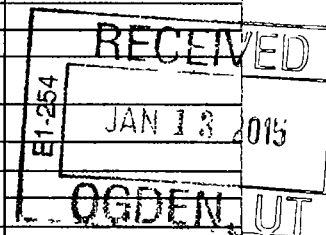

2. Grant applications must be postmarked on or before April 1st for consideration at the spring meeting, where applications are reviewed and decisions made. The grant applicant is informed of the decision shortly thereafter, and checks for approved grants are mailed the following August.
3. For efficient distribution of applications to the Review Committee, submit ten (10) copies to the Foundation office. **Please number the pages, use space and a half, no less than a 12 pitch font, and print front and back if possible. If these specifications are not followed, the proposal will be returned to the researcher(s). Include images if critical for understanding of the proposal.**
4. As one prepares the financial information, think of a September to August research year, rather than a calendar year. Please include a Budget Page.
5. Include anticipated duration of the project. Grants are awarded for one year only, and may be evaluated and considered for renewal upon receipt of a progress report, plans for the coming year, and a written request for continuation of funding. It cannot be assumed that renewal will be approved automatically.
6. The Foundation does not pay any indirect costs (overhead) on its research and education grants. Nor does it pay faculty or principal investigator's salary.
7. At the completion of a project, send a final report (reprints or theses are acceptable) to the Foundation Office before the end of the calendar year. In publications, a footnote acknowledging financial support of the Fred C. Gloeckner Foundation, Inc. will be appreciated. Please e-mail a pdf of the progress report to the Foundation for posting on the Foundation website (thutter@fredgloeckner.com). You may choose to have us delay the posting of your Progress Report if it is considered "Confidential". Please inform us of the length of the delay that is necessary.
