
Auditor's Responsibility

1. Description of the Foundation

Wm. Wrigley Jr Company Foundation (the "Foundation") is an Illinois not-for-profit corporation, which was incorporated on November 14, 1986. The Foundation was organized exclusively to further charitable and educational purposes through contributing to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"). Certain administrative expenses of the Foundation are absorbed by Wm. Wrigley Jr Company.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates

Risks and Uncertainties

Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is possible that changes in risk in the near term would materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of financial position and the statements of activities.

Contributions

Contributions received by the Foundation from the Wm Wrigley Jr. Company or its employees and contributions made by the Foundation to outside agencies are recorded when the unconditional promise to give cash or other assets is made. Conditional promises to receive or give are recorded when the conditions are met

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash and all highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less
The Foundation considers all money market investments to be cash equivalents.

Investments

Investments in securities and mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are measured at fair value in the statements of financial position. Fair value is estimated based on quoted market prices for these or similar investments. Investment income or loss (including realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, interest and dividends) is included in revenues, gains (losses) and support in the statements of activities.

3. Investments

The Foundation measures its financial instruments at fair market value. ASC Topic 820 defines fair value as the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. ASC Topic 820 also establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The basis of fair value measurement in the three levels of the fair value hierarchy, in order of priority, is described below:

Level I Quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical assets or liabilities;

Level II Quoted prices in markets that are not active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly; quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, and model-derived valuations whose inputs are observable or whose significant value drivers are observable,

Level III Significant inputs to the valuation model are unobservable

4. Federal Taxes

The Foundation is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code

The Foundation is classified as a private foundation pursuant to Section 509(a) of the Code and, therefore, is subject to an excise tax based on the appropriate percentage of net investment income, including interest, dividends, realized gains and losses and investment fees.

Private foundations are required to make certain minimum distributions in accordance with a specified formula. At December 31, 2014 and 2013, the Foundation's distributions did exceed the 5% distribution requirement.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Foundation and recognize a tax liability if the Foundation has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Foundation, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2014, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements

5. Matching Grants Program

On January 1, 1994, the Foundation implemented a Matching Grants Program. Current and retired Wm Wrigley Jr. Company employees are eligible to participate in the program. Officers and directors are also eligible to participate. Participants' contributions up to \$1,500 per calendar year are matched on a two-for-one basis. The Foundation made matching contributions of \$260,430 and \$252,233 in 2014 and 2013, respectively

6. Contributions Payable

On March 8, 2013, the Foundation entered into an agreement with the New Zealand Dental Association, Inc. to grant \$89,880, payable in installments through 2015. \$29,960 remains payable at December 31, 2014. The obligation was discounted to a net present value using a discount rate of 0 90% at December 31, 2014.

On April 3, 2013, the Foundation entered into an agreement with the Australian Dental Association Foundation to grant \$315,780, payable in installments through 2015. \$105,260 remains payable at December 31, 2014. The obligation was discounted to a net present value using a discount rate of 0.90% at December 31, 2014.

On April 8, 2013, the Foundation entered into an agreement with Pratham USA to grant \$1,016,440, payable in installments through 2015. \$508,200 remains payable at December 31, 2014. The obligation was discounted to a net present value using a discount rate of 0 90% at December 31, 2014

On June 13, 2013, the Foundation entered into an agreement with the American Dental Hygienists' Association Institute for Oral Care to grant \$126,000, payable in installments through 2014. The final payment of \$63,000 was contributed in 2014. The obligation was discounted to a net present value using a discount rate of 0.54% at December 31, 2013.

On August 30, 2013, the Foundation entered into an agreement with Save the Children Federation, Inc. to grant \$3,600,000, payable in installments through 2014. The final payment of \$1,800,000 was contributed in 2014. The obligation was discounted to a net present value using a discount rate of 0.54% at December 31, 2013.

On September 5, 2013, the Foundation entered into an agreement with The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation to grant \$333,334, payable in installments through 2014. The final payment of \$166,667 was contributed in 2014. The obligation was discounted to a net present value using a discount rate of 0 54% at December 31, 2013.

1. Description of the Foundation

Wm. Wrigley Jr. Company Foundation (the "Foundation") is an Illinois not-for-profit corporation, which was incorporated on November 14, 1986. The Foundation was organized exclusively to further charitable and educational purposes through contributing to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"). Certain administrative expenses of the Foundation are absorbed by Wm. Wrigley Jr. Company

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates

Risks and Uncertainties

Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is possible that changes in risk in the near term would materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of financial position and the statements of activities.

Contributions

Contributions received by the Foundation from the Wm Wrigley Jr Company or its employees and contributions made by the Foundation to outside agencies are recorded when the unconditional promise to give cash or other assets is made Conditional promises to receive or give are recorded when the conditions are met

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash and all highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less. The Foundation considers all money market investments to be cash equivalents.

Investments

Investments in securities and mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are measured at fair value in the statements of financial position. Fair value is estimated based on quoted market prices for these or similar investments. Investment income or loss (including realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, interest and dividends) is included in revenues, gains (losses) and support in the statements of activities

3. Investments

The Foundation measures its financial instruments at fair market value. ASC Topic 820 defines fair value as the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. ASC Topic 820 also establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The basis of fair value measurement in the three levels of the fair value hierarchy, in order of priority, is described below:

- Level I Quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical assets or liabilities;
- Level II Quoted prices in markets that are not active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly, quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; and model-derived valuations whose inputs are observable or whose significant value drivers are observable;
- Level III Significant inputs to the valuation model are unobservable
