INFORMATION FOR GRANT APPLICATIONS

General Information

The Janson Foundation is a trust created under the terms of the Last Will and Testament of the late Edward W. Janson. During his lifetime Mr. Janson was a longtime public servant of Skagit County, displaying the utmost in high character and ideals and untiring in his service to the citizens of the county. He wanted to perpetuate this service through this trust fund, by assisting and fostering worthwhile and deserving charitable organizations and projects, which he authorized to be determined from year to year by the Foundation Grant Committee.

Grant Policy

The direct grants administered by the Janson Foundation are limited to:

- (1) **Capital funds for the purchase of equipment or the building of facilities or land for the facilities needed for a community service.**
- (2) **Capital funds for the major repair or replacement of facilities and/or equipment needed to expand or improve a community service.**
- (3) **Grant sums will be limited to amounts not exceeding \$10,000 but generally are expected to be in the range of \$1,000 to \$2,500.**

It is not the intention of the Foundation to make grants to be used for operating purposes for any organization or community service.

Grant Application Procedure

- (1) The organization must maintain a nonprofit status as defined and approved by the Internal Revenue Service.
- (2) The organization must effectively and efficiently contribute to the improvement in the well-being and welfare of residents in the community.
- (3) The organization's service must be open to all members of the community regardless of race, religion, political affiliation, abilities to pay, or other background.
