To be considered for a grant, applicants must be tax-exempt, nonprofit organizations as defined under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or an accredited public or private school or university.

Funding Focus Areas:

Education: We believe education is vital to social and economic development because it gives people in our communities the knowledge and skills they need to achieve employment and economic security in our rapidly changing, global economy. To help keep our communities and our business competitive and prosperous, we support formal educational opportunities for students of all ages including K-12 education, higher education, business-education partnerships, and other local needs. The Foundation focuses its education funding on programs that support science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) education; emphasize the benefits of recycling to protect the environment; and support diversity by providing opportunities for educational achievement and diverse thought regardless of racial and ethnic background, gender or economic status.

Recycling: Recycling is critical to the future of our business, society and planet. Its benefits include saving significant amounts of energy and natural resources. The Foundation supports programs that increase recycling rates, improve collection processes and provide education about the benefits of recycling.

Community Engagement: An important part of the cultural values of Ball Corporation and the Ball Foundation is to be a good neighbor, corporate citizen and employer of choice in communities where we have a presence; a healthy business depends upon thriving communities. As a packaging and aerospace company, we support organizations, programs and civic initiatives that advance sustainable livelihoods for the citizens of our communities by improving self-sufficiency and access to essential needs, especially food security and disaster relief.

The Ball Foundation prefers grant requests for specific projects and programs as opposed to sponsorships. We reserve the right to deny funding to organizations at any time.

What We Do Not Fund

The Ball Foundation does not support organizations that discriminate against a person or a group on the basis of age, political affiliation, race, national origin, ethnicity, gender, disability, sexual orientation or religious belief.

In order to maintain its focus and achieve a greater impact through the use of its funds, the Ball Foundation will also not support:

- Individuals
- Religious groups for religious purposes
- Programs targeted for people with specific physical, medical or psychological conditions
- Medical research
- Grant requests for production of audio, film or video
- Requests to support travel
- Lobbying, political or fraternal activities
- Organizations not exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the IRS code or unaccredited public/private schools
- Programs or organizations for which the Ball Foundation is asked to serve as the sole funding source

How to Apply

Interested organizations must apply online. Click the Grant Home tab to log in and begin the application process. The first step is a mandatory eligibility review. Organizations that meet the Foundation's eligibility requirements will be permitted to register and complete the Foundation's grant application.

Response

The Ball Foundation board of directors meets quarterly. Organizations that pass the eligibility review and complete online applications can expect a response within approximately 90 days, depending on the board meeting cycle.

Requirements and Limitations

All requests for grants and/or charitable funding in the U.S. must be made through the Ball Foundation and should not be directed to Ball Corporation or any of its operating units, including Ball Aerospace & Technologies Corp. The Foundation may direct requests from organizations that serve communities outside Colorado where Ball operates manufacturing facilities or Aerospace services to those facilities for consideration.

All agencies or organizations whose applications are approved by the Foundation's board of directors must sign a letter of agreement regarding the terms of the respective grant.

Agencies or organizations that receive Ball Foundation funds will be required to complete follow-up reporting so that the Foundation can evaluate program impact and benefits as well as ensure proper use of Foundation funds.

Organizations that have been denied funding by the Foundation must wait one year before being eligible to reapply for funding.

Organizations that are currently funded by the Foundation that wish to apply for additional funding for a new or different program must submit a separate application for each program

Organizations that are currently being funded may apply for continuation of the program being funded (if applicable), but must follow all procedures implemented by the Foundation during the course of the program to be eligible to receive continuation funding.

Generally, a particular program or organization will not be funded for more than three consecutive years. After that time the organization must wait 12 months before reapplying.
