## ELIGIBILITY

Applicants to the West Corporation Scholarship Program must be -

- Dependent\* children, age 24 and under, of full-time United States West employees who work 30+ hours per week and who have a minimum of six months of employment with the company as of the application deadline date

*\*Dependent children are defined as natural and legally adopted children or stepchildren living in the employee's household or primarily supported by the employee*

## AWARDS

If selected as a recipient, the student will receive an award ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,000. ## **SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS**

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances, an outside appraisal, and financial need. Financial need as calculated by Scholarship Management Services must be demonstrated for the student to receive an award.
