Part IX-A Summary of Direct Charitable Activities

Tax Year 2014 is the Foundation's second (full) year of existence. The Foundation's direct charitable activities have largely been deferred, pending the completion of its first literary project (a biographical account of the life of a physician who escaped Communist Cuba, with a focus upon the subject's journey to reclaim his human dignity and the role of his faith in fueling his resolute determination in the face of threats upon his life, his faith, and his freedom), which occurred in the first quarter of 2014. [Efforts to complete and then "launch" and market the book were delayed by the death of the book's biographical subject (Louis "Cucho" Balart) on November 21, 2013.] Following such publication, the Foundation's efforts with respect to its direct charitable activities, as identified below, have begun.

The Foundation's literary projects will be predominantly faith-based in theme/topic and/or which explore issues related to education, spirituality, and human dignity. The Foundation will strive to provide inspiration, motivation, and hope to the public through literary projects which offer non-fictional accounts of personal triumph/achievement, particularly those involving the transcendence of personal tragedy, oppression, and/or other obstacles, while also exploring the integral role of faith in the journey to such triumph/achievement. The Foundation may also publish or otherwise participate in literary projects which explore issues related to education, access to effective education, problems facing educational systems across the Nation, etc. The Foundation's Founders and Board believe that education is an indispensible component of human dignity, with the result that the topics of education, human dignity, faith, perseverance, and personal growth are interwoven topics, and that a literary product is an appropriate vehicle to bring the message and mission of the Foundation to the public.

The Foundation anticipates that it will both sell and donate books it publishes. Profits from book sales will be used by the Foundation to foster its other charitable purposes in providing charitable relief to poor and distressed individuals, and to the underprivileged (as described below). The Foundation plans to identify schools, organizations, communities, and other segments of the population who would benefit from the donation of the books published by the Foundation, depending upon the topic/theme of the book. The Foundation may also purchase or accept contributions of books (not published by the Foundation) and/or other educational materials for distribution to schools.

The Foundation plans to directly provide charitable relief to poor and distressed individuals, and to the underprivileged. The Foundation intends to primarily serve the poor and underprivileged residing in the Parish of East Baton Rouge, Louisiana. As the Foundation and its resources grow, the Foundation may expand its consideration to

requests for aid from outside the Parish of East Baton Rouge, but a primary focus will be on the Parish of East Baton Rouge. The Foundation may provide assistance in the form of funds or, in some circumstances, goods to provide for basic necessities (such as food, clothing, and basic supplies).

The Foundation may also research and select other non-profit, tax-exempt organizations {qualified under IRC Section 501(c)(3)}, which foster, support, and encourage religious, charitable, scientific, literary, and/or educational purposes, to which donations may be made. When making contributions to other entities/organizations, the Foundation will restrict its financial support to those entities which are tax-exempt under IRC Section 501(c)(3). The Foundation will secure a copy of the entity's IRS "Determination Letter" or other documentation confirming that the entity is tax-exempt under IRC Section 501(c)(3), prior to or contemporaneous with providing any financial support.

The Foundation plans to directly provide charitable relief to poor and distressed individuals, and to the underprivileged. The Foundation intends to primarily serve the poor and underprivileged residing in the Parish of East Baton Rouge, Louisiana. As the Foundation and its resources grow, the Foundation may expand its consideration to requests for aid from outside the Parish of East Baton Rouge, but a primary focus will be on the Parish of East Baton Rouge. The Foundation does not anticipate distributions of aid for any purposes other than (a) basic and essential living expenses, (b) medical expenses, (c) funeral expenses, (d) disaster relief/emergency hardship, and (e) education expenses, at this time.

The Foundation will make local churches and other charitable organizations serving the community aware of its ability to offer financial assistance to needy individuals. The criteria which will be considered by the Foundation in selecting recipients for aid will be strictly need-based criteria, in order to identify financially needy individuals, as set forth on the Financial Assistance Application previously provided (and attached hereto). Aid will be limited to low-income individuals and priority will be given first to families supporting children under the age of 16, who are enrolled and attending primary or secondary school or have not yet attained school age, and then to the elderly.

The Foundation may provide assistance in the form of funds or, in some circumstances, goods to provide for basic necessities (such as food, clothing, and basic supplies). The Foundation expects that individual disbursements will be in the range of \$500 to \$5,000, although more significant disbursements may be provided in extenuating circumstances.

The Foundation contemplates that it may, on occasion, rely upon the screening process of other tax-exempt organizations (e.g., St. Vincent de Paul, etc.), with more resources and experience, to identify individuals in need of financial assistance. The charitable class to be served by this Foundation will be identified by reasonable and objective criteria. The Foundation will not serve a pre-selected group of people or specific individuals. Further, the Foundation will not "ear-mark" contributions received by the Foundation for a particular person or family. The Foundation will require that those individuals seeking assistance complete an Application (substantially similar to the attached). The Foundation will retain the Application submitted by the individual, a description of the assistance provided, a summary of the criteria considered which is not otherwise reflected in the Application, and the identity of each Board Member who reviewed/approved the Application.

Based upon available resources, The Parable Foundation is pleased to be able to provide assistance for qualified individuals and families. Financial Assistance awards are based upon a review of the Applicant's household income, available resources, and extenuating circumstances.

To evaluate your needs, the Foundation requires a variety of information about your financial situation. Financial Assistance Applications will be considered incomplete until all application items are submitted. Once the completed application package is received, it takes approximately 3 weeks to review and process.
