BYLAWS
OF
GREEN ACROSS THE WORLD, INC.

Pursuant to Title 11B of the Vermont Statutes Annotated, we the undersigned, being the Board of Directors of Green Across the World, Inc., hereby make and declare the Bylaws by which said nonprofit corporation shall be governed.

ARTICLE I

This organization, formerly known as Green Across the Pacific, Inc., shall be known as Green Across the World, Inc. as of April 6th 2015.

ARTICLE II – PURPOSE

This corporation has been founded to assist in establishing and operating student and teacher exchange programs between the United States and other countries including apprenticeships for students.

Green Across the World, Inc. shall admit persons of any race, sex, or creed to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to members.

Green Across the World, Inc. shall not discriminate on the basis of race, creed, sex, or ethnic national origin in the administration of any of its policies, programs, standards of admission and retention, and scholarship and other assistance programs.

Said corporation is a nonprofit corporation organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes, as defined by section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) or any corresponding sections of any future federal tax code.

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make reasonable payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth herein. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including publishing or distributing statements) any political campaign on behalf of a candidate for public office.

The corporation shall not, in any circumstance, carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on, (1) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code or any future federal tax code, or (2) by a corporation, Contributions to which are deductible under applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code or any future federal tax code.

Upon dissolution of the corporation, its assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of sections 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or any future federal tax code or shall be distributed to federal, local, or state governments for public purposes. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court of Addison County, State of Vermont exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as the court may determine, which are organized and operated for such purposes.

The corporation shall, in all circumstances applicable to its operation, comply with the requirements of Title 11B of the Vermont Statutes Annotated.

The corporation will distribute its income tax for each year at such time and in such a manner as to not become subject to tax on undistributed income imposed by section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future tax code.

The corporation will not engage in any excess business holdings as defined in section 4943(d) of the Internal Revenue Code, or any corresponding future tax code.

The corporation will not retain any excess business holdings as defined in section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code, or any corresponding future tax code.

The corporation will not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code, or any corresponding future tax code.

The corporation will not make any taxable expenditures as defined in section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code, or any corresponding future tax code.

ARTICLE III

SECTION I – The property of the corporation shall be held, and its affairs shall be managed and controlled by a Board of Directors of not less than five (5) voting members and not to exceed thirteen (13) voting members.

SECTION II – The Board of Directors shall be constituted as follows:

The initial number of voting members shall be nine. Eight seats shall be known as term seats and one seat as an ex officio seat. The ex officio seat shall be occupied by the person who is the Executive Director of Green Across the World, Inc. The holders of the term seats shall be elected by the remaining directors to serve a term of two years or such lesser period as may be

specified at the time of election. The duration of the terms shall be scheduled so that the number of seats to be filled shall, so far as practicable, be at equal in each succeeding year.

SECTION III – Terms shall be deemed to have been completed at the close of the annual meeting.

SECTION IV – Any vacancy on the Board of Directors may be filled for the unexpired term by the majority of the remaining members of the Board. An election to fill such a vacancy may be held at any annual or special meeting called for that purpose by the Chairperson.

SECTION V – The holder of the ex officio seat shall have the right to attend all meetings of the Board or any committee thereof and shall be entitled to vote on all matters except his or her retention and compensation.

SECTION VI – Five members of the Board, including the holder of the ex officio seat, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SECTION VII – The annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the third Saturday of September each year. Such other meetings of the Board or any of its committees shall be as they determine.

SECTION VIII – Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson of the Board, or as requested by four or more other Board members.

SECTION IX – Except as stated herein, the Board will conduct all of its business by majority vote of those present or participating telephonically or virtually in real time. The Chairperson shall vote only to resolve any tie votes.

SECTION X – The Board may elect such nonvoting members as it deems necessary to assist it in the conduct of its business. Terms of nonvoting members shall be for two years. The Board may designate such nonvoting members by whatever titles the Board deems appropriate from time to time.

SECTION XI – The Chairperson shall determine the rules to govern the conduct of the business of the Board.

ARTICLE IV – Officers

SECTION I – The officers of the corporation shall include a Chairperson and a Vice-chairperson of the Board of Directors, a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer, all of whom must be a member of the Board of Directors and who shall hold office for a term of two years.

SECTION II – The Executive Director of the corporation shall be appointed by the Board and charged with the conduct of the day to day business of the corporation and shall report periodically his or her doings to the Board as directed by the Chairperson. The Executive

Director shall be compensated for the work performed as determined by the Board of Directors and shall continue to hold office at the pleasure of the Board.

SECTION III – The President shall be the chief executive officer of the corporation and shall act in accordance with the direction of the Board of Directors. He/she shall investigate all matters referred to him/her and shall make such recommendations to the Board as he/she deems fit.

SECTION IV – The Chairperson shall organize and manage the Board of Directors and investigate all matters referred to him/her and shall make such recommendations to the Board of Directors as he/she deems fit.

SECTION V – The Vice-chairperson shall function as the Chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson.

SECTION VI – The Secretary shall have charge of the corporate records and shall maintain the minutes of each meeting of the Board of Directors.

SECTION VII – The Treasurer shall be responsible for the care and safekeeping of all funds and other property of the corporation and shall be responsible for the maintenance of the accounting records of the corporation.

ARTICLE V

These Bylaws may be amended at any meeting of the Board of Directors by the affirmative vote of two thirds of the entire number of all voting members, provided notice of the amendment has been mailed or e-mailed to all voting members at least one week prior to the meeting at which the proposed amendment is to be considered.
