


**(These Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation of Stratacor supersede and replace all prior amendments and restatements of the Articles of Incorporation of Dental Benefit Plans of Minnesota.)**

**ARTICLE I**

The name of the corporation shall be: Stratacor.

**ARTICLE II**

2.1 General. This corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for the promotion of social welfare within the meaning of Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). For these purposes, the corporation shall become and serve as the parent holding company of Delta Dental of Minnesota, a nonprofit health service plan incorporated under Chapter 317A of Minnesota Statutes for the residents of the State of Minnesota, and related affiliates. Within the framework and limitations of the foregoing, this corporation shall, among other things, provide on a nonprofit basis through its affiliates, various health service benefits intended to promote the health and social welfare of the residents of the State of Minnesota and other states. The corporation shall also have all of the power afforded to it by the provisions of the Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation Act and all acts amendatory or supplementary thereto that are consistent with the purposes of the corporation.

2.2 Pecuniary Gain Prohibited. This corporation shall in no way, directly or indirectly, incidentally or otherwise, pay dividends or afford pecuniary gain to any of its members, directors, or officers, other than to a member that is a nonprofit organization, nor

shall any part of the net earnings of the corporation in any way inure to the private benefit of any such member, director or officer of the corporation, or to any individual within the meaning of Section 501(c)(4) of the Code, except that the corporation shall be authorized to make reasonable allowance and payment for actual expenditures incurred or services rendered for the corporation.

2.3 Use of Assets in Event of Dissolution. The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to its purposes. In the event of a dissolution of the corporation, all of the assets and property thereof, after payment of its just debts and obligations, shall be distributed to such other nonprofit entity or entities which are exempt from taxation under the provisions of Section 501(c) of the Code, as may be determined by the Board of Directors to be most in accord with the purposes of the corporation. No distribution of the assets or property of the corporation shall ever be made to or inure to the benefit of any member, director or officer of the corporation, or to any private individual within the meaning of Section 501(c)(4) of the Code.

### **ARTICLE III**

The registered office of this corporation shall be located at 500 Washington Avenue South, Minneapolis, MN 55415.

### **ARTICLE IV**

The duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

### **ARTICLE V**

The corporation, not being organized for profit, shall have no capital stock. The corporation shall have two classes of members: health service members and public members. Other than as set forth herein, the rights, responsibilities, and distinctions regarding the classes of membership shall be as set forth in the Bylaws and the Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation Act.

## **ARTICLE VI**

Authority and responsibility for election of officers and proper and lawful operation of the corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors, consisting of not less than twelve (12) and not more than twenty-one (21) Directors, elected in accordance with the procedure set forth in the Bylaws.

## **ARTICLE VII**

The Board of Directors shall annually elect from their own numbers, a Chair, a Vice Chair, a Secretary and a Treasurer, and assign to each of them the duties ordinarily performed by such officers and as set forth by the Bylaws. The Board of Directors shall also elect and hire a President of the corporation who shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the corporation. The President need not be a member of the Board of Directors. The time, place and manner of call of meetings of the Board of Directors shall be fixed by the Bylaws.

## **ARTICLE VIII**

The Bylaws may be amended as provided therein.

## **ARTICLE IX**

The funds of the corporation shall be invested only in those securities and property designated by the Board of Directors and as permitted by the laws of the State of Minnesota.

## **ARTICLE X**

Neither the directors, officers, committee members, employees, agents or members of the corporation shall be personally liable for the payment of any debts or obligations of the corporation of any nature whatsoever, nor shall any of the property of any of the directors, officers, committee members, employees, agents or members be subject to the payment of the debts or obligations of the corporation to any extent whatsoever. All income of the corporation shall be devoted to the fulfillment of the purposes for which the corporation is formed as set forth in these Articles and as provided for by law, including the actual operating expenses of the corporation.

## ARTICLE XI

Article X shall not be construed to prohibit payment of Directors' fees and expenses to members of the Board of Directors.

## ARTICLE XII

The corporation shall have all the powers conferred upon such corporations by law, and in addition to its other powers may receive or acquire property by purchase, gift, grant or devise and may hold, use, invest, expend, convey or dispose of any real or personal property whatever for any of the purposes for which the corporation is organized and in the manner provided for by law, and may lease, mortgage or use the same in any manner, as provided for by law, and deemed most conducive to the carrying out of its corporate purposes.

## ARTICLE XIII

The corporation shall cause each of its subsidiaries or affiliates that are nonprofit health service plans to issue to every group subscriber and make available to every covered person under such nonprofit health service plan a copy of the contract entered into with the group subscriber. Such contract shall clearly state the health service care, appliances and supplies to be provided under such contract and the rate charged such subscriber. Every covered person and subscriber shall, consistent with applicable contract provisions, have at all times free choice of any health service provider to treat him or her; and such right shall be prominently printed in such contract.

Every covered person and subscriber under such contract, having as a matter of law free choice of the health service provider who is to treat him or her, neither the corporation nor any of its subsidiaries or affiliates shall assume, and no contract so issued shall impose upon the corporation or any of its subsidiaries or affiliates, any liability of such health service provider out of the patient-health service provider relationship. Neither shall the corporation nor any of its subsidiaries or affiliates assume, and no contract so issued shall impose upon the corporation or any of its subsidiaries or affiliates, liability for any act or omission whether by

way of negligence or otherwise on the part of any health service provider so selected by such person.

Additionally, the corporation shall cause each of its subsidiaries or affiliates that are nonprofit health service plans to ensure that their articles of incorporation and bylaws, including amendments, conform to the requirements of Laws 1971, Chapter 568 and Chapter 317A of the Minnesota Statutes, and that their purposes are in strict conformity with Laws 1971, Chapter 568 of the Minnesota Statutes.

Nothing in these Articles shall be construed to prevent employers or groups of employers or other agencies, governmental, social or otherwise, from paying, underwriting or contributing, in part or in full, for the benefits to which a covered person or subscriber is entitled under such voluntary nonprofit health service plan issued by any subsidiary or affiliate of the corporation.

#### **ARTICLE XIV**

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended upon the approval of: (i) a majority of directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present; (ii) a majority of the health service provider members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present; and (iii) a majority of the public members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present.

#### **ARTICLE XV**

Any action that may be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors that does not require the vote of the members may be taken without a meeting when authorized in a written action signed or consented to in an electronic communication, in one or more counterparts, by the number of directors that would be required to take the same action at a meeting of the Board of Directors at which all directors were present. Any action that may be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors that requires the vote of the members may be taken without a meeting when authorized in a written action signed or consented to in an electronic communication, in one or more counterparts, by all of the directors.
