1 - Project Witness:

In terms of providing a safety network for individuals, International Orphans Foundation through its Christian Alliance partnership has created a state wide community outreach program. IOF partners with local community based organizations to assist those who are struggling with a multitude of life's issues, i.e., alcoholism, drug addiction, homelessness, crisis pregnancy, depression and hunger. Currently, Christians Alliance has partnered with 14 member volunteers in 14 Connecticut towns.

Project Witness overview and how it works:

- "Project Witness" is a 30 minute production, broadcasted on local public access cable channels, into 37 communities consisting of approximately 600,000 homes throughout Connecticut.
- Each Segment tells the story of a life transformed from alcohol abuse, drug addiction, homelessness, depression or marital troubles
- Throughout the broadcast, a 1-800 phone number is displayed.
- At the end of each segment, viewers are encouraged to call the number on the screen.
- IOF contracts with a 24/7 call center vendor.

IOF provides volunteers and marketing assistance for this program. The mobile food truck and food items are provided by Foodshare of Hartford County.	
Foodshare's mission is to engage the Greater Hartford community for the purpose of distributing food and increasing self-sufficiency. By working closely with other local partners - individuals, businesses, schools, faith groups and government agencies -	
Foodshare seeks to increase awareness of hunger within our communities. The local mobile Foodshare site provides free fresh produce and high value food items to those in need. These are items that would otherwise be out of the price range for a majority of the cliental. The mobile Foodshare site provides food items for 100 - 120 families on a bi-weekly basis.	

Expenses do not include in-kind services.
