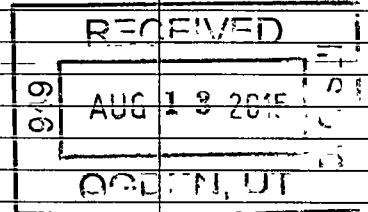

2. Qualified Advocates may not apply on behalf of a relative.

3. Employees of churches, temples and other religious organizations are not included in the definition of a Qualified Advocate.

C. HOW DOES A QUALIFIED ADVOCATE APPLY?

1. A Qualified Advocate must complete the online Here to Help Foundation Application.
2. Do not fax an application. Only submit online.
3. Do not have the applicant fill out the application. Only the Qualified Advocate can complete and submit the application.

D. WHAT OCCURS ONCE AN APPLICATION IS SUBMITTED?

1. If an application is successfully submitted, the Qualified Advocate will be immediately directed to a web page confirming the application was received.

If, instead, there are errors in the application, these errors will be shown at the top of the application page. The Advocate will then need to correct all errors and push the "Submit entry" button again.

2. The staff of the Here to Help Foundation will review the application and all the required documentation and reply via email to the Qualified Advocate with any additional questions and/or requests for documentation. This will usually occur within 48 hours of the receipt of the application.

E. WHAT OCCURS IF A GRANT IS AWARDED?

The Here to Help Foundation does not provide money to the individual directly but to the service provider or creditor (i.e. car repair shop, landlord, utility service etc.).

Who Can We Help?

A. GENERAL INFORMATION:

The Here to Help Foundation, through its programs, has the ability to directly assist qualified individuals facing an economic crisis. We assist temporarily impoverished individuals who, through no fault of their own, are facing an unexpected emergency and thereby lack the basic necessities of life. The goal of Here to Help is to relieve human distress and to assist individuals in achieving self-sufficiency and independence. There must be a very strong likelihood that with our assistance the individual will not need help in the near future and will be able to continue moving forward. We are unable to assist everyone in need as the IRS has specific rules and regulations that 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organizations (such as Here to Help) must adhere to in providing direct assistance to individuals.

Here to Help is a resource of last resort and our one-time grants are only for residents of Wayne or Oakland County in southeastern Michigan.

B. KEY CRITERIA FOR ASSISTANCE:

- 1.The grant cannot be a temporary solution. With our assistance, the grantee must be able to move forward and be self-sufficient and capable of meeting all their monthly economic obligations.
- 2.Here to Help Foundation is a resource of last resort. Assistance from other agencies and State Emergency Relief (SER), where applicable, must first be attempted.
- 3.The individual must find themselves in an emergency situation through no fault of their own.
- 4.There must be an identifiable and specific need (i.e. rent, car repair, utility bill etc.) that the individual is incapable of paying for on his or her own.
- 5.If an applicant is claiming they are disabled from employment, it must be documented that he or she is receiving SSI or SSD.
- 6.An applicant receiving governmental assistance (not for a disability) must establish they are striving for self-sufficiency and independence.
- 7.Our one-time grants are only for residents of Wayne or Oakland County in southeastern Michigan.
