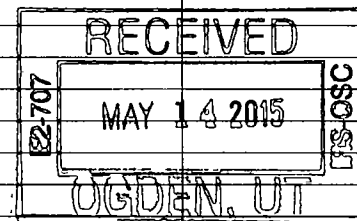

**RESOLUTIONS OF THE TRUSTEES
REGARDING TERMINATION OF TRUST AND
DISTRIBUTION OF ALL TRUST ASSETS TO
VBR RESEARCH AND EDUCATION FOUNDATION, INC.**

The undersigned, being all of the trustees of the Nordic Educational Trust, a Vermont charitable trust (the "Trust"), hereby unanimously consent that the actions herein shall be deemed the actions of the trustees with the same force and effect as if taken at a duly noticed and called meeting of the trustees. This written consent is executed and delivered in accordance with the Vermont Trust Code and shall be filed with the records of the Trust.

WHEREAS, in 1988 a Declaration of Trust ("Declaration") was entered into by trustees Ross R. Anderson, Gail E. Anderson, Ian Anderson, and Deirdre Anderson (the "Andersons") to establish the Trust;

WHEREAS, Section 1.2 of the Declaration states that the purposes of the Trust are as follows:

The trustees may receive and accept property...to be held, administered, and disposed of: (i) for the purpose of providing scholarship grants and other financial aid to assist deserving residents of Vermont in pursuing higher education at two-year post-secondary institutions; and (ii) pursuant to the provisions of this Declaration, but no gift, bequest or devise of any such property shall be received and accepted if it is conditions or limited in such manner as to require the disposition of the income or its principal to any person or organization other than a "charitable organization" or for other than "charitable purposes" within the meaning of such terms as defined in Article II of this Declaration of Trust, or as shall in the opinion of the Trustees, jeopardize the federal income tax exemption of this trust pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

WHEREAS, in July 2010 the Andersons appointed the Vermont Business Roundtable, Steve Voigt, Renee Bourget-Place, and Sparky Millikin to serve as co-trustees of the Trust (hereinafter such persons the "Successor Trustees") and thereafter the Andersons resigned as co-trustees of the Trust;

WHEREAS, the VBR Research and Education Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") was formed as a Vermont nonprofit corporation on June 13, 2012, with the following purposes: "The corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 in order to lessen the burdens of government and to promote a variety of charitable and educational activities that enrich the education and

welfare of the children of the State of Vermont and their families. The corporation will, among other things, work to ensure a continuum of high quality educational experiences to prepare children and families to be productive citizens in a global economy (from prenatal through post-secondary and higher education)”;

WHEREAS, the Successor Trustees desire to terminate the Trust and distribute to the Foundation in furtherance of the Trust’s tax-exempt purposes all of the Trust’s assets, property and accounts of every nature, including, without limitation, any contribution, gift bequest, or devise that may now or in the future be directed to or intended for the Trust (collectively the “Trust Assets”);

WHEREAS, Subsection 2.1.2 of the Declaration provides that the Trust may be terminated as follows: “The Trust shall continue forever unless the Trustees terminate it and distribute all of the principal and income, which action may be taken by the Trustees in their discretion at any time. On such termination, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes with in the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose”;

WHEREAS, the Successor Trustees and the Foundation desire to enter into a grant agreement, in a form substantially similar to that attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, whereby all of the principal and income of the Trust (the “Trust Assets”) will be distributed to the Foundation for the Foundation to use solely in furtherance of the charitable purposes of the Trust, including the provision of scholarship grants and other financial aid to assist deserving residents of Vermont in pursuing higher education at two-year post-secondary institutions;

WHEREAS, upon distribution of the Trust Assets to the Foundation, the Successor Trustees desire to terminate the Trust;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

1. That the Liquidating Grant Agreement between the Trustees and the Foundation in a form substantially similar to that in **Exhibit A** attached hereto (the “Liquidating Grant Agreement”) is hereby approved, and any one or more of the Successor Trustees is hereby authorized to execute the Liquidating Grant Agreement on behalf of all of the Successor Trustees.
2. That, as soon as practicable following the signing of the Liquidating Grant Agreement, the Successor Trustees will distribute the Trust Assets to the Foundation, with any one or more of the Successor Trustee authorized to distribute such assets. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Successor Trustees will retain \$5,000 for the purpose of winding up the affairs of the Trust, with any remaining funds after winding up to distributed to the Foundation.

3. That, promptly following the execution of the Liquidating Grant Agreement, the Successor Trustees will distribute the Trust Assets as provided herein and wind up the Trust's affairs.

4. That each of the Successor Trustees is hereby authorized and empowered to take all actions and to do all things necessary to enter into the Liquidating Grant Agreement, distribute the Trust Assets, and wind up the Trust.






