

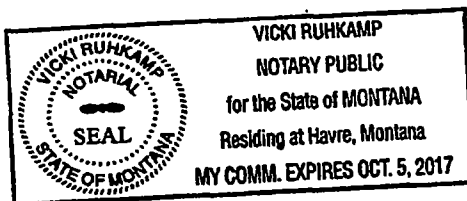

According to the Quit Claim Deed signed and dated by Ruth Cooper Nystrom and Karl Nystrom 12/4/1998, the property reverts to the heir(s) of the property if the Grantee (North Havre Community Gift Away House, Inc.) fail to use the property as described.

Article of Inc. by Laws:

Article III – This Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes to donate food, clothing and other necessary items to persons of need to the common good and general welfare of people in the community and the surrounding areas and the corporation shall be non-profit.

Board members allowed the below items after being informed they could not:

1. Requiring an entrance fee and calling it a donation.
2. Charging inconsistent fees to people on each visit or charged penalties for non-payment on a previous visit
3. It has come to my attention through various sources that clients were prevented from entering the Community Give A Way House without making the required “donation” fee. The fees are inconsistent and assessed through the whims of the volunteers and/or director overseeing the operations.

2. With the passing of Ruth Nystrom, the registered agents then become those who are serving on the board.

Board operations

I am in agreement with the statement to the standards of conduct for a director. However; certain directors are meeting without notice to all members and voting on issues. This is not allowing an opportunity for the missing directors to voice their opinion, approval or objection to those issues. Examples are:

1. Minutes not recorded accurately and voted on appropriately,
2. The following letter was sent to the director members January 29, 2014 regarding the relocation and financial issues discussed at January board meeting. The letter was never discussed in the preceding board meeting nor recorded in the February minutes –

If there was less than the above amount returned to the present board, an audit would find where the funds were spent.

When this present board makes the name change and rewrites the bylaws, file the changes with the IRS and the State of Montana and moves to a new location. I, Carol Nystrom Forshee will resign from this board. I would suggest that this present board make as a goal for this change to be completed by December 31, 2014."

3. Members meeting secretly or without appropriate notice to all 5 members for scheduled meeting,
4. \$2,000.00 claim for reimbursement to Sheila Forshee for utility & phone bills paid while disputed group claimed to be the rightful board.
5. The complete claim of Roberta Beute not listed in the minutes.
6. By paying Roberta Beute her claim of utilities & phone bill; set precedence to pay all claims for repayment of same bills.
7. Decisions are made without input or vote from all 5 members
 - a. Payments (reimbursement-not including the total amount requested) made to Roberta Beute but no discussion or record in minutes,

- b. No record in minutes for bills submitted to the board for utilities & phone costs paid during the time that the contending board claimed ownership submitted by Sheila Forshee,
 - c. Keys – voted for certain board members to hold the keys, but keys not given to all voted members.
 - d. Corporate Authorization Resolution not voted on. (neither Carol Forshee nor Kelly Ann Damson saw the written resolution to vote on). Neither was it included in the next month's secretary report to be voted on,
8. No written financial statement has been presented to the board for review and vote. When one was asked for, incomplete bank statements were sent in lieu of to the party requesting the financial statement. Not all board members received like report. **35-2-906. Corporate records-(2)** A corporation shall maintain appropriate accounting records. (Bank statements are not appropriate accounting records.)
 9. Usage of electronic device made available but not allowed to be used.
 10. July meeting was held in a place that prevented electronic equipment to operate.
 11. August meeting was held without giving location, time or date.

Additionally; when electronic equipment was provided so that ALL directors could participate, they were objected to and the meeting was dismissed. The members who objected to the loaned equipment then held a meeting at another location. Another meeting was held in a room where the electronic devices are prevented from working.

Since board of the Community Give-A-Way House Incorporation (1058 2nd Street North, Havre, MT 59501) received the Notice to Vacate by September 6, 2014, based upon the violations stated above, than the **board has been dissolved**. If the other directors decide to operate a board similar to Community Give-A-Way House (excluding the use of the name) than it is up those directors.

Who Must File

When To File
