On behalf of the Board of Directors of Memorial Hall Center for the Arts, Inc. I thank you for your act of generosity. Your donation to the Projector Fund will be immortalized on a lobby plaque with other donors to the fund that met the \$300 requirement for inscription. The name of Franklin Philanthropic Foundation will be proudly displayed and viewed by many in thanks to your help in this endeavor.

MHCA, Inc. presently has \$36,400 in the Projector Fund account, which is short of the Challenge Grant requirement of \$63,701.
