The majority of gifts are awarded through our matching gift program and only a small number of grants are awarded through a competitive selection process.

- *Health and Human Services...* to support those outstanding providers of health care and human services that seek to improve the overall welfare of the community.
- *Education*.. to foster higher education by allocating resources to accredited schools, colleges, and universities. This need is addressed primarily through our Matching Gift Program.
- Culture and the Arts... to provide assistance to performing arts groups; museums of art, history, and science, libraries; public radio, television stations, and networks; and programs that enrich our collective cultural experiences.
- Civic and Community Affairs... to support organizations that enhance the quality and safety of community life, promote volunteerism or build nonprofit capacity.
- The Environment... to support organizations dedicated to the protection of the region's ecosystem and the conservation of natural resources.
