Charity care Capital health provides care to patients who meet certain criteria defined by the new jersey department of health and senior services ("dohss") without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Because capital health does not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care, they are not reported as revenue. Capital health's records identify and monitor the level of charity care it provides and include the amount of charges forgone for services and supplies furnished. Dohss allows retroactive application for charity care up to two years from the date of service. The cost of charity care is derived from both estimated and actual data. The estimated cost of charity care includes the direct and indirect cost of providing such services and is estimated utilizing capital health's ratio of cost to gross charges, which is then multiplied by the gross uncompensated charges associated with providing care to charity patients. Charity care provided, at cost, during 2014 and 2013 totaled approximately \$41,795,000 and \$62,129,000, respectively. Capital health receives payments from the new jersey health care subsidy funds for charity care and such amounts totaled approximately \$30,013,000 and \$29,170,000 for the years ended december 31, 2014, and 2013, respectively.
